WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council, published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to make such regulations as may be deemed expedient, *inter alia*, for the purpose of subjecting any stock to such restrictions or remedial measures as may be deemed necessary to pre-

vent the introduction or spread of disease; for providing for the steps to be taken in case of any disease breaking out among any stock in the State, and for preventing the spread of such disease; for the regulation, management, and control of quarantine grounds, and for prescribing the treatment and control of stock whilst in quarantine or in transit thereto or therefrom; and generally for all or any such purposes as he may deem necessary for preventing the introduction or spread of disease: AND WHEREAS it is expedient that a further regulation should be made to eradicate and prevent the spread of disease among swine: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby make the following Regulation under the said Act.

REGULATION.

It shall not be lawful for any person to remove swine from any premises within the areas described in the schedule hereto without the permission, in writing, of an inspector of stock. Any person committing a breach of this regulation is liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds.

THE SCHEDULE.

1. All that portion of the State bounded on the North by an Easterly line from the sea coast to the 44-mile post on the Eastern Railway Reserve; on the East by a South-Easterly line therefrom to the North-East corner of Avon Location 3444; thence Southerly along its Eastern boundary to its South-East corner; thence South-South-Westerly to a point situate 6 miles East from the North Dandalup Railway Station; on the South by a Westerly line therefrom to the sea coast; and on the West by the sea coast aforesaid.

WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered by Order in Council, to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to make, vary, alter, or revoke such Regulations made under this Act as may be deemed expedient; *inter alia*—

For the purpose of subjecting any stock to such restrictions or remedial measures as may be deemed necessary to prevent the introduction or spread of disease.

For providing for the steps to be taken in case of any disease breaking out among any stock in the Colony, and for preventing the spread of such disease.

For regulating the charges to be made for conveying stock to or from quarantine, and their care, maintenance, and inspection while in quarantine.

Generally for all or any such purposes as he may deem necessary for preventing the introduction or spread of disease.

AND WHEREAS Regulations were duly made by Order in Council on the 16th day of September, 1903, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 18th day of September, 1903, whereby it was provided, *inter alia*, that vessels discharging tick-infested cattle may make fast within four feet of the South side of Robb's Jetty: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to amend the said Regulations to enable permission to be given for landing such cattle on Robb's Jetty: Now THEREFORE His Excellency the Governor, with

the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby amend the said Regulations, by adding to Regulation No. 2 the following words:—

Provided also, that vessels requiring to land such cattle may berth at and make fast to Robb's Jetty, for the purpose of discharging such cattle, on payment of a fee of 2d. (twopence) per head by the owners or their agents to the Stock Branch of the Agricultural Department, for the purpose of cleansing the Jetty on each occasion when it may be so used.

WHEREAS by the 17th Section of "The Health Act, 1898," as amended by Section 10 of "The Health Act, Amendment Act, 1900," the area of any district defined for the purpose of a Local Board of Health may, from time to time, be extended or contracted or abolished by the Governor by Order in Council: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby extend the area at present under the control of the Maylands Local Board of Health, so as to include the area bounded on the North-Eastward by the South-West side of Caledonian Road, and the North-Eastern boundary of Lot 596 in the Peninsula Estate. On the North-Westward by the North-West boundaries of Lots 1 to 14 inclusive, 151, 174, 185 to 188 inclusive, 227, and 228 in the same estate. On the South-West by the right bank of the Swan River. WHEREAS it is by "The Explosives Act, 1895," amongst other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, or repeal by-laws and regulations dealing with any of the following matters:—

1. The packing of explosives.
2. Carriage of explosives.
3. General rules for factories, magazines, and stores.

AND WHEREAS the Governor in Council, under the powers of the said Act, may from time to time, by order, define the composition, quality, and character of an explosive, and may classify explosives, and may prohibit the manufacture, keeping, importation, and sale of any explosive when considered expedient for the public safety:

Now, THEREFORE, the Governor in Council does hereby make the following By-laws dealing with the above matters, and does hereby define the quality, composition, and character of explosives, and does prohibit the manufacture, keeping, importation, and sale of explosives other than those mentioned herein.

BY-LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

PART I.—PACKING OF EXPLOSIVES.

General Rules for Packing.

1. All explosives other than gunpowder imported into or manufactured or stored in the State of Western Australia shall be packed in accordance with the following general rules, and in determining to what class or division any explosives may belong the classification and division of explosives hereinafter prescribed shall be strictly observed.

