REGULATIONS UNDER "THE FISHERY ACT, 1889."

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } FRED. G. D. BEDFORD, Governor. [L.S.]

By His Excellency Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

WHEREAS by Section 6 of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the Government Gazette, amongst other things

- 7. To prescribe limits in or about the mouth of, or within any river, creek, stream, estuary, or other inlet of the sea within which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed
- 2. To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease:

and to impose such reasonable penalties not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) and forfeitures as the Governor in Council may think fit for any breach of such regulations:

His Excellency the Governor in Council does by these Regulations declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine in any part of Warnbro' Sound (otherwise known as Safety Bay), more particularly described in Schedule attached hereto, during the season commencing on the fifteenth day of October and ceasing on the thirty-first day of December, both days inclusive, in each and every year till further notice.

And also that it shall be unlawful for any person to fish with a line within the said Sound or Bay except between the times of five o'clock a.m. and eight o'clock a.m. (which will be notified by the flying of a flag from the Government launch at five o'clock and the lowering thereof at eight o'clock a.m.) for a period of six days per week, commencing as from and inclusive of Monday in each and every week during the season commencing on the fifteenth day of October and ceasing on the thirty-first day of December, both days inclusive, in each and every year till further notice.

Every person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty on conviction of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and shall forfeit the instruments used and all fish that shall have been taken.

HEREAS by "The Fishery Act, 1889" (53 Vict., No. 4), and "The Fisheries Act, 1899" (63 Vict., No. 47), the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to declare any Western Australian waters to be close waters for all or any kind of fishing, and for any time specified in such Proclamation: AND WHEREAS

it is deemed expedient that Thompson's Bay, Rottnest Island, should be declared close waters for fishing by means of any net or fixed engine: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation, declare Thompson's Bay, Rottnest Island, more particularly described in Schedule hereto attached, to be close waters for fishing by means of any net or fixed engine from and after the thirtieth day of September, 1903.

STOCK REGULATIONS.

(The Stock Diseases Act, 1895.)

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 7th day of October, 1903.

Present :

WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered by Order in Council, to be published in the Government Gazette, from time to time to make, vary, alter, or revoke such Regulations under this Act as may be deemed expedient for all or any of the following purposes:—(1.) For regulating the conditions upon which any stock may be introduced or imported into the State; (2.) For the inspection of imported stock; (3.) For the seizure and destruction of infected stock; (4.) For the purpose of subjecting any stock to such reta.) For the purpose of subjecting any stock to such restrictions or remedial measures as may be deemed necessary to prevent the introduction or spread of disease; (5.) For providing for the steps to be taken in case of any disease breaking out among any stock in the State, and for preventing the spread of such disease; (6.) For prescribing the manner in which persons coming into contact with infected stock, and land, premises, or conveyances travelled over or used by infected stock shall be cleansed and dis-infected; (7.) For the regulation, management, and control of quarantine grounds, and for prescribing the treatment and control of stock whilst in quarantine or in transit thereto or therefrom; (8.) For prescribing the term during which stock shall be quarantined; (9) For regulating the charges to be made for conveying stock to or from quarantine, and their care, maintenance, and inspection while in quarantine; (10) Generally for all or any such purposes as he may deem necessary for preventing the introduction or spread of disease: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, does bearing the the following Recorder transports the stock of the secutive council, does hereby make the following Regulations under the said Act.

