W HEREAS by "The Game Act, 1892," the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to declare any portion of the State or locality a Reserve for Native Game or any particular Native Game -AND WHEREAS it is deemed desirable that the whole of the waters of the Mundaring Weir should be declared a Reserve for Wild Duck of all species: Now THEREFORE I, the Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare Reserve No. 7294, situated in the Swan and Avon Districts, being the Helena River Reservoir as surveyed and shown coloured blue on Plan $\frac{IC}{40}$, Department of Lands and Surveys, a Reserve for Wild Duck of all species.

IS Excellency the Administrator in Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws made the Local Boards of Health, Coolgardie, Wiluna, by Cottesloe, and Narrogin.

COOLGARDIE LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH. BY-LAW No. 28. 1452

FOR REGULATING OCCUPATION OF BEDS IN COMMON LODGING-HOUSES WITHIN THE AREA UNDER CONTROL OF THE LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH OF COOLGARDIE.

The keeper of any common lodging-house shall not cause or suffer any lodger to occupy any bed in any common lodging-house kept by him at any time within the period of eight hours after such bed shall have been vacated by the last preceding occupant thereof.

PENALTY FOR BREACH.

Any person who shall offend against the foregoing By-law shall be liabl; for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding £10. Provided, nevertheless, that the Justices or Court before whom any complaint may be made or any proceedings may be taken in respect of any such offence, may, if they think fit, adjudge the payment of a penalty of any less sum than the full amount of the penalty imposed by this By-law, but in n > case to be less than Five shillings.

The above By-law was duly passed at a Meeting of the Local Board of Health held on the 20th November, 1902.

BY-LAWS OF THE WILUNA LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH. 3315

WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1898," any Local Board of Health may make By-laws as therein provided: Now, therefore, in pursuance thereof, the Local Board of Health for the District of Wiluna hereby make the following Bylaws, which shall come into operation from the date of publication in the Governm nt Gazette :

BY-LAW No. 19.

1. No person other than the Board's employees shall remove from any premises or place within the townsite boundary any sewage or refuse, unless permission for so doing is given by the Board, save and except the person who is at the time of such removal the occupier or owner of the premises from which such sewage or refuse is being removed.

2. No person shall ask, demand, or receive, for the removal of any sewage or refuse matter, more than is set out in the Schedule of charges below, marked "A," unless the consent in writing of the Board has been previously obtained.

3. Every person employed by the Board for the removal of rubbish shall remove all refuse matter as often as required by the owner or occupier of any premises, or as may be required by the Instector or the By-laws of the Board, and shall use every care, despatch, and cleanliness in the performance of their duties, and shall deposit such refuse as required by the By-laws.

4. The Bourd may cancel or suspend the license of any person who commits a breach of or neglects or fails to observe this By-law.

Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 or less than as.

BY-LAW No. 20.

REGULATING THE DEPOSIT OF RUBBISH ON PREMISES.

1. The owner or occupier of every house or premises within the townsite boundary shall provide such and so many receptacles or bins of the material and of the dimensions as may be required by the Inspector or Board for the reception of refuse or other matter.

2. The owner or occupier of all premises shall regularly collect all refuse or rubbish from such premises, and place the same in the receptacles, and shall not permit or suffer such receptacles to overflow or become offensive.

3. Every receptacle as aforesaid shall be kept in such place as the Inspector may direct. and so as to be convenient for the discharge of the contents thereof.

4. Every owner or occupier of premises to which a receptacle as aforesaid is attached or used shall cause the same to be emptied, as follows: if such premises are used as an hotel, at least once a fortnight; and all other premises at least once every four weeks, or in either case as often as the Inspector may direct; and shall, after notice from the Inspector and within the time specified in such notice, replace by a new and approved receptacie, any receptacle that the Inspector may deem worn out or unfit for use.

Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding 25 or less than 5s., or a penalty not more than 22 or less than 10s. per day for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

BY-LAW No. 21.

REGULATING THE KEEPING OF CAMELS WITHIN THE TOWNSITE BOUNDARY.

No person or persons shall keep any camels within the townsite boundary between sunrise and sunset for a longer period than two consecutive hours, unless with the written permission of t e Inspector, and all persons are prohibited from keeping any camels within the townsite boundary after sunset.

Any person offending against this By-law shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceed ng £5 or less than 5s.

