HEREAS by Section 23 of 1 and 2 Edward VII., No 24, the Governor may, by Proclamation, temporarily suspend the operation of "The Early Closing Act, 1902," in suspend the operation of "The Early Closing Act, 1902, In so far as it applies to the closing time fixed or appointed for any shop or shops: Now THEREFORE I, Sir Edward Albert Stone, Knight, Administrator as aforesaid, do hereby suspend the operation of the said Act in so far as it applies to the closing time of "Small Shops," as hereinafter defined, until the 30th day of June, 1903:-

"Small Shops" are those:

(a.) Which are registered as such in accordance with the regulations made under the said Act; and

(b.) Wherein only one registered assistant (whether

paid or unpaid) is engaged or employed; and
(c.) Which are closed at 8 o'clock p.m. on Mondays
Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, at 2 o'clock
p.m. on Wednesdays, and 10 o'clock p.m. on
Saturdays, and are kept closed until 7 o'clock a.m. on the next following week day; and

(d.) The shopkeeper whereof and the assistant (if any),

engaged or employed therein are registered in accordance with the said regulations; and

(e.) The assistant (if any) is the wife, husband, child, grandchild, parent, or sister of the shopkeeper.

### CAVES TO BE OPEN.

1. The caves within these reserves will be open for inspection daily between 8 a.m. and 10 p.m., provided visitors give the caretakers reasonable notice of the time they intend to visit them.

VISITORS TO BE ACCOMPANIED BY CARETAKER.

2. No person or persons shall enter any cave unless accompanied by the Caretaker.

#### Admission Fee.

3. Every person entering a cave shall pay to the caretaker an admission fee of 1s.

#### Injuring or Destroying Trees.

4. No person shall injure, cut, break, deface, pull up, pick, remove, or destroy any tree, shrub, plant, or flower growing on the said Reserves.

#### Injuring or Disfiguring Caves.

5. No person shall break, remove, injure, or deface by writing or marking, or in any way damage any rock, stalactite, or stalagmite, or remove any rock, stalactite, or stalagmite, or in any way injure, damage, or disfigure the stairways, ladders, cave gates, railings, seats, fences, buildings, machinery, lighting appliances, or other structures or improvements within any cave or upon any cave reserve.

INJURING THE SOIL OR SURFACE, OR DESTROYING BIRDS OR ANIMALS.

No person shall cut up, damage, or disfigure, or interfere with the soil, or rocks, or turf, or surface of the caves' reserves, or the roads or footways across, around, or over the same, or pollute or interfere with any water thereon, interfere with or destroy any birds or animals thereon in any manner whatsoever.

VISITORS TO ACT IN OBEDIENCE TO INSTRUCTIONS OF CARETAKER.

7. Every visitor to the reserves or caves therein shall act in obedience to the instructions of the Caretaker, whilst being shown through or over any cave or caves.

#### PERSONS MISCONDUCTING THEMSELVES.

8. No person or persons shall misconduct themselves in any way by indulging in riotous or indecent conduct, or make use of any indecent or improper language, or commit any nuisance on or within the said reserves and caves.

CARETAKER MAY REMOVE ANY PERSON GUILTY OF IMPROPER CONDUCT.

#### Posting Bills.

No person shall post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint, or otherwise affix or cause to be posted, stuck, stamped, stencilled, painted, or otherwise affixed any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement, or any document whatsoever upon any tree, fence, post, gate, wall, flagging, road, path, building, or any place whatever upon or within the said reserves and caves.

Shooting, etc., on the Reserves.

11. No person shall shoot or discharge any firearms, or throw or discharge any stone or missile, upon or within any of the said reserves and caves.

SELLING GOODS ON THE RESERVES.

#### THE COAL MINES REGULATION ACT, 1902.

Amendment of Part I. of the Regulations thereunder.

IIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to repeal Part I. of the Regulations under "The Coal Mines Regulation Act, 1902," made on 25th July, 1902, and to approve of the following in lieu thereof.

# PART I.—ACCIDENT RELIEF FUND.

- 1. The trustee to be appointed by the mine owners shall be appointed by memorandum under the hand, or, in the case of an incorporated company, the seal, of a majority of the owners, and such memorandum shall be transmitted to the Minister.
- 2. The trustee to be appointed by the miners shall be appointed in manner following:—

An Inspector of Mines, or some other person to be nominated by the Minister, shall, by seven days' notice, in writing, exhibited on each mine in the district, convene a meeting of miners, who, at such meeting, by a majority of miners present, shall appoint a trustee, and the name of the person appointed shall be transmitted by the Inspector or such other person as aforesaid to the Minister.