- 1. Every owner within the boundaries of the State known as the "South-West Division" shall, between the 1st day of October and the 31st day of December in every year, dip, or cause to be dipped, all sheep running on land whereof he is the occupier: Provided that, on the application whereof he is the occupier: Provided that, on the application of any owner, an Inspector may grant an extension of the time in which such owner shall dip his sheep, but so that such extension shall not exceed sixty days prior to the month of June: Provided also that the sheep shall be dipped in some specific known to be fatal to ticks and lice, and for every sheep not so dipped such owner shall be liable to a fine not exceeding two shillings.
- 2. If any Inspector is satisfied that any sheep in a flock are affected with ticks or lice, he may give the owner notice to dip such flock forthwith to the satisfaction of the said Inspector, or any other Inspector; but if the Inspector is satisfied that such sheep are intended and fit for slaughter, he may postpone the giving of such notice to dip for a period not exceeding fourteen days: Provided that every owner who refuses, neglects, or fails to comply with such notice on or before the date specified therein is liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds; and if immediately after the date of such conviction such sheep shall not be dipped to the satisfaction of any Inspector, such owner shall, upon conviction, be liable to a further penalty not exceeding fifty pounds, and so on for each and every succeeding conviction.
- 3. Every person who by himself, his agent, or servant, drives, without the permission of an Inspector, or suffers to stray across or upon any land, or drives, depastures, or suffers to stray upon or along any highway any sheep affected with lice or tick, is liable, on conviction, for every day during which such stock shall be driven, depastured, or suffered to stray, to a penalty not exceeding five pounds nor less than two pounds.
- 4. If any sheep affected with tick or lice shall be found in any pound, or in any yard or yards, or on any land or other place at which sheep are offered for sale or exhibited for show purposes, the owner exposing the sheep so affected shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds: Provided that any Inspector, if he deems it necessary, may order the withdrawal from sale of any sheep affected with ticks or lice until such sheep have been dipped or dressed to the satisfaction of such Inspector or any other Inspector, and shall give notice to the aforesaid owner of such sheep to dip or dress the same forthwith, at such place as the Inspector may direct; and every such owner who refuses,

neglects, or fails to comply with the aforesaid notice is liable to a further penalty not exceeding twenty pounds. But if the Inspector is satisfied that such sheep are intended for immediate slaughter, he may withhold such notice to

- 5. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations, it shall not be necessary to dip any ewe affected with lice or ticks during such time previous to or after her lambing as the Inspector may appoint; and for such purpose any Inspector may, in respect of ewes, extend any notice to dip for such time as he shall think fit.
- 6. Within seven days after the dipping of his sheep the owner shall make a statutory declaration before a Justice of the Peace, stating that he has dipped his sheep in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations, the date of dipping, the number of sheep dipped, and the class of dip used: Provided also that he shall forward a copy of this declaration to the Chief Inspector of Stock, at Perth, and retain the original in his possession for production when called upon to do so by an Inspector.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1898.

BY-LAWS OF THE LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH OF THE DISTRICT OF NORTH PERTH.

THE DISTRICT OF NORTH PERTH.

The Municipal Council of North Perth, being the Local Board of Health for the District of North Perth, in pursuance of the powers vested in it, and by virtue of "The Health Act, 1898," and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, hereby repeals By-laws Nos. nine (9) to twenty-one (21), gazetted on the 12th day of December, 1902, and hereby, in pursuance of such powers and authorities aforesaid, makes and publishes the following By-laws in lieu thereof By-laws in lieu thereof:

PART 1.—INTERPRETATION.

1. The interpretation of words used in these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, shall be in accordance with Section 3 of "The Health Act, 1898."

The following words in these By-laws shall be interpreted as follows, viz. :-

- (a.) "Cowshed" means any building or premises in which milking cows or goats may be kept;
- (b.) "Cowkeeper" means any person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk.
- 53.—For the Inspection of all Dairy Farms and MILK STORES.
- 1. Every cowkeeper or occupier of a dairy farm or milk store, which the Officer of Health or Inspector may visit for the purpose of inspection, and every person for the time being having the care or control of any such dairy farm or milk store, shall afford such Officer of Health or Inspector all reasonable assistance that may, for the purpose of inspection, be required of him.
- -For the Inspection of Grazing Grounds of Dairy CATTLE, AND FOR PROHIBITING THE USE OF THE SAME IF LIKELY TO BE PREJUDICIAL TO HEALTH BY AFFECTING THE MILK OR OTHERWISE.
- 1. Every cowkeeper or occupier of a dairy, and every 1. Every cowkeeper or occupier of a dairy, and every person in charge of any dairy, which may be visited by an Officer of Health or Inspector for the purpose of ascertaining the position of and inspecting the grazing ground upon which the dairy cattle may be depastured, shall afford such Officer of Health or Inspector all reasonable assistance that may be required of him for such inspection.
- 2. Every cowkeeper shall, upon being directed so to do by any Medical Officer of Health, forthwith remove his milking cows from any portion of the grazing land upon which they may be depasturing, if such grazing ground has been found or suspected or is likely to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk of the cows.
 - (a.) He shall not, until permission in writing is given him by such Medical Officer of Health, permit or suffer any of his dairy cattle to graze or be depastured upon such prohibited land.
- 55.—For the Inspection of Cattle in Dairies, and for prescribing and regulating the Lighting, Venti-LATION, CLEANSING, DRAINAGE, AND WATER SUPPLIES OF HOUSES, DAIRIES, AND COWSHEDS IN THE OCCUPA-TION OF PERSONS FOLLOWING THE TRADE OF COW-KEEPERS OR DAIRYMEN.
- 1. Every cowkeeper or occupier of a dairy, or any person in charge of any dairy, which any Officer of Health or Inspector may visit for the purpose of inspecting any cattle therein, shall afford such Officer of Health or Inspector all reasonable assistance that may, for the purpose of inspection, be required of him.

