WHEREAS by "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1902" (1 and 2 Edward VII., No. 20), the Governor may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, after the opinion of the Road Board of the District has been requested, close any road or reservation for a road which may have been surveyed or shown as a road on any plan published by the Department of Lands and Surveys: Provided such road is not within the limit of a Municipality or Townsite, and has not been declared a Government road or a road under "The Roads Act," or any Act amending the same: AND WHEREAS the road hereinafter described has been surveyed and shown as a road on the plan of the survey of Green-

mount Suburban Area, as published by the Department of Lands and Surveys: AND it is desirable to close such road: AND WHEREAS the opinion of the Greenmount Road Board has been requested: NOW THEREFORE I, Sir Edward Albert Stone, on behalf of His Excellency Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, G.C.B., Governor as aforesaid, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the said surveyed road to be closed.

DESCRIPTION ABOVE REFERRED TO:

The surveyed road passing along the West boundaries of Swan Location 1242 and Greenmount Suburban Lot 29, to its junction with Road No. 1522.

AMENDMENT OF THE BOUNDARIES OF THE PLANTAGENET, COLLIE, AND WELLINGTON MAGISTERIAL DISTRICTS.

WHEREAS by Proclamation dated the 3rd day of September, 1902, the Administrator of the Government of Western Australia, acting under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Magisterial Districts Act, 1886," amended the boundaries of the Williams and Katanning Magisterial Districts: AND WHEREAS the boundaries of the Plantagenet, Collie, and Wellington Magisterial Districts were respectively affected by the alteration of the said boundaries: AND WHEREAS by the said Proclamation the boundaries of the Plantagenet, Collie, and Wellington Magisterial Districts were not redefined: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the

Executive Council, do by this Proclamation declare that the boundaries of the Plantagenet, Collie, and Wellington Magisterial Districts shall for the future be as follows:—

PLANTAGENET MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the *East* by a South line H 26 on Koorawalyee Rock to a point West of Mount Ridley; thence West to a point North of Mount Madden and South to the sea coast. On the *South* by the sea coast aforesaid from the said East boundary to D'Entrecasteaux Point, including the islands adjacent. On the *Northward* and *Westward* by lines extending North-Easterly from Point D'Entrecasteaux aforesaid to the junction of the Wilgarup River with the Warren River, thence by an Easterly line to the South-West corner of Nelson Location 6 at Popanup; thence Easterly by the road to Albany to Muir's Bridge at the Frankland River; thence in a Northerly direction up the Frankland River to its junction with the Gordon River to its junction with the East boundary of Reserve 875, thence Easterly to the South-West corner of Plantagenet Loc. 169 (near Pootenup), thence East about 4 miles; thence North-Easterly passing through Survey Mark O 11 near Kybelup Pool, and onwards in the direction of Mt. Glasse in the Bremer Range to a point East of Survey Mark Q 6 near Bungon Pool in the Arthur River, thence due East.

COLLIE MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from a point situate about 2 miles South and 6 miles West from the Eastern end of the Southernmost boundary of Wellington Location 56 and extending North about $14\frac{1}{2}$ miles, passing along the East boundary of Wellington Location 5; thence East about 28 miles, passing along the South boundary of T.L. 186/113 to a point in a line extending West-South-Westerly from the South-West corner of P.P.R. 8/194 to the North-East corner of Collie Mining District; thence to said corner of Collie Mining District; thence South about 12 miles, passing through Survey Mark T 52; thence West about 14 miles, North about 5 miles, and West to the starting point.

WELLINGTON MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the *West* by the sea coast. On the *North* by an East line therefrom, passing through the summit of Mt. William to the Murray River, thence by that river upward, excluding the locations and leases on both banks to the junction of the Hotham and Williams Rivers. On the *Eastward* by a South-South-Easterly line from the junction of the Hotham and Williams Rivers to a point West of the South-West corner of Reserve 605 (Quindaning); thence West to a point North of the South-West corner of P.P.R. 8/194; thence South to said corner, and West-South-Westerly in direction of the North-East corner of Collie Mining District, to a point East of the South boundary of T.L. 186/113; thence West about 28 miles, South about $14\frac{1}{2}$ miles passing along the East boundary of Wellington Loc. 5; thence East about $12\frac{1}{2}$ miles; thence South, passing along the East boundary of Wellington Location 40.

On the *Southward* by an East line from the sea coast to the Capel River, passing along the South boundary of Sussex Location 82; thence by said river upwards to Wellington Location 171 inclusive; thence due East about 3 miles from the South-West corner of Loc. 171 aforesaid; thence North to a point West of the South boundary of Donnybrook Townsite; thence East to the Donnybrook-Bridgetown Railway Reserve, and along it Southerly to a point East of the South-West corner of said Wellington Location 171; thence due East.

AMENDMENT TO REGULATION No. 107.

WHARFAGE.

No. 107.

Inwards Manifests to be supplied and certified to.—The master of every vessel arriving at the Port of Fremantle shall, in order to enable the amount of wharfage dues payable in respect of cargo carried by such vessel, deliver at the office of the Trust, prior to commencing to discharge such cargo, a true, legible, and complete copy of the manifest of the said vessel, certified to by himself as being true and complete in accordance with the form set forth in Schedule A, and shall also furnish within a reasonable time a certified statement of all alterations (if any) which may be made in such manifest by reason of re-measurement of goods included therein or otherwise. Should the master of any such vessel fail to furnish such information within the time specified, or should he furnish the Trust with any information which is inaccurate in any material particular, or is not duly certified to as being true and complete, the said master, or, in his absence from the port, the owner or agent of the vessel, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding One hundred pounds (£100).

