TO PETER WHITINGTON, Esq., AND DR. ERNEST BLACK:

W HEREAS by his Commission bearing date the 11th day of June, 1902, His Excellency the Honourable Sir ARTHUR LAWLEY, K.C.M.G., then Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, authorised and appointed FREDERICK HORATIO BRUFORD, Esq., and you the said PETER WHITINGTON, Esq., and Dr. ERNEST BLACK, Commissioners, to inquire into and report upon certain matters relating to the classification and reorganisation of the Public Service of Western Australia, and for other purposes relating to the said Public Service, with certain powers in such Commission mentioned: AND WHEREAS by his supplemental Commission bearing date the 30th day of July, 1902, and addressed to the said three Commissioners appointed by the said Commission dated the 11th day of June, 1902, the said Honourable Sir Arthur Lawley, K.C.M.G., as Governor aforesaid, defined the expression "Public Service" and added to the powers of the said commissioners, and confirmed the said Commission dated the 11th day of June, 1902, all as in the said supplemental Commission mentioned and expressed: AND WHEREAS the said Frederick Horatio Bruford having been recalled to his ordinary duties in the State of Victoria, and thereby prevented from continuing to act as a Commissioner under the said Commission dated the 11th day of June, 1902, and the said supplemental Commission, left the State of Western Australia on the 11th day of June, 1903:

AND WHEREAS part of the work and duties of the said three Commissioners still remains to be performed :

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to remove any doubt as to the power and authority of you, the said PETER WHITINGTON and ERNEST BLACK, to complete the work and perform the remainder of the duties authorised and directed to be performed as aforesaid by the said three Commissioners : NOW THEREFORE I, ADMIRAL SIR FREDERICK GEORGE DENHAM BEDFORD, Governor as aforesaid, do by these presents authorise and appoint you the said PETER WHITINGTON and ERNEST BLACK, acting jointly, as Commissioners to do and perform all acts, duties, and things, and to exercise all powers (including the power of delegation in the said supplemental Commission mentioned) directed or authorised to be done, performed, and exercised by the said Commission dated the 11th day of June, 1902, and the said supplemental Commission, or either of them, in the same manner, and with the like authority and powers as the said three Commissioners might have done and performed such acts, duties, and things and exercised such powers had the said Frederick Horatio Bruford continued to act as a Commissioner: AND I ratify and confirm all acts of you the said PETER WHITINGTON and ERNEST BLACK, or either of you, done or which purported to be done, and all powers exercised or which purported to be exercised by you, or either of you, by virtue of the said Commission dated the 11th day of June, 1902, and the said supplemental Commission, or either of them, between the time when the said Frederick Horatio Bruford ceased to act as a Commissioner as aforesaid and the date of these presents, provided such acts might have been validly done by the said three Commissioners or a single Commissioner had the said three Commissioners all continued to act: AND in all other respects I confirm the said Commission dated the 11th day of June, 1902, and the said supplemental Commission.

PORT HEDLAND COMMON.

By-LAWS.

Department of Lands and Surveys, <u>8460</u> 1897

Perth, 24th June, 1903.

T is hereby notified, for general information, that under Sections 42 and 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws made by the Board of Management of Port Hedland Common (Reserve /N 6090).

BY-LAWS FOR REGULATING THE DEPASTURING OF HORSES, SHEEP, CATTLE, PIGS, GOATS, CAMELS, ASSES, AND MULES UPON PORT HEDLAND COMMON, AND FOR REGULATING THE FELLING AND REMOVAL OF GREEN AND GROWING TIMBER THEREON.

1. All stock running on the common otherwise than in accordance with these By-laws will be treated as trespassing stock.

With the exception of stock owned by bond fide $\mathbf{2}$. travellers, travelling teamsters, and packers, as hereinafter provided, no stock of any description will be allowed to depasture on the common free of charge.

3. Swine or camels shall under no circumstances be allowed to depasture on that part of the common which consists of the island upon which Port Hedland townsite is situated.