Lighting and Ventilation.

- 2. In enclosed sheds, windows or openings placed in the walls or roofs at equal distances shall be provided, and the area of such windows or openings shall be at the rate of not less than one square foot to seven feet of the floor area of such shed, and no obstruction to natural light shall be permitted or suffered to be placed opposite or near to any of such openings or windows.
 - (a.) Every enclosed cowshed shall be provided with lantern louvred ventilators in roof or louvred ventilators in the sides thereof.

(b.) No cowkeeper shall permit any cowshed to be occupied by any cow unless a cubic air space of not less than 800 cubic feet is provided therein for each cow: Provided as follows:--In calculatfor each cow: Provided as follows:—In calculating the air space for the purpose of this By-law, no space shall be reckoned which is more than 16 feet above the floor, but if the roof or ceiling is inclined, then the mean height of the same above the floor may be taken as the height thereof for the purpose of this By-law.

Cleansing.

- 3. Every cowkeeper shall cause every part of the interior of every cowshed in his occupation to be thoroughly cleansed from time to time, as often as may be necessary, to secure that such cowshed shall be at all times reasonably clean and sweet.
 - (a.) Such person shall cause the ceiling or interior of the roof and the walls of every cowshed in his occupation to be properly lime-washed at least four times in every year, that is to say—once during each of the months of April, July, October, and January, and at such other times as may be necessary: Provided that this requirement shall not apply to any part of such ceiling, roof, or walls that may be properly painted or varnished, or constructed of or covered with any material such as to render the lime-washing unsuitable or inexpedient, and that may be otherwise properly cleansed.
 - (b.) He shall cause the floor of every cowshed to be thoroughly swept, and all dung and other offen-sive matter to be removed from such cowshed immediately after each milking.
 - (c.) He shall cause every stockyard to be kept in a cleanly condition, and shall from time to time, as often as may be necessary, collect and remove all dung or other offensive matters from such stockyard.

Drainage.

4. For the purpose of efficient drainage, the floors of all cowsheds shall be absolutely watertight, and shall have an even surface and solid foundation. Such floors may either be constructed of hard burnt bricks on edge, of equal quality, laid in cement mortar and grounded in cement or Portland cement concrete, having a thickness of at least 6in., or some similar material, and the floor shall have a fall to the gutter of not less than 1 in 36.

A surface gutter shall be constructed of some durable impervious material, and shall extend the whole length of the building, and shall not be less than 12in. in width, and shall be thoroughly watertight, of sufficient and uniform fall, shallow at its upper extremity and gradually deepening to the outlet, so that no fluid may lodge or stagnate therein. It shall not be less than 3in. deep at its upper extremity, nor more than 9in. deep at its outlet. Such surface gutter shall empty into a watertight receptacle capable of being easily emptied and readily and thoroughly cleansed.

- (a.) No cowkeeper shall cause or suffer any inlet to any drain of such cowshed to be within such cowshed.
- (b.) Every cowkeeper shall cause every stockyard used by him to be well drained.

Water supply.

- 5. Every cowkeeper shall keep in or in connection with every cowshed in his occupation a supply of water suitable and sufficient for all such purposes as may from time to time be reasonably necessary.
 - (a.) He shall cause every receptacle which may be provided for such water to be emptied and thoroughly cleansed from time to time, as often as may be necessary to prevent the pollution of any water that may be stored therein, and where such receptacle is used for the storage only of water, he shall cause it to be properly covered and ventilated, and so placed as to be at all times readily accessible.

 - (b.) If the water used for such purposes is obtained from a well, spring, stream, or other source of supply, he shall adopt every precaution to prevent any such source of supply being polluted.
 (c.) He shall, when directed to do so by the Local Board of Health, forthwith discontinue using the water for any purpose from any such source of supply, and shall forthwith obtain another supply of water from a source to be approved by such Inspector. by such Inspector.