2. With respect to explosives of the 2nd (Nitrate Mixture) and 3rd (Nitro-Compound) Classes:—

- (a.) The explosive, if not exceeding 5lbs. in amount, shall be contained in a substantial case, bag, canister, or other receptacle, made and closed so as to prevent any explosive from escaping.
- (b.) The explosive, if exceeding 5lbs. in amount, shall be contained in a double package. The inner package shall be a substantial case, bag, canister, or other receptacle, made and closed so as to prevent any explosive from escaping; and the outer package shall be a box, barrel, or case of wood or metal or other solid material, and shall be of such strength, construction, and character that it will not be broken or accidentally opened or become defective or insecure whilst being conveyed, and will not allow any explosive to escape; and the amount of explosive in any one outer package shall not exceed 50lbs., except with the consent and under the conditions approved of by a Government Inspector.

3. With respect to explosive of the 4th (Chlorate Mixture) Class:—

- (a.) The explosive, if not exceeding 5lbs. in amount, shall be contained in a substantial bag, canister, or other receptacle, made and closed so as to prevent any explosive from escaping.
- (b.) The explosive, if exceeding 5lbs. in amount, shall be contained in a double package. The inner package shall be a substantial case, bag, or covering, without any metal in the construction thereof, and so made as to prevent any explosive from escaping, and any one of such packages shall not contain more than 10lbs.; and the other package shall be a box, barrel, or case of wood or other solid material (other than metal), and shall be of such strength, construction, and character that it will not be broken or accidentally opened, or become defective or insecure whilst being conveyed, and will not allow any explosive to escape; and the amount of explosive in any one outer package shall not exceed 50lbs., except with the consent of and under conditions approved of by a Government Inspector. In addition, the inner or outer package as above prescribed, or both, shall be thoroughly water-proof.

4. With respect to explosives of the 5th (Fulminate) Class:—

- (a.) An explosive of the Fulminate Class which is of such a character that it cannot be packed mixed with water, or that danger would arise from such mode of packing, shall be packed in such manner as shall be specially directed by the Government Inspector.
- (b.) Any other explosive of the Fulminate Class shall be packed as follows:—It shall be packed in bags or coverings of calico, canvas, or other material permeable to water, and containing each not more than 25lbs. of fulminate, and so made and closed as to prevent any explosive from escaping. Such bags or coverings shall be packed in a case containing sufficient water to ensure the explosive being kept constantly wet, and such case (hereafter called the inner case) shall be packed in an outer case, containing water constantly to surround the inner case; and the inner case and the outer case shall each be of such strength, construction, and character that it will not be broken or accidentally opened or become defective or insecure whilst being conveyed, and will not allow any fulminate or water to escape; and the amount of explosive in any one outer case shall not exceed 200lbs., except with the consent of and under the conditions approved of by a Government Inspector.

5. With respect to explosive of the 1st Division of the 6th (Ammunition) Class, the explosive shall be contained in a box, barrel, or case of wood, metal, or other solid material, and of such strength, construction, and character that it will not be broken or accidentally opened, or become defective or insecure whilst being conveyed, and will not allow any explosive to escape.

6. With respect to explosives of the 2nd Division of the 6th (Ammunition) Class:—

- (a.) A shell or torpedo containing any explosive material, whether such shell or torpedo be separate or form part of a rocket or other appliance, shall be packed in such manner as may be specially directed by a Government Inspector with reference to such explosive.
- (b.) An explosive material when made up into a cartridge or charge for cannon, shells, mines, blasting, or other like purposes shall be packed in the manner required for the same explosive material when not so made up; provided that where a double package is required, the enclosing case of each cartridge or charge, if it satisfies the conditions required for the inner package, may be held to be in such inner package.
- (c.) Any other explosive of the 2nd Division shall be packed in a box, barrel, or case of wood, metal, or other solid material, and of such strength, construction, and character that it will not be broken or accidentally opened or become defective or insecure whilst being conveyed, and will not allow any explosive to escape; and any one such package shall not contain more than 100lbs. of ammunition, except with the consent of and under the conditions approved of by a Government Inspector.

7. With respect to explosive of the 3rd Division of the 6th (Ammunition) Class: The explosive shall be packed in a double package. The inner package shall be a substantial bag, case, canister, or other covering, made and closed so as to prevent any explosive from escaping, and shall not contain more than 25lbs. of such explosive. The outer package shall be a box, barrel, or case of wood, metal, or other solid material, and shall be of such strength, construction, and character that it will not be broken or accidentally opened or become defective whilst being conveyed, and will not allow any explosive to escape; and any one such package shall not contain more than 50lbs., except with the consent of and under conditions approved of by a Government Inspector.