BY-LAW No. 58.

Every pan for the reception of nightsoil shall be emptied by the nightman licensed by the Board once at least in every week.

BY-LAW No. 59.

The sum of fourpence for each removal of nightsoil from each pan shall be charged to each occupier of the premises from whence such removal is effected, and shall be paid to the Board.

WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1898" (62 Vict, No. 24), the Local Board of Health has power to make By-laws: Now, therefore, in pursuance thereof, the following By-laws have been made, and shall come into operation from the date of publication in the *Government Gazette*.

INTERPRETATION.

In the construction and for the purposes of these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the terms herein used shall have the meanings severally attached to them in Section 3 of the said Act.

BY-LAW No. 1.

Cesspools to be cleansed and filled up.

All existing cesspools within the area under the juris-diction of the Local Board shall be cleansed and filled up to the satisfaction of the Inspector within a calendar month of notice to that effect being given to the owner or occupier.

BY-LAW No. 2.

Regulating the position and manner of construction of privies.

1. No person shall erect within the district of the Local Board any earth-closet, privy, or urinal the distribution of the hold are not of stone, wood, wood and iron, or brick, and every closet shall be equipped with the sealed pan adopted by the Local Board. The doors of every closet shall be properly fitted, and shall at all times be kept in a state of theorem is provided. thorough repair. The trap-door shall be so constructed as to readily admit the pan (and shall be placed facing the right-of-way).

All closets, privies, or urinals shall be erected in such be erected as near the right-of-way as con-eniently can be, and every such structure shall be ventilated to the satisfaction of the Local Board.

3. Authority under Section 173, Subsection 3.-The occupier of every house or premises, whether public or private, shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a box containing either ashes, dry earth, lime, sawdust, carbolic powder, or other disinfectant approved by the Local Board, and shall cause all nightsoil or other matter which may be deposited in such pan or receptacle in such closet or privy to be immediately deodorised or disinfected with a sufficient quantity of the disinfectant kept in such box.

BY-LAW No. 3.

Closets supplied with receptacles for excrementitious matter-Size, shape, materials of construction-Interchangeable.

Each closet shall be supplied with a sufficient number of receptacles for excrementitious matter which shall be interchangeable with others in the same district, and shall be of the following size, shape, style and materials :-

NOTE.-Specifications recommended by Central Board attached.

BY-LAW No. 4.

There shall be provided by the occupier two receptacles for every closet on the premises occupied by him.

BY-LAW No. 5.

Every nightman shall cause every receptacle for nightsoil, after the disposal of the contents, to be cleansed by super-heated steam.

BY-LAW No. 6.

Every contractor shall cause the nightsoil removed from any premises to be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator, or to be trenched or ploughed into the land.

BY-LAW No. 7.

That failing the use of a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator, the contractor be compelled to obtain a receipt from the occupier of the land whereon deposit is made, or from the manager of some approved depôt for nightsoil for the number of pans there emptied or delivered.

BY-LAW No. 8.

The Local Board shall exercise stringent supervision over all such depôts or places of deposit, and the Inspector shall inspect such depôts or places regularly at such intervals as the Local Board may direct.

BY-LAW No. 9.

Mode of removal, etc.

The mode of removal of each receptacle in each closet shall be as follows .-- The nightman shall remove each receptacle and at once cover the same with a suitable tight-fitting lid, and upon every such removal shall carefully place a cleansed pan of the pattern approved by the Local Board in lieu of every pan so removed, and each pan shall be dealt with as prescribed in the next following clause hereof, that is to say-

Each receptacle which shall have been removed from a closet and sealed with a lid as prescribed in the foregoing clause shall be then removed by the nightman in a cart or vehicle of a pattern to be approved by the Local Board, and the contents of all such receptacles shall be deposited in such place or places as shall from time to time be fixed by the Local Board.

Until otherwise directed, the nightman shall deposit the contents of all such receptacles in trenches, to be excavated at his own expense, in such place or places as shall be fixed by the Local Board, and treated with disinfectant, and covered with carth to such depth as the Local Board may from time to time direct.

The said receptacles shall be emptied once a week at the least, or so much more frequently as the Local Board may from time to time direct.

BY-LAW No. 10. Fixing the charge, etc.