- (d.) He shall, for the purpose of testing the purity or otherwise of the water used by him, assist and permit an Inspector, when so required, to obtain the necessary samples of such water for analysis.
- 56.-For prescribing the Precautions to be taken FOR PROTECTING MILK AGAINST INFECTION OR CON-
- 1. Every cowkeeper shall cause the two or three jets of milk first drawn at every milking from each teat of any cow milked on his premises to be rejected, and shall not permit or suffer such milk to fall into the milking pail or be mixed into the milk intended for sale.
 - (a.) Such cowkeeper shall not cause or suffer any cow belonging to him or under his care or control to be milked for the purpose of obtaining milk for sale, unless at the time of milking the udder and teats of such cow are thoroughly clean, and unless the hands of the person milking such cow are thoroughly clean and free from all infection and contamination.
 - (b.) He shall not suffer or permit any milk from a diseased cow to be mixed with other milk, or sold for human consumption.
 - (c.) He shall not permit or suffer any milk from a diseased cow to be used as food for pigs or other animals, unless it has been well boiled.
 - (d.) He shall not permit any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or recently in contact with or in attendance upon any other person so suffering, to milk any cow or handle any vessel used for containing milk, or take part in the preparation, storage, or distribution of any milk produced on his premises.
 - (e.) He shall cause the milk drawn from any cow on his premises (except as hereinbefore mentioned) to be forthwith taken to the milk room and there run through a suitable strainer and cooler.
- 2. Every cowkeeper, purveyor of milk, and person selling milk by retail, shall take all reasonable and proper precautions in and in connection with the storage and distribution of the milk, and otherwise to prevent the exposure of the milk to any infection or contamination.
 - (a.) He shall not deposit or keep any milk intended for sale, or any of the milk vessels used in his
 - 1. In any room or place where it or they would be liable to become infected or contaminated by impure air, or by any offensive, noxious, or deleterious gas or substance, or by any noxious or injurious emanation, exhalation, or effluvium; or
 - 2. In any room used as a kitchen, or as a living room; or
 - In any room or building or part of a build-ing communicating directly by door, window, or otherwise with any room used as a sleeping room, or in which there may be any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or which may have been used by any person suffering from any such disease, and may not have been properly disinfected; or
 - 4. In any room or building or part of a building in which there may be any direct inlet to any drain.
 - (b.) He shall not keep milk for sale, or cause or suffer any milk to be placed in any vessel, receptacle, or utensil which is not thoroughly clean.
 - (c.) He shall cause every vessel, receptacle, or utensil used by him for containing milk for sale to be thoroughly cleansed with steam or clean boiling water after it shall have been used, and to be maintained in a constant state of cleanliness.
 - (d.) He shall cause every wheeled vehicle used k him for the carriage or distribution of the milk to be thoroughly cleansed at least once in every
 - (e.) He shall cause all pans and other receptacles used by him in the carriage of milk to be furnished with closely fitting lids, and he shall not suffer or permit any rag, cloth, or other material to be used with any such lid.
 - (f.) He shall cause all vessels, utensils, receptacles, coolers, and articles used by him for containing milk to be properly tinned or enamelled, and maintained at all times in thorough repair.

3. No cowkeeper, purveyor of milk, or occupier of any milk store or milk shop shall store or keep any vessels, utensils, receptacles, coolers, or any article used to contain milk within 100 feet of a piggery or other offensive trade establishment.