8. In the case of detonators, the following general conditions shall be observed, in addition to all other general conditions relating to the packing for conveyance of explosives of the 3rd Division of the 6th (Ammunition) class:—

- (a.) The detonators and the spaces between the detonators and the spaces between the sides of the inner package and the detonators therein shall all be filled, as far as practicable, with fine sawdust or other similar material. A layer of cotton-wool or other soft elastic material shall be placed between each end of each detonator

and the interior of the inner package in which the same is placed, in such manner and so secured that both ends of each detonator will rest upon the cotton-wool or other material used in the place of cotton-wool. Every inner package, if of metal, must be lined throughout with paper or other soft material.

- (b.) When the number of detonators to be packed for conveyance exceeds 1,000, or when a greater number than 1,000 has, subject to any special conditions, been approved by a Government Inspector (which he is hereby authorised to do), then if the number of detonators to be packed for conveyance exceeds the number so approved, all the inner packages containing detonators shall be placed inside a substantial case of wood or metal, made and closed so as to prevent any of the inner packages escaping therefrom, and such case shall be placed inside the outer package required in the case of explosives of the 3rd Division of the 6th (Ammunition) Class, packed for conveyance and so secured as to leave a clear space of not less than three inches between every part of the interior of such outer package and such inner case, and such clear space may be either filled with sawdust or with straw or other soft or elastic substance, or may contain a light framework of wood, or wooden battens so arranged as to keep such case in such position as aforesaid with respect to the outer package.
9. With respect to explosive of the 7th (Firework) Class:—
- (a.) An explosive of the 1st Division shall be contained in a double package. The inner package shall be a substantial canister, case, or other receptacle, hermetically closed, and containing no more than 1lb. of explosive; and the outer package shall be a box, or case of wood, metal, or other solid material, and shall be of such strength, construction, and character that it will not be broken or accidentally opened or become defective or insecure whilst being conveyed, and will not allow any explosive to escape; and any one outer package shall not contain more than 20lbs., except with the consent of and under the conditions approved by a Government Inspector; and there shall not be any iron or steel in the construction of any such inner or outer package unless the same is effectually covered with tin, zinc, or other suitable material.
- (b.) An explosive of the 2nd Division exceeding 5lbs. in weight shall be contained in a box, barrel, or case of wood, metal, or other solid material, and of such strength, construction, and character that it will not be broken or accidentally opened or become defective or insecure whilst being conveyed, and will not allow any explosive to escape; and the amount of explosive in any one package shall not exceed 100lbs., except with the consent of and under the conditions approved by a Government Inspector: Provided, however, that, in addition to their being contained in a box, barrel, or case of wood, metal, or other solid material, Magic pin-crackers shall be packed in numbers not exceeding twelve, in stout paper; and each such package shall be placed singly in a box of wood or cardboard, properly secured against escape of explosive.
10. Any explosive which, for the time being, is not authorised by license to be manufactured for general sale shall be packed in such manner as may be specially directed by a Government Inspector.
11. Whatever be the amount of the explosive or the Class and Division to which it belongs—
- (a.) The interior of every package, whether single or double, shall be kept free from grit, and otherwise clean.
- (b.) No package, whether single or double, when actually used for the packing of Fireworks shall be used for any other purpose.
- (c.) On the outermost package there shall be affixed in conspicuous characters, by means of a brand or securely attached label or other marks, the word "Explosive" and the name of the explosive, followed by the name and number of the class and division to which it belongs, and in the case of the 2nd (Nitrate Mixture), 3rd (Nitro-Compound), 4th (Chlorate Mixture), and 2nd Division of the 6th (Ammunition) Classes there shall also be exhibited a mark indicating the date of manufacture of the explosive.

PART 2.—CARRIAGE OF EXPLOSIVES.

12. No explosive shall be conveyed as merchandise unless the same be conveyed in vehicles enclosed on all sides by wood (if the quantity conveyed be more than 250lbs. in weight) or (if the explosive be less than 250lbs. in weight) unless the explosive be surrounded on all sides with tarpaulins or other suitable material so as to effectually protect it against communication of fire, and so as to prevent the explosive or the cases containing the same from coming in contact with any exposed iron or steel.

13. No such explosive shall be conveyed in any vehicle used for the conveyance of passengers, nor along any route traversed by tramways or by any system of wires conveying electric power.

