REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE HOMES FOR THE AGED AND INFIRM IN WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

1. The Director of State Charities, under instructions from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, will control the admission and discharge of inmates, and supervise generally all Homes in the State established within the meaning of the Act 46 Victoria, No. 8.

2. The Resident Officer in Charge of the Home, and who in the case of the Homes for men will be styled Superintendent, and in the case of the Home for women Matron, will, under the general authority of the Director, carry out such instructions as they may receive from him, and will be held responsible for the Rules and Regulations being strictly adhered to.

GENERAL RULES FOR INMATES.

3. All persons received into any of the Homes may be searched on admission, and also on their return at any time when out on leave.

4. They will be required, on admission, to thoroughly wash and cleanse themselves, and will be supplied with suitable clothing. While resident in the Homes all inmates must keep themselves clean in person and have regular baths.

5. Inmates, unless specially authorised by the Superintendent or Matron, are not allowed to leave food, clothing, or articles of any description in the sleeping wards of the Institutions.

6. The hours for rising, for meals, for work, and for retiring to rest are as follows:—

Rising	... 6:30 a.m.	(1st October to 31st March).

Breakfast	... 7:30	„
Employment	... 9:0	„ till 11:45 a.m.
Dinner	... 12:0	noon.

Retiring to rest	8:0	„

7. These hours must be strictly observed; a bell to be rung five minutes before each meal.

8. Deserving inmates may be granted a small monetary allowance for special work performed. The granting of this allowance does not, however, in any way imply that inmates generally are to receive payment for work performed. Inmates able to work, and certified as such by the Visiting Medical Officer, must perform any reasonable duties required of them. Inmates refusing to work when requested by the Superintendent or Matron of the Home or any other officer appointed to supervise labour, are liable to be discharged or dealt with under 52 Victoria, No. 10. Deserving men may be allowed a small tobacco allowance weekly.

9. Inmates not incapacitated by sickness or infirmity will be required to take their meals at the time and in the place appointed.

10. Inmates shall not throw away or destroy food of any description, and shall not receive presents or purchase extras without the permission of the Officer in Charge of the Home. No present shall consist of or include intoxicating liquor. Swearing, indecent conversation, unruly conduct, and gambling of any description are strictly prohibited.

11. Inmates returning, when on leave, in a state of intoxication, or are found while resident there in this condition, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of the Regulations, and be liable to be dismissed the Institution. No dismissal of an inmate, however, under this rule or any other, shall take place without the sanction of the Director of Charities.

12. Visitors will not be allowed access to the inmates without the consent of the Officer in Charge of the Institution. A special afternoon in each week will be set apart for visitors. Ministers of religion will be allowed to conduct religious services and visit inmates at such times as may be arranged.

13. Inmates will be allowed leave of absence as arranged, but will not be allowed to leave the Institution or the grounds attached thereto without the consent of the Officer in Charge.

14. Inmates desirous of leaving the Home must give the Officer in Charge forty-eight hours' notice of their intention to do so. This rule will not apply in cases where, for reasons considered sufficient by the Officer in Charge, inmates should be allowed to leave without the usual notice.

15. Money in the possession of any person, other than an Imperial, Military, or Naval pensioner, who is an inmate of any of the Homes, and who is receiving relief therein, may be daily applied in payment for the relief of such person at the rate of one shilling per diem.

16. Any money in the possession of an Imperial, Military, or Naval pensioner, who is an inmate of any of the said Homes, and who is receiving relief therein, may be daily applied in payment for the relief of such person at the rate of ninepence per diem.

17. In calculating the number of days an inmate of any of the said Homes remains an inmate, a broken day shall count as a whole day.

18. In the event of any person who is an inmate of any of the said Homes ceasing to be an inmate before such money has been exhausted by such daily payment, the unexpended balance of such money shall be returned to such person on leaving the Home.

19. Inmates wilfully transgressing any of the Regulations render themselves liable to be dismissed forthwith, or to be punished under "The Poor Houses Discipline Act, 1888," which states:—"That notwithstanding the third section of "The Poor Houses Discipline Act, 1882," it shall be lawful for any Justice of the Peace to order an inmate of a Poor House, who shall be convicted before him of a breach of any Rule or Regulation made under the said Act, to be imprisoned with or without hard labour for any term not exceeding one month, and to be kept upon a diet of bread and water for any part of the said term not exceeding seven days."

20. A copy of the above Rules and Regulations shall be placed in a conspicuous place at the Home for the information of the inmates.

DUTIES OF OFFICIALS.

*Superintendents and Matrons.*

21. The Superintendents of the Homes for men and the Matron of the Home for women shall exercise a direct and personal supervision over the internal arrangements of the Institution under their charge, and be responsible for the due maintenance of order, discipline, economy, cleanliness, and general efficiency.

22. They should see that punctuality is observed throughout the Homes, and that the hours of rising, serving of meals, hours of work and retiring to rest are strictly adhered to.

23. They should see that the quality of food and other articles supplied to the Homes is in accordance with the contract, and that all books are kept regularly posted up and returns forwarded as required.

24. The Superintendents and Matrons should be careful to see that no waste of food occurs at any of the Homes, and that no bedding or clothing is condemned until absolutely useless.

25. To see that Medical comforts are only distributed in accordance with the instructions of the Visiting Medical Officer, unless in cases of emergency.

26. A thorough inspection of the whole establishment should take place each day not later than 10:30 a.m. The state of the beds, bedding, and general cleanliness should be minutely inquired into. The Superintendents and Matrons should visit the wards and other offices daily, at uncertain times, in order to secure complete supervision and efficiency throughout the Homes. The cleanliness of the inmates, both as regards person and clothing, should receive very careful attention.