GOVERNMENT

- 4. No cowkeeper, purveyor of milk, or occupier of a milk store or milk shop shall permit or suffer any dog, cat, fowl, or other animal to have access to the milk, milk room, or milking shed.
 - (a.) He shall not suffer or permit any cesspit for the reception of nightsoil to remain upon his premises.
 - (b.) He shall provide a sufficient number of privies, furnished with approved movable receptacles for nightsoil, for the use of persons residing or working upon his premises; and shall daily collect, remove, and dispose of all excrementations are former and the statement of the content of t titious matter, refuse, and noxious or offensive matters produced upon his premises, as he may from time to time be directed by an Inspector.
 - (c.) He shall not suffer or permit to be erected or He shall not suffer or permit to be erected or constructed, or to remain, any fowl house, cesspool, manure shed, privy, or urinal within a distance of 50 feet of any milking shed, milk room, or place where milk is stored or kept.
- 5. Every cowkeeper shall provide sufficient stabling accommodation for the horses employed by him in connection with his trade, and such stabling shall be disconnected from, and be at least 50 feet from, the milking shed and milk room.
 - (a.) He shall not suffer or permit any horse or other draught animal to be at any time stabled in his milking shed.
- 6. No cowkeeper shall permit any brewers' grain to be kept or stored within 50 feet of any milking shed or milk
 - 7. Every cowkeeper shall-
 - (a.) Provide on his dairy premises a detached room to be used for separating, straining, cooling, and storing milk, and for storing vessels and utensils used by him for containing milk when such vessels or utensils are not in actual use in the collecting or distribution of the milk.
 - (b.) Such cowkeeper shall cause such room to be constructed at least forty feet distant from any cowshed or stable, or other possible source of contamination, and at least 100 feet from any
 - (c.) He shall cause such room to be sufficiently ventilated, and shall cause all external openings to be fitted with fly-proof screens constructed of suitable materials.
 - (d.) He shall cause the floor of such room to be paved with flagstones, concrete, or other non-absorbent material properly set in cement.
 - (e.) He shall cause the internal wall surface to be covered with hard, smooth, and impervious material to a height of at least six feet from the floor, and such hard, smooth, and impervious material shall not be covered with cement-wash, lime-wash, or other substance.
 - (f.) He shall provide suitable apparatus for heating water in close proximity to such room.
 - (g.) He shall not permit or suffer any such apparatus for heating water to be used for washing or boiling bed or body linen, or for any other purpose which might cause contamination or infection of milk.
 - (h.) He shall not suffer or permit such room to be used for any other purpose than the manipula-tion or storage of milk, or the storage of milk vessels.
 - (i.) He shall at all times maintain such room in good order and repair, dust and fly proof, and scrupulously clean in every part, externally as well as internally, and in all its fittings.
 - (j.) He shall not suffer or permit any dog, fowl, or other animal to have access to such room.

Cleaning Utensils.

Every cowkeeper shall, from time to time, as often as may be necessary, cause every milk vessel that may be used by him for containing milk for sale to be thoroughly cleansed with steam or clean boiling water, and shall otherwise take all proper precautions for the maintenance of such milk vessels in a constant state of cleanliness.

(a.) He shall, on every occasion when any such vessel shall have been used to contain milk, or shall have been returned to him after having been out of his possession, cause such vessel forthwith recleansed with steam or clean boiling water.

Reporting Cases of Infectious Diseases.

- 9. Whenever any infectious or contagious disease occurs in any house or premises in the occupation of a cowkeeper or purveyor of milk, the occupier of such house or premises shall immediately report such occurrence to the Local or District Board of Health.
- 57 .- For destroying or removing from any Dairy, MILK STORE, OR MILK SHOP, OR MILK YARD ANY DISEASED COW OR OTHER ANIMALS, AND FOR REMOVING ANY SICK PERSONS FROM THE PREMISES OF ANY SUCH DAIRY, MILK STORE, MILK SHOP, OR MILK YARD.
- Every cowkeeper shall cause every cow or other animal deemed to be infected at the time being in his care or under his control to be isolated or removed from all possible contact with other dairy cattle, upon being directed so to do by an Inspector.
- 2. He shall also cause any such cow or other animal to be destroyed forthwith upon receipt of an order from the Local or District Board of Health to that effect; and he shall also cause such cow or other animal to be destroyed in the manner specified in such order.

Removal of Sick.

3. Every cowkeeper or purveyor of milk shall, when ordered to do so by the Local or District Board of Health, forthwith remove from the premises of any dairy, milk store, milk shop, or milk yard any sick person that may be therein.

58.—PENALTIES.

Any person guilty of any breach of any of the foregoing By-laws is liable, for every such offence, in addition to the payment of any costs or expenses which may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person guilty of such offence, and of any costs or expenses which may be incurred in remedying such default, as particularly provided for in the last to a possity not exceeding the sum of for in the Act, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Twenty pounds, and to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Twenty shillings for each day during which such offence is continued by such person. (Vide 62 Vict., No. 20, sec. 242.)

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Collie, made under "The Weights and Measures Act, 1899," and "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and numbered 59, for regulating the Scale of Charges for comparing and stamping weights, measures, scales, balances, or other weighing machines.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Collie order as follows

By-Law No. 59.

The Weights and Measures Act, 1899.