14. Nothing besides explosives shall be conveyed on any vehicle carrying the same, and no explosives shall be conveyed together in the same vehicle other than those authorised to be stored together under Part 3 of these Regulations.

15. No explosives shall be conveyed within the boundaries of any municipality or townsite except between the hours of sunrise and sunset.

16. The quantity of explosives conveyed in any vehicle within the boundaries of any municipality or townsite shall not exceed two hundred and fifty pounds of gunpowder, or other explosives, except detonators, and shall not exceed ten thousand detonators, except under a special permit in writing granted by the Inspector of Explosives; and such permit shall specify the maximum quantity of explosives to be conveyed in any one vehicle, and the route to be traversed by such vehicle, with any other special conditions which the Inspector may consider necessary.

17. No person in charge of any vehicle carrying explosives and unloading any vehicle with explosives shall smoke or commit any other act liable to cause fire or explosion.

18. Every person who commits, or attempts to commit, any breach of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable, on summary conviction by any two or more Justices of the Peace in Petty Sessions, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for such offence, and to a penalty of Ten pounds for each day during which the offence continues, and forfeiture of all or any part of the explosives in respect of which the breach of By-law has taken place.

PART 3.—GENERAL RULES FOR FACTORIES, MAGAZINES, AND STORES.

19. The general rules for factories, magazines, and stores for gunpowder contained in Part I. of "The Explosives Act, 1895," shall apply to every kind of explosive in like manner, with the substitution of that kind of explosive for gunpowder, subject only to any provisions hereinafter contained.

20. In respect to the different kinds of explosives which may be stored together, the following division shall be observed, and only those explosives classed under a particular division shall be stored together:—

Division A.—The various explosives of Class 1 (Gunpowder), Class 2 (Nitrate Mixture), Class 3 (Nitro-Compound); Safety Fuse belonging to the 1st Division of Class 6 (ammunition); and the various explosives of the 2nd Division of Class 6 (ammunition) as do not contain any exposed iron or steel.

Division B.—The various explosives of the 1st Division of Class 6 (ammunition).

Division C.—Such of the explosives of the 2nd Division of Class 6 (ammunition) as contain any exposed iron or steel.

Division D.—The various explosives of the 3rd Division of Class 6 (ammunition).

Division E.—The various explosives of Class 7 (fireworks).

21. In the case of stores licensed for keeping and selling gunpowder or other explosives, in lieu of the maximum amount of gunpowder limited by Section 18 of "The Explosives Act, 1895," there shall be substituted the following amounts of other explosives, viz.:—

If stored in mode (a): In lieu of each pound of gunpowder, 1lb. of fireworks, or $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. of any explosive other than gunpowder or fireworks.

If stored in mode (b): In lieu of each 1lb. of gunpowder, 1lb. of fireworks, or $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. of any explosive other than gunpowder or fireworks.

22. Where any room is used in connection with any store for filling cartridges, the distance to be maintained between such room and store shall in each case be not less than ten feet.

PART 4.—CLASSIFICATION OF EXPLOSIVES.

23. Explosives shall be divided into seven classes, as follows:—

Class 1	Gunpowder
Class 2	Nitrate Mixture
Class 3	Nitro-compound
Class 4	Chlorate Mixture
Class 5	Fulminate
Class 6	Ammunition
Class 7	Fireworks

And when an explosive falls within the description of more than one class, it shall be deemed to belong exclusively to the latest of the classes within the description of which it falls, and the composition, quality, and character of the following explosives shall be as defined in any confidential order of the Governor in Council in force for the time being:—

Class 1.—Gunpowder.

The term “gunpowder” means exclusively gunpowder, consisting of potassium nitrate, sulphur, and charcoal.

Class 2.—Nitrate Mixture.

The term “nitrate mixture” means any preparation other than gunpowder, formed by the mechanical mixture of a nitrate with any form of carbon, or with any carbonaceous substance not possessed of explosive properties whether sulphur be or be not added to such preparation, and whether such preparation be or be not mechanically mixed with any other non-explosive substance.

The nitrate mixture class comprises the following explosives:—

- Dahmenite,
- Safety Blasting Powder.

Class 3.—Nitro-Compound.

The term “nitro-compound” means any chemical compound possessed of explosive properties, or capable of combining with metals to form an explosive compound, which is produced by the chemical action of nitric acid (whether mixed or not with sulphuric acid), or of a nitrate mixed with sulphuric acid upon any carbonaceous substance, whether such compound is mechanically mixed with other substances or not.

