ANNEXATION TO BROAD ARROW MUNICIPALITY.

PROCLAMATION 1895

Western Australia, By His Excellency Admiral Sir Frederick TO WIT. 5 George Denham Bedforn, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

W HEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," the Governor may by Proclamation annex any land forming with the municipal district of some Municipality one continuous area to such Municipality: AND WHEREAS a petition has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, signed with the common seal of the Municipality of Broad Arrow, praying for the annexation to the Municipality of Broad Arrow of a portion of land severed from the Broad Arrow Road Board: And whereas the said petition was publicly advertised in the Government Gazette on the 21st day of August, 1903: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers so vested in me by the said Act, do hereby annex to the Municipality of Broad Arrow the area con-tained within the following boundaries:—

Bounded by lines starting from a point situate 160° 25′ 1 chain 50 links from the South-West corner of Broad Arrow Town Lot 478, and extending 160° 25′ about 118 chains, 252° 57′ about 66 chains, 340° 25′ about 130 chains, 70° 25′ about 64 chains, 160° 25′ 13 chains 43 links, and 70° 25′ 1 chain 50 links to the starting point; excluding existing gold mining leases within these boundaries.

The entire boundaries of the Broad Arrow Municipality being as follows:

Bounded by lines starting from a point situate 160° 25′ 1 chain 50 links from the South-West corner of Broad Arrow Town Lot 478, and extending 160° 25′ about 118 chains; thence 252° 57′ about 66 chains: thence 340° 25′ about 130 chains; thence 70° 25′ about 38 chains; thence 340° 25′ about 77 chains; thence 155° 33′, passing along the Northern side of a public street to the Western boundary of G.M.L. 757W; thence 70° 25′ about 36 chains 50 links, 160° 25′ about 52 chains; thence 70° 25′ about 40 chains, 160° 25′ about 43 chains 50 links: thence 250° 25′ 65 chains 160° 25′ about 43 chains 50 links; thence 250° 25′ 65 chains to the starting point.

REGULATIONS UNDER "THE FISHERY ACT, 1889."

By His Excellency Admiral Sir Frederick George Denman Bedford, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

W HEREAS by Section 6 of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the Government Gazette, amongst other things—

- 1. To prescribe limits in or about the mouth of, or within any river, creek, stream, estuary, or other inlet of the sea within which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine;
- 2. To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and

and to impose such reasonable penalties not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) and forfeitures as the Governor in Council may think fit for any breach of such regulations.

His Excellency the Governor in Council does by these Regulations declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine in any part of Warnbro' Sound (otherwise known as Safety Bay), more particularly described in Schedule attached hereto, during the season commencing on the fifteenth day of October and ceasing on the thirty-first day of December, both days inclusive, in each and every year till further notice.

And also that it shall be unlawful for any person to fish with a line within the said Sound or Bay except between the times of five o'clock a.m. and eight o'clock a.m. (which will be notified by the flying of a flag from the Government launch at five o'clock and the lowering thereof at eight o'clock a.m. for a period of six days per week, commencing as from and inclusive of Monday in each and every week during the season), commencing on the fifteenth day of October and ceasing on the thirty-first day of December, both days inclusive, in each and every year till further notice

Every person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty on conviction of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and shall forfeit the instruments used and all fish that shall have been taken.

WHEREAS by "The Fishery Act, 1889" (53 Vict., No. 4), and "The Fisheries Act, 1899" (63 Vict., No. 47), the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to declare any Western Australian waters to be close waters for all or any kind of fishing, and for any time specified in such Proclamation: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that Thompson's Bay, Rottnest Island, should be declared close waters for fishing by means of any net or fixed engine: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation, declare Thompson's Bay, Rottnest Island, more particularly described in Schedule hereto attached, to be close waters for fishing by means of any net or fixed engine from and after the thirtieth day of September, 1903.

BY-LAWS OF THE CARNARVON LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

No. 15.

Regulating the disinfecting or deodorising of nightsoil contained in places for the deposit thereof, and regulating the disinfecting and deodorising of any nightsoil removed therefrom, and preventing injury to health arising from the transport, deposit, or use as manure of nightsoil.

No nightsoil or any human urine, whether mixed with other substances or not, or any solution of nightsoil, shall be removed from any place or depôt duly authorised for the reception, utilisation, or deposit of nightsoil or human urine, without having been first subjected to a heat of not less than 212° Fahrenheit for not less than 15 minutes.

WESTERN AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT.

PORT CHARGES.

HARBOUR AND LIGHT DEPARTMENT, FREMANTLE.