27. An Official's leave time-table should be arranged by the Superintendent of the Homes for men, and the Matron of the Home for women, and submitted to the Director of Charities for approval.

28. A brief report dealing with complaints, if any, or of events of special importance, to be forwarded weekly to the Director of Charities.

ORDERLIES AND OTHER OFFICIALS.

29. All orderlies, nurses, cooks, and other officials employed at the various Homes are under the control and supervision of the Resident Officer in Charge. It is the duty of this officer to apportion and arrange the work of all officials employed in any capacity, and be responsible to the Director for the successful performance of their respective duties.

MALLET STRIPPING REGULATIONS.

1. The Minister or such other person as he appoints may issue a Mallet Bark License, authorising the licensee to strip and remove mallet bark upon and from the Crown lands named in the license.
2. A similar license must be obtained by every person engaged only in removing the bark dealt with under a Mallet Bark License.
3. Each license will be available only by the person named therein as licensee, and will not be transferable except by the special permission of the officer authorised for the time being to issue licenses.
4. Every licensee must show his license whenever production thereof is demanded by an Officer of the Woods and Forests Department, or other authorised officer.
5. All trees must be felled before being stripped.
6. No mallet tree of nine (9) inches in diameter or under measured at four (4) feet from the ground, shall be felled.
7. All trees felled shall have the limbs as well as the bole stripped to a diameter of three (3) inches.
8. No mallet tree shall be stripped of bark except during the months from July to December, inclusive, in each year.
9. Bark stripped upon Crown lands and not removed during the currency of the license shall become, should the Minister so decide, the property of the State.
10. The officers of the Woods and Forests Department may seize and dispose of any bark stripped or removed contrary to these Regulations.
11. Any person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £20 for any single offence, nor £2 per day for a continuing offence, and not exceeding £100 in the aggregate.
12. The fee for a Mallet Bark License shall be 5s. per month for each person employed in stripping, and for each person engaged only in carting.

NOTES FOR SEPTEMBER.

In the notes for July it was pointed out that the character of the disturbances this winter differs considerably from that which has generally been experienced at this time of the year ever since the Observatory was founded. The peculiarity consists in the occurrence of rain of the usual monsoonal type, which has passed from the N.W. coast inland through the interior. In the present month a repetition of the disturbance of this character gave the vast goldfield districts, including both the Murchison and Coolgardie fields, by far the heaviest fall ever experienced there in the month of September. There were curious features connected with it which makes it worth while to place on record the following particulars:—On Monday morning, the 12th, after a few days fine weather, the map showed a “low” off the West coast, near Geraldton (lat. 29), with cloudy weather throughout the State South of the tropics, and rain on the coast between Geraldton and Fremantle. As a general rule, a “low” appearing in this manner may be expected to pass either straight across to the Bight or down the coast and thence Eastward, giving falling barometers and unsettled weather throughout the South-West and South districts. On this occasion, however, the barometer at Cape Leeuwin was noticed to be rising rapidly, a most unusual thing under the circumstances, and it was evident that a “high” was pushing vigorously into our South-West corner. This latter succeeded in establishing itself and moving Eastward, forming a well-marked feature over our Southern coast districts and the Great Australian Bight. The “low” was apparently swallowed up by this movement, and disappeared from the weather-map, but the unsettled weather passed across country in a South-East direction just as if the “low” accompanied it, in the teeth of strong Easterly and South-Easterly winds and a well-developed “high,” giving heavy rains throughout the Murchison and Northern portions of the Coolgardie fields. The weather remained unsettled, with scattered showers, during the next few days, a moderate “low” following the “high,” and then, curiously, the same kind of thing was repeated on the 18th and 19th. This time the rain was more general, but it was again accompanied by the passage of a “high” along our South coast, and followed by a “low,” which passed overland across our South-West districts to the Great Bight, after most of the rain was over.

These heavy rains and the general character of the present winter season raise a most interesting and extremely practical question—one of the greatest importance to this State. It refers to the general conditions to be expected throughout the interior. From all the records already taken, the normal amount of rain seems to be very small, that for September being about half an inch in the neighbourhood of Kalgoorlie, and less than a quarter of an inch on the Murchison. It must not be forgotten, however, that these records extend over a period covering one of the most protracted droughts ever experienced in the Eastern States of Australia, and recent investigations by English and Indian meteorologists tend to show that this drought was common to an enormous region, including India and the whole of Australia. It may, therefore, be that our statistics do not yet represent by any means the true West Australian rainfall, and that the occurrence of these monsoonal storms, which differentiate the present winter from all others since the Observatory was founded (1897), is not so infrequent as our present records would indicate. This, however, cannot be settled for many years—it may take at least 100 to give a fair idea of the normal character of our seasons. At all events, these disturbances introduce a hope that the interior districts may not after all be so barren as they have been supposed to be, and will make our statistics for the next few years of more than usual value. As might be expected from the above, the rainfall map for the month shows a great excess over the average for most of the State South of the tropics. Exception is made in South-West coastal districts between Perth and Albany, where the fall was about or slightly below the mean for previous years. In the tropics, as usual at this season, little or no rain fell.

Pressure and temperature were, on the whole, very slightly below normal. Frosts prevailed occasionally at inland places, and the following table will be of practical use to all cultivators, as it gives the average and absolute lowest readings of a minimum thermometer placed on the surface of the ground.