The nitro-compound class has two divisions.

- E.C. Powder Company's Rifle Powder, J.B. Patent

- Rendite
- Rifle Gun Cotton
- Schultze Gunpowder
- Schultze Blasting Powder
- Tonite or Cotton Powder No. 1
- Tonite or Cotton Powder No. 2
- Tonite or Cotton Powder No. 3.

Class 4.—Chlorate Mixture.

The term “Chlorate Mixture” means any explosive containing a chlorate, and comprises the following explosives and any chlorate preparation which consists partly of nitro-glycerine or some other liquid nitro-compound:—

- Cheddite
- Rackarock (authorised for manufacture only; see special regulations hereinafter contained)

Class 5.—Fulminate.

The term “fulminate” means any chemical compound or mechanical mixture, whether included in the foregoing classes or not, which from its great susceptibility to detonation, is suitable for employment in percussion caps or any other appliances for developing detonation, or which from its extreme sensibility to explosion, and from its great instability (that is to say, readiness to undergo decomposition from very slight exciting causes) is especially dangerous.

The class consists of two divisions.

Division 1 comprises such compounds as the fulminates of silver and of mercury, and preparations of these substances such as are used in percussion caps; and any preparation consisting of a mixture of a chlorate with phosphorus or certain descriptions of phosphorous compounds, with or without the addition of carbonaceous matter, and any preparation consisting of a mixture of a chlorate with sulphur or with a sulphur with or without carbonaceous matter.

Division 1.

- Cap Composition.
- Fulminate of Mercury,

Division 2.

Division 2 comprises such substances as the chloride and iodide of nitrogen, fulminating gold and silver, diazobenzol and the nitrate of diazobenzol.

Class 6.—Ammunition.

The term “ammunition” means an explosive of any of the foregoing classes when enclosed in any case or contrivance, or otherwise adapted or prepared so as to form a cartridge or charge for small arms, cannon, or any other weapon, or for blasting, or to form any safety or other fuse for blasting or for shells, or to form any tube for firing explosives, or to form a percussion cap, a detonator, a fog signal, a shell, a torpedo, a war rocket or other contrivance other than a firework.

The term “percussion cap” does not include a detonator.

The term “detonator” means a capsule or case, which is of such strength and construction and contains an explosive of the fulminate explosive class in such quantity that the explosion of one capsule or case will communicate the explosion to other like capsules or cases.

The term “safety fuse” means a fuse for blasting, which burns and does not explode, and which does not contain its own means of ignition, and which is of such strength and construction and contains an explosive in such quantity that the burning of such fuse will not communicate laterally with other like fuses.

The ammunition class has three divisions.

Division 1 comprises the following explosives:—

- Percussion Caps.
- Railway Fog Signals.
- Safety Cartridges.
- Safety Firing Tubes No. 1.
- Safety Fuse.

Division 2 comprises any ammunition as before defined which does not contain its own means of ignition and is not included in Division 1, viz:—

- Cartridges for Small Arms.
- Cartridges for Cannon, Shells, Mines Blasting, or other like purposes.
- Electric Fuses, including—
 - Abel's Electric Fuses.
 - Brain's Electric Fuses.
 - Electric Fuses (Smith's patent).
 - Electric Gunpowder Fuses.
 - Electric Primers.
 - High Tension Electric Fuses.
 - Low Tension Electric Fuses.
 - Spon's Electric Fuses.
- Fuses for Shells.
- Instantaneous Fuses.
- Patent Igniters.
- Pain's Instantaneous Pyrotechnic Fuses.
- Tubes for Firing Explosives.
- War Rockets.

Division 3 comprises any ammunition, as before defined, which contains its own means of ignition, and is not included in Division 1, viz. :—

Cartridges for small arms (which are not safety cartridges).

Detonators.
Electric Detonators, including—
Abel's Electric Detonator Fuses.
Bornhardt's Electric Detonator Fuses.
Brain's Electric Detonator Fuses.

Electric Detonator Fuses (Smith's patent).
High Tension Electric Detonator Fuses.
Low Tension Electric Detonator Fuses.

By ammunition containing its own means of ignition is meant—Ammunition having an arrangement, whether attached to it or forming part of it, which is adapted to explode or fire the same by friction or percussion.

Class 7.—Firework.

The term "firework" comprises firework composition and manufactured fireworks.