Every nightman shall be entitled to charge and to receive from the occupier of any premises from which any nightsoil, trade, or house refuse shall have been removed, such sum or sums of money as are specified in Schedule "A" hereto, and no nightman shall ask, demand, or receive more than the moneys mentioned in the said Schedule

BY-LAW No. 11.

Licenses to remove nightsoil.

1. No license shall be issued to any person not approved of by the Local Board.

2. No nightman shall remove nightsoil from any house or premises within the area under the jurisdiction of the Local Board, unless he shall have first obtained from the Local Board a license authorising him to do so.

3. The license shall be in the form of Schedule "B" hereto, and subject to the conditions contained in the license, and to the provisions of "The Health Act, 1898," and of these By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 12.

Imposing penalties on licensee for breach of conditions. The following shall be the conditions upon which licenses to remove nightsoil shall be issued :---

The penalties for breach of any of the foregoing conditions shall be not more than the respective amounts set forth at the conclusion of each such condition.

BY-LAW No. 13.

For the mode of carriage of, and precautions, etc.. to be observed-Meat, bread, fruit, etc.

1. No person or persons shall bring or cause to be brought or carried through any street or lane, in any cart or vehicle, any butcher's meat, bread, or fruit, unless such meat, bread, or fruit be protected from the sun and dust.

2. Every cart or other vehicle, and every construction or covering for carrying and protecting meat, bread, or fruit shall be kept in a clean and sanitary state.

BY-LAW No. 14.

For the registration annually of all persons carrying on the trade of cow-keepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk.

All persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairy-men, or purveyors of milk within the district of the Local

Board shall register their names and addresses at the office of the Local Board, and shall pay a registration fee for such registration, and shall receive a certificate thereof in the form of Schedule "C."

BY-LAW No. 15.

For securing the cleanliness of bakeries.

No person shall carry on the bakery or bread or confectionery store unless and until the premises have been examined and passed as suitable by the Inspector.

2. All bakeries and bread and confectionery stores shall be at all reasonable times open to the inspection of any of the officers of the Local Board; and all troughs, tanks, and all utensils and appliances used in such premises shall be kept in a thoroughly clean condition, to the satisfaction of the Local Board's officers.

BY-LAW No. 16.

For prescribing the time of and the precautions to be taken on the removal of pigwash, etc.

1. No person shall remove any pigwash or other filthy matter unless such pigwash or filthy matter be carried in water-tight barrels or tanks, securely covered to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof or any offensive smell therefrom.

2. Every tank or barrel and every receptacle used for the storage and reception of any pigwash or filthy matter, and every conveyance or vehicle used for the carriage or removal of any matter as above, shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.

No pigwash or filthy matter shall be removed from 3 any place or premises between the hours of 8 o'clock in the morning and 6 o'clock in the evening, except by permission of the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 17.

For the prevention of the sale of diseased fruit, etc.

No person shall sell or expose for sale in any market, No person shall sell or expose for sale in any marker, warehouse, or shop, or other place, any fruit which is diseased or unwholesome, and any fruit which, in the opinion of any officer appointed by the Local Board or Central Board, is diseased or unwholesome shall be destroyed, and all cases or packing material which surrounded such fruit shall also be destroyed as such officer may direct.

BY-LAW No. 18.

For the restriction of the storage and keeping of bonedust, etc.

No person shall store or keep any bonedust or artificial or other manure so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

BY-LAW No. 19.

Regulating and keeping of cattle or other animals,

Every occupier or owner of a building wherein or whereon any horses, cattle, swine, or other animals may be kept shall provide, in connection with such building or other premises, a suitable receptacle for dung, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may be produced from time to time in the keeping of such animals.

2. Such receptacle shall be constructed in such a manner and of such material, and shall be maintained in such a manner so as to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof or any leakage therefrom.

3. The owner or occupier of such premises shall at least once a week remove or cause to be removed all dung or other offensive matter from such receptacle, and shall convey or cause to be conveyed such dung or offensive matter to the depôt or place set apart for that purpose by the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 20.

Defining an area within which swine may not be kept, etc.

No person shall keep any swine within 100 feet of 1. any house.

2. No person shall keep any swine in any part of the district under the control of the Local Board, unless and until such premises or places to be used as a piggery have been examined and approved by the Inspector and licensed by the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 21.

For the prevention of danger to the public from manufactories or places for the storage of inflammable materials.

