WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: Now THEREFORE I, Admiral Sir FREDERICK GEORGE DENHAM BEDFORD, G.C.B., Governor of the said State, in exercise of the powers

so vested in me and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation announce and proclaim that the First Session of the Fifth Parliament of Western Australia shall be holden for the despatch of business on Thursday, the 28th day of July instant, at the hour of twelve of the clock, noon; the Session of the Legislative Council Chamber, and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly the Houses of Parliament in the City of Perth, in the said State; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

By His Excellency Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

WHEREAS by "The Prisons Act, 1903," it is enacted that the Governor may, by proclamation in the Government Gazette, declare any place to be a Penal Outstation: And whereas it is desirable that a certain portion of Rottnest Island should be declared a Penal Outstation: Now Therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclama-

tion declare that portion of Rottnest Island hereunder described to be a Penal Outstation within the meaning of "The Prisons Act, 1903":—

That portion of Rottnest Island situate Northward and Eastward of the following boundary :-

A line starting from a point on the shore of Thompson Bay, situate about 20 chains South-Eastward from the Government House Jetty, and extending along a fence South-Westward to the shore of Salt Lake and along said shore Southward, Westward, and Northward to a point Eastward of Lighthouse Hill; thence North.

Westward along a fence to the Southern shore of a lake; thence Northward along its Western shore to a fence, and along said fence North-Westward.

And I hereby rescind the Proclamation of the 4th of January, 1904, declaring Rottnest Island to be a gaol.

## MUNICIPALITY OF SOUTH PERTH.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of South Perth, made under Section 167 of the Municipal Institutions Act, 1900, and numbered 2, for the-

Regulation of storage of combustible materials and the prevention of fire.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of South Perth order, as follows :-

1. No person shall place, or knowingly permit to be placed, in or upon any house, workshop, out-offices, land, or other premises or place, fire, gunpowder, or other combustible or inflammable materials or substances of any kind, in such a manner as to endanger contiguous buildings, fences, or premises.

2. No person shall light any bonfire or firework upon or within sixty yards of any public or private street, or any public place within the Municipality.

3. No person shall wilfully set or cause to be set on fire any chimney flue, smoke vent, or stove pipe.

4. Penalty.—Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction before two Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceed-

## PINJARRA PUBLIC CEMETERY. By-Laws.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Pinjarra Public Cemetery, the said Trustees make the following By-laws :-

- All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.
- 2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make an application in the form contained in Schedule B. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an "Order for Burial," in the form contained in the Schedule C.
- 3. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Secretary in such time as to allow at least five working hours' notice being given to the Superintendent at the Cemetery prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed, unless the application, together with the Magistrate's order therefor, be handed in at the office in such time as to allow of at least six working hours' notice being given as above.
- 4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.
- 5. Before any interment is allowed, the "Order for Burial" shall be handed to and retained by the Superin-
- 6. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. No coffin not complying with this By-law shall be admitted to or be interred in the Cemetery.
- Every grave shall be at least 6ft. deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 4ft. 6in. from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.
- 8. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.
- 9. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery, nor shall any coffin be allowed to enter the Cemetery, unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Superintendent, at the latest, upon the funeral entering the Cemetery. The certificate will be retained, but the Coroner's order shall be returned to the person delivering the same.
- 10. Unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance to the Cemetery shall be open daily between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and between 7 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. during the remaining months of the year.
  - 11. The hours for burial shall be as follows:-

Week days, from 8 a.m. 1st September to 30th to 6 p.m. Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m. Week days, from 8 a.m. April to 5.30 p.m. 1st May to 31st August Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5.30 p.m.

And no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

- 12. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates; and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.
- No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the Cemetery or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the Superintendent or other officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions may be forthwith expelled from the Cemetery.
- 14. Children under the age of ten years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person,

- 15. Smoking shall not be allowed within the Cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.
- 16. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery, and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.
- 17. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or in any way infringing these By-laws, shall be expelled from the Cemetery.
- 18. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever; and any person infringing this By-law shall be expelled from the Cemetery.
- 19. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to summary dismissal.
- 20. Subject to the By-laws, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.
- 21. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.
- 22. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.
- 23. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustee may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.
- 24. Every such Grant shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for Burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.
- 25. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.
- 26. If application be made for an "Order for Burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.
- 27. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of the Act.
- 28. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees or their officers, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.
- 29. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Superintendent or other officer appointed by the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection.
- 30. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing the same.
- 31. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the Cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of 10s., which shall be forfeited if the provisions of either of the two preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Superintendent.
- 32. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery; and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Superintendent shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

- 33. All workmen, whether employed by the trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said Superintendent, shall be removable from the Cemetery.
- 34. No wooden fence, railing, cross, or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault.
- 35. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave except such as shall be approved by the Superintendent.
- 36. Subject to the approval of the Trustees, each applicant for an "Order for Burial" shall, within three months from date of application, inclose the grave mentioned in such application with a kerbing of tiles, slate, or stone, and shall cause to be placed thereon a numberplate bearing the number of the grave or vault. No mounds shall be allowed.
- 37. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—
  - (a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
  - (b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Superintendent.
  - (c.) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent,
  - (d.) Work in all cases to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying Schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees held at Pinjarra on 7th day of May, 1904, and adopted.