MUNICIPALITY OF ALBANY.

A REGULATION of the Municipality of Albany, made under Subsection 1 of Section 167 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and Section 56, Part VIII., of the Tenth Schedule to the said Act, in force in the Municipality by virtue of a By-law of the above-named Municipality, numbered twenty-six, for regulating the manner and position of affixing to each vehicle the table of fares and rates for licensed passenger vehicles plying for hire within the Municipality of Albany.

In pursuance of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Albany make the regulation following:—

That the licensee of every licensed passenger vehicle plying for hire within the Municipality of Albany shall be caused to be painted on, or an approved printed card affixed to, the box seat inside of each vehicle, and facing passengers as they enter such vehicle, a table of fares and rates by time and distance, including luggage, for licensed passenger vehicles, and the number of such licensed vehicle. Every person offending against this regulation shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £2.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Albany, made under Subsection 42, Section 16, Part VI. of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and numbered twenty-nine, for regulating the speed or pace at which persons shall ride or drive, or vehicles be driven around the corners or across the intersections of any street or streets, way or ways.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Albany order as follows:—

No person shall ride or drive, or vehicles be driven around the corners or across the intersections of any street or streets, way or ways within the Municipality of Albany at a faster rate than a common walk. Every person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £2.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Albany, made under Subsection 35, Section 167, Part VI. of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and numbered twenty-eight, for requiring and regulating the carrying of a lighted lamp or lamps by all vehicles after sunset, and inside passenger vehicles after sunset.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Albany order as follows:—

No person shall, between sunset and sunrise, in, upon, or along any streets within the Municipality of Albany drive a vehicle constructed or used for the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise without having a lamp or lantern securely fixed and lighted at the off side; nor any vehicle constructed or used for the conveyance of persons as well as goods, wares, merchandise, or persons only without having a lamp or lantern securely fixed and lighted on each side of the front of the said vehicle; nor any vehicle constructed or used to convey persons or passengers only without having a lamp securely fixed and lighted inside such vehicle. Every person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £2.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1898.

BY-LAWS FOR THE LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH FOR THE DISTRICT OF MENZIES.

WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1898" (62 Vict., No. 24), the Local Board of Health has power to make By-laws: Now, therefore, in pursuance thereof, the Menzies Local Board of Health has ordered and directed that the following By-laws be made, and shall come into operation from the date of publication in the *Government Gazette*.

INTERPRETATION.

(a.) In the construction and for the purposes of these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the terms herein used shall have the meanings severally attached to them in Section 3 of the said Act.

(b.) "Refuse" shall mean and include dust, ashes, rags, straw, empty tins, empty bottles, broken glass, bones, house and trade refuse, waste paper, and all rubbish of whatsoever kind.

BY-LAW No. 1.

Cesspools to be cleansed and filled up.

All existing cesspools within the area under the jurisdiction of the Local Board shall be cleansed and filled up to the satisfaction of the Inspector within a calendar month of notice to that effect being given to the owner or occupier

BY-LAW No. 2.

Regulating the position and manner of construction of privies.

1. No person shall erect within the district of the Local Board any earth-closet, privy, or urinal, the walls of which are not of stone, wood, wood and iron, or brick, and every closet shall be equipped with the sealed pan adopted by the Local Board. The doors of every closet shall be properly fitted, and shall at all times be kept in a state of thorough repair. The trap-door shall be so constructed as to readily admit the pan, and shall be placed facing the right-of-way.

2. All closets, privies, or urinals shall be erected not less than 20 feet from any house, dwelling, or business place, in such position and in such manner as shall be approved of by the Local Board; and all such closets, privies, and urinals shall be erected as near the right-of-way as conveniently can be, and every such structure shall be ventilated to the satisfaction of the Local Board.

3. Authority under Section 173, Subsection 3.—The occupier of every house or premises, whether public or private, shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a box containing either ashes, dry earth, lime, sawdust, carbolic powder, or other disinfectant approved by the Local Board, and shall cause all nightsoil or other matter which may be deposited in such pan or receptacle in such closet or privy to be immediately deodorised or disinfected with a sufficient quantity of the disinfectant kept in such box.

BY-LAW No. 3.

Closets supplied with receptacles for excrementitious matter—Size, shape, materials of construction—Interchangeable.

Each closet shall be supplied with a sufficient number of receptacles for excrementitious matter which shall be interchangeable with others in the same district, and shall be of the following size, shape, style and materials:—

- (a.) Pans shall be galvanised iron, cylindrical, 14in. deep, 13in. diameter.
 (b.) Each closet shall be supplied as above.
 (c.) The Local Board reserves the sole right to supply the pans, and may charge for some any price not exceeding cost price.

BY-LAW No. 4.

Double pan service.

There shall be provided by the occupier two receptacles for every closet on the premises occupied by him.

BY-LAW No. 5.

Pans to be cleansed.