1. No person shall permit on any premises owned or occupied by him any accumulation of straw, paper, shavings, empty cases, or other inflammable material.

2. Any person who, after two hours' notice from the Inspector, shall neglect to remove such inflammable material shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and, on conviction, shall forfe't and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

BY-LAW No. 22.

For the disinfection of and the prevention of nuisance or injury to health from poultry yards, rags, or other materials used or stored in marine stores.

1. No person shall keep any premises as a poultry yard at a less distance than 25 feet from any dwelling.

2. Every poultry yard shall be kept in a clean condition and disinfected at least once a week with lime, ashes, or other suitable disinfectant.

3. No rags or other materials used or stored in marine stores, flock or bedding or furniture manufactories shall be kept so as to cause a nuisance or to be injurious to health.

BY-LAW No. 23.

For the regulation of noxious or offensive trades.

1. The owner or occupier of any place, building, or premises used for the purpose of carrying on any offensive or noxious trade, business or manufactory, as set forth in Section 146 of the Act, whether established before or after the passing of the said Act, shall register the same at the office of the Local Board during the first week in January in each year, and shall pay to the Local Board an annual registration fee, as set forth in Schedule "D" hereto, of the amount of which fee the Local Board shall give notice to such owner or occupier, and if such owner or occupier fails to comply he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2 per day for each day during which such provisions shall not be complied with.

2. All premises or places so registered shall be kept in a clean and sanitary state, and shall be limewashed as often as may be required by the Local Board or its officers.

BY-LAW No. 24.

For the prevention of the use of steam whistles at factories, etc. No person or owner of any factory or other establishment shall use or cause to be used any steam whistle so as to be a nuisance to any person.

BY-LAW No. 25.

Specifying the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing.

Unless otherwise provided for, the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing required to be done by any Inspector or officer shall be determined by the Local Board, according to the nature of the case.

BY-LAW No. 26.

For preventing offensive matter running out of premises.

1. It shall not be lawful for the owner, proprietor, or any employee of or in any manufactory, brewery, slaughter-house, knacker's yard, butcher's or fishmonger's shops, laundry, or dunghill, to allow any offensive matter to escape and flow upon any street, lane, way, or throughfare, or land within the district of the Local Board.

All such offensive matter shall be placed in a suitable receptacle, and emptied as often as necessary, to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

BY-LAW No. 27.

Regulating the deposit of rubbish, etc.

1. The occupier of every house or premises shall, on written notice from the Inspector, and within the time specified in such notice, provide such and so many receptacles or boxes of the material and of the dimensions as may be required by the local Board for the temporary deposit of house refuse.

2. The occupier of such house, or if there be no occupier, then the owner, shall regularly collect all refuse or rubbish from such premises and place the same in the receptacles ; and he shall not permit or suffer such receptacle to overflow or become offensive, and shall, when necessary or directed by the Inspector or officer of the Local Board, thoroughly disinfect the same forthwith.

3. Every receptacle as aforesaid shall be kept in such place or position as the Inspector may point out, and so as to be convenient for the removal of the contents thereof.

Every owner or occupier, or if there be no occupier, then the owner, of every house or premises to which a receptacle as aforesaid is attached or used, shall cause the same to be emptied at least once a week, or as often as the Inspector may direct.

5. The owner or occupier of such premises shall, after notice from the Inspector, and within the time limited in such notice, replace by a new and approved receptacle any receptacle that the Inspector may deem worn out or unfit for use.

BY-LAW No. 28.

Ecceptacles to be kept in an inoffensive condition.

All receptacles required by "The Health Act, 1898," or under these By-laws, shall be kept in an inoffensive con-dition by the householder or occupier.

BY-LAW No. 29.

Regulating the removal of offensive matter.

person who shall convey any dust, mud, ashes, Every rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected, placed, or found in or about any house, stable, cow-house, plasty, lane, yard, street, or place whatsoever, through or along any street or lane, shall, previous to and during the whole time of such conveyance, cause such dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected to be covered with lime or suitable substance, or shall adopt such other precautions as respectively may be necessary to prevent the emission of noxious or offensive odour or effluvia therefrom; and the same shall not be deposited in any place within the district other than the place set apart by the Local Board for that purpose

BY-LAW No, 30.

Regulating the disposal of the carcases of dead animals.

