WHEREAS by "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1902" (1 and 2 Edward VII., No. 20), the Governor may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, after the opinion of the Road Board of the District has been requested, close any road or reservation for a road which may have been surveyed or shown as a road on any plan published by the Department of Lands and Surveys: Provided such road is not within the limit of a Municipality or Townsite, and has not been declared a Government road or a road under "The Roads Act," or any Act amending the same: AND WHEREAS the road hereinafter described has been surveyed and shown as a road on the plan of the survey of C.P. 49/1590 as published by the Department of Lands and Surveys: AND it is desirable to close such road: AND WHEREAS the opinion of the Brunswick Road Board has been requested: NOW THEREFORE I, Sir EDWARD ALBERT STONE, Knight, Administrator as aforesaid, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the said surveyed road to be closed.

The surveyed road running between C.Ps. 47/486 and 49/1590 (948).

CENTRAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1898.

BY-LAWS.

WHEREAS by Section 33 of "The Health Act, 1898," the Central Board of Health may from time to time make, alter, or revoke By-laws as therein provided: Now, therefore, the Central Board of Health revokes the By-laws published in the *Government Gazette* of 22nd September, 1899, and hereby makes the following By-laws, which shall come into force from the date of publication in the *Government Gazette*:—

I.—INTERPRETATION.

1. The interpretation of words used in these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, shall be in accordance with Section 3 of "The Health Act, 1898."

The following words in these By-laws shall be interpreted as follows, viz.:—

- (a.) "Cowshed" means any building or premises in which milking cows or goats may be kept.
- (b.) "Cowkeeper" means any person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk.

II.—FOR THE INSPECTION OF ALL DAIRY FARMS AND MILK STORES.

1. Every cowkeeper or occupier of a dairy farm or milk store, and which the Officer of Health or Inspector may visit for the purpose of inspection, and every person for the time being having the care or control of any such dairy farm or milk store, shall afford such Officer of Health or Inspector all reasonable assistance that may, for the purpose of inspection, be required of him.

III.—FOR THE INSPECTION OF GRAZING GROUND OF DAIRY CATTLE, AND FOR PROHIBITING THE USE OF THE SAME IF LIKELY TO BE PREJUDICIAL TO HEALTH BY AFFECTING THE MILK OR OTHERWISE.

1. Every cowkeeper or occupier of a dairy, or any person in charge of any dairy, and which may be visited by an Officer of Health or Inspector for the purpose of ascertaining the position of and inspecting the grazing ground upon which his dairy cattle may be depastured, shall afford such Officer of Health or Inspector all reasonable assistance that may be required of him for such inspection.

2. Every cowkeeper shall, upon being directed so to do by any Medical Officer of Health, forthwith remove his milking cows from any portion of the grazing land upon which they may be depasturing, if such grazing ground has been found or suspected or is likely to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk of the cows.

- (a.) He shall not, until permission in writing is given him by such Medical Officer of Health, permit or suffer any of his dairy cattle to graze or be depastured upon such prohibited land.

IV.—FOR THE INSPECTION OF CATTLE IN DAIRIES, AND FOR PRESCRIBING AND REGULATING THE LIGHTING, VENTILATION, CLEANSING, DRAINAGE, AND WATER SUPPLIES OF HOUSES, DAIRIES, AND COWSHEDS IN THE OCCUPATION OF PERSONS FOLLOWING THE TRADE OF COWKEEPERS OR DAIRYMEN.

1. Every cowkeeper or occupier of a dairy, or any person in charge of any dairy, and which any Officer of Health or Inspector may visit for the purpose of inspecting any cattle therein, shall afford such Officer of Health or Inspector all reasonable assistance that may, for the purpose of inspection, be required of him.

Lighting and Ventilation.

2. In enclosed sheds, windows or openings placed in the walls or roofs at equal distances shall be provided, and the area of such windows or openings shall be at the rate of not less than one square foot to seven feet of the floor area of such shed, and no obstruction to natural light shall be permitted or suffered to be placed opposite or near to any of such openings or windows.

- (a.) Every enclosed cowshed shall be provided with lantern louvred ventilators in roof or louvred ventilators in the sides thereof.
- (b.) A cowkeeper shall not cause or allow any cowshed in his occupation to be occupied by a larger number of cows than will have not less than 800 cubic feet of air space for each cow: Provided as follows:—In calculating the air space for the purpose of this By-law, no space shall be reckoned which is more than 16 feet above the floor, but if the roof or ceiling is inclined, then the mean height of the same above the floor may be taken as the height thereof for the purpose of this By-law.

Cleansing.

3. Every cowkeeper shall cause every part of the interior of every cowshed in his occupation to be thoroughly cleansed from time to time, as often as may be necessary to secure that such cowshed shall be at all times reasonably clean and sweet.

