<sup>2325</sup><sub>1904</sub> THE following telegram, received by His Excellency the Governor General from the Right Honourable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, is published for general information.

"In my telegram of the 10th February, rules for observance of neutrality published in *London Gazette* of 11th February lay down in rule three to what extent coal might be supplied to belligerent warships in British ports during the present war. It must be, however, borne in mind that reason for practice of admitting belligerent ships of war into neutral ports arises out of exigencies of life at sea and the hospitality which it is customary to extend to vessels of friendly powers, and that this principle does not extend to enabling such vessels to utilise neutral ports directly for purposes of hostile operations. His Majesty's Government have decided that rule above-mentioned is not to be understood as having any application to cases of belligerent fleet proceeding either to the seat of war or to any position or positions on the line of route with the object of intercepting neutral ships on suspicion of carrying contraband of war. Such fleet cannot be permitted to make use in any way of any British ports for purpose of coaling, either directly from the shore or from colliers accompanying fleet, whether vessels of the fleet present themselves at the port at same time or successively. His Majesty's Government further direct that the same practice be pursued with reference to single belligerent ships of war if it is clear that they are proceeding for purposes of belligerent operations ability defined this is not to be applied to the case of vessel putting in on account of actual distress at sea."

ON STATE FOREST AT CHIDLOW'S WELL.<sup>11591</sup>

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to set apart all that portion of Chidlow's Well Townsite North of the Eastern Railway line as a State Forest, and to make the following Regulations under the provisions of Section 161 of "The Land Act, 1898."

No person shall, without the special permission in writing of the Minister for Lands or his agent, fell, cut, split, or remove any timber growing or standing on the area of such State Forest, such permission only to be given subject to the conditions set out hereunder:—

1. The area will be divided into blocks of about 100 acres each, and any person may apply to the Minister for Lands for the right of cutting and removing timber and firewood from any of such blocks under monthly license; on approval of such application a permit will be issued giving the applicant the right of cutting and removing timber and firewood, subject as hereinafter provided.

2. Cutting operations shall commence within 14 days from the date that the applicant is informed of the approval of his application.

3. Each permit will be available only by the person named therein, and will not be transferable except by the approval of the Minister for Lands; but the holder of a permit may employ persons to cut and remove timber or firewood.

4. The permit or license issued may be cancelled at any time for any breach of these Regulations, or any of the Timber Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of the 27th June, 1902, or any other Timber Regulations in force at the time being.

5. Every licensee must show his license whenever production thereof is demanded by an officer of the Woods and Forests Department.

6. The holder of a permit may cut and remove timber of any girth, except young saplings, and such trees as have been marked by the Forest Ranger, which shall not be cut or removed.

7. All persons cutting timber within the Chidlow's Well State Forest must burn the tops and branches of the trees felled, but in so doing shall observe the provisions of "The Bush Fires Act, 1902," or any amendment thereof.

8. All tops of trees, etc., of felled timber must be removed for a radius of six feet round any tree left to mature.

9. No trees shall be felled in such a manner as to obstruct any road or used track.

10. The officers of the Woods and Forests Department may seize and dispose of any timber cut contrary to these regulations.

Any person offending against these Regulations shall, on conviction, be subject to a penalty not exceeding £20.
