By His Excellency Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: And whereas the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly now stand prorogued to Thursday, the 18th day of June, now next ensuing: Now I, Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, G.C.B., Governor of the said State, in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby further prorogue the said Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly to Thursday, the 16th day of July, now next ensuing: And I do hereby further announce and proclaim that the Third Session of the Fourth Parliament of Western Australia shall be holden for the despatch of business on the aforesaid 16th day of July next, at the hour time for holding the first and every other Session of the or the despatch of business on the aforesaid 16th day of July next, at the hour of 3 o'clock, p.m.; the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chamber, St. George's Terrace, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said State; and the Terrace, in the CITY OF FERTH, in the said State; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chamber, in Hay Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said State; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of leasing for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve A (Electric Light Station, Kalgoorlie) should vest in and be held by the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie, with power to the said Mayor and Councillors of the Munici-pality of Kalgoorlie to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PURCHASE OF AURIFEROUS COPPER ORES AT THE STATE SAMPLING WORKS, PHILLIPS RIVER.

Is Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the powers conferred upon him by Section 29 of "The Mining Development Act, 1902," has been pleased to make the following Regulations for the purchase of Auriferous Copper Ores at the State Sampling Works, Phillips River.

H. GREGORY, Minister for Mines.

- 1. All ores shall be delivered free of charge at the Works, on such place as may from time to time be directed by the Manager.
- 2. The Manager shall be the sole judge as to whether any parcel of ore shall be accepted for purchase or not, and may order the removal of any ore which he thinks unsuitable; whereupon the owner of the ore shall remove it forthwith from the Works.

- 3. As soon as possible after receipt of a parcel of ore it shall be weighed at the Works, and the weight so determined shall be taken to be the true gross weight thereof. The percentage of moisture present will be determined by assay, and deducted from the gross weight. A further deduction of one per cent. $(1 \, {}^{\circ}/_{\circ})$ will be made for draughtage. The net weight, after these deductions have been made, shall be the weight upon which the ore is purchased.
- 4. The vendor, or his representative, may be present during the weighing and sampling of parcels of ore, but shall take no part in the handling of the same, nor interfere in any way with the weighing or sampling.
- 5. After weighing, the ore shall be sampled according to such method as the Manager shall decide, and three samples shall be drawn—one for assay at the Works; one for the vendor, and the third as an umpire sample. The umpire sample shall be sealed in the presence of the vendor or his representative, and retained at the Works.
- 6. In the event of the vendor not agreeing with the assay of the Works, he may demand that the umpire sample be sent to the Government Assayer, in Perth, whose analysis shall be accepted as final by both parties. The cost of the umpire assay shall be borne by the party whose assay differs most from the umpire's result.
- 7. In computing the value of the ore, fractions of one per cent. of copper, of one pennyweight of gold, and of one ounce of silver in the assay results will not be taken into account.
- 8. No charge will be made for sampling and assay of any accepted parcel of ore exceeding five tons (5 tons) net weight, but any smaller parcel shall be charged with a fee of One guinea (£1 1s.), except in the case of a bond fide first trial parcel from a new working.
- 9. All parcels of ore which, after sampling, are found unsuitable for purchase by the Works shall be charged with a fee for sampling and assay of One guinea (£1 1s.) for each five tons or fraction of five tons net weight contained in it.
- 10. Assays for copper shall be made by such wet process as the Manager shall determine, and assays for gold and silver by fire methods, or by any combination of wet and fire methods that may appear to him most suitable.
- 11. After agreement of assays, the following deductions shall be made from the agreed assay values, in order to arrive at the amounts of the metals for which payment will be made:—
 - Copper.—From assays under ten per cent. of copper, two and a-half units will be deducted. From assays over ten per cent. of copper, three units will be deducted.
 - Gold.—From all assays up to one and a-half ounces per ton, three pennyweights will be deducted. From all assays over one and a-half ounces per ton, five per cent. of the total assay will be deducted.
 - Silver.—No silver will be paid for unless more than five ounces to the ton are present. From all assays of more than five ounces to the ton, ten per cent, will be deducted, together with the fixed amount of five ounces.
- 12. A smelting charge of Three pounds per ton (net weight) will be made in all cases.
- 13. Payment will be made for copper, gold, and silver in the ore, less the above deductions and charges, immediately on agreement of assays, at the following rates:—

Copper.—At the rate of Fifty pounds per ton.

