WHEREAS by Section 219 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900" (64 Vict., No. 8), it shall be lawful for the Governor on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, or way, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH BY-LAWS.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws made by the Peppermint Grove Local Board of Health.

PEPPERMINT GROVE LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.
THE Peppermint Grove Local Board of Health, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by "The Health Act, 1898," makes the following By-laws to have operation in the whole of the place or places within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board.

INTERPRETATION.

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the terms herein used shall have the meanings severally attached to them in Section 3 of the said Act.

2. The words "The Local Board," used in these By-laws, shall mean the "Peppermint Grove Local Board of Health."

BY-LAW No. 1.

Cesspools to be cleansed and filled up.

All existing cesspools within the area under the jurisdiction of the Local Board shall be cleansed and filled up to the satisfaction of the Inspector within a calendar month of notice to that effect being given to the owner or occupier.

BY-LAW No. 2.

The position and manner of construction of privies, earth-closets, and cesspools and urinals.

1. No person shall erect within the District of the Local Board any earth closet, privy, or urinal which does not comply with the requirements of Schedule "D," and the walls of which are not of stone, wood, and iron, or brick, and every closet shall be equipped with a pan approved by the Local Board; the doors of every closet shall be properly fitted, and shall at all times be kept in thorough repair. The seat or trap door shall be so constructed as to readily admit the pan.

2. All closets, privies, or urinals shall, unless otherwise allowed under special circumstances by the Local Board, be erected at least 40ft. distant from any room, building, or premises ordinarily used by any person or persons for sleeping, living, or working, and in manner approved by the Local Board, and shall be erected as near a right-of-way as conveniently can be, and shall be ventilated to the satisfaction of the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 3.

Closets supplied with receptacles for excrementitious matter—Size shape, materials of construction—Interchangeable.

Each closet shall be supplied with a sufficient number of receptacles for excrementitious matter which shall be interchangeable with others in the same district, and shall be of a size and shape approved of by the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 4.

Nightsoil to be rendered inoffensive.

Every contractor shall cause the nightsoil removed from any premises to be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator, or to be trenched or ploughed into the land.

BY-LAW No. 5.

Supervision over Depots.

The Local Board may exercise stringent supervision over all such depots or places of deposit, and the Inspector shall inspect such depots or places regularly at such intervals as the Local Board may direct.

BY-LAW No. 6.

Mode of removal, etc.

1. Until otherwise directed, the nightman shall deposit the contents of all such receptacles in trenches, to be excavated at his own expense, in such place or places as shall be fixed by the Local Board, and treated with disinfectant, and covered with earth to such depth as the Local Board may from time to time direct.

2. The said receptacles shall be emptied once a week at the least, or so much more frequently as the Local Board may from time to time direct.

BY-LAW No. 7.

Fixing the charge, etc.

Every nightman shall be entitled to charge and to receive from the occupier of any premises from which any nightsoil, trade or house refuse shall have been removed, such sum or sums of money as are specified in Schedule "A" hereto, and no nightman shall ask, demand, or receive more than the moneys mentioned in the said Schedule.

BY-LAW No. 8.

Licenses to remove nightsoil.

1. The Local Board shall have power to issue licenses for the removal of nightsoil to any person approved by the Local Board.

2. No nightman or other person shall remove nightsoil from any house or premises within the area under the jurisdiction of the Local Board, unless he shall have first obtained from the Local Board a license authorising him to do so.

3. No nightman, or any of his employees, shall parade or pass any nightcart or other offensive vehicle through or over the streets or roads or any of them of the district, whether full or empty, or remove, or suffer to be removed, any nightsoil or urine before the hour of eleven o'clock at night, nor after

the hour of five o'clock in the morning, and shall cause to be removed all carts used by him and used for any of the purposes aforesaid entirely outside the precincts of the district before the hour of five o'clock in the morning.

4. The license shall be in the form of Schedule "B" hereto, and shall be subject to the conditions contained in the license, and to the provisions of "The Health Act, 1898," and of these By-laws.

5. The Local Board shall have power, at any time, to revoke any license granted under these By-laws for any breach of any of the provisions of such By-laws, or for any other cause sufficient in the opinion of the Local Board.

