All proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed December 10, 1904, must, in order to be taken into considera-tion, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the first of February of the same year. Any one of the following persons is held to be duly qualified:--(a) Members of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament; (b) Members of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament; (c) Members of the International Peace Bureau; (e) Members of the Commission of the International Peace Bureau; (e) Members of the Institute of International Law; (f) University professors of Political Science and of Law, of History and of Philosophy; and (g) persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize. The Nobel Peace Prize.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.

According to the Code of Statutes, § 8, the grounds upon which any proposal is made must be stated, and handed in along with such papers and other documents as may therein be referred to.

According to § 3, every written work, to qualify for a prize, must have appeared in print.

10. The officers of the Woods and Forests Department may seize and dispose of any bark stripped or removed contrary to these Regulations.

11. Any person committing a breach of these Regula-tions shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding 220 for any single offence, nor 22 per day for a continuing offence, and not exceeding 2100 in the aggregate.

The fee for a Mallet Bark License shall be 5s. per 12 month for each person employed in stripping, and for each person engaged only in carting.

LOITERING ON RAILWAY PREMISES.

No person having travelled on the railway shall be entitled to remain on any railway station or premises for more than thirty minutes after the arrival at such station or premises of the train by which he travelled; and no person intending to travel on the railway shall be entitled to remain on any railway station or premises for more than one hour prior to the advertised time of departure of the train next proceeding to the station to which such person has booked to travel.

At junction stations passengers travelling from one line to another may remain on such stations until the departure of the next connecting train, provided such train is timed to depart within two hours of the time of arrival of such passengers at the junction station.

Platform tickets shall entitle persons to remain on the railway for thirty minutes only.
