SANTOPILLI LIGHT-CHARACTER ALTERED

With reference to Notices to Mariners, Nos. 4 and 31 of 1903, it is hereby notified that, from and after the 16th November, 1903, the character of Santopilli light will be altered from a white fixed to a group flashing white light giving two flashes every ten seconds; it will show a group of two flashes of about one-ninth second, separated by eclipses of about 2½ seconds and followed by an eclipse of about 7½ seconds duration; also that the building on which this light will be exhibited is a cement tower situated S. 43° E. mag., distant 1,800 feet from the present lighthouse.

The light will be 140 feet above H.W. level and visible in clear weather at a distance of 18 miles from all directions seawards.

MUNICIPALITY OF COOLGARDIE.

BY-LAWS.

The Municipal Council of Coolgardie, in pursuance of the powers vested in it and by virtue of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, hereby repeals all By-laws heretofore made by it save and except By-law 76, and hereby, in pursuance of such powers and authorities aforesaid, makes the following By-laws in lieu thereof. In the following By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the following terms shall have the meanings hereby allotted to them: shall have the meanings hereby allotted to them:

- "Act" shall mean "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and any Acts amending the same.
- "Mayor" the Mayor of Coolgardie.
- "Council" the Mayor and Councillors of Coolgardie. 3
- "Municipality" the Municipality of Coolgardie as extended by proclamation in the Government Gazette.
- "Person" shall include a body corporate; and
- "Owner" every person in possession or in receipt of all or any of the rents or profits of any house, building, tenements, or land in the Municipality.

The following parts of the Tenth Schedule to "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," are hereby adopted as By-laws of the Municipality of Coolgardie, and numbered from 80 to 92:-

PART 1.

Clause 3, By-law No. 80.—Crossings over footways and channels.

Clause 4, By-law No. 81.—Deposit or discharge of rubbish, liquid, etc., on streets, etc.

Clause 5, By-law No. 82.—Depositing building materials, excavations, etc.

Clause 6, By-law No. 83.—Lighting, etc., of obstructions generally.

Clause 7, By-law No. 84.—Houses, etc., encroaching on street, etc.

Clause 8, By-law No. 85.—Obstructions, etc., to streets, etc., by cattle, etc.

Clause 9, By-law No. 86.—Undermining streets.

PART 2.

Clauses 1 to 6, By-law No. 87,-Waterworks, drains, etc.

Part 5.

Clauses 1 to 4, By-law No. 88.—Buildings for public meetings.

Clause 1, By-law No. 89.—Foul chimneys.

Clause 2, By-law No. 90.—Deposit, etc., of inflammable material, etc.

Part 7.

Clauses 1 to 3, By-law No. 91.—Miscellaneous matters.

PART 8.

By-law No. 92.—Carriage of persons and goods.

- (1.) Passenger vehicles.
- (2,) Carts and carters.

BY-LAW No. 93.

For preventing broken bottles, earthenware, etc., being thrown on the streets.

Any person or persons placing or having placed or caused or having caused to be placed or broken, in or upon any road, pathway, reserve, or park lands under the control and supervision of the Council, any glass, metal, or earthenware, bottles, or utensils, without having first obtained the consent of the said Council so to do, shall be liable to a fine, upon conviction, not exceeding Ten pounds.

BY-LAW No. 94.

For regulating the use of bicycles or other similar vehicles.

- For the purposes of this By-law the word "machine" shall mean bicycle, tricycle, velocipede, or other vehicle, by whatever means propelled, and shall not include perambulators, go-carts, or invalid chairs.
- 2. No person shall ride or drive or propel a machine upon any footway set apart for the use of foot passengers.
- 3. Any person riding, driving, or propelling a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall, except on the occasions when there is a full moon, and for two days before and two days after such full moon, carry a lamp attached to the machine, so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which such person is proceeding, and such lamp shall be lighted and kept lighted so as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.
- Any person driving, riding, or propelling a machine 4. Any person driving, riding, or propening a machine shall keep the same upon the near side or left-hand side of the roadway, and whenever, with such machine, he or she shall overtake any wagon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or beast of burden or any foot passengers proceeding along the roadway, he or she shall, within reasonable distance or before passing such vehicle, beast, or foot able distance or before passing such vehicle, beast, or foot passenger, give sufficient warning of his or her approach by sounding a bell or whistle in an audible manner.
- 5. Any person driving, riding, or propelling a machine who shall overtake and pass any vehicle, or horse, or beast of burden, shall keep such machine to the off-side or right hand of such vehicle or animal.
- No person shall ride, drive, or propel any machine around street corners or across the intersection of any two streets at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.
- 7. Every person offending against the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty for each such offence not exceeding Two pounds.

