To His Honour Stephen Henry Parker, Esquire, Acting Chief Justice of Western Australia.

WHEREAS by Clause 14 of the Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom constituting the Office of Governor of the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, bearing date the 29th October, 1900, it is provided that in the event of the Governor having occasion to be temporarily absent for a short period from the seat of Government, he may in every such case, by an Instrument under the Public Seal of the State, constitute and appoint our Lieutenant-Governor, or if there be no such officer, then any other person, to be his Deputy during such temporary absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform, and execute for and on behalf of the Governor, during such absence but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor by these Our Letters Patent as shall in and by such Instrument be specified and limited, but no others: Provided, nevertheless, that by the appointment of a Deputy as aforesaid the power and authority of the Governor shall not be abridged, altered, or in any way affected otherwise than We may at any time hereafter think proper to direct;

AND WHEREAS I, the said Governor, propose to absent myself temporarily from the said seat of Government as authorised;

AND WHEREAS there is no Lieutenant-Governor of the said State;

Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, do by this Instrument under the Public Seal of the State constitute and appoint His Honour Stephen Henry Parker, from the date of my departure upon the said absence from the said seat of Government and during such absence, to exercise, perform, and execute, for and on my behalf as such Governor, all the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Letters Patent.

By His Excellency Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897" (61st Vict., No. 23), it is made lawful for the Governor in Executive Council, from time to time, by Proclamation, to appoint such place or places in each district as shall be deemed expedient to be reserved for the burial of the dead: Now THEREFORE I, Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, G.C.B., Governor of the said State, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers in me vested as aforesaid, do by this my Proclamation appoint Reserve $\frac{\Lambda}{9037}$ a Public

Cemetery for Boulder, but subject always to such regulations as may be published from time to time for the proper management of the same.

ESTABLISHMENT OF THE BLACK RANGE DISTRICT, East Murchison Goldfield.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, TO WIT.

By His Excellency Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Mining Act, 1904," it is lawful for the Governor, by Proclamation, to divide any goldfield into districts, and to define the limit of such districts; Now THEREFORE I, Sir FREDERICK GEORGE DENHAM BEDFORD, Governor of the said State, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers in me vested in that behalf by the said ordinance, do hereby declare that that portion of the East Murchison Goldfield within the boundaries described hereunder shall form and be known as the

BLACK RANGE DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from the South-West corner of the East Murchison Goldfield; thence North-North-East the East Murchison Goldfield; thence North-North-East about 89 miles along the boundary between the Murchison and East Murchison Goldfields to a point about eight miles East of the 286-mile post on the rabbit-proof fence; thence East about 41 miles to a point due North of the Wallaby Nob Well near Mt. Holmes, on the Magnet to Lawlers Road; thence South through the Wallaby Nob Well about 79 miles to the South boundary of the East Murchison Goldfield; thence West along the said South boundary about 81 miles to the starting point: And that portion of the East Murchison Goldfield within the boundaries described hereunder shall form and be known as the cribed hereunder shall form and be known as the

LAWLERS DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from a point about 81 miles East of the South-West corner of the East Murchison Goldfield; thence East to a point 15 miles East and about 44 miles North of the summit of Mt. Ida; thence North about 4½ miles; thence East about 67½ miles; thence North about 14 miles; thence East about 7 miles; thence North to the 26th parallel of South latitude; thence West to a point about 33 miles North of the summit of Mt. Russell; thence South-West along the East boundary of the Murchison Coldfold to a point about sight miles. First of the 266 miles Goldfield to a point about eight miles East of the 286-mile post on the rabbit-proof fence; thence East about 41 miles to a point due North of the Wallaby Nob Well near Mt. Holmes, on the Magnet to Lawlers Road; thence South through the Wallaby Nob Well about 79 miles to the starting point.

WHEREAS by the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," it is made lawful (in case it should appear to the Governor that burials in any Cemetery under any law relating to Cemeteries, or other burial ground or place of burial whatsoever, should be wholly discontinued or discontinued subject to any exception or qualification) for the Governor, by Order to be published in the Government Gazette, to direct that after a time mentioned in such Order (not being less than three months from the date thereof), (not being less than three months from the date thereof), burials in such Cemetery, or burial place, ground, or place of burial shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exception or qualification mentioned in the same or any subsequent Order: AND WHEREAS it has been made to appear to the said Governor that it is advisable that, except in vaults at present owned by private persons, all burials should be discontinued in the public Cemetery, Boulder (A4382): Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that from and after the first day of September, 1904, burials within the limits of the Public Cemetery, Boulder, shall be wholly discontinued, except in cases where the special permission of the said Governor be first obtained. THE STOCK DISEASES ACT, 1895. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, the 25th day of May, 1904.

