ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 14th day of September 1904.

WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the W Governor is empowered, by Order in Council, to be published in the Government Gazette, from time to time, to make, vary, alter, or revoke such Regulations under this Act as may be deemed expedient for all or any of the following purposes:—For the purpose of subjecting any stock to such restrictions or remedial measures as may be deemed necessary to prevent the introduction or spread of disease; for providing for the steps to be taken in case of any disease breaking out among any stock in the State, and for preventing the spreading of such disease; for prescribing the manner in which persons coming into contact with infected stock, and land, premises, or conveyances travelled over or used by infected stock, shall be cleaned and disinfected; for the regulation, management, and control of quarantine grounds, and for prescribing the treatment and disposal of stock whilst in quarantine, or in transit thereto or therefrom; for prescribing the term during which stock shall be quarantined, and generally for all or any such purposes a heavest down rescent for prescribing the treatment and disposal of stock whilst in quarantine, or in transit thereto or therefrom; for prescribing the term during which stock shall be quarantined, and generally for all or any such purposes a heavest down rescent for prescribing the interest of the interest poses as he may deem necessary for preventing the intro-duction or spread of disease: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby make the following Regulations under the said Act.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. It is the duty of the owner of poultry infected with 1. It is the duty of the owner or pountry infected with tick, within twenty-four hours of the time when he shall have discovered or suspected such poultry to be infected, to give written notice thereof to the nearest Inspector, and thenceforth to keep such poultry from coming into contact with other poultry until otherwise ordered by the Inspector (see 59 Vict., No. 34, Section 11).
- 2. If an Inspector shall discover on any premises poultry infected, or suspected of being infected with tick, he may serve upon the owner of such poultry a notice in the form or to the effect of the schedule hereto.
- It shall be a sufficient ground to suspect that poultry are infected with tick if tick is found in or about the fowl-houses used by such poultry, or the appurtenances used in connection with such fowl-houses.
- 4. During the fourteen days next following the service of such notice it shall be unlawful for any person to remove any poultry from the premises referred to in such notice.
- Within the fourteen days next following the service of such notice the following steps shall be taken by the owner of such poultry for cleansing and disinfecting the premises and preventing the spreading of such disease, that is to say:
 - (a.) All fowl-houses and the appurtenances used in connection therewith shall be dismantled or treated in such manner as directed by the Inspector, and all visible ticks destroyed.
 - (b.) All material with which such fowl-houses and appurtenances were constructed shall then (if not destroyed by fire) be saturated with boiling water, and, in order that all ticks and their germs hidden in crevices may be destroyed, thoroughly saturated with a three per cent. solution of carbolic acid and water, tar, or other effective destroyer.
 - (c.) Should the fowl-houses be in close proximity to or attached to fencing, such fencing must be treated in a similar manner.
 - (d.) The whole of the ground area of infected houses, etc., must be strewn to a thickness of half-inch with fresh quick-lime, and then slaked with water, also the ground within three feet of each side of infected fencing must be treated in a similar manner.

- 6. If the owner of any poultry shall make default in taking such steps as aforesaid, pursuant to such notice, all work that the Inspector shall deem necessary to be done to comply therewith may be undertaken by or under the direction of the Inspector, and the expense incurred shall be recoverable in a summary way at the suit of such Inspector before any Justice of the Peace.
- 7. All fowl-houses and the appurtenances in connection therewith which shall be dismantled in accordance with Clause (a) hereof, shall not be re-erected unless the same shall be constructed in such manner as to prevent the harbouring of tick, and shall be provided with tick-proof perches to the satisfaction of the Inspector.
- 8. Any person committing any breach of the foregoing regulations, numbered 3 and 4, shall, for every offence, be liable, in addition to any expense incurred under Regulation 5, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

THE following Circular Despatch, received by His Excellency the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, from the Right Honourable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, is published for general information.

Sir,

With reference to my Circular despatch of the 12th of February last, respecting the rules for the observance of the duties of Neutrality during the existing state of war between Russia and Japan, I have the honour to inform you that I have this day caused a telegram to be despatched to you, of which the following is the decode:—

"My telegram of 10th February, rules for observance of neutrality, published in the London Gazette of 11th February, lay down in Rule 3 to what extent coal might be supplied to belligerent warships in British ports during the present war. It must be, however, borne in mind that reason for practice of admitting belligerent vessels of war into neutral ports arises out of exigencies of life at sea and the hospitality which it is customary to extend to vessels of friendly Powers, and that this principle does not extend to enabling such vessels to utilise neutral ports directly for purposes of hostile operations. His Majesty's Government have decided that rule above-mentioned is not to be understood as having any application to case of belligerent fleet proceeding either to the seat of war or to a position or positions on the line of route with the object of intercepting neutral ships on suspicion of carrying contraband Such fleet cannot be permitted to make use in any way of a British port for purposes of coaling, either directly from the shore or from colliers accompanying fleet whether vessels of the fleet present themselves at the port at the same time or successively.

His Majesty's Government further direct that the same practice be pursued with reference to single belligerent vessels of war if it is clear that they are proceeding for purposes of belligerent operations, as at ove defined. This is not to be applied to the case of vessel putting in on account of actual distress at sea."

MALLET STRIPPING REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Minister or such other person as he appoints may issue a Mallet Bark License, authorising the licensee to strip and remove mallet bark upon and from the Crown lands named in the license.
- 2. A similar license must be obtained by every person engaged only in removing the bark dealt with under a Mallet Bark License.
- 3. Each license will be available only by the person named therein as licensee, and will not be transferable except by the special permission of the officer authorised for the time being to issue licenses.
- 4. Every licensee must show his license whenever production thereof is demanded by an Officer of the Woods and Forests Department, or other authorised officer.
- and Forests Department, or other authorised officer.

 5. All trees must be felled before being stripped.
- 6. No mallet tree of nine (9) inches in diameter or under measured at four (4) feet from the ground, shall be felled.
- 7. All trees felled shall have the limbs as well as the bole stripped to a diameter of three (3) inches.
- 8. No mallet tree shall be stripped of bark except during the months from July to December, inclusive, in each year.
- 9. Bark stripped upon Crown lands and not removed during the currency of the license shall become, should the Minister so decide, the property of the State.
- 10. The officers of the Woods and Forests Department may seize and dispose of any bark cut contrary to these Regulations.
- 11. Any person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £20 for any single offence, nor £2 per day for a continuing offence, and not exceeding £100 in the aggregate.
- 12. The fee for a Mallet Bark License shall be 5s. per month for each person employed in stripping, and for each person engaged only in carting.
