ABOLITION OF PILOT STATION AT ROTTNEST ISLAND (PORT OF FREMANTLE).

(Port of Fremantle).

The Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners, with the concurrence of the Hon. The Colonial Secretary, hereby notify, for general information and guidance of persons using the Port of Fremantle, that on and after the First day of August next (1st August, 1903), the Pilot Establishment hitherto existing at Rottnest Island, will be discontinued, and that the Pilot Service of the Port of Fremantle will thenceforward be worked from Fremantle.

The Pilot Station at Fremantle will be worked as a Shore Station, provided with a steam pilot boat, launch, and sailing lugger.

Rottnest Island is connected with Fremantle by telephone, and vessels bound for Fremantle will, on making Rottnest Island and requiring a Pilot, signal for same to the Signal Station situated at the main Lighthouse on the Island, and on this signal being made out it will be reported to the Pilot Station at Fremantle, whence Pilots will be despatched as required to board incoming vessels at the Pilot Boarding Ground (which is situated about five miles East of Bathurst Point, on Rottnest, as shown on new issues of Chart No. 1058).

Shipmasters are warned not to approach Rottnest nearer than three (3) miles, and to always pass in North of the Island and stand to the Eastward till Fremantle Time Ball Tower (Arthur Head) bears S.E. (Mag.), then steer S.E. towards Boarding Ground.

Sailing vessels working to the Southward with a head wind when East of Rottnest, not to stand closer than three miles to Rottnest Island for mainland.

When approaching Rottnest in the winter months, sailing vessels

mainland. When approaching Rottnest in the winter months, sailing vessels must guard against getting embayed South of the Island, as the winter gales generally commence at North with a falling barometer, and rapidly veer to the Westward.

Do not, under any circumstances whatever, heave to North, West, or South of Rottnest, but proceed to Pilot Boarding Ground.

At night, after picking up the Woodman's Point Leading Light stand East, through the Red and into the Bright Sector steer to the S.E. towards Boarding Ground, taking care to keep in Bright Ray. The South Passage at Rottnest is on no account to be attempted except by vessels whose Masters hold Pilotage Exemption Certificates.

- 2. Every application shall be in the Form A in the Schedule, and shall be deemed to have been received on the last day of the period during which applications may be
- 3. Every applicant shall make a statutory declaration in the Form B in the Schedule, with such alterations as the Minister may approve. Such declaration shall be made before a Justice of the Peace, the Under Secretary for Lands, or an agent duly appointed by the Minister for
- 4. The application and declaration must be enclosed in a sealed envelope, endorsed "Application for land in the ......Estate," and delivered or sent by post to the officer appointed to receive the same.
- 5. A deposit at the rate of £7 12s. 10d, for each One hundred pounds of the selling price of the allotment, as fixed by the Governor, shall be made with the application.

This was the coolest March on record in Perth. The mean of the daily maxima was only 76.8 at the Observatory and 79.3 in the Perth Botanical Gardens, or about 5° below the average for previous years. At the Observatory it was lower even than in Melbourne, where, however, it happened to be warmer than usual. It will be interesting to remember that last March was one of the bottest ever experienced.

The temperature was below the average almost throughout the entire State, except in the far North, especially the interior, where Marble Bar recorded a mean maximum of 1040 and Nullagine 1010, the average for previous years at the latter place being only 93.9

The rainfall was very light throughout the greater portion of the State. It was about an average on the South coast. In the tropics it was very patchy, some places, especially near Cossack, receiving an unusually heavy downpour, whilst others had scarcely any.

## ROADS ACT, 1902. PHILLIPS RIVER ROADS BOARD.

By-laws under "The Roads Act, 1902," for control of Cordingup Tank and other Water Supplies under THE BOARD'S CONTROL.

Is Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws by virtue of Section 117 of "The Roads Act, 1902," 2° Edwardi VII.,

- 1. No person shall bathe in any tank, spring, or other water situate within any reserve specially set apart for purpose of water supply.
- No person shall encamp upon any land specially set apart for purpose of water supply, or permit any animal to remain on such land any longer than is necessary for the purpose of taking water.
- 3. No person shall bring or deposit into or upon any reserve specially set apart for purpose of water supply any rubbish, dirt, filth, or other noisome thing, or wash or cleanse within any such reserve any cloth, wool, leather, or skin of any animal, or any other material or thing whatsoever.
- 4. Any person who shall cause or permit the water from any mining shaft, or of any sink, sewer, drain, or cesspit or other filthy water to find its way into any stream, catchment, tank, reservoir, dam, lake, lagoon, soak, spring, or other water situate within any such reserve aforesaid, or shall do any act or thing whereby the water shall be fouled, shall, for each such offence, be liable to the penalty imposed by these Regulations.

- 5. The Board may at any time restrict the water in any of the dams, tanks, etc., for human consumption only, by affixing a notice to that effect in a conspicuous place at the dam or tank in question.
- 6. The following charge will be made for water at the Cordingup Tank :-
  - (a.) Horses and cattle, 6d. per head per drink.
  - (b.) Sheep and goats, 1d. per head per drink.
  - (c.) Other water supplied will be charged for at the rate of 2s. 6d, per 100 gallons, up to 200 gallons; over 200 gallons, at the rate of 4s. per 100 gallons.
- Any person offending against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall be liable, on conviction before one or more Justices of the Peace, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20)
