WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Legislative Council of the said State, made and passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 21, intituled "An Ordinance for the Recovery of Small Debts and Demands," the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to constitute Local Courts for the recovery of Small Debts and Demands, to be holden at such times and places and within such Districts as may be most fit and convenient: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby notify and proclaim, and do hereby constitute a Local Court for the recovery of Small Debts and Demands, to be holden on the second Thursday in June next, and thenceforward on the second Thursday in each and every month, at Mulwarrie, in the North Coolgardie Magisterial District.

WHEREAS by "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1902" (1 and 2 Edward VII., No. 20), the Governor may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, after the opinion of the Road Board of the District has been requested, close any road or reservation for a road which may have been surveyed or shown as a road on any plan published by the Department of Lands and Surveys: Provided such road is not within the limit of a Municipality or Townsite, and has not been declared a Government road or a road under the Roads Act, or any Act amending the same: AND WHEREAS the road hereinafter described has been surveyed and shown as a road on the plan of the survey of Wagin Agricultural Area as published by the Department of Lands and Surveys: AND it is desirable to close such road: AND WHEREAS the opinion of the Arthur Road Board has been requested: Now THEREFORE I, Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, G.C.B., Governor as aforesaid, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the said surveyed road to be closed.

DESCRIPTION ABOVE REFERRED TO:

The surveyed road passing along the Western boundaries of Wagin Agricultural Area Lots 42 and 43.

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in, and be held by any Municipality,

Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of leasing for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that Reserve ⁷²⁵⁷ (Mundijong Lot 66, excluding Special Lease 453/152) should vest in and be held by the Serpentine Road Board in trust for "Water:" Now THEREFORE His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Serpentine Road Board, with power to the said Serpentine Road Board to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease.

 I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, copies of a Notice issued by the Home Office to shipbuilders in this country calling attention to their duties and liabilities both as regards vessels ordered by a belligerent prior to the outbreak of the war between Russia and Japan, and also as regards the making of overtures for the purchase of vessels by persons who do not disclose the intended ultimate destination of such vessels.

FOREIGN ENLISTMENT ACT, 1870. NOTICE TO SHIPBUILDERS AND OTHERS.

With reference to the war now in progress between Russia and Japan, the attention of shipbuilders and others is called to the provisions of "The Foreign Enlistment Act, 1870" (33 and 34 Vict., cap. 90), sections 8, 9, and 23, which indicate their duties and liabilities in the matter of building and equipping ships which are intended to, or may, be used in the military or naval service of the belligerents.

Section 8 provides that any person within His Majesty's Dominions who without Royal License builds, commissions, equips, or despatches any ship with intent or knowledge or having reasonable cause to believe that the same will be employed in the military or naval service of the belligerents, shall be liable to fine and imprisonment and the forfeiture of the ship and equipment.

Any person building or equipping such a ship in pursuance of a contract made before the commencement of the war shall not be liable to these penalties if—

(i.) Forthwith upon a proclamation of neutrality being issued by His Majesty he gives notice to the Secretary of State that he is so building, causing to be built, or equipping such ship, and furnishes such particulars of the contract and of any matters relating to, or done, or to be done under the contract as may be required by the Secretary of State:

(ii.) He gives such security, and takes and permits to be taken such other measures, if any, as the Secretary of State may prescribe for ensuring that such ship shall not be despatched, delivered, or removed without the licence of His Majesty until the termination of such war as aforesaid.

In any case in which overtures are made for the purchase or equipment of such ships by persons who do not satisfactorily disclose the ultimate destination of the ships, it would be the duty of all persons having knowledge of the fact to give notice to the Home Secretary in order that he might take the steps which he is empowered by the 23rd section of the said Act to take so as to ensure that such vessels should not be employed in contravention of the said Act.

BY-LAWS OF THE KIMBERLEY GOLDFIELDS
ROADS BOARD.

WHEREAS by "The Roads Act, 1902," the Roads Board of any district is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Kimberley Goldfields Roads Board, being the Roads Board for the district of Kimberley Goldfields, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it on that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

Interpretations.

In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say:—

"District."—The locality or area for the time being under the control of Kimberley Roads Board.

"Board."—The Kimberley Goldfields Roads Board.

"Chairman."—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.

"Member."—A member of the Board.

