Claims:—

1. An improved floor cramp having a sliding rack bar, a pair of operating pawls mounted in a rocker and means of clamping said cramp to the joist substantially as set forth and illustrated.

2. In a floor cramp, and in combination a sliding rack bar in a groove in the top of the bed plate, a rocker pivotally mounted on a pair of cheeks, a handle for said rocker, and a pair of pawls pivotted one above and one below the spindle of said rocker substantially as set forth and illustrated.

3. In a floor cramp an adjustable eccentric lever pivotally mounted in a lateral slotted lug having teeth on its upper surface engaging corresponding teeth on the underside of a retaining block held in position by a wing nut substantially as set forth and illustrated.

Claims:—

1. A suction-filter the filtering chamber of which is formed by two plates a of filtering material and a washer, packing ring or the like, b which is arranged between the said plates and through which passes a tube connected to the suction pipe, the said plates being pressed against the washer by suitable means.

2. The form of the suction-filter described in Claim 1 in which the frames form a casing of which the walls opposite the filtering plates are perforated for the passage of liquid and so shaped that spaces are formed between them and the said plates

3. A form of the filter described in Claims 1 and 2 specially adapted for pocket use, in which the casing consists of a flat cylindrical part c for the reception of the filter plates and the packing ring, provided with a socket or union l for the suction tube and with a cylindrical series we cover l, the packing ring being arranged round a metal ring k adapted to press the packing ring against the cylindrical wall of the casing and provided with a short out-flow tube j which extends through the metal ring and the packing ring into the union l.