- (a.) Such person shall cause the ceiling or interior of the roof and the walls of every cowshed in his occupation to be properly lime-washed at least four times in every year, that is to say—once during the months of April, July, October, and January, and at such other times as may be necessary: Provided that this requirement shall not apply to any part of such ceiling, roof, or walls that may be properly painted or varnished, or constructed of or covered with any material such as to render the lime-washing unsuitable or inexpedient, and that may be otherwise properly cleansed.
- (b.) He shall cause the floor of every cowshed to be thoroughly swept, and all dung and other offensive matter to be removed from such cowshed immediately after each milking.

- (c.) He shall cause every stockyard to be kept in a cleanly condition, and shall from time to time, as often as may be necessary, collect and remove all dung or other offensive matters from such stockyard.

Drainage.

4. For the purpose of efficient drainage, the floors of all cowsheds shall be absolutely watertight, and shall have an even surface and solid foundation. Such floors may either be constructed of hard burnt bricks on edge, of equal quality, laid in cement mortar and grouted in cement or Portland cement concrete, having a thickness of at least 6in., or some similar material, and the floor shall have a fall to the gutter of not less than one in 36.

A surface gutter shall be constructed of some durable impervious material, and shall extend the whole length of the building, and shall not be less than 12in. in width, and shall be thoroughly watertight, of sufficient and uniform fall, shallow at its upper extremity and gradually deepening to the outlet, so that no fluid may lodge or stagnate therein. It shall not be less than 3in. deep at its upper extremity, nor more than 9in. at its outlet. Such surface gutter shall empty into a watertight receptacle capable of being easily emptied and readily and thoroughly cleansed.

- (a.) He shall not cause or suffer any inlet to any drain of such cowshed to be within such cowshed.
- (b.) He shall cause every stockyard used by him to be well drained.

Water Supply.

5. Every cowkeeper shall keep in or in connection with every cowshed in his occupation a supply of water suitable and sufficient for all such purposes as may from time to time be reasonably necessary.

- (a.) He shall cause any such receptacle which may be provided for such water to be emptied and thoroughly cleansed from time to time, as often as may be necessary to prevent the pollution of any water that may be stored therein, and where such receptacle is used for the storage only of water, he shall cause it to be properly covered and ventilated, and so placed as to be at all times readily accessible.
- (b.) If the water used for such purposes is obtained from a well, spring, stream, or other source of supply, he shall adopt every precaution to prevent any such source of supply being polluted.
- (c.) He shall, when directed to do so by the Local Board of Health, forthwith discontinue using the water for any purpose from any such source of supply, and shall forthwith obtain another supply of water from a source to be approved by such Inspector.
- (d.) He shall, for the purpose of testing the purity or otherwise of the water used by him, assist and permit an Inspector, when so required, to obtain the necessary samples of such water for analysis.

V.—FOR PRESCRIBING THE PRECAUTIONS TO BE TAKEN FOR PROTECTING MILK AGAINST INFECTION OR CONTAMINATION.

1. Every cowkeeper shall cause the two or three jets of milk first drawn at every milking from each teat of any cow milked on his premises to be rejected, and shall not permit or suffer such milk to fall into the milking pail or be mixed into the milk intended for sale.

- (a.) Such cowkeeper shall not cause or suffer any cow belonging to him or under his care or control to be milked for the purpose of obtaining milk for sale, unless at the time of milking the udder and teats of such cow are thoroughly clean, and unless the hands of the person milking such cow are thoroughly clean and free from all infection or contamination.
- (b.) He shall not suffer or permit any milk from a diseased cow to be mixed with other milk, or sold for human consumption.
- (c.) He shall not permit or suffer any milk from a diseased cow to be used as food for pigs or other animals unless it has been well boiled.
- (d.) He shall not permit any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or recently in contact with or in attendance upon any other person so suffering, to milk any cow or handle any vessel used for containing milk, or take part in the preparation, storage, or distribution of any milk produced on his premises.