Every nightman shall cause every receptacle for nightsoil, after the disposal of the contents, to be thoroughly cleansed.

BY-LAW No. 6.

Nightsoil to be rendered inoffensive.

Every contractor shall cause the nightsoil removed from any premises to be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, disiccator, or incinerator, and to be trenched and covered over with soil to at least 12 inches from the surface.

BY-LAW No. 6A.

Regulating the disinfecting or deodorising of nightsoil contained in places for the deposit thereof, and regulating the disinfecting and deodorising of any nightsoil removed therefrom, and preventing injury to health arising from the transport, deposit, or use as manure of nightsoil.

No nightsoil or any human urine, whether mixed with substances or not, or any solution of nightsoil, shall be removed from any place or depôt duly authorised for the reception, utilisation, or deposit of nightsoil or human urine, without first having been subjected to a heat of not less than 212° Fahrenheit for not less than 15 minutes.

BY-LAW No. 7.

Receipt for nightsoil deposited.

That failing the use of a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator, the contractor be compelled to obtain a receipt from the occupier of the land whereon deposit is made, or from the manager of some approved depôt for nightsoil for the number of pans there emptied or delivered.

BY-LAW No. 8.

Supervision over depôts.

The Local Board shall exercise stringent supervision over all such depôts or places of deposit, and the Inspector shall inspect such depôts or places regularly at such intervals as the Local Board may direct.

BY-LAW No. 9.

Mode of removal, etc.

(a.) The mode of removal of each receptacle in each closet shall be as follows:—The nightman shall remove each receptacle, and at once cover the same with a suitable tight-fitting lid, and upon every such removal shall carefully place a cleansed pan of the pattern approved by the Local Board in lieu of every pan so removed, and each pan shall be dealt with as prescribed in the next following clause hereof, that is to say—

(b.) Each receptacle which shall have been removed from a closet and sealed with a lid as prescribed in the foregoing clause shall be then removed by the nightman in a cart or vehicle of a pattern to be approved by the Local Board, and the contents of all such receptacles shall be deposited in such place or places as shall from time to time be fixed by the Local Board.

(c.) Until otherwise directed, the nightman shall deposit the contents of all such receptacles in trenches, to be excavated at his own expense, in such place or places as shall be fixed by the Local Board, and treated with disinfectant, and covered with earth to a depth of not less than 12in. of earth, or as the Local Board may from time to time direct.

(d.) The said receptacles used in private residences or premises shall be emptied once a week at the least, or so much more frequently as the Local Board may from time to time direct.

(e.) Pans in use at all hotels, boarding houses, restaurants, stores, offices, and public buildings shall be removed, and replaced as above, as often as may be required by the Inspector, but not less than once a week.

BY-LAW No. 10.

Fixing the charge, etc.

Every nightman shall be entitled to charge and to receive from the occupier of any premises from which any nightsoil, trade, or house refuse shall have been removed, such sum or sums of money as are specified herein, and no nightman shall ask, demand, or receive more than the moneys mentioned in the said Schedule:—

BY-LAW No. 11.

Licenses to remove nightsoil.

1. No license shall be issued to any person not approved of by the Local Board.
2. No nightman shall remove nightsoil from any house or premises within the area under the jurisdiction of the Local Board, unless he shall have first obtained from the Local Board a license authorising him to do so.
3. The fee to be paid by licensed scavengers and nightmen shall be 10s., and paid half-yearly, in advance.

BY-LAW No. 12.

Imposing penalties on licensee for breach of conditions.
The following shall be the conditions upon which licenses to remove nightsoil shall be issued:—

The penalties for breach of any of the foregoing conditions shall be not more than the amounts set forth in the margin.

BY-LAW No. 13.

For the mode of carriage of, and precautions, etc., to be observed—
Meat, bread, fruit, etc.

1. No person or persons shall bring or cause to be brought or carried through any street or lane, in any cart or vehicle, any butcher's meat, bread, or fruit, unless such meat, bread, or fruit be protected from the sun and dust.
2. Every cart or other vehicle, and every construction or covering for carrying and protecting meat, bread, or fruit shall be kept in a clean and sanitary state.

BY-LAW No. 14.

For the registration, annually, of all persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk.

1. All persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk within the district of the Local Board, shall register their names and addresses at the office of the Local Board, and shall pay a registration fee annually of 10s. for such registration, and shall receive a certificate thereof in the form of Schedule "C."
2. Every dairymen or purveyor of milk shall keep his dairy, milkstore, or shop, and all milk vessels for holding milk for sale or human consumption, and every place used in connection therewith, in a thoroughly clean and healthy condition, and to the satisfaction of the Inspector of the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 15.

For securing the cleanliness of bakeries.

1. No person shall carry on any bakery or bread or confectionery store unless and until the premises have been examined and passed as suitable by the Inspector.
2. All bakeries and bread and confectionery stores shall be at all reasonable times open to the inspection of any of the officers of the Local Board; and all troughs, tanks, and all utensils and appliances used in such premises shall be kept in a thoroughly clean condition, to the satisfaction of the Local Board's officers.

BY-LAW No. 16.

For prescribing the time of and the precautions to be taken on the removal of pigwash, etc.

