WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart, by proclamation in the Government acquire and set apart, by proclamation in the Government Gazette, such ground as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations, on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purpose of the said Act: AND WHEREAS it was deemed expedient by me, the said Governor, to set apart as a Temporary Quarantine Station the enclosures known as the "Bushmead Pigsties," situated on Swan Location No. 16: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, with the advice and consent of Executive Council, do hereby withdraw and proclaim free from quarantine the above-named premises, as from the 23rd February, 1904.

QUARANTINE ORDERS.

SECTION 1.

DUTIES OF QUARANTINE OFFICERS.

To visit Ships and make inquiries.

For quarantine purposes, the Quarantine Officer of each port shall visit every ship which arrives at his port from beyond sea, or from any port in Australia at which any quarantinable disease is known or suspected to exist, and shall, before going on board the ship, put to the master the questions set out in the first schedule to these regulations; and papers containing those questions, printed or written thereon, shall be handed to the master and surgeon or other medical officer (if any) of the ship, who shall write their replies thereon and sign the same, and return the papers to the Quarantine Officer.

Until the visit of the Quarantine Officer above referred to has been made, and until pratique has been granted, no person other than the Pilot shall be permitted to board the vessel, nor shall any person on board be allowed to disembark, nor shall any boat other than that of the Quarantine Officer or Pilot be allowed alongside. Any person infring-ing this regulation shall be liable to be brought before the Magistrate and dealt with according to law.

If ship liable to quarantine.

2. If it appears from the answers to such questions that the ship is liable to quarantine under the provisions of the Act, the Quarantine Officer shall order the ship into quarantine, as prescribed by the 2nd, 5th, and 7th sections of the Act.

Where ship has touched at infected place.

Any ship arriving in Western Australia from a port 3. or place where small-pox, bubonic plague, cholera, or yellow fever is known or suspected to exist may, provided the in-cubation periods for these respective diseases have elapsed, and also provided the vessel is clean, and that no case of small-pox, bubonic plague, cholera, or yellow fever has occurred, or any case of a suspicious nature presented itself during the voyage, be granted pratique at the discretion of the Quarantine Officer.

The incubation period of each to be computed as follows: --Small-pox, 15 days; bubonic plague, 10 days; cholera, seven days; and yellow fever, five days.

Where reasonable suspicion of danger.

4. If any Quarantine Officer has reasonable cause for 4. If any quarantine oncer has reasonable cause for supposing that the public health would be endangered by the immediate admission to pratique of a ship arriving from beyond sea, or from any port or place at which any dangerous infectious disease is known or suspected to exist, he shall refuse pratique to such ship; but he must report at once to the Principal Medical Officer that he has done so, and his reasons for doing so, in order that the necessary steps may be taken for the continuance of the ship in, or its discharge from the performance of, quarantine.

May direct passengers to be landed and ship cleansed.

5. Before a ship arriving in Western Australia from beyond sea, or from any port or place at which any dangerous beyond sea, or from any port of place at which any dangerous infectious disease is known or suspected to exist, is admitted to pratique, the Quarantine Officer may, if he thinks fit, direct that the passengers shall be landed at a quarantine ground for the purpose of affording them an opportunity of bathing and of washing and disinfecting all linen, clothing, bedding, and other things that have been worn or used during the purpose of affording the deviation and disinfecting the during the voyage, and for cleansing and disinfecting the ship; and, as soon as the surgeon of the ship certifies, in writing, to the Quarantine Officer that his directions have been faithfully carried out, the Quarantine Officer shall forthwith admit the ship and passengers to pratique.

Doubtful cases.

6. If there is no surgeon or other medical officer of the ship, and it appears from the answers to the questions aforesaid that there is any sickness on board the ship, or if, whether there is a surgeon or other medical officer or not, the Quarantine Officer is not satisfied whether the ship is or is not liable to quarantine, he shall go on board the ship and examine the passengers and crew, and ascertain whether the ship is or is not liable to quarantine; and if he finds that the ship is liable to quarantine, he shall order the ship into quarantine accordingly.

Quarantine officer going on board an infected ship.

If after the Quarantine Officer has boarded a ship he finds that there is an infectious or contagious disease on board, which might be communicated to the shore by him, he shall not leave the ship without the permission of the Principal Medical Officer first obtained, except for the pur-pose of going to some place where he can remain without danger of communicating the disease to other persons, unless before boarding he shall have put on an impermeable cloak covering the whole of his clothing from head to foot, surfaces of his body, and he shall immediately after examining the infected patient disinfect his hands and exposed surfaces of his body, and he shall cause his cloak, cap, and boots to be sponged and thoroughly disinfected with a solution of chinosol or corrosive sublimate of a strength of one in five hundred parts.

Where disease on board.

8. If the Quarantine Officer boarding a ship on arrival at the first port of call in the State finds any disease on board which would render the ship liable to quarantine, he may order the immediate removal of all infected persons to the nearest quarantine ground, to be kept there under proper medical or other attendance, and may then allow the ship and the rest of the passengers to proceed on the voyage, or he may allow the ship and all the passengers so to proceed. In either case, the ship shall proceed on the voyage under the yellow flag.