A LL previous Port Regulations and Charges respecting the Harbour and Light Department at Fremantle are hereby repealed, and the following Port Charges substituted in their stead:—

LIGHT DUES.

Foreign-going Vessels.—All vessels, except where otherwise specially provided by these Regulations, arriving from parts beyond seas shall be chargeable with light dues at the rate of twopence (2d.) per ton inward and twopence (2d.) per ton outward on their net registered tonnage.

The master of any vessel who has paid light dues at any one port in Western Australia, and who may desire to visit other ports in the State for the purpose of loading or unloading thereat, may obtain from the Chief Harbour Master a certificate to that effect, and such certificate shall free him from payment of light dues at any other port in Western Australia for a period of three (3) months from the date thereof; and in the event of such vessel leaving the State and returning within the period of two (2) months and not loading or discharging more than one-quarter (4) of her net registered tonnage, such certificate shall free the said vessel from payment of light dues as above.

Vessels calling for supplies.—All vessels calling for supplies or coal (but not broaching or shipping cargo or landing or embarking passengers) shall be charged a fixed sum of five pounds (£5.)

Coasting Vessels.—Owners of coasting vessels may compound the payment of tonnage and light dues exigible in any port of this State, excepting the Port of Fremantle (on entering which port such vessel shall be free from payment of light dues only) by one annual payment of tenpence (10d.) per ton on their net registered tonnage. The owner of any vessel compounding as provided for in this Regulation may obtain from the Chief Harbour Master a certificate

to the effect that the vessel therein named is free from payment of all light dues throughout the State and from tonnage dues throughout the State, excepting the Port of Fremantle, up to the 31st day of December next ensuing and no longer.

Applicants prior to the 30th June in any year will be required to pay full rates; those subsequent to that date will only be required to pay one half (½) the amount. Owners of coasting vessels not compounding their dues as aforesaid will be required to pay light dues as laid down for foreigngoing vessels, i.e., twopence (2d.) per ton in and out of any one port each three months, and tonnage dues at the rate of one penny (1d.) per ton on all cargo landed or shipped at any port in the State other than the Port of Fremantle.

Interstate steamers extending their trips to Bunbury or Geraldton, and returning to the Port of Fremantle, shall pay one-third ($\frac{1}{3}$ d.) penny per ton on their net registered tonnage extra per trip.

Any such vessel making either of the above-mentioned trips, and not returning to the Port of Fremantle, shall pay one penny (1d.) per ton on their net registered tonnage extra per trip.

Any vessel making an intermediate trip or trips on the coast between the Port of Fremantle and the North-West Cape, or between Fremantle and Eucla, shall pay one-half penny (\frac{1}{2}d.) per ton on their net registered tonnage per trip; or between Fremantle and any port North of the North-West Cape, twopence (2d.) per ton on their net registered tonnage per trip; provided always that such vessel shall return to the Port of Fremantle, at which port such dues shall be made payable.

Any vessel making an intermediate trip or trips on the coast and not returning to the Port of Fremantle shall pay the following dues:—

per ton on their net registered tonnage per trip.

Any vessel making a coastal trip or trips not provided for in these Regulations, and returning to the Port of Fremantle, shall pay one-third penny (\frac{1}{2}d.) per ton; or any vessel making such trips and not returning to the Port of Fremantle shall pay one penny per ton on their net registered tonnage per trip.

VESSELS CALLING FOR SHELTER OR IN DISTRESS.

No charge will be made against any vessel using, for the purpose of shelter only, any of the anchorages of the ports

Interstate steamers.—Interstate steamers shall not pay the regular scale of light dues as laid down for foreigngoing vessels, but in lieu thereof shall pay one penny per ton on their net registered tonnage per entry into the port when coming direct to Fremantle and leaving direct for other States.

Ocean-going mail steamers.—All mail steamers, recognised as such by the Government of Western Australia, whether such mail steamers be British or foreign, trading between the Australasian Colonies and Europe or America, shall pay a fixed sum of Ten pounds (£10) per entry into the port.

 $\it Vessels$ of $\it War, etc.$ —The following vessels shall be exempt from light dues:—

- (1.) All vessels of war.
- (2.) All vessels chartered on behalf of His Majesty's Government.
- (3.) All vessels belonging to the Government of any of His Majesty's Colonies.
- (4.) All private yachts, and all vessels belonging to any recognised Yacht Club in any of His Majesty's Dominions.

Compounded Dues.