1. No person shall remove any pigwash or other filthy matter unless such pigwash or filthy matter be carried in water-tight barrels or tanks, securely covered to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof or any offensive smell therefrom.
2. Every tank or barrel and every receptacle used for the storage and reception of any pigwash or filthy matter, and every conveyance or vehicle used for the carriage or removal of any matter as above, shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.
3. No pigwash or filthy matter shall be removed from any place or premises between the hours of 8 o'clock in the morning and 6 o'clock in the evening, except by permission of the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 17.

For the prevention of the sale of diseased fruit, etc.

No person shall sell or expose for sale in any market, warehouse, or shop, or other place, any fruit which is diseased or unwholesome, and any fruit which, in the opinion of any officer appointed by the Local Board or Central Board, is diseased or unwholesome shall be destroyed, and all cases or packing material which surrounded such fruit shall also be destroyed as such officer may direct.

BY-LAW No. 18.

For the restriction of the storage and keeping of bonedust, etc.

No person shall store or keep any bonedust or artificial or other manure so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

BY-LAW No. 19.

Regulating and keeping of cattle or other animals.

1. Every occupier or owner of a building wherein or whereon any horses, cattle, swine, or other animals may be kept shall provide, in connection with such building or other premises, a suitable receptacle for dung, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may be produced from time to time in the keeping of such animals.

2. Such receptacle shall be constructed in such a manner and of such material, and shall be maintained in such a manner so as to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof or any leakage therefrom.

3. The owner or occupier of such premises shall at least once a week remove or cause to be removed all dung or other offensive matter from such receptacle, and shall convey or cause to be conveyed such dung or offensive matter to the dépôt or place set apart for that purpose by the Local Board.

4. No person shall turn loose, so as to become or be likely to become a nuisance to any person, any horse, cattle, camel, goat, dog, or any other animal belonging to him or her, in his or her charge, in any street, lane, reserve, or public place within the Municipality.

BY-LAW No. 20.

Defining an area within which swine may not be kept, etc.

1. No person shall keep any swine within 100 feet of any house.

2. No person shall keep any swine in any part of the district under the control of the Local Board, unless and until such premises or places to be used as a piggery have been examined and approved by the Inspector and licensed by the Local Board.

3. A registration fee of £2 must be paid to the Local Board during the first week of January of each year as license for such premises.

BY-LAW No. 21.

For the prevention of danger to the public from manufactory or places for the storage of inflammable materials.

1. No person shall permit on any premises owned or occupied by him any accumulation of straw, paper, shavings, empty cases, or other inflammable material.

2. Any person who, after two hours' notice from Inspector, shall neglect to remove such inflammable material shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and, on conviction, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

BY-LAW No. 22.

For the disinfection of and the prevention of nuisance or injury to health from poultry yards, rags, or other materials used or stored in marine stores.

1. No person shall keep any premises as a poultry yard at a less distance than 25 feet from any dwelling.

2. Every poultry yard shall be kept in a clean condition and disinfected at least once a week with lime, ashes, or other suitable disinfectant.

3. No rags or other materials used or stored in marine stores, flock or bedding or furniture manufactories shall be kept so as to cause a nuisance or to be injurious to health.

BY-LAW No. 23.

For the regulation of noxious or offensive trades.

1. The owner or occupier of any place, building, or premises used for the purpose of carrying on any offensive or noxious trade, business, or manufactory, as set forth in Section 146 of the Act, whether established before or after the passing of the said Act, shall register the same at the office of the Local Board during the first week in January in each year, and shall pay to the Local Board an annual registration fee, as set forth in Schedule "D" hereto, of the amount of which fee the Local Board shall give notice to such owner or occupier, and if such owner or occupier fails to comply he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2 per day for each day during which such provisions shall not be complied with.

2. All premises or places so registered shall be kept in a clean and sanitary state, and shall be limewashed as often as may be required by the Local Board or its officers.

BY-LAW No. 24.

For the prevention of the use of steam whistles at factories, etc.

No person or owner of any factory or other establishment shall use or cause to be used any steam whistle so as to be a nuisance to any person.

BY-LAW No. 25.

Specifying the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing.

Unless otherwise provided for, the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing required to be done by any Inspector or officer shall be determined by the Local Board, according to the nature of the case.

BY-LAW No. 26.

For preventing offensive matter running out of premises.

1. It shall not be lawful for the owner, proprietor, or any employee of or in any manufactory, brewery, slaughterhouse, knacker's yard, butcher's, or fishmonger's shops, laundry, or dunghill, to allow any offensive matter to escape and flow upon any street, lane, way, or thoroughfare, or land within the district of the Local Board.

2. All such offensive matter shall be placed in a suitable receptacle, and emptied as often as necessary, to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

BY-LAW No. 27.

Regulating the deposit of rubbish, etc.

1. The occupier of every house or premises shall, on written notice from the Inspector, and within the time specified in such notice, provide such and so many receptacles or boxes of the material and of the dimensions as may be required by the Local Board, for the temporary deposit of house refuse.

2. The occupier of such house, or if there be no occupier, then the owner, shall regularly collect all refuse or rubbish from such premises and place the same in the receptacles; and he shall not permit or suffer such receptacle to overflow or become offensive, and shall, when necessary or directed by the Inspector or officer of the Local Board, thoroughly disinfect the same forthwith.

