WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council, pub-lished in the Government Gazette, from time to time to make lished in the Government Gazette, from time to time to make such regulations as may be deemed expedient, *inter alia*, for the purpose of subjecting any stock to such restrictions or remedial measures as may be deemed necessary to pre-vent the introduction or spread of disease; for providing for the steps to be taken in case of any disease breaking out among any stock in the State, and for preventing the spread of such disease; for the regulation, management, and control of quarantine grounds, and for prescribing the treatment and control of stock whilst in quarantine or m treatment and control of stock whilst in quarantine or in transit thereto or therefrom; and generally for all or any such purposes as he may deem necessary for an or any such purposes as he may deem necessary for preventing the introduction or spread of disease: AND WHEREAS it is ex-pedient that a further regulation should be made to eradicate and prevent the spread of disease among swine: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby make the following Regulation under the social Act. make the following Regulation under the said Act.

REGULATION.

It shall not be lawful for any person to remove swine from any premises within the areas described in the schedule hereto without the permission, in writing, of an inspector of stock. Any person committing a breach of this regulation is liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds.

THE SCHEDULE.

1. All that portion of the State bounded on the North by an Easterly line from the sea coast to the 44-mile post on the Eastern Railway Reserve; on the *East* by a South-Easterly line therefrom to the North-East corner of Avon Location 3444; thence Southerly along its Eastern boundary to its South-East corner; thence South-South-Westerly to a point situate 6 miles East from the North Dandalup Railway Station; on the South by a Westerly line there-from to the sea coast; and on the West by the sea coast aforesaid.

Charles Hardinge |WHEREAS by section 1S of the *Extradition Act* 1870, it is among other things enacted that, if by any law or ordinance made after the passing of the said Act by the Le islature of any British Possession provision is made for carrying into effect within such Possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, such British Possession, His Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Act in the case of any foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, either—

Suspend the operation within any such British Possession of the said Act, or any part thereof, so far as it relates to such foreign State, and so long as such law or ordinance continues in force there and no longer;

Or direct that such law or ordinance, or any part thereof, shall have effect in such British Possession, with or without modifications and alterations, as if it were part of the Act:

And whereas by certain Orders of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council, Her Maje-ty was pleased to direct that certain Acts respect-ively enacted by the Legislatures of the Colonies of South Australia, Western Australia, Queensland, Tasmania, and Victoria should have effect in the said Colonies respectively, without modification or altera-tion, as if they were part of the *Extradition Act* 1870:

And whereas on the 1st day of January, 1901, the Commonwealth of Australia was established under the provisions of an Act of Parliament passed in the sixty-third and sixty-fourth years of Her late Majesty's reign, shortly entitled The Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act, and each of the said Colonies is now a State forming part of the Com-monwealth established as aforesaid:

And whereas the Parliament of the Commonwealth is empowered, under the provisions of the said Act, to make laws for the peace, order, and good Government of the Commonwealth with respect to (*inte ali*) the influx of criminals and external affairs:

And whereas the Commonwealth is a "British Possession" within the meaning of section 26 of the *Extradition Act* 1870:

And whereas by an Act enacted by the Parliament of the Common-wealth, the short title of which is the *Extradition Act* 1903, and the provisions of which are fully set forth in the First Schedule appended to this Order, provision has been made for carrying into effect within the Commonwealth the surrender of fugitive criminals who are therein or suspected of being therein:

And whereas it is provided by the scid Act that the said Act shall commence on the day on which the Governor-General makes known by Proclamation that His Majesty has by Order in Council directed that the said Act, or any part thereof, shall have effect in the Commonwealth as if it were part of the Extradition Act 1870:

Now therefore His Majesty, in pursuance of the *Extradition Act* 1870, and in exercise of the powers in that behalf in the said Act contained, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, direct as follows :---

- The Commonwealth Extradition Act 1903 shall have effect in the Commonwealth of Australia, without modification or alteration, as if it were part of the Extradition Act 1870. 1.

SCHEDULE I.

The Commonwealth of Australia Extradition Act 1903. WHERFAS by the Imperial Act known as the Extradition Act 1870, it is enacted that that Act when applied by Order in Council shall, unless it is otherwise provided by such Order, extend to every British Posses-sion, but with the following among other modifications, namely --No warrant of a Secretary of State shall be required, and all powers vested in or acts authorised or required to be done under that Act by the police magistrate and the Secretary of State, or either of them, in relation to the surrender of a fugitive criminal, may be done by the Governor of the British Possession alone : And whereas by that Imperial Act it is also aneated that if by any law

Governor of the British Possession alone: And whereas by that Imperial Act it is also enacted that if, by any law made by the Legislature of any British Possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within that possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, that possession, the King may by Order in Council direct that such law, or any part thereof, shall have effect in that possession, with or without modifica-tions and alterations, as if it were part of that Imperial Act: And whereas by other Imperial Acts known as the Extradiiton Act 1873 and the Extradition Act 1850, it is enacted that those Acts shall be construed as one with the Extradition Act 1870, and that the three Acts may be cited together as the Extradition Act 1870 to 1895:

Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:--

1. This Act may be cited as the Extradition Act 1903.

2. This Act shall commence on the day on which the Governor-General makes known by Proclamation that the King has, by Order in Council, directed that this Act, or any part thereof, shall have effect in the Commonwealth as if it were part of the *Extradition Act* 1870.

3. In this Act, unless the contrary intention appears, terms defined in the Extradition Acts 1870 to 1895 have the same meaning as in those Acts.

EXTRADITION FROM THE COMMONWEALTH.

4. All powers vested in and nets authorised or required to be done by a Secretary of State, under the Extradition Acts 1870 to 1895, in relation to the surrender of a fugitive criminal, are hereby vested in, and may in the Commonwealth be exercised and done by, the Governor-General, and may in any part of the Commonwealth be exercised and done by any deputy of the Governor-General thereto authorised.

5. All powers vested in and nots authorised or required to be done by a police magistrate or any justice of the peace under the Extradition Acts 1870 to 1895, in relation to the surrender of a fugilive criminal, are hereby rested in, and may in the Commonwealth be exercised and done by, any stipendiary or police or special magistrate of the Commonwealth or of a State, or any magistrate of a State thereto specially authorised by the Governor-General.

EXTRADITION FROM FOREIGN STATES.

6. Where the Extradiion Act 1870 applies in the case of any foreign State, a requisition for the surrender of a person, accused or convicted of an extradition crime in the Commonwealth, who is or is suspected to be in that foreign State, may be made by the Attorney-General to a Consular Officer of that State in the Commonwealth, \cdots to any Minister of that State through the Diplomatic Representative of His Majesty in that State, or in such other mode as is settled by arrangement.

7. Any person accused or convicted of an extradition crime, who is surrendered by a foreign State, may, under the warrant for his surrender issued in the foreign State, be brought into the Common-wealth and delivered to the proper authorities to be dealt with according to law.

 (2.) Sells or describes as super-phosphate or super any fertiliser containing less than 20 per centum of
 - water soluble phosphate, and a less total than 30 per centum of water soluble phosphate and

Sells or describes as Thomas's Phosphate any fertiliser composed of basic slag containing less than 30 per centum of tricalcic phosphate, and so prepared that less than 80 per centum shall pass through a sieve of 100 meshes to the lineal inch, or 10,000 meshes to the square inch, or more than 5 per centum of which fails to pass through a sieve of 60 meshes to the lineal inch, or 3,600 meshes to the square inch; or (4.)