BY-LAW No. 95.

To require lights to be carried on vehicles by night.

Any person who, between sunset and sunrise, shall in upon, or along any public streets or lane within the Municipality drive or cause to be driven any vehicle constructed for the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise, without having suitable lamps securely fixed and lighted at the off-side of the front of such vehicle; or shall drive any vehicle constructed for the conveyance of persons, as well as goods, or of persons only, without having a suitable light securely fixed and lighted on each side of the front of such vehicle, shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

BY-LAW No. 96.

To prevent the danger of rapid driving or riding round corners.

Any person who shall drive or ride any animal or animals, whether attached to any vehicle or not, round the corners or over any crossings formed by the junction of any street in the Municipality with any other street in the Municipality, at any other than a walking pace, shall forfeit and pay upon conviction a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 97.

Regulating signboards.

- 1. No person shall place or suspend in any street or lane in the municipality any signboard or other sign, showbill, or showboard which shall project more than three feet from the building line or be at a lesser height than eight feet in the clear from the ground, except by permission of the Council.
- 2. Every person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Four pounds.

BY-LAW No. 98.

To prevent the erection of structures composed of inflammable material.

Any person who, without obtaining permission of the Council, shall, within the municipality, erect, or cause or permit to be erected, any house, shed, tent, pavilion, or other structure of canvas, hessian, calico, or other highly inflammable material shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for each such offence, and to a further penalty of like amount for each day or part of a day during which such offence shall be continued. Failing the removal of such building within seven days after notice duly given, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Council to remove the same at the cost and charges of the person so offending, which may be recovered by the Council in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

BY-LAW No. 99.

For regulating camel traffic.

- 1. Not more than 10 camels in one continuous train with a separate attendant to each train, shall at any time be led or driven into, along, or upon any street or lane at any time in any part of the municipality.
- 2. Any person committing or causing or allowing to be committed any breach of this By-law, whether by neglect or otherwise, shall be liable to a penalty for each such offence not exceeding Ten pounds.

BY-LAW No. 100.

For licensing Hawkers.

- 1. Any person hawking fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game or vegetables within the municipality, without having first obtained a license thereto from the Council, and paying a license fee of Three pounds (payable 15s. quarterly) for the same, shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.
- 2. Such license shall be of force and effect within any part of the municipality other than Bayley Street, or within nine chains of Bayley Street, and under no conditions whatever shall any hawker, whether licensed or otherwise, ply his trade in any part of the above-named street, and any person attempting so to do shall, for each such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
- 3. Every license, notwithstanding the date of issue, shall be in force until the 31st day of December then next ensuing, provided that it shall be at the discretion of the Council at any time to cancel or suspend any such license for sufficient cause shown.

BY-LAW No. 101.

To prevent the letting or sub-letting of houses or premises for immoral purposes.

- 1. Any person, whether owner, landlord, tenant, or agent, letting or sub-letting, or causing or permitting to be let or sub-let, the whole or any part of any house or premises within the municipality, any part of which is used by any person or persons as a brothel, shall, upon receipt of seven days' notice from the Council, close up such house, and shall no longer permit the same to be used for any such purposes.
- 2. Any person acting as proprietor, manager, or agent, or exercising any control over, or occupying the whole or any part of any house or premises used as a brothel shall,

- upon receipt of seven days' notice from the Council, cease to keep, manage, or occupy, or permit to be used, kept, managed, or occupied such house or premises for any such purposes as aforesaid.
- 3. For the purposes of this By-law any person receiving rent for the use for all or any portion of any brothel or house of illfame and repute shall be deemed to be the owner of the same.
- 4. Any person committing a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each such offence.
- 5. Nothing in this By-law shall prevent any number of persons being proceeded against simultaneously and either together or separately as owners, landlords, managers, tenants, proprietors or occupiers of such premises for any breach of any provisions of this By-law.

BY-LAW No. 102.

Regulating the loading, etc., of camels, etc.

- 1. It shall not be lawful for any person to load, keep, camp, or otherwise detain any camel or dromedary within the municipality between the hours of sunset and sunrise, without having first obtained permission from the Council so to do.
- 2. Any person offending against the requirements of this By-law shall, for each such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds per head per night.

BY-LAW No. 103.

Regulating the keeping of pigeons.