6. Every nightman shall keep, or cause to be kept, clean and deodorised or disinfected all nightcarts or other vehicles used by him for the removal of filthy or offensive matter, to the complete satisfaction of the Local Board, and shall not allow such nightcarts or other vehicles to be kept or remain in any place where they cause a nuisance to any person, whether the same are in use or not.

BY-LAW No. 9.

Imposing penalties on licensee for breach of conditions.

The holder of every license to remove nightsoil shall observe the following conditions, and if he shall commit a breach of any of such conditions he shall, for any and every such breach, forfeit and pay the amount set opposite thereto hereunder:—

Penalty for breach.

- (a.) Remove all pans at the time and in the manner appointed for the purpose, 5s.
- (b.) Place cleansed pans in their proper position for use, 5s.
- (c.) Clean or keep deodorised all pans, nightcarts, or other vehicles 5s.
- (d.) Properly dispose of nightsoil as soon as it is deposited at the depot, not more than 10s. nor less than 5s.
- (e.) Not deposit any load or part thereof of any nightsoil, slops, rubbish, or refuse at any other place than the place appointed by the Local Board, not more than 20s. nor less than 5s.
- (f.) Close the door or gate of any yard or other means of ingress or egress used by the nightman or his employees, or the door of any closet which was closed when the nightman entered, 5s.
- (g.) Not permit any nightcart or other offensive vehicle to remain in or pass through the town or any part thereof during hours prohibited by Section 108, Police Act, 1892, not more than 10s. nor less than 5s.
- (h.) Cleanse all public latrines in the manner and at the time appointed for so doing, not more than 10s. nor less than 5s.
- (i.) Not spill the contents or any part of the contents of any pan within any premises, not more than 10s. nor less than 5s.
- (j.) Comply forthwith with any reasonable order of the Local Board, 10s.
- (k.) Replace any pan when so ordered by the Local Board, 5s.
- (l.) Not allow any refuse, rubbish, or slops for pigs to be removed in carts or receptacles or by other than those specially set apart for that purpose, 5s.
- (m.) Not collect any charge from any householder for work done which shall be in excess of the rates specified in Schedule "A." 5s.

The Local Board may recover such penalties in addition, and without prejudice, to any other powers given to it under these By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 10.

For mode of carriage of, and precautions, etc., to be observed—Meat, bread, fruit, etc.

1. No person or persons shall bring or cause to be brought or carried through any street or lane, in any cart or vehicle, any butcher's meat, bread, or fruit, unless such meat, bread, or fruit be protected from the sun and dust.

2. Every cart or other vehicle, and every construction or covering for carrying and protecting meat, bread, or fruit shall be kept in a clean and sanitary state.

BY-LAW No. 11.

For the registration annually of all persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk.

All persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk within the district of the Local Board shall register their names and addresses at the office of the Local Board, and shall pay a registration fee for such registration, and shall receive a certificate thereof in the form of Schedule "C."

BY-LAW No. 12.

For securing the cleanliness of bakeries.

1. No person shall carry on any bakery or bread or confectionery store unless and until the premises have been examined and passed as suitable by the Inspector.

2. All bakeries and bread and confectionery stores shall be at all reasonable times open to the inspection of any of the officers of the Local Board; and all troughs, tanks, and all utensils and appliances used in such premises shall be kept in a thoroughly clean condition, to the satisfaction of the Local Board's officers.

BY-LAW No. 13.

For prescribing the time of and the precautions to be taken on the removal of pigwash, etc.

1. No person shall remove any pigwash or other offensive or filthy matter unless the same be carried in water-tight barrels or tanks, securely covered to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof or any offensive smell therefrom.

2. Every tank or barrel and every receptacle used for the storage and reception of any pigwash, offensive or filthy matter, and every conveyance or vehicle used for the carriage or removal of any matter as above, shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.

3. No pigwash, offensive or filthy matter shall be removed from any place or premises between the hours of 8 o'clock in the morning, and 8 o'clock in the evening, except by permission of the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 14.

For the prevention of the sale of diseased fruit, etc.