"The Act."—The Roads Act of 1902 and all amendments thereto, or which may come into force hereafter, as far as the Act allows.

"Reserve."—A reserve under the control of the Board.

"Road."—The word "road" will include all public roads and thoroughfares within the goldfields area

"Person."—The word person shall include the plural and also a body corporate.

Duties of Secretary.

1. To attend all Board meetings.
2. To attend all committees.
3. To take notes of minutes and prepare reports of committees.
4. To conduct all correspondence, and to give other officers instructions as directed by the minutes.
5. To answer all questions on Board's business.
6. To see that the accounts are audited once a year, and the balance-sheet prepared and published yearly in the *Government Gazette*, and at least one newspaper circulating in the district.
7. To prepare the rate-book and Board's electoral list, examine proofs of latter, and arrange for distribution of copies prior to elections; also to attend all Courts of Revision or Appeal, making the necessary arrangements for the elections, and preparing all papers, etc., for clerk.
8. To summon the members to Board and Committee meetings.
9. The Secretary shall keep the cash-book, as well as any or all other books required to show the receipts and expenditure made by the Board, and in accordance with directions issued from time to time by the Minister. The said books shall be written up at least once every month, ready for inspection by the Board or any member of the Board who may at any time desire to see them.
10. He shall check all accounts sent in to the Board, and see that all accounts for works (exceeding £10 in amount) have stated on them the authority under which such works have been done, and shall check returns made by collectors or other of the Board's officers, and shall see that with all returns made the heels of the receipt-book accompany the returns.
11. He shall remit to the bank upon every mail day, to the credit of the Board, any sum or sums of money that may be received by him on behalf of the Board.
12. He shall, at regular intervals, forward the pass-book to the bank, being careful to have the pass-book in hand on the 30th June in each year for the annual audit. No money shall be paid into the bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board except the Secretary. The Secretary shall readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands of the Board, and shall attend to all other matters affecting the finances of the Board and not herein specified.
13. The Secretary may at any time be employed by the Board to draw out specifications for works projected, and to inspect, on the Board's behalf, any contract that has been completed.
14. The Secretary may at any time be employed by order of the Board on maintenance work if it is considered necessary, and shall be entitled to remuneration at current rate of wages, in addition to his salary as Secretary, and such order of the Board shall relieve the Secretary from attendance at Board meetings during the term of such work.
15. The Board, in the absence of the Secretary, to appoint one of their members to act for any meeting.
16. The Secretary shall not be entitled to tender for any contracts to be let by the Board.

Meetings and Proceedings.

17. Meetings of the Board will be of two kinds: ordinary or special. Ordinary meetings shall be those held on or about mail day in each month for the transaction of the ordinary business of the Board. Special meetings are those called to consider special business, the nature of which shall be notified on the notice paper posted at the office. Business may be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was held. But minutes of all special meetings shall be read and confirmed at the next ensuing ordinary meeting.
18. At least one ordinary meeting in each month shall be held upon the incoming mail day, and these By-laws will constitute sufficient notice thereof. In the event of a mail day falling on a Sunday, the meeting to be held upon the day before or the day after, as the Chairman may decide.
19. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman or the Secretary at any time after notice of such meeting being necessary has been posted at the Road Board Office for twenty-four hours and notice in accord with Section 81 of the Act.
20. No business shall be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting unless at least three members, inclusive of the Chairman or member of the Board chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present.
21. The first business of all meetings of the Board shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding ordinary meeting, or of any subsequent special meeting, aloud, with a view to confirmation.

Minutes of Meeting.

22. In addition to the minute-book prescribed to be kept by the 90th Section of the Act, a rough minute-book shall be kept in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall then and there be entered by the Secretary, and subsequently re-entered by him in the manner prescribed by the Act.

Order of Business.

23. (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary and special meetings (if any).
- (b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.
- (c.) Reading of correspondence received and despatched, and taking such immediate action as may be deemed expedient with regard thereto.
- (d.) Presentation of reports of Committee and consideration thereof.
- (e.) Consideration of tenders, and ratification of contracts.
- (f.) General business.
- (g.) Passing of accounts for payment.

Tenders.