To make report.

9. The Quarantine Officer for the Port of Fremantle shall, as soon as practicable, report to the Principal Medical Officer the full names and ages and classification of all passengers landed at any Quarantine Station from any ship. The Quarantine Officers at other ports shall furnish similar reports by telegraph to the Principal Medical Officer, which shall be forwarded by him to the Minister.

10. All persons, goods, wares, merchandise, and other articles on board any vessel arriving at any port or place within the Colony, which shall have touched at any port or place, or communicated with any vessel at or on board of which bubonic plague shall be known or suspected to exist, or arriving at such port or place under any other alarming or suspicious circumstances as to infection, although such or suspicious circumstances as to infection, although such vessel shall not have come from any place which the Governor may have adjudged and declared it probable that such infectious disease may be brought, may be dealt with in such manner as the Quarantine Officer of such port (acting under the instructions of the Principal Medical Officer) shall direct.

Communication with ship may be prohibited.

11. The Quarantine Officer may, in his discretion, direct that all communication between the quarantine ground and the ship shall cease for the whole or any part of the time during which the ship remains liable to quarantine.

SECTION II.

DUTIES OF MASTERS OF SHIPS IN QUARANTINE. To proceed to Quarantine Station.

12. The master of any ship ordered into quarantine shall proceed with all possible despatch to the anchorage at the appointed Quarantine Station.

To assist in landing passengers, etc.

13. He shall afford every facility to the caretaker of the Quarantine Station, or his assistant, for landing passengers and their luggage, together with such stores as may be required for use on the quarantine ground. The provisions shall be placed in charge of the purser of the ship or other person who shall be landed with the passengers.

Ship to be thoroughly cleansed.

14. After the landing of the passengers and their luggage, and the stores, he must cause all bunk fittings in the 'tween decks to be burnt or disinfected, and the ship to be thoroughly cleansed, as the Quarantine Officer may direct.

Crew's effects to be disinfected.

15. He must also cause the whole of the clothes worn by the crew, and those remaining in their chests or bags, to be thoroughly washed and disinfected.

Release from Quarantine.

16. Before application is made by the master of any ship to be released from quarantine, the Quarantine Officer and the surgeon of the ship shall inspect the crew thereof, and if they are satisfied that the crew are free from any infectious or contagious disease, and that the instructions prescribed in the 11th, 14th, and 15th of these Regulations have been faithfully carried out, they shall forward to the Principal Medical Officer a certificate to that effect, which shall be forthwith reported to the Minister.

SECTION III.

DUTIES OF SURGEON IN CHARGE OF QUARANTINE. Sick to be placed in hospital.

17. On the arrival of the ship at the Quarantine Station, the surgeon or other medical officer in charge of the passengers shall, as soon as practicable, cause the sick to be landed and removed to the place set apart as a hospital, together with such attendants as may be required, and may, if he thinks fit, cause all clothes, bedding, and other things belonging to the sick to be burnt.

Where healthy passengers to be placed.

18. The healthy people shall then be landed with their luggage, and shall occupy the buildings or tents erected for their reception. Single women shall be placed in charge of the matron (if any), and, when practicable, they shall be located close to the surgeon's quarters, the married people next to the single girls' quarters, and the single men next to the surgeon but at come distance or matrix to the married people, but at some distance away.

Effects of passengers to be cleansed.

19. He shall, as soon as practicable, see that all the clothes that have been worn by the passengers during the voyage, and those remaining in their boxes, are properly cleansed, washed, and disinfected.

Isolation.

20. He shall not permit any communication whatever to take place between the patients or their attendants in the hospital and the healthy passengers; and in the event of any fresh case breaking out, he will cause the patient to be at once removed to the hospital, and, if necessary, his clothes and bedding to be burnt.

Matron.

21. He shall see that the matron (if any) discharges her duties as on board the ship towards those who are intrusted to her care, and that the women's quarters are carefully secured before retiring for the night; and that no com-munication shall take place between the single women and other passengers without his permission.

Discipline.

22. He shall see that the same discipline is enforced as is required to be observed by the passengers on board ships, and shall report to the Principal Medical Officer any person who is guilty of misconduct, or who wilfully destroys or takes any property belonging to the Government or to any person in quarantine, or who commits a breach of these Regulations.

Letters, etc., to be disinfected before despatch.

23. He shall see that all letters from passengers are properly disinfected before leaving the quarantine ground.

Diary and case-book to be kept.

He shall keep a diary and a medical case-book, both 24 of which must be written up daily; and he shall make a report to the Quarantine Officer as often as an opportunity presents itself, in the form of Schedule 2 to these Regulations.

Quarantine buildings, etc., to be cleansed.

25. Before the release of the passengers from quarantine, he shall cause the whole of the buildings to be thoroughly cleansed, and the tents, cooking utensils, and other articles which have been used to be carefully stowed away to the satisfaction of the Quarantine Officer.

