THE STOCK DISEASES ACT, 1895. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council, to be published in the Government Gazette, from time to time to make, wary, alter, or revoke such Regulations under this Act as may be deemed expedient for all or any of the following purposes:—For the purpose of subjecting any stock to such restrictions or remedial measures as may be deemed necessary to prevent the introduction or spread of disease; for sary to prevent the introduction or spread of disease; for providing for the steps to be taken in case of any disease breaking out among any stock in the State and for preventing the spreading of such disease; for prescribing the manner in which persons coming into contact with infected stock, and land, premises, or conveyances travelled over or used by infected stock, shall be cleansed and disinfected, for the reculetion measurement. cleansed and disinfected; for the regulation, management, and control of quarantine grounds, and for prescribing the treatment and disposal of stock whilst in quarantine, or in transit thereto or therefrom; for prescribing the term during which stock shall be quarantined, and generally for all or any such purposes as he may deem necessary for preventing the introduction or spread of disease: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby make the following Regulations under the said Act.

### REGULATIONS.

1. It is the duty of the owner of poultry infected with tick, within twenty-four hours of the time when he shall have discovered or suspected such poultry to be infected, to give written notice thereof to the nearest inspector, and thenceforth to keep such infected poultry from coming into contact with other poultry until otherwise ordered by the inspector. (See 59 Vict., No. 34, Section 11.)

- 2. If an inspector shall discover on any premises poultry infected with tick, he may serve upon the owner of such poultry a notice in the form or to the effect of the schedule
- 3. During the four weeks next following the service of such notice it shall be unlawful for any person to remove any poultry from the premises referred to in such notice.
- Within the four weeks next following the service of such notice the following steps shall be taken by the owner of such poultry for cleansing and disinfecting the premises and preventing the spreading of such disease, that is to
  - (a.) All fowl houses and the appurtenances used in connection herewith shall be dismantled, and all visible ticks destroyed.
  - (b.) All material with which such fowl houses and appurtenances were constructed shall then (if not destroyed by fire) be saturated with boiling water, and in order that all ticks and their germs hidden in crevices may be destroyed, thoroughly saturated with a three per cent. solution of carbolic acid and water.
  - (c.) Should the fowl houses be in close proximity to or attached to fencing, such fencing must be treated in a similar manner.
  - (d.) The whole of the ground area of infected houses etc., must be strewn to a thickness of half inch with fresh quicklime, and then slaked with water, also the ground within three feet of each side of infected fencing must be treated in a similar manner.
- 5. If the owner of any poultry shall make default in taking such steps as aforesaid pursuant to such notice, all work that the inspector shall deem necessary to be done to comply therewith may be undertaken by or under the direction of the inspector, and the expense incurred shall be recoverable in a support way to the suit of such be recoverable in a summary way at the suit of such inspector before any Justice of the Peace.
- 6. Any person committing any breach of the foregoing regulations, numbered 3 and 4, shall for every offence be liable, in addition to any expenses incurred under Regulation 5, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

#### REGULATIONS.

The following Regulations are incorporated with the Regulations made on the 24th day of September, 1902, and published in the Government Gazette on the 26th day of September are considered in the Government Gazette on the 26th day of September and Control of the Control of th tember, 1902:

- 1. All horses imported into Western Australia from beyond the limits of the Australian States and New Zealand shall, immediately before leaving the place of shipment, be subjected by a duly qualified veterinary surgeon to the Mallien test for glanders, and a certificate of the veterinary surgeon that they have been submitted to such test and are free from disease or infection must be produced before the landing of such horses will be permitted.
- All such horses may be again subjected to the Mallien test after their arrival and before they are released from quarantine if, in the opinion of the Chief Inspector of Stock, such test is necessary.
- 3. All cattle imported into Western Australia from beyond the limits of the Australian States and New Zealand shall, immediately before leaving the place of shipment, be subjected by a duly qualified veterinary surgeon to the tuberculin test for tuberculosis, and a certificate of the veterinary surgeon that they have been submitted to that test and are free from disease or infection must be produced before the landing of such cattle will be permitted.
- 4. All such cattle must be again submitted to the tuberculin test after their arrival and before they are released from quarantine if, in the opinion of the Chief Inspector of Stock, such test is necessary.

## THE MINING DEVELOPMENT ACT, 1902.

REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH STONE WILL BE Crushed and Tailings treated at the State BATTERIES.

Department of Mines,

Perth, 7th April, 1904. 2500 1001

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the powers conferred upon him by Section 29 of "The Mining Development Act, 1902," has been pleased to cancel the Regulations gazetted on 14th August, 1903, and in lieu thereof to make the following Regulations under which Stone will be crushed and Tailings treated at the State Batteries.

> H. GREGORY, Minister for Mines.