24. Upon a majority of the Board deciding to call for tenders for any work within the goldfields area, it will be the duty of the Chairman to seal up the tender box, and such seal shall not be broken until the day and hour appointed therefor, and then only in the presence of at least three members of the Board in special meeting assembled therefor, or in the event of three members not being obtainable, then any two members, together with the Chairman or his deputy, may, at the hour appointed in the tender notice, open the tender box, and having carefully noted the number of tenders received (without opening them), shall initial such tenders and put them away to be opened at the next meeting of the Board. A note of such proceedings shall be entered in the minute-book of the Secretary.

Rules of Debate.

25. A speaker having audience shall not digress from the subject under debate.

Motions and Amendments.

26. A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be withdrawn unless by consent of the Board.
27. One or more amendments may be proposed on the motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved, the question shall be first put on the last amendment, and then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion, in the reverse order in which they were moved.
28. A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.
29. In submitting a motion or amendment, the Chairman must put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.
30. When an amendment is carried, the motion amended becomes a substantive motion upon which further amendments may be moved before it is finally dealt with.

Appointment of Committee.

31. The Board may at any time appoint two or more members as a Committee to inquire into any matter and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no Committee shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever without express and specific authority conferred by the by-laws, or by resolution of the Board. A quorum of Committee shall comprise two members.

Finance accounts.

32. All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Board by the Chairman at the ordinary meeting, and after being certified as correct shall be paid by cheque.
33. The bankers of the Board shall be the Union Bank of Australia and the Honourable the Colonial Treasurer, and all money received by the Board's officers from whatever source shall be paid into such bank to the credit of the Board, as prescribed by Section 171 of the Act, and no account shall be paid except by cheque on bank or Treasury, signed by the Chairman and one member of the Board in addition to the signature of the Secretary, or in his absence, another member of the Board signing on the Secretary's behalf.
34. All moneys belonging to the Board shall be remitted to the Bank at least once in each and every month under registered cover.

Urgent Work.

35. The Chairman with one member, or in his absence any two members may, in case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding Ten pounds sterling, but shall in every case report the same at the next meeting of the Board.

Unauthorised expenditure.

36. Every item of expenditure and every liability incurred by any Committee or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these by-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure, and a breach of these by-laws by such person.

Elections.

37. Elections for the Board shall take place at the Board's offices, Hall's Creek.

38. The day of election in each year shall be upon the third Thursday in December, as prescribed by the Act.

39. In the event of a vacancy being created through the death or resignation of a member, by-elections shall take place upon any date that the Chairman may appoint after posting notice of same for fourteen days. A day of nomination shall be appointed, and the posting of the names of candidates having nominated at the Board's office for seven days will constitute sufficient notice thereof.

Publication of Notices and Collection of Rates.

40. The following will constitute good and sufficient notice within the meaning of the Act:—

- (a.) *Elections.*—A notice posted on the notice board outside the Board's office, Hall's Creek, for 14 days.
- (b.) *Tenders.*—Notice posted on the notice board outside the Board's office, Hall's Creek, for 14 days.
- (c.) *Rates—when struck.*—Notice of rates being struck shall be published in *Government Gazette* and *Western Mail*.
- (d.) *Rates—when due.*—Notice will be posted to each individual ratepayer of such person's assessment, and such notice shall bear upon the face thereof a date of payment.
- (e.) *Rates—Enforcing payment.*—In event of any ratepayer not having forwarded the amount due to the Board upon the day stated in the notice, a second notice shall be served by post, under registered cover, and such ratepayer shall be warned that in six weeks from the date of such posted notice legal proceedings will be taken for the recovery of such rates.

Offences.

41. Any person damaging or destroying any of the Board's property, such as wells, buckets, pumps, windlasses, chains, ropes, troughing, or sign boards, or who pollutes in any way the water in any wells so as to render it unfit for human consumption, shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £20 sterling.

42. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these by-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these by-laws, and where not otherwise provided shall be liable to a fine or penalty not exceeding £20 sterling for every offence.

BY-LAWS OF THE MOUNT MAGNET ROADS BOARD.

THE Mount Magnet Roads Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

WHEREAS by "The Roads Act, 1902," the Board of any district is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned: It is hereby resolved by the Board of the Mount Magnet district, by and with the

approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the following By-laws shall be in force within the said district from the date of the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*:—

Interpretation.