Gold.—At the rate of Four pounds per ounce fine, less ten per cent.

 $\it Silver. — At$ the rate of One shilling and ninepence per ounce fine.

After realisation of the ore, whether by smelting on the spot or sale elsewhere, any balance over and above the above payments that may accrue from the realisation will be paid to the vendor, less interest at the rate of five per cent. per annum on the amount of the first payment.

- 14. The State shall have the right to dispose of any ore on which a first payment has been made, either by smelting or sale, as the Minister of Mines may decide, and the vendors shall have no claim to any compensation on the ground that the ore might have given them a higher return if disposed of in some manner other than that adopted.
- 15. All accounts against the State for payments due on account of ore sold to the Works shall be rendered on the usual forms of accounts against His Majesty's Government, and shall be certified as correct by the Manager of the Works before being forwarded to the Under Secretary for Mines, Perth, for payment.

FREE ASSAYS AT THE SCHOOL OF MINES, COOLGARDIE.

WITH the object of encouraging bona fide prospectors, free assays for gold, silver, copper, etc., and determinations of mineral samples and rocks will be made at the School of Mines, Coolgardie, under the following circumstances :-

- (a.) The sender must satisfy the Director that he is a bond fide prospector, or acting on behalf of such. and that the sample forwarded is one genuinely complying with the following conditions under which free assays will be made.
- (b.) The sample must have been obtained from land within the State not held under lease for mining purposes.
- (c.) The exact locality where the sample was found must be disclosed.
- (d.) The sample must be of sufficient promise to warrant an assay being made at the expense of
- (e.) Free assays will not be made of samples showing free gold, or of tailings or other metallurgical products, or of umpire samples.
- (f.) Samples to be assayed for gold should weigh about 1 or 2lbs. Other samples should be as large as circumstances will permit, up to 2lbs.
- (g.) Each sample must be properly marked, and securely fastened in a separate bag, along with the name and address of the sender.

(h.) The parcel must be forwarded, prepaid, to F. B. ALLEN,

Director School of Mines, Coolgardie,

and be accompanied by a letter containing instructions and stating the locality where the samples were obtained.

Duplicate samples should be kept by the sender.

The Department reserves to itself the right of refusing to make any particular assay, and also the right of publishing at any time the results of an assay made at the public

Western Australian Government Railways.

BY-LAWS.

THE Commissioner of Railways does hereby declare that the following By-laws, having been approved of by the Governor in Executive Council, are the By-laws for regulating the use of the Government Railways, to be observed henceforth by all parties; and the By-laws previously in force in this connection, approved in Executive Council on the 7th November, 1900, are hereby cancelled:—

BY-LAWS.

Sale and purchase of tickets; passengers using expired tickets.

1. Tickets and free passes are not transferable; and any person using, or attempting to use, a transferred ticket or pass, or a ticket or pass the time for the proper use of which has expired, with intent to defraud, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

Sale of tickets.

2. Any person, not duly authorised by the Commissioner, who shall sell, or offer for sale, any free pass, ticket, or portion of a return ticket, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Purchase of Tickets.

3. Any person who shall purchase, or offer to purchase, from any person not duly authorised by the Commissioner to sell, any free pass, ticket, or portion of a return ticket shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

Both halves of return tickets to be produced on outward journey.

4. Any servant of the Commissioner may require any passenger travelling on the outward half of a return ticket to produce the return half, and failing such production the passenger shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

Travelling in a superior class of carriage to that for which ticket is held.

5. Any person knowingly, and with intent to defraud, travelling upon any railway in a carriage of a superior class to that for which he is provided with a ticket, or altering a return or other ticket, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

Free pass holders travelling beyond distance, or in a superior carriage to that for which pass is available.

6. Any person being the holder of a free pass who travels or attempts to travel beyond the distance for which such pass is available, without being previously duly authorised to proceed such additional distance, or travels in a superior class of carriage to that for which such pass is available, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

Tickets only to be used between stations named thereon and by proper trains.

7. Tickets, whether single or return, shall be used by passengers only upon the journey between the stations named thereon, or to a station between those named upon the ticket. Workmen's weekly tickets and cheap excursion tickets are not available for any other train than that for which they may have been issued. If the holder of a workman's weekly ticket leaves a train on the forward journey at any station before the destination shown upon such ticket, he shall not continue his journey to such destination without paying the ordinary fare from the place at which he resumes such journey. A cheap excursion ticket is not available for any station other than that shown upon it. Any person using or attempting to use a ticket in violation of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

Press tickets—irregular use of.