3. Every receptacle as aforesaid shall be kept in such place or position as the Inspector may point out, and so as to be convenient for the removal of the contents thereof.

4. Every owner or occupier, or if there be no occupier, then the owner, of every house or premises to which a receptacle as aforesaid is attached or used, shall cause the same to be emptied at least once a week, or as often as the Inspector may direct.

5. The owner or occupier of such premises shall, after notice from the Inspector, and within the time limited in such notice, replace by a new and approved receptacle any receptacle that the Inspector may deem worn out or unfit for use.

BY-LAW No. 28.

Receptacles to be kept in an inoffensive condition.

All receptacles required by "The Health Act, 1898," or under these By-laws, shall be kept in an inoffensive condition by the householder or occupier.

BY-LAW No. 29.

Regulating the removal of offensive matter.

Every person who shall convey any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected, placed, or found in or about any house, stable, cow-house, pigsty, lane, yard, street, or place whatsoever, through or along any street or lane, shall, previous to and during the whole time of such conveyance, cause such dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected to be covered with lime or suitable substance, or shall adopt, such other precautions as respectively may be necessary to prevent the emission of noxious or offensive odour or effluvia therefrom; and the same shall not be deposited in any place within the district other than the place set apart by the Local Board for that purpose.

BY-LAW No. 30.

Regulating the disposal of the carcases of dead animals.

In the event of death or any accident necessitating the slaughter of any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animal, the carcase of such animal shall be removed to a safe distance beyond the Municipality or Townsite, or to such place as the Local Board may direct, and there thoroughly burned and destroyed or buried to the satisfaction of the Inspector, by the owner or person in charge of such animal, as the case may be.

BY-LAW No. 31.

Regulating the burning of offal and other offensive matter.

No person shall burn any offal, rags, clippings, or parings of leather, or any offensive matter so as to be offensive to any person or resident in the neighbourhood of such burning.

BY-LAW No. 32.

Regulating the removal of slops.

1. Any person who shall be ordered by the Local Board or its Inspectors shall provide and maintain proper watertight vehicles or receptacles fitted with close-fitting covers or lids for the purpose of carting or receiving any slops or suds, house refuse, waste, or other matter or substance used in any laundry which is likely to become a nuisance or offensive by reason of exposure.

2. All such vehicles or receptacles shall be kept in such convenient places so as to be readily removed as may be directed by the Inspector, so as not to be a nuisance to any person, and shall be kept in a thoroughly sanitary condition and removed at least once a week and cleansed and disinfected both inside and out.

BY-LAW No. 33.

Regulating the deposit of offensive liquid, etc.

1. No foul or offensive water, or other offensive liquid, and no garbage, sweepings, or other offensive matter or thing, shall be pumped, emptied, swept, thrown, or otherwise discharged or deposited into or upon any street, lane, yard, vacant land, or other place, whether public or private, within the district other than the place set apart by the Local Board for that purpose.

2. No person shall deposit any offensive matter, rubbish, or refuse of any kind in or near any reservoir or catchment area, or open drain of any dam, or reservoir of the water supply of the Municipality, under a penalty of £10 for each such offence.

BY-LAW No. 34.

Restricting contracts.

No individual householder shall contract for the removal of nightsoil or any other refuse or offensive matter whatever, except with the person licensed by the Local Board, and in accordance with these By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 35.

Regulating the carrying off of storm or rain water.

Every owner shall cause all buildings to be provided with spoutings, downpipes, and drains sufficient to carry off all storm or rain water.

BY-LAW No. 36.

PRIVATE HOSPITALS.

Regulating Private Hospitals.

1. Every person keeping, or intending to keep, or open any private hospital within the district shall register the same at the office of the Local Board; and each applicant shall state the number of patients to be admitted, the number of nurses or assistants to be maintained, and the class or classes of disease or cases to be admitted for treatment at any such hospital; and the Board reserves the right to revoke or cancel any such license or registration.

2. The officers of the Local Board shall at all reasonable times have access to such hospitals, for the purpose of inspection as to drainage, good management, and sanitary regulations; and no such building shall be registered unless it be passed by the Board's officers as a fit and proper place to be used as a hospital.

3. Every person in charge of a private hospital shall keep a register of all cases admitted into and treated in any such hospital; and such register shall be produced for inspection at the request of any officer, inspector, or servant of the Local Board.

4. Any person in charge of any such hospital shall, at the request of the Officer of Health for the Board, provide for the isolation or removal of any patient suffering from scarlet fever, diphtheria, variola, varicella, puerperal fever, erysipelas, measles, or any other infectious or contagious disease.

5. In every hospital, as aforesaid, there shall be one nurse, whose qualifications shall be approved of by the Local Board, and one assistant to every 10 patients.

6. The fee for registration shall be 10s.

7. No person, after the confirmation and gazetting of this By-law, shall keep open, occupy, or conduct any hospital in contravention of this By-law, under penalty not exceeding the sum of £20, and to a further penalty not exceeding 20s. for each day during which such offence is continued by such person.

BY-LAW No. 37.

Penalties.

