To Peter Whitington, Esq., and Dr. Ernest Black: WHEREAS by his Commission bearing date the 11th day of June, 1902, His Excellency the Honourable Sir Althur Lawley, K.C.M.G., then Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its dependencies, authorised and appointed Frederick Horatio Bruford, Esq., and the said Peter Whitington, Esq., and Dr. Ernest Black, Commissioners, to inquire into and report upon certain matters relating to the classification and reorganisation of the Public Service of Western Australia, and for other purposes relating to the said Public Service, with certain powers in such Commission mentioned: AND WHEREAS by his supplemental Commission bearing date the WHEREAS by his supplemental Commission bearing date the 30th day of July, 1902, and addressed to the said three Commissioners appointed by the said Commission dated the 11th day of June, 1902, the said Honourable Sir Arthur Lawley, K.C.M.G., Governor as aforesaid, defined the expression "Public Service," and added to the powers of the said Commissioners, and confirmed the said Commission dated the 11th day of June, 1902: AND WHEREAS the said Frederick Horatio Bruford having been recalled to his ordinary duties in the State of Victoria, I, Admiral Sir Frederick Gronge Denham Rederick G.C.B. Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, G.C.B. Governor as aforesaid, by my Commission dated the 3rd day of July, 1903, authorised and appointed you, the said Peters Whitington, Esq., and Dr. Ernest Black, acting jointly as Commissioners, to do and perform all acts, duties and things, and to exercise all powers authorised or directed to be done, performed and exercised by the said Commission dated the 11th day of June, 1902, and the said supplemental Commission, or either of them: And whereas it is desirable to further except from the definition of the words "Public Service" the "Audit Department and the Officers employed therein," and to exempt such Department and Officers from the said Commissions: Now THEREFORE I, Governor as aforesaid, do declare that the Audit Department and the Officers employed therein be, and the same are hereby excepted from the said definition and exempted from the said Commissions.

HEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900" (64 Vic., No. 8), the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to unite any two or more Municipalities which form one continuous area so as to form one Municipality, and also to alter the name of any Municipality and of the Corporation thereof, and also to divide any Municipality into Wards and define the boundaries thereof: AND WHEREAS the Municipalities of Broad Arrow and Paddington form one continuous area: AND WHEREAS a petition, signed with the common seal of each of the Municipalities concerned, has common seal of each of the Municipalities concerned, has been presented to His Excellency the Governor of the State of Western Australia praying that the Municipalities of Broad Arrow and Paddington be united, and that their names be altered to, and that the name of the united Municipality be "The Broad Arrow-Paddington Municipality": And whereas the said petition was publicly advertised in the Government Gazette on the 28th day of August, 1903: Now THEREFORE I, Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers so vested in me by the said Act, do hereby unite the Municipalities of Broad Arrow and Paddington, so as to form one Municipality and Corporation under the name, style, and title of "The Mayor and Councillors of Broad Arrow-Paddington," and do hereby declare the population of such Municipality to be under one thousand, and do also declare and proclaim the boundaries of the said Municipality to be as follows: pality to be as follows:

Bounded by lines starting from a point situate 160° 25′ 1 chain 50 links from the South-West corner of Broad Arrow Town Lot 478, and extending 160° 25′ about 118 chains, 252° 57′ to the Western side of the Railway Reserve, and along it South-Easterly about 45 chains; thence 162° 57′ about 40 chains; thence 252° 57′ 71 chains; thence 342° 57′ 80 chains and 340° 25′ about 130 chains; thence 70° 25′ about 38 chains; thence 340° 25′ about 77 chains; thence 155° 33′, passing along the Northern side of a public street to the Western boundary of Gold Mining Lease 757w; thence 70° 25′ about 36 chains 50 links 160° 25′ about 52 thence 70° 25′ about 36 chains 50 links, 160° 25′ about 52 chains; thence 70° 25′ about 40 chains, 160° 25′ about 43 chains 50 links; thence 250° 25′ 65 chains to the starting

And with the like advice, and by virtue of the powers so vested in me by the said Act, I hereby divide the said Municipality into two Wards, to be known as the Broad Arrow Ward and the Paddington Ward, respectively, and declare the boundaries of the said Wards to be as follows, namely:

Bounded by lines starting from a point situate 160° 25′ 1 chain 50 links from the South-West corner of Broad Arrow Town Lot 478, and extending 160° 25′ about 118 chains; thence 252° 57′ about 66 chains; thence 340° 25′

about 130 chains; thence 70° 25′ about 38 chains; thence 340° 25′ about 77 chains; thence 155° 33′ passing along the Northern side of a public street to the Western boundary of Gold Mining Lease 757w; thence 70° 25′ about 36 chains 50 links, 160° 25′ about 52 chains; thence 70° 25′ about 40 chains, 160° 25′ about 43 chains 50 links; thence 250° 25′ 65 chains to the starting point.