8. Press tickets are issued solely to persons wholly and permanently employed by the proprietors of a "registered" newspaper, and travelling for the purpose of reporting, and any person, not being duly entitled thereto, who shall travel or attempt to travel on such a ticket, or who shall directly or indirectly aid or abet any person so travelling, or attempting to travel, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

BY-LAWS-continued.

Defaced tickets not to be recognised.

9. No ticket will be recognised by any servant of the Commissioner unless the number, date, and names of the stations written or printed on such ticket shall be perfectly legible. The holder of any ticket who shall wilfully deface his ticket, or render it illegible in any of the above particulars, with intent to defraud, will be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

Joining a train without ticket.

10. Any person joining a train at any booking station without having previously provided himself with a ticket shall, on demand by any railway official, pay sixpence in addition to the ordinary fare.

Male passengers not to enter waiting rooms or carriages set apart for females.

11. No male passenger is allowed to enter any waiting room or carriage set apart for the accommodation of females; and any person remaining in any such room or carriage after being warned to leave the same may be summarily removed therefrom, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Opening carriage doors or getting through windows.

12. Any person, not being an officer of the Commissioner, who lets himself in or out of any railway carriage by getting through a window, or who opens a locked railway carriage door with a key or other instrument for the purpose of entering or leaving the carriage at any railway station, or at any time during the journey, or who enters or leaves a carriage elsewhere than at the side of the carriage adjoining the platform at which the carriage is standing, or other place appointed by the Commissioner for passengers to enter or leave the carriages, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Travelling outside; joining or leaving train in motion.

13. No person, other than an officer of the Commissioner, shall travel on the roof, steps, or foot-board of a railway carriage, or on the engine or any portion of a carriage not intended for the accommodation of passengers, or shall get upon or into or quit any carriage when the train is in motion, and any person doing so, or attempting to do so, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Smoking in Carriages.

14. Any person who smokes tobacco in or upon any railway carriage other than that specially set apart for the purpose, and who persists in smoking after being required by any passenger or by any officer of the Commissioner to desist, and any person who smokes opium or other substance than tobacco on railway premises, whether in a smoking carriage or not, may be summarily removed therefrom by any officer of the Commissioner, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Full-fare passengers only to travel in smoking compartments.

15. Every person under the age of 21 travelling in any compartment of any carriage set apart for smoking shall pay the full ordinary adult fare for the time being in force, notwithstanding the production of any certificate purporting to authorise him to travel at a fare less than such ordinary adult fare.

Smoking on railway premises prohibited.

16. Any person who smokes tobacco in or upon any railway premises, on which a notice is exhibited that smoking is prohibited, and who persists in smoking after being warned to desist by any officer of the Commissioner, may be removed from such premises by any such officer, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Conveyance of dogs.

17. Dogs will be conveyed and charged for according to printed conditions, but will not on any account be allowed to accompany passengers in the carriages. Any person taking a dog into a passenger carriage shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Gratuities to railway servants forbidden.

18. No gratuity is, under any circumstance, allowed to be received by a railway servant, on pain of dismissal. Any person giving or offering a gratuity to any such servant shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Persons intoxicated or committing a nuisance.

19. Any person found in or upon any railway carriage or station or premises in a state of intoxication, or making use of obscene, insulting, abusive, indecent, or blasphemous language, or writing any obscene words or figures, or committing any nuisance, or gambling or wilfully interfering with the comfort of any passenger, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and to removal from such carriage, station, or premises, as soon as shall be practicable.

Drivers of vehicles to be provided with written license.

20. No driver or conductor of any hackney carriage, omnibus, or other public vehicle shall ply for hire within railway premises without a license in writing from the Commissioner; and any person offending contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Drivers and conductors of vehicles under the direction of railway servants.

21. Every driver or conductor of an omnibus, cab, carriage, or other vehicle shall, while in or upon any station, yard, or other premises of the Railway Department, obey the directions of the railway officers and employés duly authorised on that behalf; and every person offending against this Regulation may be summarily removed from such station, yard, or premises, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Communication between passengers and railway servants forbidden, without sufficient reason.

22. Any person who shall make use of the means of communication between the passengers and the railway servants in charge of a train, or apply any brake without reasonable and sufficient cause, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Unauthorised persons soliciting custom.