No person shall sell or expose for sale in any market, warehouse, or shop, or other place, any fruit which is diseased or unwholesome, and any fruit which, in the opinion of any officer appointed by the Local Board or Central Board, is diseased or unwholesome shall be destroyed, and all cases or packing material which surrounded such fruit shall also be destroyed as such officer may direct.

BY-LAW No. 15.

For the restriction of the storage and keeping of bonedust, etc.

No person shall store or keep any bonedust or artificial or other manure so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

BY-LAW No. 16.

Regulating and keeping of cattle or other animals.

1. Every occupier or owner of a building wherein or whereon any horses, cattle, swine, or other animals may be kept shall provide, in connection with such building or other premises, a suitable receptacle for dung, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may be produced from time to time in the keeping of such animals.

2. Such receptacles shall be constructed in such a manner and of such material, and shall be maintained in such a manner so as to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof or any leakage therefrom.

BY-LAW No. 17.

Defining an area within which swine may not be kept, etc.

1. No person shall keep any swine within 100 feet of any house.

2. No person shall keep any swine in any part of the district under the control of the Local Board, unless and until such premises or places to be used as a piggery have been examined and approved by the Inspector and licensed by the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 18.

For the prevention of danger to the public from manufactories or places for the storage of inflammable materials.

1. No person shall permit on any premises owned or occupied by him any accumulation of straw, paper, shavings, empty cases, or other inflammable material.

2. Any person who, after two hours' notice from the Inspector, shall neglect to remove such inflammable material shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and, on conviction, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding £5 and not less than 5s., for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

BY-LAW No. 19.

For the disinfection of and the prevention of nuisance or injury to health from poultry yards, rags, or other materials used or stored in marine stores.

1. No person shall keep any premises as a poultry yard at a less distance than 25 feet from any dwelling.

2. Every poultry yard shall be kept in a clean condition and disinfected at least once a week with lime, ashes, or other suitable disinfectant.

3. No rags or other materials used or stored in marine stores, flock or bedding or furniture manufactories shall be kept so as to cause a nuisance or to be injurious to health.

BY-LAW No. 20.

For the prevention of the use of steam whistles at factories, etc.

No person or owner of any factory or other establishment shall use or cause to be used any steam whistle so as to be a nuisance to any person.

BY-LAW No. 21.

Specifying the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing.

Unless otherwise provided for, the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing required to be done by any Inspector or officer shall be determined by the Local Board, according to the nature of the case.

BY-LAW No. 22.

For preventing offensive matter running out of premises.

1. It shall not be lawful for the owner, proprietor, or any employee of or in any manufactory, brewery, slaughterhouse, knacker's yard, butcher's or fishmonger's shops, laundry, or dunghill, to allow any offensive matter to escape and flow upon any street, lane, way, or thoroughfare, or land within the district of the Local Board.

2. All such offensive matter shall be placed in a suitable receptacle, and emptied as often as necessary, to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

BY-LAW No. 23.

Regulating the deposit of rubbish, etc.

1. The occupier of every house or premises shall, on written notice from the Inspector, and within the time specified in such notice, provide such and so many receptacles or boxes of the material and of the dimensions as may be required by the Local Board for the temporary deposit of house refuse.

2. The occupier of such house, or if there be no occupier, then the owner, shall regularly collect all refuse or rubbish

from such premises and place the same in the receptacles; and he shall not permit or suffer such receptacle to overflow or become offensive, and shall, when necessary or directed by the Inspector or officer of the Local Board, thoroughly disinfect the same forthwith.

3. Every receptacle as aforesaid shall be kept in such place or position as the Inspector may point out, and so as to be convenient for the removal of the contents thereof.

4. Every owner or occupier, or if there be no occupier, then the owner, of every house or premises to which a receptacle as aforesaid is attached or used, shall cause the same to be emptied at least once a week, or as often as the Inspector may direct.

5. The owner or occupier of such premises shall, after notice from the Inspector, and within the time limited in such notice, replace by a new and approved receptacle any receptacle that the Inspector may deem worn out or unfit for use.

BY-LAW No. 24.