4. No person, partnership, or company shall be allowed to run more than six head of horses and cattle on the common at any one time, except *bond fide* butchers who may be allowed to depasture eight head of cattle at any one

time, at a charge of threepence per week or part of a week per head of cattle.

5. Stock under twelve months old, the progeny of stock lawfully running on the common, and being the *bond fide* property of any resident in the townsite of Port Hedland, shall not be charged for.

6. No sheep shall be allowed to run or depasture on the common except by license granted by the Board to bond fide butchers carrying on business in Port Hedland, and keeping

such sheep for killing and supplying the public. 7. No butcher shall be licensed to depasture more than 125 sheep on the common at any one time, unless there shall at any time be only one person or firm, carrying on the business of a butcher in Port Hedland, in which case the number may be increased to 250.

8. Every such license shall be an annual license, and the charge for the same shall be at the rate of fourpence per head for the number of sheep licensed to be kept by the licensee on the common at any one time.

9. The fee for goats shall be Five shillings per head per annum, and all goats over the age of six months, for which commonage fees have not been paid, found on the common may be destroyed, in accordance with the pro-provisions of "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impound-ing Act, 1882" (46 Vict., No. 7, section 4, subsections 1 and 2).

10. Subject to these By-laws, the following fees shall be payable in respect of all stock running or depasturing on the common :-

- For horses, cattle, asses, and mules.—Fifteen shillings per head per aunum; Ten shillings and sixpence per head per half-year; or Six shillings and six-pence per head per quarter, or lesser period.
- For camels.—Two shillings and sixpence per head per week, or lesser period.

11. Any person running stock on the commonage may change such stock from time to time, provided that such stock shall not at any time exceed the number for which such person shall have paid commonage fees.

12. It shall be compulsory upon every person making use of the common to furnish the Secretary of the Board or Ranger of the common with a list giving correct description of all stock placed by such person upon the common, within 12 hours of placing stock thereon, and to obtain from such officer a certificate showing the number and description of such stock.

13. Bond fide travellers, teamsters, and packers shall be allowed to run their horses or cattle on the common for the space of four clear days free of charge, and their camels for the space of three clear days free of charge on that portion of the common allotted to them. Should that period, how-ever, be exceeded, bonk fide travellers, teamsters, and packers shall be charged at the rate of threepence per head per day, or part of a day, for all horses and cattle. Camels shall be charged for as provided in Regulation 10.

The Board shall in all cases be the sole judge of what constitutes a bond fide traveller, teamster, and packer.

14. Stock for shipment shall not be permitted to depasture on the Port Hedland side of the Four-mile well, but they may remain on the farther side for three days free of charge. After the expiration of three days, a charge of one farthing per head per day for sheep and pigs, and one penny per head per day for cattle and horses shall be made. Stock coming in for shipment after passing the Four-mile well must be kept together and driven direct to shipping yards.

15. All annual fees shall be due and payable on the fifteenth day of April in each year, and the Secretary of the Board shall at any time, with the approval of the Chairman or any two members of the Board, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of any fees unpaid.

16. No stock on which commonage fees are due shall be removed from the common unless with the written sanction of the Secretary of the Board or Ranger.

17. Commonage fees shall not be payable for stray stock proved to be accidentally upon the common, but such stock shall be treated as trespassing stock.

18. No entire horse, pig, or bull over the age of six months (except with the sanction of the Board) shall be allowed on the common, and, in addition to the penalty hereinafter prescribed and recoverable under these By-laws against the owner thereof, if known, any such horse, pig, or bull found thereon may be dealt with in manner prescribed by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Im-pounding Act, 1882" (46 Vict., No. 7).

19. The Ranger for the time being shall have authority to demand particulars of stock depasturing on the common.

20. The Board will not be responsible for the safe keeping, damage, or injury sustained, from any cause what-ever, by any horses, sheep, cattle, pigs, goats, camels, asses, or mules depasturing on the common under these by-laws.

