#### REGULATION.

No State Battery Officer to hold Mining Interests.

No Officer in charge of, nor any Assayer employed on any State Battery shall hold, directly or indirectly, any share or interest in any claim, mining lease, or other mining adventure whatsoever in the (foldfield or Mineral field in which he is employed.

Any such Officer or Assayer shall, for a breach of this Regulation, be liable to a five not exceeding Fifty pounds, and in default of payment to imprisonment with hard labour for any period not exceeding six months, and to dismissal from his office.

#### REGULATIONS.

PROSPECTING AREAS.

Dimensions of Prospecting Areas for Gold.

3. The maximum area which any miner who desires to prospect for gold on Crown Land may mark off and hold for that purpose shall be as follows :---

- (a.) Outside the limits of a proclaimed Goldfield, forty-eight acres.
- (b.) Within the limits of a proclaimed Goldfield, eighteen acres.

And every such area shall be marked in the prescribed manner. Every such area shall be called a Prospecting Area.

The Warden may, in his discretion, refuse to register any Prospecting Area, or he may register any Prospecting Area of such less extent than forty-eight or eighteen acres, as the case may be, as to him shall seem fit.

#### Prospecting Areas to be marked.

4. Every Prospecting Area shall be, as nearly as possible, in the form of a rectangular parallelogram, the length of which shall, in no case, exceed twice the width, and shall be marked at each corner by a substantial post or a cairn of stones projecting above the surface of the ground not less than three feet, and set in the angle of an "L" trench, the arms of which shall not be less than four feet in length and six inches in depth, cut in the general direction of the boundary lines. When the nature of the ground will not permit of trenches being cut, rows of stones of similar dimensions shall be substituted. The boundary lines shall be cleared from post to post. On one of such posts shall be cleared from post to post. On one of such most shall be date on which the area was marked off. Such marking off and notice shall be deemed a sufficient title to such Prospecting Area for ten days if the same is situated within twenty miles of the nearest Warden's Office, and for fourteen days in any other case, and at the expiration of either of such periods, as the case may be, every Prospecting Area shall be registered as provided in Regulation 5.

#### Registration of Prospecting Area.

5. Any miner desirous of registering any Prospecting Area shall, before the expiration of the period in any case provided, make application for registration thereof in duplicate, in the form of Schedule 9, by lodging the same at the Mining Registrar's Office, and at the same time shall deposit the fee for registration at the rate prescribed; and on receipt thereof the Mining Registrar shall deliver to the applicant a Certificate of Application, in duplicate, in the form of Schedule 10, one of which shall forthwith be posted by the applicant on the Notice Board at the Mining Registrar's Office; and the other shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be posted on one of the posts of the area. Provided that the Mining Registrar may, if no prior right or public interest is thereby affected, register such Prospecting Area upon receipt of the application therefor, and the fees for registration thereof, without issue of Schedule 10 or posting thereof. And provided, further, that the Mining Registrar may require the application totice; and in such case such notice shall be posted as provided and kept legible and intact for a period, no objection shall have been lodged, he may register such area, subject to the provisions of Regulation 3, or he may refer the application to the Warden, and in that case shall be guided by his decision. If any objection shall have been lodged, the Mining Registrar shall defer registration until such objection has been heard and determined by the Warden, and shall be guided by the decision thereon.

# SCHOOL OF MINES OF W.A.

GENERAL REGULATIONS FOR SCHOLARSHIPS.

1. The examinations will be held during November in each year, at times to be duly announced.

2. Applications from candidates, together with satisfactory proof of age and a fee of ten shillings, must reach the Secretary of the School of Mines, Kalgoorlie, not later than October 20th.

3. The scholarships will be awarded on the reports of the Examiners to those candidates who obtain the highest aggregate of marks and comply with the conditions. 4. No scholarship will be awarded any candidate unless he passes in each subject of the examination and obtains at least 60 per cent. of the aggregate marks.

5. No person will be allowed to hold two of these scholarships concurrently.

6. Successful candidates must produce certificates of good character and of *bong fide* residence for six months in Western Australia.

7. The Minister for Mines reserves the right of cancelling any scholarship should the holder be reported for irregular attendance, idleness, or bad conduct.

8. As a condition of holding a School of Mines scholarship, successful candidates must regularly attend the classes and pass the annual examinations in the subjects specified for each scholarship.

