3. A metal sheet-piling, composed of channel-beams joined edgewise and having the back and channel sides thereof positioned alternately with reference to each other when assembled in a wall structure.

4. In metal sheet-piling, the combination with piling beam-sections interlocked along their flanged edges in continuous order of succession, of the angle z-bars secured to and preventing the displacement of the sections when assembled together.

5. In metal sheet-piling, a corner section composed of companion L-beams positioned at right angles with reference to each other, of an angle-iron rigidly joining the L-beams and the companion z-bars secured thereto.