- 1. The occupier of any premises within the Municipality of Coolgardie shall not keep or permit the keeping of a pigeon or pigeons within a distance of 20 feet from any dwelling house in such municipality, or in such a situation or in such a manner as to pollute any water.
- 2. No person shall, within the municipality aforesaid, keep a pigeon or pigeons except in a closed cage or cote.
- 3. No person shall permit any pigeon or pigeons to stray, fly, or wander at liberty within the said municipality.
- 4. Every such eage or cote shall be constructed in such a manner and of such materials and maintained in such a condition as to prevent any excrement, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter, or any soakage therefrom, escaping on to or into the ground.
- 5. Every person who shall keep pigeons within the municipality aforesaid shall cause the cage or cote in which the same are kept, at least once within every three days to be thoroughly cleansed, and all excrement, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter to be removed.
- 6. Every person who shall offend against any of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

BY-LAW No. 104.

Regulating Blasting.

- 1. No person shall be at liberty to blast any rock within 100 yards of any street, lane, or building until he shall have given at least 24 hours' notice to the Town Clerk, and obtained a permit setting forth the terms and conditions under which such blasting may be permitted.
- 2. No person shall be at liberty to depart from, vary, or neglect any of the terms and conditions referred to in the previous clause.
- 3. Any person offending, whether by neglect or otherwise, against the provisions of this By-law shall, for each such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

BY-LAW No. 105.

Regulating Processions.

- 1. No procession of persons, with or without vehicles (except for funeral, military, or police purposes), shall parade or pass through any street or public place within the municipality unless and until the consent of the Mayor shall be first obtained, and then only by such route and at such time as shall be specified in such consent. The cost of advertising the route shall be, at the discretion of the Mayor, by fee payable in advance by the applicants.
- 2. Every member of any procession acting in contravention of this By-law shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

BY-LAW No. 106.

To prevent the traffic of locomotives or steam-engines within a certain area.

Every person who shall drive any locomotive steam-engine over, upon, or along any street of the municipality between the southern boundary of Woodward Street, the northern Street, the eastern boundary of Ford Street, and the western boundary of Moran Street shall, for each such offence, forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds.

Nothing herein contained shall apply to any street steam-roller whilst engaged in rolling any street of the municipality under the direction of the Engineer, or in going to or returning from such street.

BY-LAW No. 107.

For preventing the destruction of trees in streets, park lands, etc.

Any person who shall carelessly or wilfully destroy or remove from its place any tree planted in any street, park lands, or other place belonging to or under the control of the Council, or who shall ride or drive against, or hitch or tie any horse or other animal to any tree-guard, fence, or other protection shall, for each such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds.

BY-LAW No. 108.

For regulating bathing at the Municipal Baths.

- Every person resorting to the baths shall, before being admitted to any portions thereof, pay to the caretaker or his assistant such sum as the Council may from time to time direct.
- A person shall not by foreible or improper means seek admission to any swimming bath or compartment.
- 3. Every person resorting to the baths shall at all times exercise rearonable and proper care in the use of any bath or bathroom, dressing room, closet, box, or compartment.
- 4. Any person resorting to the baths shall not at any time carelessly or negligently break, injure, or improperly interfere with the use and efficient action of any lock, cock, valve, or pipe work, or engine or machinery in connection with any bath, or carelessly or negligently injure any furniture, fittings, or conveniences of any bath, bathroom,
- A person shall not at any time carelessly or negligently injure or destroy any towels or other linen or other articles supplied for his use.
- A person shall not at any time, while being upon the premises, by any disorderly or improper conduct disturb or interrupt any other person in the proper use of any bath, bathroom, dressing room, closet, box, or compartment, or any officer, servant, or person appointed by the Council, in the proper execution of his duty.
- A person shall not cause or allow any dog belonging to such person or under his control to enter or remain in any passage leading to or from any bath or bathroom.
- A person shall not at any time while being upon the premises use any indecent or improper language or behave in an indecent or offensive manner.
- 9. A person shall not at any time while being in any swimming bath use any soap or other substance or preparation whereby the water in such swimming bath may be rendered turbid or unfit for the proper use of the bathers.
- 10. A person shall not wilfully or improperly foul or pollute the water in any separate bath or in any swimming bath, or wilfully or improperly soil or defile any towel supplied for his use, or any bathroom, dressing-room, closet, box, or compartment, or any furniture or articles therein.
- A person shall not at any time, while suffering from any cutaneous, infectious, or contagious disease, enter or use any swimming bath or separate bath.
- $12.\,$ A person shall not deface by writing or otherwise the walls or portion of the baths.
- A person under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall not be permitted to enter the baths.
- 14. Any towel or other linen or other article supplied to any person must be returned before the person using same leaves the building.
- 15. A person shall not commit a nuisance on any part of the premises.
- $16.\,$ No person shall pull down, deface, or otherwise in jure any copies of these By-laws.
- 17. Every person who shall offend against any of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable, for every such offence, to a penalty not exceeding £10.
