ABOLITION OF PILOT STATION AT ROTTNEST ISLAND
(PORT OF FREMANTLE).

The Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners, with the concurrence of the Hon. The Colonial Secretary, hereby notify, for general information and guidance of persons using the Port of Fremantle, that on and after the First day of August next (1st August, 1903), the Pilot Establishment hitherto existing at Rottneest Island, will be discontinued, and that the Pilot Service of the Port of Fremantle will thenceforward be worked from Fremantle.

The Pilot Station at Fremantle will be worked as a Shore Station, provided with a steam pilot boat, launch, and sailing lugger.

Rottneest Island is connected with Fremantle by telephone, and vessels bound for Fremantle will, on making Rottneest Island and requiring a Pilot, signal for same to the Signal Station situated at the main Lighthouse on the Island, and on this signal being made out it will be reported to the Pilot Station at Fremantle, whence Pilots will be despatched as required to board incoming vessels at the Pilot Boarding Ground (which is situated about five miles East of Bathurst Point, on Rottneest, as shown on new issues of Chart No. 1058).

Shipmasters are warned not to approach Rottneest nearer than three (3) miles, and to always pass in North of the Island and stand to the Eastward till Fremantle Time Ball Tower (Arthur Head) bears S.E. (Mag.), then steer S.E. towards Boarding Ground.

Sailing vessels working to the Southward with a head wind when East of Rottneest, not to stand closer than three miles to Rottneest Island for mainland.

When approaching Rottneest in the winter months, sailing vessels must guard against getting embayed South of the Island, as the winter gales generally commence at North with a falling barometer, and rapidly veer to the Westward.

Do not, under any circumstances whatever, heave to North, West, or South of Rottneest, but proceed to Pilot Boarding Ground.

At night, after picking up the Woodman's Point Leading Light stand East, through the Red and into the Bright Sector steer to the S.E. towards Boarding Ground, taking care to keep in Bright Bay.

The South Passage at Rottneest is on no account to be attempted except by vessels whose Masters hold Pilotage Exemption Certificates.

1. Whenever land is proclaimed open to selection under, Section 11 of "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1896," applications may be made for any allotment thereof at such place and between such dates as may be fixed by the proclamation.

2. Every application shall be in the Form A in the Schedule, and shall be deemed to have been received on the last day of the period during which applications may be made.

3. Every applicant shall make a statutory declaration in the Form B in the Schedule, with such alterations as the Minister may approve. Such declaration shall be made before a Justice of the Peace, the Under Secretary for Lands, or an agent duly appointed by the Minister for Lands.

4. The application and declaration must be enclosed in a sealed envelope, endorsed "Application for land in theEstate," and delivered or sent by post to the officer appointed to receive the same.

5. A deposit at the rate of £7 12s. 10d. for each One hundred pounds of the selling price of the allotment, as fixed by the Governor, shall be made with the application.

NOTE.—Contractors' plant includes tools, tackle, stores (other than groceries and provisions), chaff and material necessary for carrying out the work. Live stock and explosives will not be conveyed at above rates. The rates will apply only to Contractors' plant used for constructing a Government railway sent to the station nearest to the line to be constructed, and will be allowed on return trip when sent from new line to one station, only not distant more than the original mileage conveyed on outward journey.

Government Railway Contractors' Trains.—The Commissioner may, at his discretion, allow Government Railway Contractors' trains to be run over the lines, and, in the

event of permission being granted, the following will be the rates and conditions:—

An engine, light, 1s. 6d. per mile, under steam; minimum, 50s.

A train of ten wagons, ballast or material—Contractors' own engine, trucks and men—or haulage of a dead engine, 2s. 6d. per mile; minimum, 50s. per train. Ballast or material trains are not charged for the return journey empty.

A train of contractors' empty wagons, Department finding engine and men, 5s. per mile; minimum, 50s. per train.

A train of ten contractors' wagons with material for their own contract, Department finding engine and men, 7s. 6d. per mile; minimum, 50s. per train.

Contractors' empty wagons attached to ordinary goods trains, 3d. per truck per mile; minimum, 5s. each.

Contractors' wagons cannot be sent by ordinary goods trains unless provided with spring buffers.