- 3. The persons appointed as aforesaid, with the trustee appointed by the Minister, shall constitute the trustees of the fund, and their appointment shall be notified in the Government Gazette. Any two trustees shall constitute a quorum, and may, subject to Regulation S, operate on the trust account.
- 4. The Accident Committee shall consist of five members, to be appointed by the miners at the meeting convened under Regulation 2 for the appointment of a trustee, and the names of the persons appointed shall be transmitted by the Inspector of Mines or such other person as aforesaid to the Minister, and notified in the Government Gazette. Any three members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum.
- 5. Every trustee and every member of the Accident Committee shall hold office for one year from the notification of his appointment in the Government Gazette, but shall be eligible for re-appointment.
- 6. In the case of any vacancy in the office of any trustee or member of an Accident Committee by death, resignation, or otherwise, another trustee or member shall be appointed in manner aforesaid.
- 7. All contributions to the fund shall be paid to the trustees, and shall be paid by them to the credit of a trust account, to be called the Accident Relief Fund Account, to be kept in the names of the trustees at a bank approved by the Minister.
- 8. All moneys withdrawn from the trust account shall be paid by the trustees to any person injured, or to the relatives of any person injured, in accordance with the recommendation and with the approval of the Accident Committee.
- 9. In making any recommendation the Accident Committee shall be guided by the following rules:—
- (A.) Any employee who meets with an accident in or about a mine shall immediately give notice of the nature and cause of the accident to the workman nearest him, and to one or other of the overmen, and shall within five days of the occurrence of such accident send or cause to be sent a notice, in writing, to the Secretary of the Accident Committee giving full particulars as to the time, date of the accident, and the circumstances attending such accident, together with the certificate of a qualified medical practitioner, or the claim shall not be entertained, and the Secretary of the Accident Committee shall forthwith notify the Inspector of Mines for the district of such accident and of the nature thereof as reported to him
- (B.) The allowance that may be paid from the funds shall be as follows :—
  - (1.) Where disablement results from an accident, a weekly sum of twenty-seven shillings, or the rate of four shillings and sixpence for every working day from the date of the accident. Such payment shall only be made and continued on the certificate of a qualified medical practitioner that the em

ployee is unable to work. In the event of an employee being permanently disabled he may, on the certificate of a qualified medical practitioner, be granted a fixed sum not exceeding Fifty pounds in satisfaction of all claims. A person shall be deemed to be disabled when he is wholly incapacitated from attending to his ordinary occupation.

- (2.) Where death results from the accident-
  - (a.) If deceased was married-
    - A weekly sum of ten shillings, payable to the widow, if any, while unmarried and of good conduct.
  - (II.) A weekly sum of two shillings and sixpence in respect of each child, if any, of the deceased until such child attains the age of fourteen years or dies, payable to the widow, if any, during her life, or if there is no widow, or the widow dies while any such sum is payable, to the guardian or person having the care of such child.
  - (b.) If the deceased was unmarried-
    - (1.) A weekly sum of ten shillings, payable to the father of the deceased during his life, if, in the opinion of the Committee, the father was at the time of his son's death dependent on the deceased for support; or
    - (11.) A weekly sum of ten shillings, payable to the mother of the deceased, if a widow, during her life and while she continues a widow, if, in the opinion of the Committee, she was at the time of her son's death dependent on the deceased for support.
  - (III.) If the father and mother of the deceased are dead or are not entitled to an allowance, a weekly sum of ten shillings, payable to the sister or sisters of the deceased (sharing equally), while such sister or any of such sisters is or are alive and unmarried, if, in the opinion of the Committee, she or they were at the time of his death dependent on the deceased for support.
  - (iv.) A weekly sum of two shillings and sixpence for each child of the mother of the deceased, or of the sister or sisters of the deceased, payable to the mother or to the sister or sisters as the case may be, until such child attains the age of fourteen years, if, in the opinion of the Committee, such mother or such sister or sisters was or were at the time of his death dependent on the deceased for support.
- (c.) If the Committee considers that any allowance payable to any person for or in respect of a child would not be or is not being properly expended or used by the said persons for the benefit of the child, it may recommend the payment of such allowance to such other person as it may think fit.
- 10. (a.) No payment to any employee shall be recommended unless accompanied by a certificate signed by the manager or some other responsible official of the mine that the deceased, or the person disabled, was at the time of the accident employed in or about such mine, and that the accident occurred in or about the workings of such mine; and
- (b.) A certificate signed by a legally qualified medical practitioner or the local Coroner that the disablement or death was caused primarily by the accident referred to. In the case of disablement, the nature and effects thereof shall be stated in such certificate.
- 11. When any accident resulting in the disablement of an employee occurs in any mine situate in a locality remote from settlement, where the services of a duly qualified medical practitioner are not procurable, payment at the prescribed rate may be made for any period not exceeding thirty days from date of the accident, on the certificate of the Inspector of Mines for the district, or in his absence, or if there be no Inspector, on the certificate of the mine manager.
- 12. No employee shall be entitled to relief for an accident caused by drinking intoxicating liquors, fighting, or any kind of athletic sports or game of amusement, or any accident directly attributable to the serious and wilful misconduct of the employee.
- 13. If any employee meets with an accident which proves fatal, a sum not exceeding Fifteen pounds may be granted to any person towards defraying the funeral expenses of the deceased, and an additional sum not exceeding Fifteen pounds may be granted to the widow or any near relative of such deceased employee, if previously dependent upon the deceased for support, in full satisfaction of all claims upon the Fund.

