 As an appliance for the herein described game a winning turnstile or roulette consisting of a lower circular piece or disc having eight numbered cups in its surface and a vertical pivot pin at its centre, combined with and supporting a loose boss piece carrying eight radial spokes furnished with end rubber buffers and with the surface between the spokes of different colours and numbered to correspond with said cups substantially as described and illustated.
 As an appliance for the herein described game a half-way turnstile consisting of a lower circular piece or disc having an annular recess formed in its surface and a vertical pivot pin at its centre combined with and supporting a loose boss piece having eight radial spokes furnished with end rubber buffers and with the surface between the spokes of different colours or similar to that of the roulette sub-stantially as described and illustrated.
 As an appliance for the herein described game, an arch consisting of two flanged posts connected together loosely by an arched or curved wire substantially as described and illustrated.

As an appliance for the herein described game, a bridge consisting of two side checks or plates inclined both ways, connected together by cross bars, substantially as described and illustrated.