The fee specified in the Schedule hereunder shall be charged, received, and taken by the Inspector of Weights and Measures, for and on behalf of the Municipal Council of Collie, for comparing with authorised copies and stamping (if found correct) weights and measures, scales, beams, balances, steelyards, and other weighing machines. All such fees to be paid to the said Inspector before delivery to the owner of such weights and measures, beams, scales, steelyards or weighing machines. steelyards, or weighing machines.

SCHEDULE REFERRED TO:

For comparing weights with authorised copies, and stamping when

Avoirdupois Weight.

For each weight of 56lbs., if of brass, 1s.; if of iron, 9d. For each weight of 28lbs., if of brass, 9d.; if of iron, 6d. For each weight of 14lbs., if of brass, 6d.; if of iron, 4d. For each weight of less than 14lbs., if of brass, 4d.; if of iron, 3d.

Troy Weight.

For each weight of 50czs., and any weight exceeding 50czs., 1s.

For each weight of 40 czs., 9d.

For each weight of 30czs., 7d.

For each weight of 20czs., 6d.

For each weight of 10czs., 4d.

For each weight of 4czs. or under, 3d.

For examining and comparing balances, beams, scales, steelyards, and other weighing machines, including stamping when necessary:—

Avoirdupois Weight.

For each, if constructed to weigh not exceeding 56lbs., 6d. If constructed to weigh more than 56lbs., and not more than 1cwt..

If constructed to weigh more than lewt., for the first cwt. 1s. For each additional cwt., or part thereof, 6d.

For each cut, or part thereof, exclusive of carting weights necessary for testing 1s. 3d.

For examining and comparing balances, scales, beams, or other weighing machines, including stamping when necessary:—

Troy Weight.

For each constructed to weigh not more than 50ozs., 1s.

A written record, signed by the person making the tests and examination, shall be made in the book required to be kept at the mine in accordance with General Rule 27 of Section 23 of 'The Mines Regulation Act, 1895,' forthwith upon the completion of the same, and the said record shall state the true date upon which the said tests and examinations were made."

REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH STONE WILL BE CRUSHED AND TAILINGS TREATED AT THE STATE BATTERIES AFTER 1ST JULY, 1903.

Department of Mines,
Perth, 13th August, 1903.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council,
under the powers conferred upon him by Section 29
of "The Mining Development Act, 1902," has been pleased
to make the following Regulations under which Stone will
be crushed and Tailings treated at the State Batteries after
1st July, 1903.

H. GREGORY,

Minister for Mines.

- 1. All stone accepted for treatment at the State batteries shall be estimated at 21 cubic feet per ton, except where weighing machines are provided, when stone must pass over same to ascertain weight.
- 2. The manager of the battery may refuse any stone considered too poor to pay crushing charges, unless a deposit is paid in advance.
- 3. The charge for crushing, as determined from time to time by the Hon. the Minister for Mines, shall be posted up at each battery and strictly adhered to while in force.
- 4. A minimum charge will be made for all parcels of less tonnage than will return £5 on the rate charged per ton,
- 5. Payment for crushing shall be made to the manager on completion of treatment, or sufficient gold will be retained to pay for the amount due.
- 6. Where no cyanide plant has been erected at a battery, any person desirous of claiming tailings, the proceeds of his crushing, shall remove them from the battery site immediately the crushing is completed, otherwise they will be treated as abandoned tailings.
- 7. Where a cyanide plant has been erected at a battery, tailings resulting from stone crushed at that battery will be treated, but the manager may, in his discretion, refuse to treat any tailings should he consider them unsuitable for treatment by cyanide.
- 8. The number of tons of tailings suitable for cyanide treatment by the ordinary leaching vat plant installed at the battery shall be determined by the manager, whose decision shall be final; provided that in no case shall such tonnage exceed eighty per cent. of the number of tons milled. Where a slimes plant is working in conjunction with the ordinary vat system, the combined tonnage of sand and slimes shall not exceed 90 per cent. of the tons milled.
- 9. The manager shall take samples of the tailings as they pass through the battery, or from the pit into which the tailings may be deposited. The tailings collected shall be thoroughly mixed and divided into three samples, one for assay by the manager, one for the owner, and one sealed and kept by the manager for reference. The assay of the manager's sample will be available on application within fourteen days from the completion of any crushing, and should the owner dispute such assay, he shall within six weeks of the completion of the crushing notify the manager to that effect, in writing, and shall at the same time forward a certificate from a competent assayer. On receipt of such certificate the results of the two assays will be averaged, provided that the difference between them does not exceed six grains; but should the difference in the assay exceed six grains, and should the owner still refuse to accept the manager's assay, the manager shall forward the sealed sample previously referred to, to the Government assayer, Perth, and the result of the assay as furnished by him shall be considered as final. The cost of such assay (fifteen shillings) shall be borne by the party whose assay differs most widely from the referee assay.
- 10. A clean-up will be made about every two months, when the Department will make a pro rata distribution, based upon the original assay value of the tailings, the estimated extraction therefrom, and the actual extraction. After the deduction of ten shillings per ton for cost of treatment, the owners of tailings treated will receive the amount due to them within 14 days after the value of the bullion has been ascertained.
- 11. All tailings assaying less than 3dwts. 3grs. per ton shall become the property of the Government.
- 12. A charge of ten shillings per ton for treatment shall be the first charge on all tailings treated, and the gold contents of tailings will be paid for at the rate of Four pounds per ounce.