- 14. Any employee, while in receipt of relief, must be in his usual place of abode by seven o'clock every evening rfom April to September, and eight o'clock from October to March, unless he can show reasonable cause to the Accident Committee for being abroad after that hour.
- An employee misconducting himself by fighting, being under the influence of intoxicating liquors, behaving in a riotous or indecent manner, or behaving in any way that constitutes a breach of the public peace, or an offence to morality or common decency, while in receipt of relief on account of any accident, shall cease to receive further relief in respect of such accident from the time that he so misconducts himself.
- 16. In the event of any member of the Accident Committee obtaining, or being placed in the possession of, information that an employee in receipt of relief has misconducted himself as aforesaid, it shall be incumbent upon him to make a report to the members of the district Accident Committee of the said misconduct.
- 17. In the event of the employee concerned requiring an inquiry to be held into the nature of, or circumstances attending, the misconduct with which he is charged, the Accident Committee shall hold such inquiry and receive evidence bearing upon the nature and circumstances attending the alleged misconduct, or evidence rebutting the same.
- 18. In the event of the Accident Committee being satisfield that the employee so charged has exonerated himself, or that a reasonable doubt exists as to his participation in the misconduct with which he is charged, the Committee shall have power to pay any arrears of relief money which have accrued since the charge was made to the employee so charged, r any portion thereof.
- 19. It shall not be competent for any employee so charged to be represented by any counsel or solicitor at such inquiry.
- 20. If the trustees are of opinion at any time that the scale of relief provided by these Regulations is inadequate, or, having regard to the state of the funds at their disposal, that the scale should be reduced, they shall make a recom-mendation to the Minister accordingly, with the view to an amendment of Regulation 9: Provided that no recommendation shall be made to increase the rate of relief beyond Thirty shillings per week.
- 21. In the event of the demands for relief being in excess of the funds at the disposal of the trustees, relief shall abate proportionately.
- 22. The trustees shall keep proper books of accounts showing the various items of receipt and expenditure in relation to the said account, and such books shall at all reasonable times be open to the inspection of the Inspector of Mines or other person appointed by the Minister, who may take such extracts therefrom as he may require.
- 23. Any actual and necessary disbursements attending the appointment of any trustee or members of the Committee, or incurred by the trustees in the performance of their duties, and approved by the Minister, may be paid out of the Trust Funds.
- 24. The Committee may appoint a Secretary at a salary to be fixed annually by the Minister. Such salary shall be paid from the trust funds.

nights, the mean minimum temperature being only 47.6.

Turning to the other side of the picture, we find that almost unbearable heat was experienced in the North-West and Kimberley divisions, the worst place being Marble Bar, where the mean daily maximum was 107° and the highest individual reading 117°.

The atmospheric pressure throughout was normal, the means being in remarkably close agreement with the average for previous

years at nearly every station.

The rainfall was very light, and below the average for previous years at all stations except in the extreme North and extreme South-East.

"Good day; most remarkable weather," is the usual greeting just now. It usually is here at the close of the year; but it happens to be founded upon a correct appreciation for once. Last December was the coolest ever recorded in Perth since observations commenced, in 1875. The average of the daily maximum readings was only 79.2 at the Botanical Gardens and 75.4 at the Observatory, as against means of 83.4 and 80.2, respectively, for previous years. December is seldom oppressively hot, but there are very few years in which the temperature does not reach 100° at least once and 90° several times. On this occasion, however; it only reached 90° once in the Gardens, and not at all at the Observatory, the highest readings for the month being only 92.0 and 89.2, respectively. It was not only in Perth that the temperature was below the average for previous years, but almost throughout the State. It was, however, specially noticeable on the West coast.

#### PROVISIONAL ORDER.