Receptacles to be kept in an inoffensive condition.

All receptacles required by "The Health Act, 1898," or under these By-laws, shall be kept in an inoffensive condition by the householder or occupier.

BY-LAW No. 25.

Regulating the removal of offensive matter.

Every person who shall convey any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected, placed, or found in or about any house, stable, cow-house, pigsty, lane, yard, street, or place whatsoever, through or along any street or lane, shall previous to and during the whole time of such conveyance cause such dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected to be covered with lime or suitable substance, or shall adopt such other precautions as respectively may be necessary to prevent the emission of noxious or offensive odour or effluvia therefrom; and the same shall not be deposited in any place within the district other than the place set apart by the Local Board for that purpose.

BY-LAW No. 26.

Regulating the disposal of the carcasses of dead animals.

In the event of death or any accident necessitating the slaughter of any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animal, the carcass of such animal shall be removed to a safe distance beyond the district, or to such place as the Local Board may direct, and there thoroughly burned and destroyed or buried to the satisfaction of the Inspector, by the owner or person in charge of such animal, as the case may be.

BY-LAW No. 27.

Regulating the burning of offal and other offensive matter.

No person shall burn any offal, rags, clippings or parings of leather, or any offensive matter so as to be offensive to any person or resident in the neighbourhood of such burning.

BY-LAW No. 28.

Regulating the removal of slops.

1. Any person who shall be ordered by the Local Board or its Inspectors shall provide and maintain proper water-tight vehicles or receptacles fitting with close-fitting covers or lids for the purpose of carting or receiving any slops or suds, house refuse, waste, or other matter or substance used in any laundry which is likely to become a nuisance or offensive by reason of exposure.

2. All such vehicles or receptacles shall be kept in such convenient places so as to be readily removed as may be directed by the Inspector, so as not to be a nuisance to any person, and shall be kept in a thoroughly sanitary condition and removed at least once a week and cleansed and disinfected both inside and out.

BY-LAW No. 29.

Regulating the deposit of offensive liquid, etc.

No foul or offensive water or other offensive liquid, and no garbage, sweepings, or other offensive matter or thing shall be pumped, emptied, swept, thrown, or otherwise discharged or deposited into or upon any street, lane, yard, vacant land, or other place, whether public or private, within the district without the consent of the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 30.

Restricting contracts.

No individual householder shall contract for the removal of nightsoil or any other refuse or offensive matter whatever, except with the person licensed by the Local Board, and in accordance with these By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 31.

Regulating the carrying off of storm or rain water.

Every owner shall cause all buildings to be provided with spoutings, downpipes, and drains sufficient to carry off all storm or rain water.

1. Seats to be hinged, so as to lift up for inspection and cleaning.
2. The top of no pan or receptacle to be under any circumstances more than 1in. from the under surface of the seat.
3. Guide bars to be inserted, to insure placing of pan in exact position by nightman.
4. All floors under pans to be made impervious. A 24-gauge galvanised-iron tray would meet most cases.
5. All urinals to be provided with removable receptacles, and all soak wells, concrete pits, etc., to be removed or disinfected and filled in.
6. Make the privy doors 8in. shorter than the opening, and hang it 4in. above the floor.
7. Arrange for ventilation near the ceiling or through it.

In the absence of the in-door physician or the in-door surgeon, his work shall be done by the corresponding out-door physician or out-door surgeon, as the case may be. REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH STONE WILL BE
CRUSHED AND TAILINGS TREATED AT THE STATE
BATTERIES AFTER 1ST JULY, 1903.1135
1903Department of Mines,
Perth, 13th August, 1903.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the powers conferred upon him by Section 29 of "The Mining Development Act, 1902," has been pleased to make the following Regulations under which Stone will be crushed and Tailings treated at the State Batteries after 1st July, 1903.

H. GREGORY,
Minister for Mines.

1. All stone accepted for treatment at the State batteries shall be estimated at 21 cubic feet per ton, except where weighing machines are provided, when stone must pass over same to ascertain weight.

2. The manager of the battery may refuse any stone considered too poor to pay crushing charges, unless a deposit is paid in advance.