9. The interpretation of these and the following regulations, together with the decision of all matters not specifically provided for, shall rest with the Director of the School of Mines, who shall also have full control of the conduct of the examinations.

10. There will be offered annually the following scholarships :—

- (a.) One Junior and one Entrance Scholarship for youths residing within the Eastern Land Division.
- These scholarships will be tenable at the School of Mines, Kalgoorlie.
- (b.) One Senior Scholarship open to all youths completing the first year's course for an Associateship of the School of Mines. Students of the Perth Technical School will be eligible to compete, and if successful may obtain permission from the Hon, the Minister for Mines to continue their studies in Perth.
- (c.) Two other Junior Scholarships for separate competition, one in the South and Eucla Divisions, and one in the Western, North-West, and Kimberley Divisions.
- (d.) A second Entrance Scholarship for competition outside the Eastern Division.

The last four scholarships, viz., the Senior, the two Juniors, and the Entrance, by permission to be granted in each case by the Minister for Mines, may be held at the Perth Technical School.

#### SPECIAL REGULATIONS.

#### Junior Scholarships.

1. Junior Scholarships will be offered annually for competition, open to youths who are at least 15 years of age on the 1st of March following the examination, and have been *bona fide* residents of Western Australia for six months immediately prior to the examination.

2. The scholarships will be offered for separate competition in the following land divisions, viz.:—One in the Eastern Division, one in the South-West and Eucla Divisions, and one in the Western, North-West, and Kimberley Divisions.

3. Each successful candidate must at once enter upon classes in Preparatory Mathematics, Chemistry, and Physics, as laid down in the School of Mines syllabus, and by the end of his second year must complete the first course for the Associateship.

4. The scholarships will have an annual value of £40 for three years, with remission of class fees, and will be tenable for a fourth year if the holder completes the second year's work of the Associateship course at the end of his third year.

5. The Junior Scholarship examinations will be held in the following subjects :--

- (a.) ENGLISH.—Grammar, dictation, and composition, as laid down for Standard VII. of the State Primary Schools.
- (b.) ARITHMETIC. Notation, numeration, tables, weights and measures, the simple and compound rules, square root, fractions, proportion, practice, and the mensuration of simple surfaces and solids.

- including (c.) ALGEBRA.—The elementary rules, brackets and simple equations.
- (d.) GEOMETRY.-The definitions, axioms, and postulates of Euclid, Book I., and propositions 1 to 26.
- The (e.) PHYSIOGRAPHY.—Elementary principles. atmosphere and oceans, circulation and action of water, the composition and movements of the earth's crust.

SCHOOL OF MINES ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS.

1. Entrance Scholarships will be offered annually for competition to youths who are at least 15 years of age, on the first of March following the examination, and have been bona fide residents of Western Australia for six months immediately prior to the examination.

Each successful candidate must at once enter upon an Associate course in mining or metallurgy, as laid down in the School of Mines syllabus, and must pass the exami-nations for the first and second years' Associateship course at the end of his first and second year respectively, as a condition of retaining the scholarship.

The scholarships will have an annual value of  $\pounds 60$ 3. for three years, with remission of class fees.

The Entrance Scholarship examinations will be held in the following subjects :

- (a.) ARITHMETIC.-The whole subject, with mensuration of simple surfaces and solids.
- (b.) ALGEBRA.—The elements up to easy quadratics.
- (c.) GEOMETRY.—The first three books of Euclid.
- (d.) CHEMISTRY.—The elementary principles, including the simple chemistry of hydrogen, oxygen, nitro-gen, and carbon, and simple calculations.
- (e.) PHYSICS. The elementary principles of sound, light, heat, magnetism, and electricity.

All candidates who pass in the mathematics portion of this examination will be entitled, without further examination, to enrolment as Associateship students of the School of Mines of Western Australia.

SCHOOL OF MINES SENIOR SCHOLARSHIP.

1. One Senior Scholarship will be offered annually for competition to students who are registered Associateship students and are completing the first year's work of an Associateship course in either Mining or Metallurgy.

2. The successful candidate must at once enter upon the second year's work of the Associateship course and pass the terminal examinations at the end of his first year as a condition of holding the scholarship.

The Senior Scholarship will have an annual value of £75 for two years with remission of class fees.

The Senior Scholarship Examination will be identical with the annual examinations for the first year of the School of Mines Associateship course held in the following subjects :-

(a.) MATHEMATICS.—First course.

- (b.) CHEMISTRY.-First course.
- (c.) GEOLOGY.