Surgeon's certificate for release.

26. After the prescribed quarantine has been performed, if the surgeon or other medical officer considers that the passengers are free from further infection, and may be released with safety to the public health, he shall forward to the Quarantine officer a certificate in the form of Schedule 3 to these Regulations, which shall be forthwith reported to the Minister by the Principal Medical Officer.

SECTION IV.

DUTIES OF PILOTS.

27. Before boarding any vessel arriving at any port in Western Australia, the Pilot shall satisfy himself that no infectious or contagious disease exists on board of such vessel. He shall obtain this information by requiring replies to the questions contained in Schedule 4 of these Regulations.

28. If any infectious or contagious disease exists on board, the pilot shall, if possible, place the vessel in safety without going on board, and shall then communicate at once with the Quarantine Officer, or, in the absence of that officer, with the Resident Magistrate.

Should a Pilot be unable to secure the safety of a vessel entering a port without boarding such vessel he must go on board, and will be liable to perform such quarantine as may be prescribed for the other persons on board.

H IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897" (61st Vict., No. 23), and of "The Cemeteries Act, 1899" (63rd Vict., No. 38), for the management of the Mount Morgans Public Cemetery Reserve $\bigwedge_{(7391)}$.

BY-LAWS.

1. All fees and charges payable to the Cemetery Trust shall be made at the time when applications are made, or orders given, and all interments shall be paid for before burial takes place.

2. Any person desiring ground in the Cemetery for any grave, vault, tombstone, monument, or enclosure, or for any other purpose, shall make application therefor at the office of the Cemetery Trust. Upon such application being approved of, the Cemetery Trustees shall cause to be issued to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial, in the form prescribed by the Act.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Cemetery Trustees at least six hours previous to the time fixed for burial.

4. The name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of deceased, and any other particulars shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.

5. Any person requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under the supervision of the Cemetery Trustees, after submitting a plan of same and obtaining the written approval of the Cemetery Trustees thereto. Every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

6. Every coffin shall have on the lid an approved metal plate, bearing the name and age of the deceased stamped thereon in legible characters.

7. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than five feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

8. No interment shall be allowed in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial, as in Schedule A, or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except in such cases as are provided for in the following by-laws.

9. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written consent of the owner shall be handed in with the application.

10. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery without a certificate from the Deputy Registrar of Deaths, or a Coroner. Such certificate shall be handed in to the office of the Cemetery Trustees before the funeral takes place.

11. All burials shall take place between the hours of sunrise and sunset.

12. At any funeral no vehicle shall, under any consideration, be allowed to enter the Cemetery, with the exception of the hearse and first mourning coach, and only the latter when driven by the undertaker or his employee.

13. The materials used in every erection shall be subject to the approval of the officers of the Cemetery Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing same to be used, or by the contractor for the erections.

14. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing same.

15. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work in the Cemetery, deposit with the Cemetery Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if the previous by-law is not complied with to the satisfaction of the officer of the Cemetery Trustees, 16. Subject to the approval of the Cemetery Trustees, each proprietor shall enclose his land with tile, slate, or stone kerbing, and shall cause to be placed thereon the number of the grave or vault. No mounds shall be allowed. The shape and height of all graves, etc., shall be subject to the supervision and approval of the officer of the Cemetery Trustees.

17. No trees or shrubs shall be planted in any enclosure except such as shall be approved by the Cemetery Trustees.

18. All workmen, whether employed by the Cemetery Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the officer of the Cemetery Trustees, and shall only obey such directions as that officer may find it necessary to give; and any workman committing any breach of these regulations and by-laws, or neglecting or refusing to comply with any directions of the said officer, shall be removed from the Cemetery.

19. Any person taking part in attending or dressing any grave shall comply with the following rules :---

- (a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material used in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other adjoining grave, and if placed on any other adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
- (b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the officer of the Cemetery Trustees.
- (c.) The dressing of all graves, and the wheeling and carting of all material, shall be subject to the supervision of the officer of the Cemetery Trustees.
- (d.) Work in all cases to be carried on with all despatch, and only during regulation hours.

20. No dogs shall be admitted to the Cemetery, and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.

21. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, border, or any erection, or in any way infringing "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," or any rule, regulation, or by-law made for protecting the Cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.

22. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery, or its approaches, any trade, business, or calling either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, or cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

23. No person employed by, or under, the Cemetery Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever whilst in the discharge of his duties, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work, under a liability of summary dismissal.

24. The following shall be the Trustees of the Cemetery:—The Mayor of Mount Morgans, Mr. John Smith; Priest in charge Anglican Church, Rev. P. J. Ryall, B.A.; Priest in charge Roman Catholic Church, Rev. Edward O'Malley; the Minister Wesleyan Church, Rev. W. R. Lang.

25. Every person committing a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws shall, for every offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds, and, in case of a continuing breach, not exceeding one pound for every day during which such breach continues.