3. The charge for crushing, as determined from time to time by the Hon. the Minister for Mines, shall be posted up at each battery and strictly adhered to while in force.

4. A minimum charge will be made for all parcels of less tonnage than will return £5 on the rate charged per ton.

5. Payment for crushing shall be made to the manager on completion of treatment, or sufficient gold will be retained to pay for the amount due.

6. Where no cyanide plant has been erected at a battery, any person desirous of claiming tailings, the proceeds of his crushing, shall remove them from the battery site immediately the crushing is completed, otherwise they will be treated as abandoned tailings.

7. Where a cyanide plant has been erected at a battery, tailings resulting from stone crushed at that battery will be treated, but the manager may, in his discretion, refuse to treat any tailings should he consider them unsuitable for treatment by cyanide.

8. The number of tons of tailings suitable for cyanide treatment by the ordinary leaching vat plant installed at the battery shall be determined by the manager, whose decision shall be final; provided that in no case shall such tonnage exceed eighty per cent. of the number of tons milled. Where a slimes plant is working in conjunction with the ordinary vat system, the combined tonnage of sand and slimes shall not exceed 90 per cent. of the tons milled.

9. The manager shall take samples of the tailings as they pass through the battery, or from the pit into which the tailings may be deposited. The tailings collected shall be thoroughly mixed and divided into three samples, one for assay by the manager, one for the owner, and one sealed and kept by the manager for reference. The assay of the manager's sample will be available on application within fourteen days from the completion of any crushing, and should the owner dispute such assay, he shall within six weeks of the completion of the crushing notify the manager to that effect, in writing, and shall at the same time forward a certificate from a competent assayer. On receipt of such certificate the results of the two assays will be averaged, provided that the difference between them does not exceed six grains; but should the difference in the assay exceed six grains and should the owner still refuse to accept the manager's assay, the manager shall forward the sealed sample previously referred to, to the Government assayer, Perth, and the result of the assay as furnished by him shall be considered as final. The cost of such assay (fifteen shillings) shall be borne by the party whose assay differs most widely from the referee assay.

10. A clean-up will be made about every two months, when the Department will make a *pro rata* distribution, based upon the original assay value of the tailings, the estimated extraction therefrom, and the actual extraction. After the deduction of ten shillings per ton for cost of treatment, the owners of tailings treated will receive the amount due to them within 14 days after the value of the bullion has been ascertained.

11. All tailings assaying less than 3dwts. 3grs. per ton shall become the property of the Government.

12. A charge of ten shillings per ton for treatment shall be the first charge on all tailings treated, and the gold contents of tailings will be paid for at the rate of Four pounds per ounce.

13. All tailings collected for treatment by the owner will be treated at the rate of 27 cubic feet per ton.

14. The Department reserves the right to suspend operations from any cause whatsoever, and will accept no responsibility for delays in treatment.

15. At every battery there will be kept a book in which shall be recorded the number of tons in each parcel lodged for treatment, the name, locality and number of the lease or holding from which it was obtained, and the name of the person for whom the stone is to be crushed.

A copy of the foregoing rules shall be inserted in the said book, and every person sending stone for treatment shall sign opposite the entry relating to the stone lodged by him, and such signature shall be sufficient evidence that he is cognisant of the foregoing rules, and agrees to be bound by them.

The atmospheric pressure was fairly normal throughout the State. There were no remarkable anti-cyclones or severe depressions. The temperature in the day time was below the average for previous years throughout the extra tropical portion of the State, and fairly normal at night. In the tropics it varied on either side of the normal.

The weather was mostly fine during the first half of the month, but from the 15th to the end it was raining on nearly every day in South-West and South districts. The total fall recorded was generally about or slightly above the average for previous years, except in the tropics, where most of the stations reported "nil."

The total fall from the commencement of the year up to the end of July at the Observatory was 14.55 inches, and this is 6.25 inches below the corresponding average for previous years.

No very severe frosts have been reported, but the temperature has been a few degrees below freezing at several stations. The following table shows the mean minimum and absolute lowest temperatures recorded on the surface of the ground at those places which are provided with self-recording terrestrial thermometers :-