Any person guilty of any offence against any of these By-laws, not otherwise specially provided for, shall be liable for every such offence, besides any costs or expenses that may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person, as well as any costs and expenses which may be incurred in remedying such default, as provided for in "The Health Act, 1898" (Sections 35 and 242), or these By-laws, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £10, and to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £5 for each day during which such offence shall be continued; and such penalty or penalties shall be recovered as provided in the said Act: Provided always, that no penalty imposed hereunder shall be less than 5s.

BY-LAW No. 10.

1. A bank cheque or a bank draft in favour of the Colonial Treasurer must accompany application, the amount of which will be placed at fixed deposit at current bank rate of interest for the period mentioned in application. No amount will be deposited bearing interest for a less period than six months. Such deposit will be renewed from time to time for like periods, unless notice to the contrary is given not less than seven days prior to deposit maturing.

2. Interest accruing on deposits will be forwarded direct to ledger account holder, or paid to his credit at any bank, as may be desired.

3. Deposits may be withdrawn at any time upon notice (in writing) being given to the Chief Accountant, and ledger accounts closed, but interest will be allowed only on deposits which have matured, and not for any broken periods.

4. Credit will not be given beyond the amount of deposit.

5. Accounts will be rendered at least monthly, and must be paid in full within seven days of delivery of same. In the event of payment not being so made, it will be optional with the Department to summarily close the account and apply the amount of deposit, or so much of it as may be necessary, in payment of such account, and should there be a deficiency, detain goods on any part of the railway premises as lien. Accounts will be rendered more frequently than monthly if desired by the ledger account holder, and if convenient to the Commissioner. No money will be received in part payment of an account.

1. No cab, carriage, cart, trolly, or other wheeled vehicle will be allowed to enter upon the railway premises for the purpose of plying for hire, unless the person in charge thereof has been duly licensed for that purpose by the Commissioner.

2. Applications for licenses must be made to the Commissioner (in the form of Schedule A hereto) and forwarded through the Station Master or other official in charge of the place for which the license is required.

3. Applicants for licenses must forward, with their application, certificates of character from at least two persons of repute, or one certificate from the Police authorities of the district wherein the applicant resides or plies his calling.

4. A half-yearly fee of 10s. (Ten shillings) shall be paid on every license issued. Every license shall terminate on the 30th June and 31st December in each year, and the Commissioner may, subject to the regulations in force for the time being, renew such license on payment of the prescribed fee of 10s.

5. The holder of a license shall not solicit custom or hire, or in any wise interfere with or obstruct any passenger or servant of the Commissioner upon any railway premises or any approach thereto (*vide* By-laws 20 and 21).

6. Licenses are not transferable. They must be delivered up to the Commissioner when required.

7. Should the person in charge of any vehicle plying for hire on any railway premises be found in possession of, and using a license which has not been issued to him, he will be liable to prosecution.

8. The Commissioner may cancel any license the holder of which,—

- Has been convicted of a breach of the By-laws; or
- Has been proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioner to have been guilty of any disorderly conduct; or
- Of making use of threatening, abusive, indecent, or offensive language; or
- Is guilty of any breach of these regulations.

9. The Commissioner may, without giving any reason, cancel any license issued under these regulations.

10. All previous regulations are hereby cancelled.

In the matter of "The Tramways Act, 1885," and in the matter of an application by "The Kalgoorlie Tramways, Limited," for a Provisional Order authorising the construction of Tramways in the District of the Municipality of Boulder.

WHEREAS "THE KALGOORLIE ELECTRIC TRAMWAYS, LIMITED," whose registered office in Western Australia is in Boulder Road, Kalgoorlie, a Company within the meaning of the expression "The Promoters" as defined by "The Tramways Act, 1885," Section 3, Sub-section 2, has made application to me for a Provisional Order authorising the construction of Tramways in the District of the Municipality of Boulder along the routes in the Schedule hereunder written; AND WHEREAS the Promoter has published notice of its intention to make such application in the form prescribed in the Schedule "B" annexed to "The Tramways Act, 1885," by advertisement in the *Government Gazette* and in the *Kalgoorlie Miner* and *Evening Star* newspapers, published in the said District, and has deposited the documents described in Schedule "C" annexed to the same Act with the Minister for Works, Perth, and with the Town Clerk of the Municipality of Boulder: AND WHEREAS I have considered the said application and it appears to me expedient and proper that the said application should be granted: NOW THEREFORE I, C. H. RASON, the Minister for Works for Western Australia, DO HEREBY, by virtue of the provisions of "The Tramways Act, 1885," make a Provisional Order, and I DO ORDER as follows, that is to say:—

1. The Promoter shall be and is hereby empowered to make, form, lay down, construct, maintain, and work tramways in, upon, and along such of the streets and roads in the District of the Municipality of Boulder as are mentioned in the said Schedule hereunder written: PROVIDED NEVERTHELESS that, notwithstanding anything herein contained, it shall be lawful for the Minister for Works, at any time within six months from this date, by notice in writing to the Promoter, delivered at its registered office for the time being, to prohibit the construction of any part or parts of the said tramway which, in the opinion of the Minister for Works, may interfere with the Railway system.