- All tailings collected for treatment by the owner will be treated at the rate of 27 cubic feet per ton.
- 14. The Department reserves the right to suspend operations from any cause whatsoever, and will accept no responsibility for delays in treatment.
- At every battery there will be kept a book in which shall be recorded the number of tons in each parcel lodged for treatment, the name, locality and number of the lease or holding from which it was obtained, and the name of the person for whom the stone is to be crushed.

A copy of the foregoing rules shall be inserted in the said book, and every person sending stone for treatment shall sign opposite the entry relating to the stone lodged by him, and such signature shall be sufficient evidence that he is cognisant of the foregoing rules, and agrees to be bound by them.

THE ROADS ACT, 1902.

BY-LAWS OF THE YALGOO DISTRICT ROADS BOARD. Interpretation.

1. The Yalgoo Roads Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, and by virtue of the said Act, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws, namely:

Whereas by "The Roads Act, 1902," the Board of this district is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned: It is hereby resolved by the Yalgoo Roads Board, by and with the approval of the Governor in Council, that the following By-laws shall be in force in the said District of Yalgoo from the date of the publication thereof in the Government Gazette:

In the undermentioned By-laws the terms shall, unless otherwise indicated, bear the meaning as shown below:

- "District" shall mean Yalgoo Roads Board District.
- "Board" shall mean Yalgoo Roads Board.
- "Chairman" shall mean any member acting for the time being as Chairman.
- " Member " shall mean any member of the Board.
- "Secretary" shall mean Secretary of the Board.
- "Supervisor" shall mean Supervison of the Board.
- "The Act" shall mean "The Roads Act, 1902."
- "Road" or "Reserve" shall mean any road or reserve in the Yalgoo Roads Board District.
- "Person" shall mean any person or persons or corporate body.

Duties of Secretary.

- 2. (a.) To attend all Board and Committee Meetings and take minutes. To prepare Reports of Committees. To conduct all correspondence and give instructions to any other officer of the Board under instructions from the Board.
- (b.) To answer all questions in connection with the Board's business and accounts, etc.
- (c.) To see the accounts of the Board are audited once a year and to have balance sheets prepared yearly and inserted in the Government Gazette.
- (d.) To prepare rate book and Roads Board electoral lists; also to arrange and attend the Revision Court, and make necessary arrangements for same, and prepare papers and lists for elections.

(e.) To summon all members to Board and Committee

meetings.

(f.) The Secretary shall keep cash book, ledger, cart licenses, dog licenses, camel licenses, bicycle licenses, and all other books of the Board, and keep vouchers and receipts, and all the inward correspondence of the Board, also press copy of all outward correspondence of the Board, and shall keep books posted up to date for the Board's inspection.

(g.) He shall also prepare all contracts and specifications for work, submitting same for the Board's approval before they are signed, and shall also see all accounts sent into the Board and charged

up to their proper accounts in the ledger.

(h.) He shall pay into the Western Australian Bank,
Geraldton, to the Board's credit at once any
sums exceeding £5 which he may have in hand,
received from the various licenses and fines, etc.

received from the various licenses and fines, etc.

(i.) The Board shall provide all necessary schedules on properly printed forms, according to and provided for in "The Roads Act 1902," and any ratepayer may, upon application to the Secretary, be supplied with any such schedule upon payment of one shilling for each copy.

Duties of Supervisor.

