MUNICIPAL BY-LAWS.

HIS Excellency the Administrator in Council has been pleased to confirm the following By-laws made by the Council of the Municipality of Boulder.

MUNICIPALITY OF BOULDER.

BY-LAW No. 76.

A By-law of the Municipality of Boulder made under Section 167 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and numbered seventy-six, for the control and management of the Boulder Mechanics' Institute.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Boulder order as follows:

- The Council shall hold in trust for the Municipality Boulder Town Lot No. 658, with the buildings thereon known as the Mechanics' Institute, and any buildings which may be hereinafter erected, together with the fittings, furniture, books, and other property contained therein, and now or at any other time appertaining thereto; and the Council shall be responsible for the proper maintenance of the said buildings.
- 2. The Council shall have power to place the control of the said Institute in the hands of a Committee of Management, which shall be appointed or elected in such manner and subject to such restrictions as the Council shall determine; but no powers shall be conferred on or exercised by such Committee in excess of what is conferred on it by this By-law.
- The Committee shall have control of the Building as tenants of the Council, paying for the same such rent as the Council shall determine.
- The Committee shall cause books of accounts to be kept showing particulars of all moneys received and expended, and such accounts shall be balanced on the 30th April and the 31st October in every year, and the same, together with a summarised statement of receipts and expenditure, and also of the assets and liabilities at the date of balancing, shall be ready for audit within fourteen days after the said 30th April and 31st October.

- 5. The Auditors appointed or elected to audit the accounts of the Municipality, or such other person or persons as the Council shall specially appoint for the purpose, shall audit the accounts of the Institute, and the Chairman and any other member or officer of the committee who may have in his custody or control any books, accounts, vouchers, or papers necessary for the purpose of such audit shall produce and lay the same before such auditors.
- A copy of the statement of receipts and expenditure and of assets and liabilities, together with the auditors' report or certificate thereon, shall be delivered by the committee to the Council within seven days of the completion of the Audit.
- 7. The Council shall have power, should it at any time see fit, to dissolve the Committee of Management; and on a resolution being passed by a majority of the whole of the members of the Council that the Committee be dissolved, and the publication of such resolution in the Government Gazette, such Committee shall thereupon be dissolved, and the Chairman, members, and officers thereof shall forth-with deliver up to the Council all books or other property, of whatsoever description, appertaining to the Mechanics' Institute, which may for the time being be in their
- Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £5.

THE DIVIDEND DUTIES ACT, 1902.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The oath of fidelity and secrecy to be taken and subscribed by every person employed by the Minister to aid in the execution of "The Dividend Duties Act, 1902" (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), shall be in the form "A" in the Schedule.
- 2. Every return made under Section 6 of the Act shall be in the form "B" in the Schedule, and shall contain the particulars indicated.
