PROCLAMATION

West rn Australia, By His Excellency Sir Edward Albert Srone, Knight, Administrator of the Government in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc. etc., etc.

L.S.

HEREAS by the Fisheries Act, 1899 (63 Vict., No. 47), the Governor is empowered by Proclamation in the Government Gazette :-

- (1.) To declare any West Australian waters to be close waters for all or any kind of fishing.
- (2.) To regulate the length and meshes of nets.

And whereas by Proclamation dated 5th December, 1900, published in the Government Gazette of the 14th idem, the Swan River (including Melville Water and all water below the Lower Canning Bridge) was declared close water for fishing by means of a sunk net, or by means of a net containing or attached to a bag, cod, or pocket:

AND WHEREAS by Proclamation dated 6th November, 1901, and published in the Government Gazette of the 22nd idem, the length of nets to be used in prawning was prescribed as 15 fathoms, the mesh of which shall not be less than one half-inch: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to extend the length of such nets to 25 fathoms;

Now THEREFORE I, the Administrator aforesaid, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby exempt prawning nets from the operation of the Proclama tion dated 5th December, 1900; and do hereby extend the length of nets to be used in prawning from 15 fathoms to 25 fathoms, the mesh of which shall not be less than one half-inch.

Every person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £20, and shall forfeit the implements used, and all fish that shall have been taken.

WHEREAS by the provisions of Section four of "The Noxious Weeds Act, 1900," it is made lawful for the Governor in Council, on the recommendation of the Agricultural Advisory Board, to declare any plants to be noxious weeds, either generally or in any particular locality:

And whereas the Agricultural Advisory Board has recommended that the plants known as—

"Spanish Radish" (Kaphanus raphanistrum),
"Prickly Pear" (Opuntia vulgaris),
"Apple of Sodom" (Sola um sodomæum)

shall be declared "noxious weeds" throughout the State:

Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the above-named plants to be "noxious weeds" throughout the State.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLLIE.

AT a Special Meeting of the above Council, held 27th October, the Building By-law No. 7 of the Municipality of Collie was amended to read as under:—

7. With regard to the component materials of any external walls of buildings that front upon or face towards Throssell Street and Forrest Street, every such wall, if the premises are to be used for business purposes, must be built of brick or stone, or artificial stone, together laid in, and with mortar or cement in such manner as to produce solid work. If the premises are to be used as dwellings only, the external walls may, by permission of the Council, be of wood, provided that the premises are erected not less than forty (40) feet from the street line, and that the plans and specifications of the building, and its position on the ground, have been approved by the Surveyor or Town Clerk. And it is further directed that all material used within and beyond the above-mentioned area shall be subject to the approval of the Surveyor or Town Clerk.

FREMANTLE LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH. By-Law No. A., 1902.

To prevent any person expectorating in any public place within the jurisdiction of the Local Board of Health of the Town of Fremantle.

No person shall expectorate on any made footpath in any street or public place, or on any building to which the public have access, or any approach thereto, or on any railway carriage, tramcar, or other public conveyance.

Any person violating the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings.