STOCK REGULATIONS.

(The Stock Diseases Act, 1895.)

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 7th day of October, 1903.

WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered by Order in Council, to be published in the Government Gazette, from time to time to make, vary, alter, or revoke such Regulations under this Act as may be deemed expedient for all or any of the

following purposes:—(1.) For regulating the conditions upon which any stock may be introduced or imported into the State; (2.) For the inspection of imported stock; (3.) For the seizure and destruction of infected stock; (4.) For the purpose of subjecting any stock to such restrictions or remedial measures as may be deemed necessary to prevent the introduction or spread of disease; (5.) For providing for the steps to be taken in case of any disease breaking out among any stock in the State, and for preventing the spread of such disease; (6.) For prescribing the manner in which persons coming into contact with infected stock, and land, premises, or conveyances travelled over or used by infected stock shall be cleansed and disinfected; (7.) For the regulation, management, and control of quarantine grounds, and for prescribing the treatment and control of quarantine grounds, and for prescribing the treatment and control of stock whilst in quarantine or in transit thereto or therefrom; (8.) For prescribing the term during which stock shall be quarantined; (9) For regulating the charges to be made for conveying stock to or from quarantine, and their care, maintenance, and inspection while in quarantine; (10) Generally for all or any such purposes as the may deem necessary for preventing the introduction or spread of disease: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby make the following Regulations under the said

- 1. Every owner within the boundaries of the State known as the "South-West Division" shall, between the 1st day of October and the 31st day of December in every year, dip, or cause to be dipped, all sheep running on land whereof he is the occupier: Provided that, on the application of any owner, an Inspector may grant an extension of the time in which such owner shall dip his sheep, but so that such extension shall not exceed sixty days prior to the month of June: Provided also that the sheep shall be dipped in some specific known to be fatal to ticks and lice, and for every sheep not so dipped such owner shall be liable to a fine not exceeding two shillings.
- If any Inspector is satisfied that any sheep in a flock are affected with ticks or lice, he may give the owner notice to dip such flock forthwith to the satisfaction of the said Inspector, or any other Inspector; but if the Inspector is satisfied that such sheep are intended and fit for slaughter, he may postpone the giving of such notice to dip for a period not exceeding fourteen days: Provided that every owner who refuses, neglects, or fails to comply with such notice on or before the date specified therein is liable, on notice on or before the date specified therein is hable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds; and if immediately after the date of such conviction such sheep shall not be dipped to the satisfaction of any Inspector, such owner shall, upon conviction, be liable to a further penalty not exceeding fifty pounds, and so on for each and every succeeding conviction.
- 3. Every person who by himself, his agent, or servant, drives, without the permission of an Inspector, or suffers to stray across or upon any land, or drives, depastures, or suffers to stray upon or along any highway any sheep affected with lice or tick, is liable, on conviction, for every day during which such stock shall be driven, depastured, or suffered to stray, to a penalty not exceeding five pounds nor less than two pounds.
- If any sheep affected with tick or lice shall be found in any pound, or in any yard or yards, or on any land or other place at which sheep are offered for sale or exhibited for show purposes, the owner exposing the sheep so affected shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds: Provided that any Inspector, if he deems it necessary, may order the withdrawal from sale of any sheep affected with ticks or lice until such sheep have been dipped or dressed to the satisfaction of such Inspector or any other Inspector, and shall give notice to the aforesaid owner of such sheep to dip or dress the same forthwith, at such place as the Inspector may direct; and every such owner who refuses, neglects, or fails to comply with the aforesaid notice is liable to a further penalty not exceeding twenty pounds. But if the Inspector is satisfied that such sheep are intended for immediate slaughter, he may withhold such notice to dip.
- 5. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations, it shall not be necessary to dip any ewe affected with lice or ticks during such time previous to or after her lambing as the Inspector may appoint; and for such purpose any Inspector may, in respect of ewes, extend any notice to dip for such time as he shall think fit.

6. Within seven days after the dipping of his sheep the owner shall make a statutory declaration before a Justice of the Peace, stating that he has dipped his sheep in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations, the date of dipping, the number of sheep dipped, and the class of dip used: Provided also that he shall forward a copy of this declaration to the Chief Inspector of Stock, at Perth, and retain the original in his possession for production when called upon to do so by an Inspector.

DY virtue of the authority vested in the Governor in Council by "The Explosives Act, 1895," His Excellency the Governor, by and with the consent of Executive Council, doth hereby make the following By-laws with regard to the conveyance, loading and unloading of Explosives within the Harbours of Western Australia, exclusive of the Port of Fremantle; and all other By-laws and Regulations dealing with such conveyance, loading and unloading, in force at this date shall be and are hereby repealed.

