On behalf of His Excellency Admiral Sir FREDERICK GEORGE DENHAM BEDFORD, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honour-able Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc.

W HEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900" (64 Vict., No. 8), the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any town or locality containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding one shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, calculated under the provisions of the said Act, a sum of three hundred pounds, to be a municipality, and to

declare the population of the locality so to be proclaimed; AND WHEREAS a petition has been presented to His Excel-lency Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, G.C.B., Governor as aforesaid, praying that the town of Broome might be proclaimed a Municipality, signed by not fewer than fifty inhabitants of the said town of Broome who would, upon the incorporation thereof, be liable to be Who would, upon the incorporation thereof, be Hable to be assessed for municipal taxes in respect of land or household residence within the said proposed municipality: AND WHEREAS the said petition was publicly advertised in the Government Gazette on the 26th day of August, 1904: AND WHEREAS it has been made to appear to the Governor in Executive Council that the town of Broome (harding the doscibed councils rates the property careful as (hereinafter described) contains rateable property capable of yielding the required amount levied as aforesaid, and should be proclaimed a municipality: Now THEREFORE I, Admiral Sir Frederick George Denhem Bedford, Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers so vested in me by the said Act, burstance of the powers so vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare the population of the said town of Broome to be over one thousand and not exceeding five thousand: AND I do, with the like advice, by this my Proclamation declare and proclaim it to be a Municipality under the name, style, and title of "The Mayor and Councillors of Broome," and do also declare and proclaim the boundaries of the said Municipality to be as follow :---

Bounded by lines starting from a point at high water mark on the North-Western shore of Roebuck Bay, situate in prolongation Sou h-Easterly of the Western side of Dora Street and extending North-North-Easterly along said side of Dora Street and its prolongation to the Northern side of Macpherson Road; thence Easterly to the North-West corner of Broome Lot 42; thence Easterly passing along its Northern boundary and that of Lots 43 and 430 to a point at high water mark on the right bank of Dampier Creek: at high water mark on the right bank of Dampier Creek; thence South-Westerly along said bank of Dampier Creek and the North-Western shore of Roebuck Bay aforesaid to the starting point.

That the following clauses of Part VI. of the 10th Schedule of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," be, and the same are, hereby adopted, namely :

#### PART VI.-FIRE PREVENTION.

#### (1,) FOUL CHIMNEYS.

Wilfully setting fire to chimneys.-Every person who wilfully sets or causes to be set on fire any chimney-flue, since vent, or stove-pipe, herein called in common "chimney," shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds: Provided always that nothing herein contained shall exempt the person so setting or causing to be set on fire any chimney from liability to be informed against or pro-secuted before any Court having criminal jurisdiction for such act as for an indictable offence. such act as for an indictable offence.

2. Negligently suffering chimney to be on fire.—If any chimney accidentally catch or be on fire, the person occupying or using the premises in which such chimney is situated shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings; provided always that such forfeiture shall not be incurred if such person prove to the satisfaction of the Justice before whom the case is heard that such fire was in nowise owing to the omission, neglect, or carelessness, whether with respect to cleansing such chimney or otherwise, of himself or his servant.

(2.) DEPOSIT, ETC., OF INFLAMMABLE MATERIAL, ETC.

3. Regulations.-It shall be lawful for the Council from time to time to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following, that is to say :

- For prescribing the distance from any adjoining land, or from any building, within which it shall not be lawful to make or keep any stack of hay, corn, straw, or other produce, if not placed under roof or cover, and the like were placed under roof or cover, and for pro-hibiting or restraining the use for such covering of such inflammable materials as shall be described in such regulation.
- For prescribing the distance from any adjoining land, or from any street or public place, or from any building within which it shall not be lawful to deposit such combustible materials as shall be specified in the regulation, or save in some properly constructed fireplace within some building to make or light any fire.

And every such regulation may be made to apply to the whole or separately to any part or parts of the Municipality described by boundaries in such regulation, and may provide as to the subject matter thereof, either absolutely or with relation to the consent of the Council, or of the proper officer of the Council, to be given or withheld in any case to be in question under such regulation.

4. Stacks or covering, etc., in violation of or otherwise than required by regulation.—Every person who shall make or place any stack of hay, corn, straw, or other produce, or place as or for the covering of any such stack any inflammable material, or deposit any combustible material, or light, or fire, contrary in any such case to any regulation under this subdivider and occur of compromision whereas subdivision, and every occupier of any premises whereon any stack or any such covering of a stack shall be, or any combustible materials have been deposited, if the same, though lawfully made, placed, or deposited before the coming into force of any such regulation, shall be there contrary to the tenure of such regulation, who shall not, within seven days after notice from the Council so to do, within seven days after notice from the Council so to do, remove such stack, covering, or materials, or who shall suffer to remain any such stack, covering, or materials unlawfully made, placed, or deposited before the coming into force of such regulations, shall forfeit, on conviction, for such offence, a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and in every such case a further sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day of the area public even in the such of the such offence. for every day after any such conviction during which such stack, covering, or material shall so continue.

5. Setting fire to matter without notice.—Every person who wilfully sets fire to any inflammable matter whatsoever in the open air without having given notice in writing to the occupiers of the land adjoining to the land upon which such matter shall be, and also to the Town Clerk, of his interview of the set of the theorem between the set of the intention so to do, or within twenty-four hours giving the last given of such notices, or between the hours of four in the afternoon of any day and eight in the morning of the following day, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Fireworks.—Every person who shall light any bonfire-tar-barrel, or firework upon or within sixty yards of any public or private street, or any public place, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds

Bush fences.-It shall not be lawful for any person to make or place, or to keep or continue any fence of brushwood, bushes, or other like material, and every person who shall make or place any such fence, and every owner or occupier of any premises who for seven days after notice from the Council to remove any such fence thereto apper-taining, if lawfully made or placed before the couning into operation of this subdivision, shall suffer any such fence or any part thereof to remain, or shall suffer to remain any such fence unlawfully made before such coming into operation, shall forfeit, on conviction for such offence, a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and in every such case a further sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day after any such conviction during which such fence shall continue. wood, bushes, or other like material, and every person who continue.

2. A similar license must be obtained by every person engaged only in removing the bark dealt with under a Mallet Bark License.

3. Each license will be available only by the person named therein as licensee, and will not be transferable except by the special permission of the officer authorised for the time being to issue licenses.

Every licensee must show his license whenever production thereof is demanded by an Officer of the Woods and Forests Department, or other authorised officer.

5. All trees must be felled before being stripped.

6. No mallet tree of nine (9) inches in diameter or under measured at four (4) feet from the ground, shall be felled.

7. All trees felled shall have the limbs as well as the bole stripped to a diameter of three (3) inches.

8. No mallet tree shall be stripped of bark except during the months from July to December, inclusive, in each year.

Bark stripped upon Crown lands and not removed during the currency of the license shall become, should the Minister so decide, the property of the State.

10. The officers of the Woods and Forests Department may seize and dispose of any bark stripped or removed contrary to these Regulations.

11. Any person committing a breach of these Regula-tions shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding  $\pounds 20$  for any single offence, nor  $\pounds 2$  per day for a continuing offence, and not exceeding  $\pounds 100$  in the aggregate.

12. The fee for a Mallet Bark License shall be 5s. per month for each person employed in stripping, and for each person engaged only in carting.
