# WESTERN AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS.

W.R. 5075/1904.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-law being added to the By-laws regulating the use of the Government Railways, to operate from the 1st November, 1904:--

# LOITERING ON RAILWAY PREMISES.

34. No person having travelled on the railway shall be entitled to remain on any railway station or premises for more than thirty minutes after the arrival at such station or premises of the train by which he travelled; and no person intending to travel on the railway shall be entitled to remain on any railway station or premises for more than one hour prior to the advertised time of departure of the train next proceeding to the station to which such person has booked to travel.

At junction stations passengers travelling from one line to another may remain on such stations until the departure of the next connecting train, provided such train is timed to depart within two hours of the time of arrival of such passengers at the junction station.

Platform tickets shall entitle persons to remain on the railway for thirty minutes only.

Any person refusing or neglecting to quit the railway premises after the expiration of the time specified in this By-law, when required by any railway officer or servant so to do, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and to be removed from the railway premises.