23. No person will be allowed to come upon any railway premises for the purpose of removing any passenger or luggage, unless required by a passenger and engaged by him for such purpose; and no person will be allowed to come upon any railway premises for the purpose of soliciting custom or hire. Any person attempting to evade, or being guilty of a breach of this Regulation, or not quitting the premises when required by a Station-master or other railway servant, may be summarily removed therefrom, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Polluting water in reservoir, etc.

24. Any person found washing, bathing, or swimming, or otherwise polluting the water in any reservoir or tank belonging the railway, or any unauthorised person drawing water therefrom, shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Posting placards on railway property or premises.

25. Any person, unless authorised by the Commissioner, who shall post or stick any placard or bill within or on any of the railway property or premises, shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding $\mathfrak{L}10$.

Loaded firearms not to be carried.

26. Firearms shall not, under any circumstances, be taken into or placed upon or carried in any carriage used for the conveyance of passengers upon the railway, nor shall loaded firearms be brought upon the railway premises, and every person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and to removal from such carriage or premises as soon as shall be practicable.

Taking possession of seat in carriage.

27. It shall not be lawful for any passenger to take possession of the seat in a railway carriage of any other passenger who has been occupying such seat, and who has temporarily left the carriage for refreshments or other purposes. Any person so offending, and refusing to give up the seat to the previous occupant, may be removed therefrom by any officer of the Commissioner, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

BY-LAWS.—continued.

Placing feet or boots on carriage seat, etc.

28. Any person who wilfully places either of his feet or boots upon the seat of any railway carriage so as to injure or be likely to injure the same, or the cushion or covering thereof, or to cause inconvenience or annoyance to any passenger, or who expectorates upon the floor or any other part of any railway carriage, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Persons with infectious disorders.

29. The Commissioner may refuse to carry any person who has any infectious disorder. If any person who has, or may reasonably be supposed to have, any such disorder is found upon the railway premises, or travels or attempts to travel on the railway, without the special permission of the Commissioner, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and, in addition, shall forfeit any fare which he may have paid, and he may be removed at the first opportunity from the railway premises. Any person who has charge of any person suffering from an infectious disorder while upon the premises of the Commissioner, or travelling or attempting to travel on the railway, or who aids or assists any person suffering from such disorder in being upon the railway premises, or travelling or attempting to travel on the railway, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, unless the person suffering from such disorder be travelling with the special permission of the Commissioner.

Wilful damage to railway property.

30. Any person who wilfully injures any railway carriage, or any cushion or other furniture thereof, or breaks or injures or defaces any window, or removes or injures any number, plate, picture, or advertisement, or removes or extinguishes any lamp, or pulls down, destroys, or injures any gate, railway fencing, milepost, board, or notice, or obliterates or defaces any of the letters or figures thereon, or in or upon any railway carriage or railway premises, or in any way disfigures, by writing or otherwise, any railway building, fence, or wall within railway premises, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and shall in addition be liable to pay the amount of damage done.

Selling of articles on railway premises.

31. No article shall be sold on any railway premises without the consent of the Commissioner; and every person offending against this By-law shall forfeit a sum not exceeding £10.

Depositing rubbish, etc., on railway lands.

32. Any person who shall at any time throw or deposit, or cause to be thrown or deposited, any glass, filth, dirt, rubbish, or other matter of a similar nature on any of the railways, or on any lands, station buildings, piers, wharves, or jetties vested in or under the direction or management of the Commissioner, shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

Explanation of terms.

33. The word "fare" in these By-laws shall be held to mean the rate of toll or sum of money approved by the Governor in Council and published under the authority of the "Railways Amendment Acts, 1879-1881," and other Acts; and the words "railway carriage" shall include every passenger carriage, goods-truck, horse-box, meat-van, or other vehicle used in the railway.

THE GOLDFIELDS WATER SUPPLY ACT, 1902.

IIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws made by the Minister for Works under the provisions of Section 105 of the above Act.

BY-LAWS.

1. Every rate-paying consumer will be entitled to a supply of water at the rate of 8s. per thousand gallons in return for the amount of rates paid by him. Provided that such water shall be taken during the period for which the rate is struck, and that the maximum quantity to be taken in consideration of the rate, during any one quarter of a year, shall not exceed one-fourth of the supply to which the consumer is entitled in respect of an annual rate, or one-half of the supply to which he is entitled in respect of a half-yearly rate.