- 1. All stone accepted for treatment at the State batteries shall be estimated at 21 cubic feet per ton, except where weighing machines are provided, when stone must pass over same to ascertain weight.
- 2. The manager of the battery may refuse any stone considered too poor to pay crushing charges, unless a deposit is paid in advance.
- The charge for crushing, as determined from time to time by the Hon. the Minister for Mines, shall be posted up at each battery and strictly adhered to while in force.
- 4. A minimum charge will be made for all parcels of less tonnage than will return £5 on the rate charged per ton.
- 5. Payment for crushing shall be made to the manager on completion of treatment, or sufficient gold will be retained to pay for the amount due,
- 6. Where no cyanide plant has been erected at a battery, any person desirous of claiming tailings, the proceeds of his crushing, shall remove them from the battery site immediately the crushing is completed, otherwise they will be deemed absolutely abandoned
- 7. Where a cyanide plant has been erected at a battery, tailings resulting from stone crushed at that battery will be treated, but the manager may, in his discretion, refuse to treat any tailings should he consider them unsuitable for treatment by cyanide.
- 8. The number of tons of tailings suitable for cyanide treatment by the ordinary leaching vat plant installed at the battery shall be determined by the manager, whose decision shall be final; provided that in no case shall such tonnage exceed eighty per cent. of the number of tons milled. Where a slimes plant is working in conjunction with the ordinary vat system, the combined tonnage of sand and slimes shall not exceed 90 per cent. of the tons milled.
- 9. The manager shall take samples of the tailings as they pass through the battery, or from the pit into which the tailings may be deposited. The tailings collected shall be thoroughly mixed and divided into three samples, one for assay by the manager, one for the owner, and one sealed and kept by the manager for reference. The assay of the manager's sample will be available on application within fourteen days from the completion of any crushing, and should the owner dispute such assay he shall, within six weeks of the completion of the crushing, notify the manager to that effect, in writing, and shall at the same time forward a certificate from a competent assayer. On receipt of such certificate the results of the two assays will be averaged, provided that the difference between them does not exceed six grains; but should the difference in the assay exceed six grains, and should the owner still refuse to accept the manager's assay, the manager shall forward the sealed sample previously referred to, to the Government assayer, Perth, and the result of the assay as furnished by him shall be indisputable and final. The cost of such assay (fifteen shillings) shall be borne by the party whose assay differs most widely from the referee assay.
- A clean-up will be made about every two months when the Department will make a pro rata distribution, based upon the original assay value of the tailings, the estimated extraction therefvom, and the actual extraction. After the deduction of ten shillings per ton for cost of treatment, the owners of tailings treated will receive the amount due to them within 14 days after the value of the bullion has been ascertained.
- 11. All tailings assaying less than 3 dwts. 3grs. per ton shall become the property of the Government.

- A charge of ten shillings per ton for treatment shall be the first charge on all tailings treated, and the gold contents of tailings will be paid for at the rate of Four pounds
- 13. All tailings collected for treatment by the owner will be treated at the rate of 27 cubic feet per ton.
- 14. All slimes, the produce of stone crushed at any State Battery, shall be absolutely the property of the Government, but when the Minister has decided to erect a plant for treatment of slimes in connection with such battery, thenceforward, as from such date as may be fixed by the Minister, payment will be made to the owners of the stone from which slimes are obtained of the value of the gold actually obtained therefrom by such treatment, less such charges for treatment, and deductions, and allowances for losses, and subject to such conditions and regulations as the Minister may from time to time prescribe.
- 15. All stone will be delivered and received for treatment absolutely at the owner's risk, and the Government shall not be responsible for any suspension of operations, delays in treatment, or for any loss or damage arising from any cause whatsoever
- 16. At every battery there will be kept a book in which shall be recorded the number of tons in each parcel left for treatment, the name, locality, and number of the lease or holding from which it is obtained, and the name of the person for whom the stone is to be crushed.

A copy of the foregoing rules shall be inserted in the said book, and every person sending stone for treatment shall sign opposite the entry relating to the stone lodged by him, and such signature shall be sufficient evidence that he is cognisant of the foregoing rules, and agrees to be bound by them.

#### GOVERNMENT ASSAYS.

A SSAYS, Analyses, and Determinations of any Western Australian Ore or Rock will be made by the Assayer to the Geological Survey, when not unduly interfering with official work, subject to the following conditions:—

- A letter must be sent at the same time to the same address, stating for what metals the samples are to be assayed, or containing other instructions, as the case may be.

- Before any assay is made the prescribed fee must be paid to the Mineralogist and Assayer or sufficient reasons, in accordance with Section 7 below, be furnished for having the samples treated free of cost.

This was an unusually warm month in Western coastal districts, but on the Eastern side of the Darling Ranges it was, on the contrary, remarkably cool. We find that whereas at the Perth Observatory the mean daily maximum was 4·1 above that for previous years, at Coolgardie it was 4·7 below, so that we have the very unusual condition that the Eastern Goldfields in March were considerably cooler than the districts near the West coast. In fact the hottest place in the whole State South of latitude 30 was Guildford; Geraldton was very much hotter than usual, the mean daily maximum being 89·1 or 5·7 above the average for previous years. There were two very unpleasant periods of hot sultry weather, viz., from 28th February to the 8th March, and from the 21st to 27th. Altogether there were 12 days when the temperature exceeded 90, or more than double the average. Following the former heat spell were showers in South-West and South districts, and following the latter were general rains throughout the extra tropical portion of the State; in some cases very heavy. On the whole the rainfall in South-West and South districts was far in excess of the mean for previous years. Elsewhere it was patchy, but mostly above the average.

Pressure was generally below the average, especially on the South-West coast.

The names contained in such certificate of the scrutineers, or a majority of them, shall be the members of the Committee in place of those who retire or whose term of office shall have expired. The Committee shall from time to time make such provision as they may think necessary for taking such ballot."

By-law 24.—As passed 1st May, 1902, altered to read as follows:—"A member desirous of recording his vote may, at any time after the names of the intending candidates have been duly advertised, obtain from the Secretary a ballot paper indorsed by the Secretary, and after duly notifying thereon the members for whom he proposes to vote, such ballot paper shall be deposited in the ballot box.