Division 1.—The term "firework composition" means any chemical compound or mechanically-mixed preparation of an explosive or inflammable nature, which is used for the purpose of making manufactured fireworks, and is not included in the former classes of explosives, and also any coloured firework composition.

Division 2.—The term "manufactured firework" means any explosive of the foregoing classes, and any firework composition when such explosive or composition is enclosed in any case or contrivance, or is otherwise manufactured so as to form a squib, cracker, serpent, rocket (other than a war rocket), maroon, star, lance, wheel, chinese fire, roman candle, or other article adapted for the production of pyrotechnic effects or pyrotechnic signals or sound signals.

Firework Composition.

Division 2 comprises—

Amorces or Toy Caps
Crack Shots
Distress Signal Rockets
Manufactured Fireworks
Snaps for Bon-bon Crackers
Socket Distress Signals
Sound Signal Rockets
Socket Light Signals
Throwdowns

PART 5.—RACKAROCK.

24. The manufacture of the explosive known as "Rackarock," except under the conditions and restrictions herein-after specified, is hereby prohibited.

25. The Minister may issue to such persons as he may think fit licenses authorising the manufacture by such persons of the explosive known as rackarock.

26. The names of the ingredients to be used in the manufacture of the said explosive shall be mentioned in each license.

27. The manufacture of the said explosive shall not be carried on underground in any mine.

28. No person shall carry on the manufacture of the said explosive other than the person to whom the license is issued, or some person in his employ duly authorised in writing by him.

29. The quantity of rackarock to be manufactured at any one time shall not exceed such a quantity as would be required for the purposes of a mine for six working days, and, in the event of any quantity of the said explosive being stored or kept for a period of more than seven days from the date of the manufacture thereof, the license will be liable to immediate forfeiture by the Minister.

30. If any matter which is not provided for by any express condition or proviso in any license, a Government Inspector find any store for the said explosive or for the ingredients which, when combined, constitute the said

explosive or any part thereof, or any practice therein or connected therewith, to be unnecessarily dangerous or defective, so as, in his opinion, to tend to endanger the public safety of any person, such Inspector may require the person to whom the license is issued to remedy the same at once and without delay; and if such person neglect to do so, such neglect shall be deemed a breach of these Regulations.

31. The Minister may, either with or without notice, at any time stop the manufacture of the said explosive by any licensed person, provided he deems such stoppage necessary in the interest of public safety, or may, in the said interest, direct the licensee or his agent to alter or amend the process of manufacture in such manner as he, or any person duly authorised by him in that behalf, may direct.

32. The Minister may, by notice in writing, declare any such license void upon being satisfied that the manufacture of the said explosive is not being conducted in accordance with the conditions of the license or in accordance with the directions given in pursuance of the last preceding clause, and that the further continuance of its manufacture will imperil the public safety.

33. The conveyance of Rackarock in any vehicle or boat, in or upon any public thoroughfare, river, harbour, or public place is hereby prohibited.

PART 6—GENERAL.

34. These Regulations shall come into force one month from the date of their approval, and all other Regulations and By-laws under "The Explosives Act, 1895," then in force shall be null and void from the said date of these Regulations coming into force, with the exception of By-laws dated 21st October, 1903, relating to the conveyance, loading, and unloading of Explosives within the Harbours of Western Australia.

35. Any person who shall commit or attempt to commit any breach of the foregoing By-laws shall, for every act or default, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence and £10 for each day during which the offence continues, and the forfeiture of all or any part of the explosive in respect of which the breach of the By-laws has taken place.

- (1.) Sells or describes as bonedust or bonemeal any fertiliser containing less than 40 per centum of tricalcic phosphate derived from bones, or of which less than 80 per centum will pass through a mesh of one-eighth of an inch; or.
- (2.) Sells or describes as super-phosphate or super any fertiliser containing less than 20 per centum of water soluble phosphate, and a less total than 30 per centum of water soluble phosphate and citrate soluble phosphate; or

(3.) Sells or describes as Thomas's Phosphate any fertiliser composed of basic slag containing less than 30 per centum of tricalcic phosphate, and so prepared that less than 80 per centum shall pass through a sieve of 100 meshes to the lineal inch, or 10,000 meshes to the square inch, or more than 5 per centum of which fails to pass through a sieve of 60 meshes to the lineal inch, or 3,600 meshes to the square inch; or

(4.) Sells for use as food for cattle any article which contains any ingredient deleterious to cattle, or to which has been added any ingredient worthless for feeding purposes, and not disclosed at the time of sale,