- (e.) He shall cause the milk drawn from any cow on his premises (except as hereinbefore mentioned) to be forthwith taken to the milk room and there run through a suitable strainer and cooler.
2. Every cowkeeper, purveyor of milk, or person selling milk by retail, shall take all reasonable and proper precautions in and in connection with the storage and distribution of the milk, and otherwise to prevent the exposure of the milk to any infection or contamination.
- (a.) He shall not deposit or keep any milk intended for sale, or any of the milk vessels used in his trade—
1. In any room or place where it or they would be liable to become infected or contaminated by impure air or by any offensive, noxious, or deleterious gas or substance, or by any noxious or injurious emanation, exhalation, or effluvia; or
 2. In any room used as a kitchen, or as a living room; or
 3. In any room or building or part of a building communicating directly by door, window, or otherwise with any room used as a sleeping room, or in which there may be any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or which may have been used by any person suffering from any such disease and may not have been properly disinfected; or
 4. In any room or building or part of a building in which there may be any direct inlet to any drain.
- (b.) He shall not keep milk for sale, or cause or suffer any milk to be placed in any vessel, receptacle, or utensil which is not thoroughly clean.
- (c.) He shall cause every vessel, receptacle, or utensil used by him for containing milk for sale to be thoroughly cleansed with steam or clean boiling water after it shall have been used, and to be maintained in a constant state of cleanliness.
- (d.) He shall cause every wheeled vehicle used by him for the carriage or distribution of the milk to be thoroughly cleansed at least once in every day.
- (e.) He shall cause all pans and other receptacles used by him in the carriage of milk to be furnished with closely fitting lids, and he shall not suffer or permit any rag, cloth, or other material to be used with any such lid.
- (f.) He shall cause all vessels, utensils, receptacles, coolers, or any article used by him to contain milk to be properly tinned or enamelled and maintained at all times in thorough repair.
3. No cowkeeper, purveyor of milk, or occupier of any milk store or milk shop shall store or keep any vessels, utensils, receptacles, coolers, or any article used to contain milk within 100 feet of a piggery or other offensive trade establishment.
4. No cowkeeper, purveyor of milk, or occupier of a milk store or milk shop shall permit or suffer any dog, cat, fowl, or other animal to have access to the milk, milk room, or milking shed.
- (a.) He shall not suffer or permit any cesspit for the reception of nightsoil to remain upon his premises.
- (b.) He shall provide a sufficient number of privies, furnished with approved movable receptacles for nightsoil, for the use of persons residing or working upon his premises; and shall daily collect, remove, and dispose of all excrementitious matter, refuse, noxious, or offensive matters produced upon his premises, as he may from time to time be directed by an Inspector.
- (c.) He shall not suffer or permit to be erected or constructed or to remain any fowl house, cess-pool, manure shed, privy, or urinal within a distance of 50 feet of any milking shed, milk room, or place where milk is stored or kept.
5. Every cowkeeper shall provide sufficient stabling accommodation for the horses employed by him in connection with his trade, and such stabling shall be disconnected from, and be at least 50 feet from, the milking shed and milk room.
- (a.) He shall not suffer, or permit any horse, or other draught animal to be at any time stabled in his milking shed.

6. No cowkeeper shall permit any brewers' grain to be kept or stored within 50 feet of any milking shed or milk store.

7. Every cowkeeper shall—

- (a.) Provide on his dairy premises a detached room to be used for separating, straining, cooling, or storing milk, or for storing vessels or utensils used by him for containing milk when such vessels or utensils are not in actual use in the collecting or distribution of the milk.
- (b.) Such cowkeeper shall cause such room to be constructed at least forty feet distant from any cowshed or stable or other possible source of contamination, and at least 100 feet from any piggery.
- (c.) He shall cause such room to be sufficiently ventilated, and shall cause all external openings to be fitted with fly-proof screens constructed of suitable materials.
- (d.) He shall cause the floor of such room to be paved with flagstones, concrete, or other non-absorbent material properly set in cement.
- (e.) He shall cause the internal wall surface to be covered with hard, smooth, and impervious material to a height of at least six feet from the floor, and such hard, smooth, and impervious material shall not be covered with cement-wash, lime-wash, or other substance.
- (f.) He shall provide suitable apparatus for heating water in close proximity to such room.
- (g.) He shall not permit or suffer any such apparatus for heating water to be used for washing or boiling bed or body linen, or for any other purpose which might cause contamination or infection of milk.
- (h.) He shall not suffer or permit such room to be used for any other purpose except for the manipulation or storage of milk, or the storage of milk vessels.
- (i.) He shall at all times maintain such room in good order and repair, dust and fly proof, and scrupulously clean in every part, externally as well as internally, and in all its fittings.
- (j.) He shall not suffer or permit any dog, fowl, or other animal to have access to such room.

Cleansing Utensils.

8. Every cowkeeper shall, from time to time, as often as may be necessary, cause every milk vessel that may be used by him for containing milk for sale to be thoroughly cleansed with steam or clean boiling water, and shall otherwise take all proper precautions for the maintenance of such milk vessels in a constant state of cleanliness.

- (a.) He shall on every occasion when any such vessel shall have been used to contain milk, or shall have been returned to him after having been out of his possession, cause such vessel to be forthwith recleansed with steam or clean boiling water.

Reporting Cases of Infectious Diseases.

9. Whenever any infectious or contagious disease occurs in any house or premises in the occupation of a cowkeeper or purveyor of milk, the occupier of such house or premises shall immediately report such occurrence to the Local or District Board of Health.