In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say:—

- "The Act," the Roads Act of 1902, and all amendments thereto considered necessary which may come into force hereafter as far as the Act allows.
- "District," the Mount Magnet Roads Board District.
- "Board," the Mount Magnet Roads Board.
- "Secretary," the Secretary of the Board.
- "Road or Reserve," a public road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.
- "Footpath or Footway" shall include any part of a street set apart for the sole use of foot passengers, and whether the same be made or kerbed or otherwise.
- "Cycle," a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede.
- "Cyclist," a person riding, impelling, or otherwise using or having the management or control of any cycle.
- "Person" shall include the plural and also the body corporate.
- "Permission of the Board," the consent of the Board given in writing.
- "Vehicle," any cart, dray, carriage, van, omnibus, trap, or other conveyance (not being a handcart), with or without springs.

Other interpretations are as defined in Interpretation Clause 4 of "The Roads Act, 1902."

Appointments.

1. No permanent appointment shall be made to an office under the Board until an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such an appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board.

Duties of Secretary.

2. (a.) To attend all Board meetings.
- (b.) To attend committees when considered necessary.
- (c.) To take notes of all minutes and prepare reports of committees.
- (d.) To conduct all correspondence, and to give the other officers instructions as directed by the minutes.
- (e.) To answer all the questions on the Board's business.
- (f.) To supervise the preparation of the rate books and Board's electoral lists, examine proofs of latter, and arrange for the distribution of copies prior to elections; also to attend all Courts of Revision or Repeal, making the necessary arrangements for the elections, and preparing papers, etc., for the clerks.
- (g.) To summon the members to Board and Committee meetings other than the regular meetings.
- (h.) The Secretary shall keep the cash book, as well as any and all other books issued by Minister for Works in accordance with instructions inserted therein, and those required to show the receipts and expenditure made by the Board. The said books shall be kept written up every fortnight ready for the inspection of the Board or any member of the Board who may at any time during office hours desire to see them.
- (i.) He shall check all accounts sent in to the Board, and see that all accounts for works (exceeding five pounds in amount) have stated on them the authority under which such works have been done, and shall check all returns made by the collectors or other of the Board's officers, and shall see that, with all returns made, the heels of the receipt books accompany the returns; he shall supervise and attend to the due payment of all money coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the Board; he shall report to the Board at their next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns, as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto.

- (j.) He shall pay into the bank as soon as possible after the receipt, to the credit of the Board, any sum or sums of money that may be received by him on behalf of the Board.
- (k.) He shall have the cash book and bank pass book made up in readiness for the meetings of the Board, and shall produce them at each meeting thereof; should any member of the Board desire to see them at any time during office hours the Secretary shall produce them for his inspection. No money shall be paid into the bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board, except by or through the Secretary. The Secretary shall give all receipts on printed forms. The Secretary shall readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and shall attend to all other matters affecting the finances of the Board and not herein specified.
- (l.) At each ordinary meeting of the Board an approximate balance sheet shall be produced, showing as nearly as possible the financial position of the Board as regards payments already made, its present assets and liabilities, which latter shall specify and include moneys voted for special purposes which have not yet been undertaken or contracted for; and no further expenditure of any nature shall be incurred unless the balance sheet shall be then produced.

Duties of Collector.

3. (a.) To send out all rate notices.
- (b.) To collect all moneys due to the Board for rates and licenses.
- (c.) To report to the Board at every meeting the business he has transacted for the Board, the amount of money collected and paid over to the Secretary.

Meetings and proceedings.

4. (a.) Notice shall be given by the Chairman or Secretary of ordinary or special meetings at least three days before such meeting, and "notice in writing" of every meeting adjourned for a term exceeding two days.
- (b.) The Chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and in his absence, or, if after being present he shall retire, one of the members of the Board chosen by the ratepayers or members present (as the case may be) shall preside for remainder of meeting.
- (c.) Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds, "Ordinary" and "Special."
- (d.) It shall rest with any three members of the Board to exclude the public when, in their opinion, it is expedient so to do.
- (e.) A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time and in the manner prescribed by Section 81 of the Act, but the Chairman may call a meeting of the Board as soon as he may think proper.
- (f.) No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called.
- (g.) At all meetings of the Board, when there is no quorum present, or when the Board is counted out, which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present, such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the minute book.

Order of business.