THE EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1895. BY-LAWS RELATING TO EXPLOSIVES.

PART I .-- INTRODUCTORY.

Interpretation.

- 1. In these By-laws, unless inconsistent with the subject matter or context, the word "ship" shall include every description of navigable vessel, whether propelled by wind, steam or other power, and also any lighter, barge, or other vessel not usually provided with independent means of propulsion.
- 2. Whenever in these By-laws an explosive is distinguished as belonging to a particular class or division of a class, reference is made to the classification of explosives contained in any Order in Council in force for the time being classifying explosives in pursuance of Section 59 of "The Explosives Act, 1895."

Exemptions.

- 3. Nothing in these By-laws shall apply to any ship having on board, exclusively, explosives of the following kind or kinds, or to the loading or unloading into, or out of, or conveyance to or from any such ship of the same (that is to say):—
 - (a.) Explosives belonging to the 1st Division of the 6th (Ammunition) Class, namely:—

Safety cartridges for small arms. Percussion caps. Railway fog signals. Safety fuse for blasting.

(b.) The following explosives of the 2nd Division of Fireworks Class, namely :—

Squibs, crackers, serpents, rockets (other than war rockets), maroons, stars, lances, wheels, and Roman candles.

- (c.) Other explosives, and in such quantities and under such authorities as may be from time to time approved by the Inspector of Explosives.
- (d.) Explosives on ships of war.
- (e.) Explosives carried for a ship's own use, and in such quantities as are necessary to meet the law's requirements for signalling purposes, and provided that the explosives are kept, while the ship is in port, in a magazine of copper or other suitable material, and that if two or more of the following explosives be in the same ship they

shall be kept in separate and completely enclosed receptacles in the magazine:—

- 1. Gunpowder.
- 2. Rockets.
- 3. Sound signal rockets.
- 4. Blue lights.
- 5. Holmes lights.
- 6. Pyrotechnic signals of any other kind.

PART II.

BY-LAWS APPLICABLE TO THE PORTS OF ALBANY, BUNRURY, AND GERALDTON.

- 4. Ships are not to anchor within a quarter-of-a-mile of any other ship, or half-a-mile from any wharf or jetty, except by special permission from the Inspector of Explosives.
- 5. Ships having a fixed mast or masts, with explosives on board, shall fly the red burgee at the main or only mast while loading or unloading while in port. Ships without masts shall fly a red flag or vane, at least 2ft. square, on a flag-pole provided for that purpose.
- 6. All boats conveying explosives either to or from ships, wharves, or other places shall be subject to all By-laws or Regulations, as far as the same may be applicable, in force for the time being for the management of magazines as regards the wearing of inflammable clothing by those on board, and the precautions to be observed to prevent accident by fire or explosion.
- 7. If the explosive is not effectually protected from accident by fire from without, by being conveyed in the hold of a boat having a close deck, securely closed, then the explosive shall be completely covered with tarpaulins or other suitable material, so as to effectually protect it against communication of fire. There shall not be any iron or steel in the interior of the portion of the boat where the explosive is deposited, unless the same be covered either permanently or temporarily with leather, wood, cloth, lead, or other suitable material.
- 8. In the stowing of explosives in any boat, due precautions shall be taken by means of a partition or otherwise, and by careful stowing, to secure such explosive from being brought into contact with, or endangered by, any other article or substance conveyed in such boat which is liable to cause fire or explosion.
- 9. No person whilst on, in, or attending any boat containing any explosive shall smoke, or shall conduct the same in a dangerous or reckless manner, and no person who is intoxicated shall be permitted to be in, on, or attending the same.
- 10. Nothing in the above By-laws shall be taken to authorise the loading or unloading, or conveyance of any explosives, unless the same are packed and marked in accordance with the provisions of "The Explosives Act, 1895," or any regulations or by-laws made thereunder; or of any of any explosive not authorised to be imported, manufactured, or sold in Western Australia.
- 11. Explosives shall not be conveyed in a boat or ship whilst carrying or plying for passengers, unless the quantity be less than 5lbs., and the same be securely covered, and all due precaution be taken for the prevention of accidents by fire or explosion; but in no case shall there be conveyed in any boat, whilst carrying or plying for passengers, any explosive of the 5th (fulminate) class, or any explosive of the 1st division of the 7th (firework) class.
- 12. No explosive shall be put on board of or discharged from any boat or ship, or placed in or removed from any magazine, except between the hours of sunrise and sunset.

PART III.

BY-LAWS APPLICABLE TO ANY OTHER PORT OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA, EXCEPT THE PORT OF FREMANTLE.