Special Conditions.—All engines, wagons, etc., must be examined and passed by the Chief Mechanical Engineer before being allowed to run, and all expenses thereby incurred, together with freight, pilotage, and any other Departmental charge, must be paid in advance. In order to avoid unnecessary delay, where the amount of such expenses and charges cannot be definitely ascertained before running, a deposit equal to the estimated amount must be made, and any undercharge or overcharge adjusted when the correct amount has been determined.

Contractors' men in charge of engines or trains must give satisfactory proof of their knowledge of the line, and general fitness, before being permitted to run.

The Department finds pilots in all cases, whose wages and expenses are to be paid by Contractors.

GOVERNMENT RAILWAY CONTRACTORS—USE OF
WAGONS, ETC.

The charge for trucks loaded with material previously conveyed by rail taken by Contractors for new lines under construction from the junction of the new line with the main line to the head of the road will be 5s. per truck per trip, if the distance exceeds one mile. No charge is made for distances not exceeding one mile.

The foregoing rates are contingent on the trucks being hauled by Contractors' engine from the place material is deliverable at by the Commissioner, according to contract, and provided the empty trucks are returned within twelve working hours; if not returned within twelve working hours, 1s. per truck per hour, or 4s. per working day, demurrage to be charged.

Government trucks will not be allowed to be loaded for traffic from point to point on the construction line except under special arrangement with the Commissioner.

* For the first time means of previous years are taken between 1897 (when the Meteorological service was re-organised), and 1902 (inclusive). All observations prior to 1897 have been rejected, except in the case of the Perth Botanical Gardens.

This was the coolest March on record in Perth. The mean of the daily maxima was only 76.8° at the Observatory and 79.3° in the Perth Botanical Gardens, or about 5° below the average for previous years. At the Observatory it was lower even than in Melbourne, where, however, it happened to be warmer than usual. It will be interesting to remember that last March was one of the hottest ever experienced.

The temperature was below the average almost throughout the entire State, except in the far North, especially the interior, where Marble Bar recorded a mean maximum of 104.0° and Nullagine 101.0°, the average for previous years at the latter place being only 93.9°.

The rainfall was very light throughout the greater portion of the State. It was about an average on the South coast. In the tropics it was very patchy, some places, especially near Cossack, receiving an unusually heavy downpour, whilst others had scarcely any.

ROADS ACT, 1902.

PHILLIPS RIVER ROADS BOARD.

BY-LAWS UNDER "THE ROADS ACT, 1902," FOR CONTROL OF CORDINGUP TANK AND OTHER WATER SUPPLIES UNDER THE BOARD'S CONTROL.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws by virtue of Section 117 of "The Roads Act, 1902," 2^d Edwardi VII., No. 48:—

1. No person shall bathe in any tank, spring, or other water situate within any reserve specially set apart for purpose of water supply.

2. No person shall encamp upon any land specially set apart for purpose of water supply, or permit any animal to remain on such land any longer than is necessary for the purpose of taking water.

3. No person shall bring or deposit into or upon any reserve specially set apart for purpose of water supply any rubbish, dirt, filth, or other noisome thing, or wash or cleanse within any such reserve any cloth, wool, leather, or skin of any animal, or any other material or thing whatsoever.

4. Any person who shall cause or permit the water from any mining shaft, or of any sink, sewer, drain, or cesspit or other filthy water to find its way into any stream, catchment, tank, reservoir, dam, lake, lagoon, soak, spring, or other water situate within any such reserve aforesaid, or shall do any act or thing whereby the water shall be fouled, shall, for each such offence, be liable to the penalty imposed by these Regulations.

5. The Board may at any time restrict the water in any of the dams, tanks, etc., for human consumption only, by affixing a notice to that effect in a conspicuous place at the dam or tank in question.

6. The following charge will be made for water at the Cordingup Tank:—

(a.) Horses and cattle, 6d. per head per drink.

(b.) Sheep and goats, 1d. per head per drink.

(c.) Other water supplied will be charged for at the rate of 2s. 6d. per 100 gallons, up to 200 gallons; over 200 gallons, at the rate of 4s. per 100 gallons.

7. Any person offending against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall be liable, on conviction before one or more Justices of the Peace, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).