5. The ordinary business at all ordinary meetings shall be as follows, that is to say:—
- (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary and of special meetings, if any.
- (b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.
- (c.) Reading of correspondence (received and despatched) and taking such immediate action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.
- (d.) Passing of accounts for payment.
- (e.) Presentation of petitions or memorials and Committee reports, and consideration thereof.

- (f.) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts.
- (g.) Ordinary business of the Board.
- (h.) No discussion shall take place upon the minutes except as to their accuracy, or for the ratification of any clerical error.
- (i.) Immediately after the confirmation of the minutes the Chairman may make any communication to the Board which he may deem advisable, or bring under consideration any business he may think necessary; and it shall be competent for any member of the Board to ask a question or questions, but he shall confine himself to the question simply, and no debate shall ensue thereon at the time.

Petitions.

6. Every petition or memorial must be couched in respectful and temperate language and shall be presented by a member only; such member shall affix his signature thereon.

Tenders.

7. Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matter of the tenders comes on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a Committee appointed for the purpose. Deposit—Up to £10, 10s.; £10, to £20, £1; £20 to £50, 15 per cent.; over £50, 10 per cent.

Speaker must not digress.

8. Every member addressing Chairman must stand on his feet.

- (a.) A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate, and speak for not more than ten minutes, unless by permission of the Board.
- (b.) A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be withdrawn unless by the consent of the Board.
- (c.) One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board.
- (d.) When more than one amendment is moved the question shall first be put on the last amendment, then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion, in the reverse order in which they are moved.
- (e.) A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover nor put by the Chairman.
- (f.) In submitting a motion or amendment, the Chairman must put the question, first in the affirmative and then in the negative.
- (g.) When an amendment is carried, the motion as amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which further amendment may be moved before it is finally dealt with.
- (h.) All notices of motion shall be in writing, and shall be lodged with the secretary seven clear days before regular meeting of the Board.
- (i.) Notices of expenditure must be given one month previous, with power for the Chairman to accept same, with the consent of the Board, without notice, in case of urgent matter.
- (j.) No motion shall be brought forward for discussion except given notice of or permission being granted by members and Chairman of the Board present.

Committee.

9. No committee shall incur any financial liability, or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatsoever, without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws or by a resolution of the Board.

Finance accounts.

10. All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Board by the Chairman at the ordinary meetings, and after being certified correct shall be so initialled by him and paid by cheque.

Unauthorised expenditure.

11. Every item of expenditure, and every liability incurred by any committee or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure.

Offences, omissions, or neglects.

12. Any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglects shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £10:—

- (a.) Riding or driving a horse, cattle, or other animals, or wheeling any barrow or driving any carriage upon or along any footpath.
- (b.) Placing any timber, bricks, or other building material upon any footpath, channel, surface drain, or carriage road without the permission of the Board having first been obtained.
- (c.) Placing any advertisement board, placard, on property under the control of the Board without having first obtained the permission of the Board.
- (d.) Opening any drain or sewer or removing the surface of any road or carriage road without the permission of the Board having first been obtained.
- (e.) Rolling any cask, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bows and arrows, football, catapult, air-gun, or firearms, or playing at any game to the annoyance or damage of any person, or obstructing any road, whether by allowing any cart or animal to remain across such road or by placing goods thereon or otherwise.
- (f.) Having any awning, verandah, or blind on any road not being of the full width of ten feet and eight feet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning, verandah, or blind over the road, or erecting any sign-board, sign-awning, blind, over-hanging lamp, or other thing over or near any road without first having obtained permission of the Board.
- (g.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any public road without permission of the Board, and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such Board.
- (h.) Furiously or negligently riding or driving on any road.
- (i.) Making a cellar door or other opening from any road without the consent of the Board.

General regulation of traffic.

13. Every person having the care or conduct of any vehicle shall keep the same on the left or near side of the road, except in case of actual necessity or other sufficient reason for deviation, and shall not interrupt or interfere with any person or vehicle passing or attempting to pass his vehicle.

No person, between sunset and the following sunrise, shall, in, upon, or along any of the public roads within the district, drive any vehicle without having a lamp or lantern securely fixed and lighted on the off side of the front of such vehicle.

No person shall ride or drive any horse or other animal along any road at a speed exceeding eight miles per hour.

The driver of every vehicle or the rider of any horse or other animal turning for the purpose of proceeding in an opposite direction, or turning the corner of any road in the district, shall bring the horse or other animal to a walking pace before commencing to turn.