- 13. No ship having explosives on board shall go alongside a wharf for any purpose, or lie within a distance of a quarter-of-a-mile to seaward of any wharf or jetty without permission, in writing, from the Inspector of Explosives.
- 14. Ships when entering a port with explosives on board, and while in port, shall fly a red burgee at the main until all explosives are discharged.

- 15. Ships with explosives on board when entering a port shall anchor as prescribed in these by-laws, and the person in charge of the ship shall not remove hatches or move from the anchorage until after he has communicated with the Port
- 16. The loading, unloading, and conveyance of explosives shall be carried on in accordance with the general provisions of the Explosives Act or by-laws or regulations thereunder.

PART IV

Penalties.

17. Every person who commits or attempts to commit any breach of any of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable, any breach of any of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable, on summary conviction by any two or more Justices of the Peace in Petty Sessions, to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds for such offence, and to a penalty of ten pounds for each day during which the offence continues, and forfeiture of all or any part of the explosives in respect of which the breach of By-law has taken place.

REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH STONE WILL BE CRUSHED AND TAILINGS TREATED AT THE STATE BATTERIES AFTER 1st July, 1903.

> Department of Mines, Perth, 13th August, 1903.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the powers conferred. $\frac{4138}{1903}$ under the powers conferred upon him by Section 29 of "The Mining Development Act, 1902," has been pleased to make the following Regulations under which Stone will be crushed and Tailings treated at the State Batteries after 1st July, 1903.

H. GREGORY,

Minister for Mines.

- 1. All stone accepted for treatment at the State batteries shall be estimated at 21 cubic feet per ton, except where weighing machines are provided, when stone must pass over same to ascertain weight.
- The manager of the battery may refuse any stone considered too poor to pay crushing charges, unless a deposit is paid in advance
- 3. The charge for crushing, as determined from time to time by the Hon. the Minister for Mines, shall be posted up at each battery and strictly adhered to while in force.
- 4. A minimum charge will be made for all parcels of less tonnage than will return £5 on the rate charged per ton.
- 5. Payment for crushing shall be made to the manager on completion of treatment, or sufficient gold will be retained to pay for the amount due.
- Where no cyanide plant has been erected at a battery, any person desirous of claiming tailings, the proceeds of his crushing, shall remove them from the battery site immediately the crushing is completed, otherwise they will be treated as abandoned tailings.
- Where a cyanide plant has been erected at a battery tailings resulting from stone crushed at that battery will be treated, but the manager may, in his discretion, refuse to treat any tailings should he consider them unsuitable for treatment by cyanide.
- 8. The number of tons of tailings suitable for cyanide treatment by the ordinary leaching vat plant installed at the battery shall be determined by the manager, whose decision shall be final; provided that in no case shall such tonnage exceed eighty per cent. of the number of tons milled. Where a slimes plant is working in conjunction with the ordinary vat system, the combined tonnage of sand and slimes shall not exceed 90 per cent. of the tons milled.
- 9. The manager shall take samples of the tailings as they pass through the battery, or from the pit into which the tailings may be deposited. The tailings collected shall be thoroughly mixed and divided into three samples, one for assay by the manager, one for the owner, and one sealed and kept by the manager for reference. The assay of the manager's sample will be available on application within fourteen days from the completion of any crushing, and should the owner dispute such assay, he shall within six weeks of the completion of the crushing notify the manager to that effect, in writing, and shall at the same time forward a certificate from a competent assayer. On receipt of such certificate the results of the two assays will be averaged provided that the difference between them does not exceed six grains; but should the difference in the assay exceed six grains, and should the owner still refuse to accept the manager's assay, the manager shall forward the sealed sample previously referred to, to the Government assayer, Perth, and the result of the assay as furnished by him shall be considered as final. The cost of such assay (fifteen shillings) shall be borne by the party whose assay differs most widely from the referee assay.

A clean-up will be made about every two months, when the Department will make a pro rata distribution, based upon the original assay value of the tailings, the estimated extraction therefrom, and the actual extraction. After the deduction of ten shillings per ton for cost of treatment, the owners of tailings treated will receive the amount due to them within 14 days after the value of the bullion has been ascertained.

11. All tailings assaying less than 3dwts. 3grs. per ton shall become the property of the Government.

12. A charge of ten shillings per ton for treatment shall be the first charge on all tailings treated, and the gold contents of tailings will be paid for at the rate of Four pounds

13. All tailings collected for treatment by the owner will be treated at the rate of 27 cubic feet per ton.

14. The Department reserves the right to suspend operations from any cause whatsoever, and will accept no responsibility for delays in treatment.

15. At every battery there will be kept a book in which

shall be recorded the number of tons in each parcel lodged for treatment, the name, locality and number of the lease or holding from which it was obtained, and the name of the

person for whom the stone is to be crushed.