In the event of death or any accident necessitating the slaughter of any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animal, the carcase of such animal shall be removed to a safe distance beyond the Municipality or Townsite, or to such place as the Local Board may direct, and there thoroughly burned and destroyed or buried to the satisfaction of the Inspector, by the owner or person in charge of such animal, as the case may be."

BY-LAW No. 31.

Regulating the burning of offal and other offensive matter.

No person shall burn any offal, rags, clippings or parings of leather, or any offensive matter so as to be offensive to any person or resident in the neighbourhood of such burning.

BY-LAW No. 32.

Regulating the removal of slops.

1. Any person who shall be ordered by the Local Board or its Inspectors shall provide and maintain proper water-tight vehicles or receptacles fitting with close-fitting covers or lids for the purpose of carting or receiving any slops or suds, house refuse, waste, or other matter or substance used in any laundry which is likely to become a nuisance or offensive by reason of exposure.

2. All such vehicles or receptacles shall be kept in such convenient places so as to be readily removed as may be directed by the Inspector, so as not to be a nuisance to any person, and shall be kept in a thoroughly sanitary condition and removed at least once a week and cleansed and disinfected both inside and out.

BY-LAW No. 33.

Regulating the deposit of offensive liquid, etc.

No foul or offensive water, or other offensive liquid, and no garbage, sweepings, or other offensive matter or thing, shall be pumped, emptied, swept, thrown, or otherwise discharged or deposited into or upon any street, lane, yard, vacant land, or other place, whether public or private, within the district other than the place set apart by the Local Board for that purpose.

BY-LAW No, 34.

Restricting Contracts.

No individual householder shall contract for the removal of nightsoil or any other refuse or offensive matter whatever, except with the person licensed by the Local Board, and in accordance with these By-laws.

BY-LAW No 35.

Regulating the carrying off of storm or rain water.

Every owner shall cause all buildings to be provided with spoutings, downpipes, and drains sufficient to carry off all storm or rain water.

BY-LAW No. 36.

Penalties.

Any person guilty of any offence against any of these By-laws, not otherwise specially provided for, shall be liable for every such offence, besides any costs or expenses that for every such offence, besides any costs or expenses that may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person, as well as any costs and expenses which may be incurred in remedying such default, as provided for in "The Health Act, 1898" (Sections 35 and 242), or these By-laws, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £10, and to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £5 for each day during which such offence shall be continued; and such penalty or excelling shall be recovered as provided in the said Act. penalties shall be recovered as provided in the said Act : Provided always, that no penalty imposed hereunder shall be less than 5s.

CAVES TO BE OPEN.

1. The caves within these reserves will be open for inspection daily between 8 a.m. and 10 p.m., provided visitors give the caretakers reasonable notice of the time they intend to visit them.

INJURING OR DESTROYING TREES.

4. No person shall injure, cut, break, deface, pull up, pick, remove, or destroy any tree, shrub, plant, or flower growing on the said Reserves.

INJURING OR DISFIGURING CAVES.

5. No person shall break, remove, injure, or deface by writing or marking, or in any way damage any rock, stalactite, or stalagmite, or remove any rock, stalactite, or stalagmite. or in any way injure, damage, or disfigure the stairways, ladders, cave gates, railings, seats, fences, buildings, machinery, lighting appliances, or other structures or improvements within any cave or upon any cave reserve.

INJURING THE SOIL OR SURFACE, OR DESTROYING BIRDS OR ANIMALS.

6. No person shall cut up, damage, or disfigure, or interfere with the soil, or rocks, or turf, or surface of the caves' reserves, or the roads or footways across, around, or over the same, or pollute or interfere with any water thereon, interfere with or destroy any birds or animals thereon in any manner whatsoever.

VISITORS TO ACT IN OBEDIENCE TO INSTRUCTIONS OF CARETAKER.

7. Every visitor to the reserves or caves therein shall act in obedience to the instructions of the Caretaker, whilst being shown through or over any cave or caves.

PERSONS MISCONDUCTING THEMSELVES.

8. No person or persons shall misconduct themselves in any way by indulging in riotous or indecent conduct, or make use of any indecent or improper language, or commit any nuisance on or within the said reserves and caves.

CARETAKER MAY REMOVE ANY PERSON GUILTY OF IMPROPER CONDUCT.