WHEREAS by Section 5 of "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor may, by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette, from time to time published in the Government Gazette, from time to time prohibit the importation into the State of any stock, or may permit the importation, subject to such restrictions and regulations as he shall see fit: AND WHEREAS Orders in Council and Regulations prohibiting the importation of Swine have from time to time been made and published and continue in force: AND WHEREAS it is desirable to amend the said Regulations as hereinafter appearing: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby order as follows :-

Notwithstanding anything contained in any Order in Council or Regulations made under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," to the contrary, the importation of stud boars from the States of New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, Queensland, and Tasmania, and the Colony of New Zealand, into the State of Western Australia at the Port of Fremantle, but not elsewhere, is permitted, subject to the following conditions :-

(1.) Every consignment shall be accompanied by:-

- (a.) A statutory declaration of the owner or manager of the farm or station from which the boars come to the effect that the boars were, at the time they left such farm or station, and always have been free from the disease of Swine Fever, and from all other infectious or contagious diseases, and had never been in contact with diseased animals, and that the said farm or station had never been visited with Swine Fever or other infectious or contagious disease.
- Government certificate of health, signed by a duly qualified veterinary (b.) A surgeon.
- (2.) Should the boars arrive at the Port of Fremantle without the said Declaration, they shall not be permitted to land. Should they arrive with such Declaration, but without such certificate, an Inspector, on being satisfied that they are free from disease, may permit the landing on payment of a fee of 10s., in addition to the ordinary fee for inspection, namely, from 1 to 50 head, 5s., and for every additional head, 1d.
- (3.) On the boars being landed, the foregoing con-In the boars being landed, the foregoing conditions having been observed, such boars shall be removed to quarantine, where they shall remain in quarantine at the expense of the owner or importer for thirty days, and if at the expiration of that period they are found to be clean, the Inspector shall issue to the owner or importer a certificate, permitting their removal to the premises of the owner or importer.

Instructions.

The following instructions are to be observed by all Farriers shoeing Police horses:—

The shoes for the fore-feet should be of an uniform width from toe to heel, averaging from seven-eighths to one inch, and of an uniform thickness from toe to heel of about threeeighths of an inch, but in the case of horses which travel exclusively on bush roads the shoe may be made narrower and thicker in proportion. The heel of the shoe should on no account be thicker than any other portion of it. There no account be thicker than any other portion of it. There should be seven nails in each shoe—four on the outside and three on the inside, and the last nail on the inside should not be further back or nearer to the heel than about midway between the toe and the heel of the shoe.

The heel of the hind shoe may be a little thicker than any other portion of the shoe, but in other respects the same remarks apply as to the fore shoes.

Calking are never to be allowed on the fore shoes execut

Calkins are never to be allowed on the fore shoes except where the horse has to travel over mountainous districts and cannot do without them, as they are inconvenient for the horse to travel in, and by the undue pressure they cause on the heels of the feet they produce bruises and corns, and frequently in a very short time render the animal quite useless

The shoe, when fitted to the foot, should present, from toe to heel, a perfectly plane or flat surface on that part which rests on the crust or wall of the foot, and should in every instance follow the natural heale of the foot, more

The feet should be prepared by carefully removing the dead or shelly portions with the rasp and knife, but on no account should the sole of the foot be pared to admit of its being sprung by the thumb of the smith, as is too frequently the case, for the sensitive foot, when thus denuded of its horny cover, is very liable to become bruised by the animal's treading on a stone or some other hard substance.

The heels should not be cut open, as it is termed, nor should the bars, which act as buttresses to prevent the heels contracting, be removed. The wall or crust should be levelled from heel to toe to receive the shoe. The heel of the fore foot, for about half an inch from the extreme point, may be about one-sixteenth part of an inch lower than the quarters, so that when the shoe is on a thin knife may be passed between it and the foot at the heel.

Unless in exceptional cases, which will seldom occur, the frog should not be pared, but should be left to itself. Nature will remove the superfluous horn, and the rags can

do no harm, and if left alone will soon disappear altogether.

The foot should never be rasped above the clinches of the nails, as it only weakens the foot, and leaves less horn to nail to when it grows down.