2. That the Promoter shall, within six months after the confirmation by Act of Parliament of the Provisional Order, or within such extended time as the Local Authority may approve, substantially commence the work in connection with the said tramways; and shall, within six months from the expiration of the above-mentioned six months or from the expiration of such extended time as aforesaid, have the electric tramways running and fully equipped for a distance equal to one-half of the total length of the routes mentioned in the said Schedule hereto; and shall, within three months from the expiration of the said last-mentioned six months, complete the other half or balance of the said tramways on the said routes and fully complete the works authorised by the Provisional Order in respect of the said routes, and the same shall in every respect be in accordance with "The Tramways Act, 1885."

3. That the Promoter shall, within two years from the date of the confirmation by Act of Parliament of this Provisional Order, purchase the freehold of, or lease with right of purchase, all such lands as shall be required for the purpose of or in connection with the working of the said tramway (such purchase in every case to be with the approval, in writing, of the Local Authority, and shall, previous to such purchase or lease, notify the Local Authority, in writing, the price proposed to be paid for such freehold or leasehold land: AND all buildings and works required or used in connection with the tramways in Boulder City shall be erected on freehold lands or leasehold lands with the right of purchase.

4. That the said Tramways shall be constructed on a 3ft. 6in. gauge.

5. That the Promoter shall, at his own expense, at all times maintain and keep in good condition and repair, with such materials and in such manner as the Local Authority shall direct and to their satisfaction, so much of any road whereon any tramway belonging to the Promoter is laid as lies between the rails of the tramway, and where double lines of rails are laid by the Promoter on any road at a distance of not more than four feet from each other the portion of the road between the tramways, and also in every case so much of the road as extends eighteen inches beyond the rail on each side of the tramways. If the Promoter shall abandon the undertaking, or any part of the same, and, with the consent in writing of the Minister for Works and the Local Authority, shall take up any tramways or any part of any tramway belonging to the Promoter, such Promoter shall, with all convenient speed, in all cases within four weeks at the most (unless the Local Authority otherwise consent in writing), fill in the ground and make good the surface, and to the satisfaction of the Local Authority restore the portion of the road upon which such tramways

were laid to as good a condition as that in which it was immediately before such tramways were laid thereon, and shall also clear away all surplus paving, metalling material, and rubbish occasioned by such work to such place as the Local Authority may direct; and the Promoter shall in the meantime cause the place where the road is opened or broken up to be fenced or watched and properly lighted at night in the same manner as prescribed in Clause 20 of the Tramways Act, 1885: PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that no part of the tramways proposed in this Agreement, after having been laid, shall be taken up or abandoned without the consent in writing of the Minister for Works and the Local Authority having been first obtained.

6. Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, the Promoter may demand and take, for every passenger conveyed upon the said tramways, any tolls and charges not exceeding the amounts following:—The maximum fare to be charged for a single journey in the case of ordinary cars shall be as follows:—

- (a.) From any part of Boulder Municipality to any other part of it, Threepence.
- (b.) From any part of Boulder Municipality (excepting only that portion of Lane Street and the Federal Road route to the North of Burt Street) to any place within the Kalgoorlie Roads Board District, Sixpence.
- (c.) From any part of Boulder Municipality (with the exception of that portion of Lane Street and the Federal Road route to the North of Burt Street) to any part of Kalgoorlie Municipality, Ninepence.
- (d.) From any part of Lane Street and the Federal Road route North of Burt Street and within the Boulder Municipality to any part of Kalgoorlie Roads Board District, Threepence.
- (e.) From any part of Lane Street and the Federal Road route North of Burt Street and within the Boulder Municipality to any part of Kalgoorlie Municipality, Sixpence.
- (f.) Special cars may be run by the Promoter, who may charge fares otherwise than set forth in this Agreement; but such special cars shall be run and fares charged subject only to the permission and approval, in writing, of the Local Authority first had and obtained.

7. In the event of the fares charged by the Promoter from any one part of the Kalgoorlie Municipality to any other part of that Municipality, or from any one part of the Kalgoorlie Roads Board District to any other part of such District, being reduced below the sum of threepence as now charged, the fare from any one part of the Boulder Municipality to any other part of it, and being a like distance, shall be to the same extent reduced if and on such routes required by the Local Authority.

8. In the event of the two Municipalities becoming contiguous, the fares then to be charged shall be:—

- (a.) From any part of the Boulder Municipality to any other part of it, Threepence (3d.)
- (b.) From any part of the Boulder Municipality to any place within the Kalgoorlie Roads Board District, Sixpence (6d.)
- (c.) From any part of the Boulder Municipality to any part of Kalgoorlie Municipality, Sixpence (6d.)

9. Workmen's tickets will be issued at a single fare for the return journey during specified hours, and will be available for the return journey between the same hours as in force over the Promoter's system of tramways in Kalgoorlie, or as may be mutually agreed between the Promoter and the Local Authority.

10. Every passenger travelling on a tramway constructed under the conditions of this Order which is crossed by another like tramway, the property of the Promoter, shall be entitled, without extra charge, to a transfer ticket authorising him or her to proceed on his or her journey to any point on such other tramway within the district to which the fare has been paid.

11. That the time table to be observed for running the said tramways and the schedule of the fares to be charged shall be fixed by the Promoter, with the approval, in writing, of the Local Authority from time to time, and no time table or schedule of fares shall be altered without the consent, in writing, of the Local Authority. Provided that the minimum number of trips to be run on each of the routes mentioned herein shall be ten (10) per day. And that in case of differences or dispute between the Promoter and

Local Authority as to the said time table or schedule of fares, the same shall be referred to arbitration, as provided for in an agreement dated the fifteenth day of August, 1903, and made between the Local Authority and the Promoter.