- 3. (a.) He shall examine all roads, bridges, wells, drains, reserves, etc., in the Board's District, and report on same to the Board, and shall visit any part of the District the Board may direct him to.
- (b). He shall also have control of all roads and contracts, (b). He shall also have control of all roads and contracts, and shall supervise works which are being carried on by the Board and report at each meeting. He shall also measure up all work carried on by the Board and give a written report on such work when finished.
 (c.) No money shall be paid by the Board until such work has been passed by the Supervisor as good and up to specification—but any member of the Board may chiect if in his oninion the work is
- and up to specification—but any member of the Board may object if, in his opinion, the work is not up to specification—when the Board shall appoint two other members of the Board to inspect such work and report at the next meeting.
- (d.) In the event of the Supervisor condemning any work, and the contractors not being satisfied, the Board shall appoint two members of the Board to visit such work (together with the Supervisor and contractors), and they shall report at the Board's next meeting.

By-laws.

- Meetings of the Board shall take place on the first and third Tuesdays in each month, at the office of the Board, Selwyn Street, Yalgoo, at 7:30 p.m.
- 5. At all meetings of the Board, should a quorum not be present, the Secretary shall note down in the minute book the circumstances, and also the members present.
- 6. Minutes of special and ordinary meetings shall be read and confirmed at the next ordinary meeting of the Board.
- 7. Any member absenting himself from three consecutive mee ings (ordinary) of the Board shall forfeit his seat unless he shall give a satisfactory excuse in writing before the third time he is absent.
- 8. Any member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate.
- 9. The Chairman, with one member, can authorise the expenditure of up to £5 in cases of urgency, but shall in every case report same at the next meeting of the Board.
- 10. The Board shall exercise their power to abate nuisances throughout their district, except where there exist local boards of health.
- 11. No person or persons shall leave any dead horse, cow, pig, sheep, goat, or other animal on any road, well, track, or reserve under the Board's jurisdiction, and all such animals shall be burnt. Any person wilfully neglecting this By-law shall be liable to a fine not exceeding forty shillings. The Board shall have power to burn any such animal left dead on any road, well, track, or reserve in their district, charging the same to the owner.
- 12. All camels shall pay annual registration fees at the following rates:—Every cow or gelded camel of any age, plying for hire, or bull camel under three years of age, plying for hire, or bull camel under three years of age, plying for hire, and used for packing, £1 per annum; but for every such camel if used for draught, 10s. per annum. Bull camels over the age of three years, £5 per annum, Prospectors' camels, used solely for prospecting, shall be free. Any person neglecting to register their camel shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £5, in addition to registration for

- All camel-drivers shall be licensed annually (license fee, 10s. per annum), and shall, when called upon, produce his license and certificate of registration for each and every camel in his charge. Any camel-driver offending against this By-law shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £5, in addition to his license fee.
- 14. All camel-drivers, and persons in charge of camels, shall, when requested, remove such camel or camels (loaded or otherwise) from off the roadway or track or well, at least 20 yards from the centre of any road or track or well, and no person other than a licensed driver shall be in charge of any camels, and then not more than eight. Any person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding £5.
- 15. Any unregistered camel found straying in any part of the Board's district may be seized, and either sold or destroyed, after such camel has been advertised for three weeks in some paper circulating in the district: the owner (if found) paying costs and expenses incurred in addition to registration fee.
- 16. All bicycles, tricycles, or motor cars used on any road or track in the Board's district shall be licensed annually (license fee, 5s. per annum). Any person neglecting to take out the same by the 31st March in each year shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £1, in addition to the license fee.
- When any person using and riding a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car on any road or track is requested to dismount, he shall do so if such bicycle, tricycle, or motor car is the cause of frightening any horse or mule being ridden or driven on any such road or track, and for each offence against this By-law shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £5, in addition to any damage arising therefrom.
- 18. Any person wilfully damaging any gate, fence, or other property of the Board shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £5, in addition to the cost of repairing the damage.
- 19. Any person polluting or otherwise damaging any well, creek, drain, or reserve under the Board's jurisdiction shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £20.
- 20. All tenders shall be accompanied by a deposit of five per cent. on total amount of contract, and also with the signature of two persons willing to become sureties for the due completion of work; the said deposit to be returned when the tender is accepted and the contract is signed. The Board may, however, keep the deposit as security for the fulfilment of the contract in the event of suitable sureties not being forthcoming.
