HEREAS by "The Fishery Act, 1889" (53rd Vict., No. 47), the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to prescribe limits within which it shall not be lawful to fish by means of any net or fixed engine, and to determine the times and seasons at which the taking and to determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease: And whereas it is deemed expedient that it shall not be lawful to fish by means of any net or fixed engine within that portion of Champion Bay hereinafter described: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine in-

That portion of the ocean waters extending from a point 200 yards to the East of the Geraldton Railway Jetty, to a point 200 yards to the West of the Geraldton Esplanade Jetty, and half a mile seaward,

Every person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds sterling (£20), and shall forfeit the instruments used and all fish that shall have been taken.

HEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserves \bigwedge_{2681} and \bigwedge_{2682} ("Park Lands," Albany) should be placed under the control of the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Albany as a Board of Management: Now. THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserves under the control of the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Albany as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserves, for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon, for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate. The Government to retain the right to utilise any portion of the Reserves that may be required for "public purposes."

BERTHING DUES.

All vessels moored in the Inner Harbour, and transhipping into lighters or other vessels cargo not intended to be landed on any of the wharves or jetties vested in the Trust, shall pay to the Trust the same berthing dues as though they were occupying a berth at such wharves or jetties.

WHARFAGE.

No cattle or merchandise of any kind shall, without the permission of the Secretary, be landed or shipped within the Port at any place other than the wharves or jetties vested in the Trust; and in respect of all cattle or merchandise landed or shipped under such permission, the same charges shall be enforced as though the same had been landed or shipped at such wharves or jetties as aforesaid.

TRANSHIPMENT OF CARGO.

On all goods transhipped from vessels moored in the Inner Harbour into lighters or other vessels, the same charges per ton will be enforced as though the said goods were transhipped from vessels occupying berths at any of the wharves or jetties vested in the Trust.