Interstate Steamers.—Interstate steamers calling at any Western Australian port or ports en route to the Port of Fremantle, or on their return trip, shall pay upon each entry into the Port of Fremantle a fixed sum of one penny and half-penny (1½d,) per ton on their net registered tonnage; such sum shall also cover light and tonnage dues at the port or ports called at as aforesaid, and shall be made payable at Fremantle.

REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH STONE WILL BE CRUSHED AND TAILINGS TREATED AT THE STATE BATTERIES AFTER 1st JULY, 1903.

Department of Mines, TIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the powers conferred man him by G. 1. under the powers conferred upon him by Section 29 of "The Mining Development Act, 1902," has been pleased to make the following Regulations under which Stone will be crushed and Tailings treated at the State Batteries after 1st July, 1903.

H. GREGORY, Minister for Mines.

- 1. All stone accepted for treatment at the State batteries shall be estimated at 21 cubic feet per ton, except where weighing machines are provided, when stone must pass over same to ascertain weight.
- 2. The manager of the battery may refuse any stone considered too poor to pay crushing charges, unless a deposit is paid in advance.
- 3. The charge for crushing, as determined from time to time by the Hon. the Minister for Mines, shall be posted up at each battery and strictly adhered to while in force.
- A minimum charge will be made for all parcels of less tonnage than will return £5 on the rate charged per ton.
- 5. Payment for crushing shall be made to the manager on completion of treatment, or sufficient gold will be retained to pay for the amount due.
- 6. Where no cyanide plant has been erected at a battery, any person desirous of claiming tailings, the proceeds of his crushing, shall remove them from the battery site immediately the crushing is completed, otherwise they will be treated as abandoned tailings.

- Where a cyanide plant has been erected at a battery tailings resulting from stone crushed at that battery will be treated, but the manager may, in h's discretion, refuse to treat any tailings should be consider them unsuitable for treatment by cyanide.
- 8. The number of tons of tailings suitable for cyanide treatment by the ordinary leaching vat plant installed at the battery shall be determined by the manager, whose decision shall be final; provided that in no case shall such tonnage exceed eighty per cent. of the number of tons milled. Where a slimes plant is working in conjunction with the ordinary vat system, the combined tonnage of sand and slimes shall not exceed 90 per cent. of the tons milled.
- 9. The manager shall take samples of the tailings as 9. The manager shall take samples of the tailings as they pass through the battery, or from the pit into which the tailings may be deposited. The tailings collected shall be thoroughly mixed and divided into three samples, one for assay by the manager, one for the owner, and one sealed and kept by the manager for reference. The assay of the manager's sample will be available on application within fourteen days from the completion of any crushing, and should the owner dispute such assay, he shall within six weeks of the completion of the crushing notify the manager weeks of the completion of the crushing notify the manager to that effect, in writing, and shall at the same time forward a certificate from a competent assayer. On receipt of such certificate the results of the two assays will be averaged, provided that the difference between them does not exceed six grains; but should the difference in the assay exceed six grains; but should the difference in the assay exceed six grains, and should the owner still refuse to accept the manager's assay, the manager shall forward the sealed sample previously referred to, to the Government assayer, Perth, and the result of the assay as furnished by him shall be considered as final. The cost of such assay (fifteen shillings) shall be borne by the party whose assay differs meet widely from the reference near. most widely from the referee assay.
- 10. A clean-up will be made about every two months, when the Department will make a pro rata distribution, based upon the original assay value of the tailings, the estimated extraction therefrom, and the actual extraction. After the deduction of ten shillings per ton for cost of treatment, the owners of tailings treated will receive the amount due to them within 14 days after the value of the bullion has been ascertained.
- 11. All tailings assaying less than 3dwts. 3grs. per ton shall become the property of the Government.
- A charge of ten shillings per ten for treatment shall be the first charge on all tailings treated, and the gold contents of tailings will be paid for at the rate of Four pounds per ounce.
- 13. All tailings collected for treatment by the owner will be treated at the rate of 27 cubic feet per ton.
- 14. The Department reserves the right to suspend operations from any cause whatsoever, and will accept no responsibility for delays in treatment.
- 15. At every battery there will be kept a book in which shall be recorded the number of tons in each parcel lodged for treatment, the name, locality and number of the lease or holding from which it was obtained, and the name of the person for whom the stone is to be crushed.

copy of the foregoing rules shall be inserted in the said book, and every person sending stone for treatment shall sign opposite the entry relating to the stone lodged by him, and such signature shall be sufficient evidence that he is cognisant of the foregoing rules, and agrees to be bound by them.