Cycles.

14. Every cyclist within the district shall observe the rules of the road laid down for vehicular traffic.

No cyclist shall ride or impel a cycle upon any footpath within the district.

No cyclist shall, between the hours of sunset and the following sunrise, ride a cycle within the district unless there is attached to such cycle a lamp, which shall exhibit a white light in the direction in which he is proceeding.

Every cyclist shall carry a bell, which shall be rung as a signal whenever any person on foot or on horseback or any vehicle is being approached or passed.

No person shall pass, at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour, any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or any animal.

When a cyclist meets or overtakes any horse or other animal, and such horse or animal becomes restless or appears likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist shall dismount, and shall remain dismounted as long as necessary to avoid accident.

No person shall ride any cycle round the corner formed by the junction of any roads in the District, or across the intersection of any road, at a pace exceeding three miles an hour.

Obstruction on roads.

15. Nothing of any kind whatever may be allowed to remain on any part of any road within the District after sunset, nor in any case longer than is absolutely necessary, without the permission of the Board.

Preservation of trees, etc.

16. No person shall injure, cut, break, deface, pull up, pick, remove, or destroy any tree, shrub, plant, etc., growing on any reserve. In case of any offence such person, on conviction, shall forfeit the sum of £10.

Throwing dangerous substances.

17. Any person who shall throw vegetable substances or any offensive, noxious, or dangerous substances upon any road or reserve shall be liable to remove same at own cost and to a fine of £2, in addition to amount of damages caused thereby.

Reserves and recreation grounds.

18. All reserves and recreation grounds under the control of the Board shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes.

Exclusive right to use and occupy any such recreation reserve for holding public sports or amusements by any responsible person or persons may be granted by the Board, providing a fee to be fixed for admission be paid to the Board.

Registration of camels and the licensing of drivers.

19. (a.) No person shall own, keep, or use within the Mount Magnet Roads Board District (hereinafter referred to as "the District") any unregistered camel.

(b.) Registration shall be effected annually under these By-laws, unless the camel is registered for the time being under the By-laws of another Road District.

(c.) Application for registration shall be made in the form "A" in the Schedule; addressed to the Secretary of the Board.

(d.) The fee payable on registration, except in respect of camels used by prospectors for prospecting purposes, shall be:—

For every cow or gelded camel over the age of three (3) years, 10s. (ten shillings) per annum.

For every bull camel over the age of three (3) years, £1 per annum.

Every draught camel, 10s.

(e.) A certificate of registration will be granted in the form "B" in the Schedule.

(f.) Every registration shall expire on the 31st day of December next following the date thereof.

(g.) Every person in charge of any camel shall produce the certificate of registration of each camel whenever required so to do by any officer or other person acting with the authority of the Board.

(h.) Every unregistered camel found within the District may be seized and sold or destroyed by any person acting under the authority of the Board.

(i.) No person shall drive camels within the District unless he is the holder of a camel-driver's license issued by the Board of the said District or of another Road District.

(j.) A camel-driver's license may be in the form "C" in the Schedule.

(k.) Every camel-driver's license shall expire on the 31st day of December next following the issue thereof.

(l.) The fee payable for a camel-driver's license shall be 5s. (five shillings.)

(m.) The number of draught or pack camels driven by any one driver shall not exceed eleven.

(n.) A camel-driver's license shall be transferable at the office of the Board on payment of a fee of one shilling.

(o.) Every camel-driver shall produce his license for inspection whenever required so to do by any officer or other person acting with the authority of the Board.

Regulation of camel traffic upon roads.

20. Every camel-driver within the Mt. Magnet Roads Board District shall observe the rules of the road, and shall at all times make way for traffic by keeping 20 yards from the centre of the road.

To prevent and prohibit animals suffering from any infectious or contagious disease from polluting water.

21. Any owner of an animal suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, and allowing such animal to water at any public watering place, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2).

Requiring all licensed vehicles to have a number affixed to such vehicle.

22. Every owner of a licensed vehicle shall attach a number to some conspicuous part of such vehicle, not less than two inches in depth.

Penalties.

For every offence against the provisions of these By-laws to which no penalty is attached, the offender shall, upon conviction before any one or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

The above By-laws were passed at a special meeting of the Mt. Magnet Roads Board, held on the 27th January, 1904.