VI.—FOR DESTROYING OR REMOVING FROM ANY DAIRY, MILK STORE, OR MILK SHOP, OR MILK YARD ANY DISEASED COW OR OTHER ANIMALS, AND FOR REMOVING ANY SICK PERSONS FROM THE PREMISES OF ANY SUCH DAIRY, MILK STORE, MILK SHOP, OR MILK YARD.

1. Every cowkeeper shall cause every cow or other animal deemed to be infected at the time being in his care or under his control to be isolated or removed from all possible contact with other dairy cattle, upon being directed so to do by an Inspector.

2. He shall also cause any such cow or other animal to be destroyed forthwith upon receipt of an order from the Local or District Board of Health to that effect; and he shall also cause such cow or other animal to be destroyed in the manner specified in such order.

Removal of Sick.

3. Every cowkeeper or purveyor of milk shall, when ordered to do so by the Local or District Board of Health, forthwith remove from the premises of any dairy, milk store, milk shop, or milk yard any sick person that may be therein.

VII.—PENALTIES.

Any person guilty of any breach of any of the foregoing By-laws is liable for every such offence, besides any costs or expenses which may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person guilty of such offence, as well as any costs or expenses which may be incurred in remedying such default, as particularly provided for in the Act, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Twenty pounds, and to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Twenty shillings for each day during which such offence is continued by such person. BY-LAWS FOR THE LICENSING OF PLUMBERS.

1. In these By-laws the terms used are to be interpreted by the meanings given by Section 2 of the Act.
2. No person shall affix, alter, or repair any service pipe or fitting to be used in connection with any main or other pipe belonging to the waterworks, or interfere in any way therewith, unless licensed as a plumber under these By-laws; but this By-law shall not prevent the employment by a licensed plumber of competent assistants working under his immediate and personal direction.
3. An application for a license shall be in writing, signed by the applicant and addressed to the Minister for Works.
4. The applicant shall satisfy the Minister that he is a competent plumber, and may be required to submit to an examination in the theory and practice of plumbing work.
5. Every license shall be granted by the Minister; and the granting and cancellation of any license shall be in the absolute discretion of the Minister.
6. Every license shall be an annual license, expiring on the Tenth day of January next following the granting thereof, and may be in the Form A in the Schedule.
7. A fee of Ten shillings shall be payable for every license, except when a license is granted after the Tenth day of July in any year, in which case the fee shall be Five shillings.
8. Every applicant shall, before receiving a license deposit with the Minister the sum of Five pounds, to be held by the Minister, during the currency of the license, as security for the proper performance of all work undertaken by the licensee.
9. The Minister may deduct from such deposit the expense of making good any bad work of the licensed plumber or his workmen; and as often as any expense is so deducted, the licensed plumber shall make good the deposit to the sum of Five pounds, and in default his license will be cancelled.
10. Every licensed plumber shall, within forty-eight hours of any change in his address, as stated in his license, give notice, in writing, thereof to the Minister.
11. The mains shall be tapped only by the workmen of the Minister.

12. No licensed plumber shall interfere with any pipe or fitting belonging to the waterworks without the permission, in writing, of an officer appointed by the Minister under these By-laws first obtained.

13. No ground shall be opened, nor shall any work be undertaken by a licensed plumber for the purpose of laying and fixing a new service or fittings, or in the extension or alteration of an existing service or fittings, until notice shall have been given by such licensed plumber to an officer appointed by the Minister under these regulations. Such notice shall be in writing, in the Form B. in the Schedule, and shall describe the nature and extent of the proposed work, and shall be given forty-eight hours at least before the work is intended to be commenced, unless the officer expressly accepts shorter notice.

14. On the completion or extension of any service the licensed plumber shall report the work to an officer as ready for inspection.

15. In no case shall the ground be filled in, or water be turned on to any land, until the work executed by the licensed plumber has been examined and passed by an officer, and a certificate in writing has been given by such officer to that effect.

16. No person shall be deemed an officer within the meaning of these By-laws unless his appointment for the purposes of these By-laws is in writing under the hand of the Minister, and has been notified in the *Government Gazette*.

17. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

6. Section fifty-seven of the principal Act shall not extend to prevent the lawful employment, by any person holding a publican's general license, of an aboriginal native on the licensed premises of such person, with the consent in writing of the Chief Protector of Aborigines first obtained.

Who is to be deemed an aboriginal native. See 50 Vict., No. 25, sec. 45.

7. Every aboriginal native of Australia, and every aboriginal half caste or child of a half-caste (such half-caste or child habitually associating and living with aboriginal natives), shall be deemed to be an aboriginal native within the meaning of the principal Act, and the Justices adjudicating upon any complaint may, in the absence of other sufficient evidence, decide on their own view and judgment whether any person, with reference to whom any proceedings are taken under the Act, is or is not an aboriginal native.