Any consumer taking water in excess of the quantity to which he is entitled in respect of a rate will be charged 8s. per thousand gallons for so much as is taken in respect of the rate, and 7s. 6d, per thousand gallons for the excess up to a total consumption of eight thousand gallons per quarter, and 7s. per thousand gallons for any excess beyond a total consumption of eight thousand gallons per quarter.

Every quarter shall end 31st March, or 30th June, or 30th September, or 31st December in every year.

- 2. The Minister may, by notice to a consumer from time to time, restrict the quantity of water that may be supplied to him in any one week.
- 3. During the time any meter is undergoing repairs, or should it cease to properly register the consumption of water, the Minister may, at his option, estimate the quantity of water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous month or quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, and shall charge for the consumption so ascertained.
- 4. Application for services shall be made on the printed form procurable at the local Water Supply Office, and shall be lodged not less than three days before the service is required.

Applications will not be entertained unless full information as indicated on the printed form is supplied, and the full amount of rates, due on the premises to which a service is required, is paid.

In respect of all metered services the amount of meter rent up to the close of the half-year current at time of application shall accompany the application.

- 5. It shall be at the discretion of the local officer as to whether or not a meter shall be affixed to any service, and such officer will also determine the size and class of meter in each case.
- 6. Meters will be supplied by the Water Supply Administration, and rent for same shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the following scale:—

7. The water rate shall be at the rate of 1s. 6d. in the pound per annum upon the net annual value of all ratable land. The minimum sum payable as rate shall be One pound per annum. Rates shall become due and payable half-yearly in advance, in the first week in January and the first week in July.

- 8. No person to whom water is supplied by the Minister shall, without written permission, sell or supply water to any other person other than any person who may reside on the premises of which he is the occupier.
- 9. The occupier of any premises to which the water has been laid on, or, in the event of there being no occupier, the owner, shall cause proper means to be taken, by locks or otherwise, subject to the approval of the local officer, to prevent the use of the water from the main by persons not connected with the premises supplied.
- 10. The owner or occupier of any allotment of land within the water area who shall erect or make, or cause to be erected or made, any building or addition to an existing building on such land, shall, within one calendar month thereafter, give notice in writing thereof to the Minister.
- 11. Any person committing a breach of, or failing to observe, any of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

The rain that set in on the West and South-West coast at the end of last month extended throughout the State South of the tropics, and during the month of June good rains were experienced, the fall being considerably above the average throughout the district between Onslow and Geraldton, and about the average, or slightly above, over the Goldfields and throughout the South-West and South. North of Onslow little fell, and nil in the Kimberley district.

The rain was particularly heavy on the 28th in the Geraldton district, over four inches being recorded at several places in the 24 hours.

The atmospheric pressure was above the average, particularly inland over the Goldfields.

The day temperatures were about normal, but the night were slightly above the average for previous years; frosts were, however, experienced at many places inland.

THE PROBATE RULES, 1903.

The Honourable Sir Edward Albert Stone, Knight, Chief Justice, the Honourable Stephen Henry Parker, Puisne Judge, and the Honourable Robert Furse McMillan, Puisne Judge, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers contained in "The Supreme Court Ordinance, 1861,"

and of every power enabling them in that behalf, make the following Rules, which shall come into operation on the 15th day of July next, and may be cited as "The Probate Rules, 1903":—

1. Solicitors and others, when taking out Probate or Letters of Administration, or Letters of Administration with the will annexed, or Sealing a Foreign Probate or Letters of Administration or Letters of Administration with the Will annexed, must produce to and leave with the Registrar, for the purpose of being recorded, a copy of the Probate and Will or Letters of Administration with the will annexed, or Foreign Probate or Letters of Administration with the will annexed, which shall be written (not typewritten) in a good clear round hand on white paper to be obtained at the Probate Office at a price to be fixed by the Registrar, and of the size of 18in. by 12in. with an outer margin of two and a half inches on one side and an inner margin of two and a half inches on the other side, and in the case of Letters of Administration or Foreign Letters of Administration a copy of the Letters or Foreign Letters on similar paper but of the size of 13in. by 8½in. and with a margin of two and a half inches on the outer margin only.

2. A fee of 6d. per folio of 90 words shall be payable for examining and comparing the copies with the originals.