21. No person shall cut, fell, or remove green or growing timber on or from the said common without having first obtained a license from the Board and paid therefor the sum of Two shillings and sixpence per axe per month.

22. For each and every breach of these by-laws the owner of stock running on the common, or any person committing such breach, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings, exclusive of costs and in addition to the commonage fees as provided in these by-laws. Such penalty and fees may be recovered and enforced in a summary manner under "The Justices Act, 1902," and shall in no way affect any fines and fees recoverable under By-laws of the Board, regulating fees and fines to be paid in respect of impounded stock.

23. That all penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of, and form part of the ordinary income of the Board.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PURCHASE OF AURIFEROUS COPPER ORES AT THE STATE SAMPLING WORKS, PHILLIPS RIVER.

Department of Mines, Perth, 2nd July, 1903.

IIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the powers conferred upon him by Section 29 of "The Mining Development Act, 1902," has been pleased to make the following Regulations for the purchase of Auriferous Copper Ores at the State Sampling Works, Phillips River.

H. GREGORY,

Minister for Mines.

1. All ores shall be delivered free of charge at the Works, on such place as may from time to time be directed by the Manager.

2. The Manager shall be the sole judge as to whether any parcel of ore shall be accepted for purchase or not, and may order the removal of any ore which he thinks unsuitable; whereupon the owner of the ore shall remove it forthwith from the Works.

3. As soon as possible after receipt of a parcel of ore it shall be weighed at the Works, and the weight so determined shall be taken to be the true gross weight thereof. The percentage of moisture present will be determined by assay, and deducted from the gross weight. A further deduction of one per cent. (1 $^{\circ}/_{\circ}$) will be made for draughtage. The net weight, after these deductions have been made, shall be the weight upon which the ore is purchased.

4. The vendor, or his representative, may be present during the weighing and sampling of parcels of ore, but shall take no part in the handling of the same, nor interfere in any way with the weighing or sampling.

5. After weighing, the ore shall be sampled according to such method as the Manager shall decide, and three samples shall be drawn—one for assay at the Works; one for the vendor, and the third as an unpire sample. The umpire sample shall be sealed in the presence of the vendor or his representative, and retained at the Works.

6. In the event of the vendor not agreeing with the assay of the Works, he may demand that the umpire sample be sent to the Government Assayer, in Perth, whose analysis shall be accepted as final by both parties. The cost of the umpire assay shall be borne by the party whose assay differs most from the umpire's result.

7. In computing the value of the ore, fractions of one per cent. of copper, of one pennyweight of gold, and of one ounce of silver in the assay results will not be taken into account.

8. No charge will be made for sampling and assay of any accepted parcel of one exceeding five tons (5 tons) net weight, but any smaller parcel shall be charged with a fee of One guinea (\pounds 1 is.), except in the case of a *bonå fide* first trial parcel from a new working.

9. All parcels of ore which, after sampling, are found unsuitable for purchase by the Works shall be charged with a fee for sampling and assay of One guinea (\pounds 1 1s.) for each five tons or fraction of five tons net weight contained in it.

10. Assay for copper shall be made by such wet process as the Manager shall determine, and assays for gold and silver by fire methods, or by any combination of wet and fire methods that may appear to him most suitable.

11. After agreement of assays, the following deductions shall be made from the agreed assay values, in order to arrive at the amounts of the metals for which payment will be made :---

- Copper.--From assays under ten per cent. of copper, two and a-half units will be deducted. From assays over ten per cent. of copper, three units will be deducted.
- Gold.—From all assays up to one and a-half ounces per ton, three pennyweights will be deducted. From all assays over one and a-half ounces per ton, five per cent. of the total assay will be deducted.

Silver.—No silver will be paid for unless more than five ounces to the ton are present. From all assays of more than five ounces to the ton, ten per cent, will be deducted, together with the fixed amount of five ounces.