12. The tolls and charges authorised to be taken and which shall be demanded by the Promoter shall be paid to such persons and at such places upon or near the tramways and in such manner and under such regulations as the Promoter shall appoint by notice to be exhibited in some conspicuous place on the inside of each of the passenger cars used by the Promoter upon the tramways.

13. Every passenger travelling upon the tramways may take with him ordinary personal luggage belonging to him, not exceeding in weight 20lbs., without any charge being made for the carriage thereof.

14. The said tramways shall be used for the conveyance or carriage of passengers and passengers' luggage only.

15. The said tramways shall be moved by electrical or other power approved of by the Local Authority. The Promoter may erect and maintain, in such place or places as shall be approved by the Local Authority, all such poles and posts, with wires attached thereto, in the said streets and roads mentioned in the said Schedule hereunder written, along the routes therein mentioned, as may be necessary or required for supplying electricity to the said cars and for working the said tramways on the overhead trolley system: PROVIDED that the Minister for Works shall be entitled to direct the alteration of position of any pole or post or wire, if it appears to him that the same is specially inconvenient and could be made less inconvenient without great cost to the Promoter, and in the event of such direction being given by the said Minister for Works, the Promoter shall comply with it without delay.

- (a.) The spans between the poles not to exceed 120 feet.
- (b.) The voltage of the current supplied not to exceed 600, volts without the approval of the Local Authority.
- (c.) Height of cables and trolley wire above street not to be less than 19 feet, without the approval of the Local Authority.
- (d.) If any cables are erected close to any balcony or building, provision must be made to prevent the possibility of any such cables actually touching and making earth with the verandahs, etc., and provision must also be made for protecting any person standing on a balcony or verandah from accidentally touching the cables. No cable carrying a voltage of from 500 to 600 volts to be placed closer to any building or verandah or balcony than 3ft., and, wherever possible, cables to be on a level with the floor or roof of the verandah or balcony.
- (e.) In the event of fire, or any other serious accident, the Local Authority, fire brigade, or police to have power to order the supply of current to be discontinued at any place in order to avoid danger or accident to firemen, etc., carrying out their duties, and the Promoter shall have no claim for compensation for loss of traffic or damage.
- (f.) Where a trolley is supported by a span wire, the span wire to be insulated at both ends of the poles in addition to the usual insulation between the span wire and the trolley wire.
- (g.) No wire, cable, pole, stay, or other fixing to be erected closer than 3 feet from any telegraph or telephone wire, cable, pole, stay, or fixing without the permission of the Minister for Works.
- (h.) Before any work is commenced, beyond the laying of the track, detailed plans and specifications of the whole of the electrical installation, machinery, buildings, and works, together with detailed drawings of the rolling-stock, shall be submitted to the Minister for Works for his approval.

16. In the construction of the tram lines, the rails to be used on the whole of the routes proposed to be laid in Lane Street, and on that portion of the Burt Street and Finiston Road routes from Finiston to Thomson Street, shall not be less than 60lb. rails of the girder groove pattern, and as regards all other proposed routes the rails shall be of the "T" pattern, and shall be not less than 45lb. rails, or such other pattern or weight as may be approved by the Minister for Works, provided they be replaced by the Promoter with 60lb. girder groove rails on the Minister for Works giving the Promoter 12 months' notice so to do. Groove rails shall be used on all curves and crossings.

17. All cars using the said tramway may travel at a speed not exceeding the rate of 10 miles an hour, and may follow after each other at distances of not less than 50 yards, and may stop at any point on the said tramways, except on crossings of streets, for the purpose of picking up and setting down passengers, and may stand at the terminus of any of the said tramways.

18. Nothing herein contained shall prejudice or affect a certain agreement, dated the fifteenth day of August, 1903, made between the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Boulder of the one part, and the Promoter of the other part, as varied by an agreement dated the 29th day of August, 1903, made between the same parties, except so far as the same is contrary to or in conflict with the provisions of this Order or "The Tramways Act, 1885."

19. The said tramways may be constructed with single or double lines as may be agreed upon between the Local Authority and the Promoter, and the tramways may at any time be laid with double lines with the approval of the Local Authority, subject to the plans being approved by the Minister for Works.

20. The term "the Promoter," wherever herein used, shall mean and include "The Kalgoorlie Electric Tramways, Limited," and its assigns whenever the context so requires or admits.

THE SCHEDULE HEREINBEFORE REFERRED TO.

- (a.) From a point in Fimiston Road one chain West of the level railway crossing in Fimiston Road; thence along Fimiston Road and Burt Street to a point in Burt Street opposite the Grand Stand of the Boulder Racecourse.
- (b.) From the present tram terminus in Lane Street along Lane Street to and along Vivian Street to Chesapeake Street; thence along Chesapeake Street to Oroya Street; thence along Oroya Street to the boundary of the Municipality of Boulder.
- (c.) Branch line along Hopkins Street from Lane Street to Shenton Street.
- (d.) Branch line along Thomson Street from Burt Street to North Terrace, and there connecting the present tramway in Salisbury Road.