12. A smelting charge of Three pounds per ton (net weight) will be made in all cases.

13. Payment will be made for copper, gold, and silver in the ore, less the above deductions and charges, immediately on agreement of assays, at the following rates :---

Copper.—At the rate of Fifty pounds per ton.

Gold.—At the rate of Four pounds per ounce fine, less ten per cent.

Silver.—At the rate of One shilling and ninepence per ounce fine.

After realisation of the ore, whether by smelting on the spot or sale elsewhere, any balance over and above the above payments that may accrue from the realisation will be paid to the vendor, less interest at the rate of five per cent. per annum on the amount of the first payment.

14. The State shall have the right to dispose of any ore on which a first payment has been made, either by smelting or sale, as the Minister of Mines may decide, and the vendors shall have no claim to any compensation on the ground that the ore might have given them a higher return if disposed of in some manner other than that adopted.

15. All accounts against the State for payments due on account of ore sold to the Works shall be rendered on the usual forms of accounts against His Majesty's Government, and shall be certified as correct by the Manager of the Works before being forwarded to the Under Secretary for Mines, Perth, for payment.

and be accompanied by a letter containing instructions and stating the locality where the samples were obtained.

THE GOLDFIELDS WATER SUPPLY ACT. 1902.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws made by the Minister for Works under the provisions of Section 105 of the above Act.

BY-LAWS.

Every rate-paying consumer will be entitled to a 1. supply of water at the rate of 8s. per thousand gallons in return for the amount of rates paid by him. Provided that such water shall be taken during the period for which the rate is struck, and that the maximum quantity to be taken in consideration of the rate, during any one quarter of a year, shall not exceed one fourth of the supply to which the consumer is entitled in respect of an annual rate, or onehalf of the supply to which he is entitled in respect of a half-yearly rate.

Any consumer taking water in excess of the quantity to which he is entitled in respect of a rate will be charged 8s. per thousand gallons for so much as is taken in respect of the rate, and 7s. 6d. per thousand gallons for the excess up to a total consumption of eight thousand gallons per quarter, and 7s. per thousand gallons for any excess beyond a total consumption of eight thousand gallons per quarter.

Every quarter shall end 31st March, or 30th June, or 30th September, or 31st December in every year.

2. The Minister may, by notice to a consumer from time to time, restrict the quantity of water that may be supplied to him in any one week.

3. During the time any meter is undergoing repairs, or should it cease to properly register the consumption of water, the Minister may, at his option, estimate the quantity of water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous month or quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, and shall charge for the consumption so ascertained.

4. Application for services shall be made on the printed form procurable at the local Water Supply Office, and shall be lodged not less than three days before the service is required

Applications will not be entertained unless full information as indicated on the printed form is supplied, and the full amount of rates, due on the premises to which a service is required, is paid.

In respect of all metered services the amount of meter rent up to the close of the half-year current at time of application shall accompany the application.

It shall be at the discretion of the local officer as to whether or not a meter shall be affixed to any service, and such officer will also determine the size and class of meter in each case.

Meters will be supplied by the Water Supply Administration, and rent for same shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the following scale :-

7. The water rate shall be at the rate of 1s. 6d. in the pound per annum upon the net annual value of all ratable land. The minimum sum payable as rate shall be One pound per annum. Rates shall become due and payable half-yearly in advance, in the first week in January and the first week in July.

8. No person to whom water is supplied by the Minister shall, without written permission, sell or supply water to any other person other than any person who may reside on the premises of which he is the occupier.

9. The occupier of any premises to which the water has been laid on, or, in the event of there being no occupier, the owner, shall cause proper means to be taken, by locks or otherwise, subject to the approval of the local officer, to prevent the use of the water from the main by persons not connected with the premises supplied. 10. The owner or occupier of any allotment of land within the water area who shall erect or make, or cause to erected or made, any building or addition to an existing building on such land, shall, within one calendar month thereafter, give notice in writing thereof to the Minister.

11. Any person committing a breach of, or failing to observe, any of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
