PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Admiral Sir FREDERICK GEORGE DENHAM BEDFORD, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

WHEREAS by Section 219 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900" (64 Vict., No. 8), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, or way, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereinafter in force: AND WHEREAS the Fremantle Municipal Council has requested that certain land hereunder named and described, which has been used for a street or way within the Municipality of Fremantle, be declared a public highway: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a Public Highway, and such land shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

By His Excellency Admiral Sir FREDERICK GEORGE DENHAM BEDFORD, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

WHEREAS by "The Fishery Act, 1889" (53rd Vict., No. 4), "The Fisheries Act, 1899" (63rd Vict., No. 47), and "The Fisheries Act Amendment Act, 1902" 2nd Edward VII., No. 43, the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any Western Australian waters to be close waters for all and or kind of fishing, and for any times specified in such Proclamation: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that the Murray and Serpentine Rivers, with their estuaries, tributaries, lakes, and lagoons, the waters of which, at any time of the year, have access, directly or indirectly, to the sea, the entrance to Peel's Inlet, and that portion of the sea more particularly described in the schedule hereto attached, should be declared close waters for fishing by net or fixed engine: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the Murray and Serpentine Rivers, with their estuaries, tributaries, lakes, and lagoons, the waters of which, at any time of the year, have access, directly or indirectly, to the sea, the entrance to Peel's Inlet, and that portion of the sea more particularly described in the schedule hereto attached, to be close waters against fishing by means of any net or fixed engine from and after the 1st day of December, 1904.

The notice published in the *Government Gazette* of the 9th June, 1899, providing for Herring and Salmon Fishing from 1st April to 31st December in each and every year within portions of No. 1 Bank, is hereby repealed.

Every person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and shall forfeit the implements used and all fish taken.

No. 1 BANK

(Portions of the Sea and Entrance to Peel's Inlet).

Bounded by line starting from the most Westerly portion of Hall's Point, and extending North one-quarter of a mile; thence East to the seas here and along it and the entrance to Peel's Inlet Southward and Eastward to a point East of the East end of Creery Island; thence West to the said end and Westward along the South shore of said Creery Island to its Southernmost point; thence Westerly to the South-East corner of Murray Location 5; thence by the Western shore of the entrance to Peel's Inlet and the sea shore East, North, West, and South to the starting point.

WHEREAS by Section 96 of "The Roads Act, 1902," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of "The Permanent Reserves Act, 1899," the Governor may place any Public Reserve under the control and management of a Road Board, and that for the purpose of controlling or managing such Reserve the Board shall have all the power of a Board of Parks and Reserves appointed under "The Parks and Reserves Act, 1895," together with the powers conferred by "The Roads Act, 1902": AND WHEREAS it is expedient that Reserve 1698 (Broome Hill Lot 366), "Recreation," should be placed under the control and management of the Broome Hill Road Board: NOW, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred by the recited section of "The Roads Act, 1902," do hereby place the said Reserve under the control and management of the Broome Hill Road Board.

THE EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1895.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is, by "The Explosives Act, 1895," amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, or repeal by-laws or regulations dealing, amongst other matters, with the carriage of Explosives: AND WHEREAS the Governor in Council, under the powers of the said Act, on the 20th day of July, 1904, made certain regulations dealing with the carriage of Explosives which it is desirable to amend: NOW, THEREFORE, the said Governor in Council does hereby repeal Regulation 12, in Part II. of the said Regulations, and does hereby make the following Regulation in lieu thereof:—

CARRIAGE OF EXPLOSIVES.

12. No explosive shall be conveyed as merchandise unless the same be conveyed in vehicles enclosed on all sides by wood, unless the explosive be surrounded on all sides with tarpaulins so as to effectually protect it against communication of fire, and so as to prevent the explosive, or the cases containing the same, from coming in contact with any exposed iron or steel. Provided that the Inspector of Explosives may, if demanded by the requirements of public safety, require in any given case that vehicles enclosed on all sides with wood shall be exclusively used.

MISDEMEANANTS OF THE FIRST DIVISION.

1. A misdemeanant of the First Division—
 - (a.) May supply his own food, clothing, and other necessary articles, subject in all cases to detention and examination, to prevent the introduction of prohibited articles.
 - (b.) May receive or purchase not more than one pint of liquor in 24 hours.
 - (c.) May wear his own clothing.
 - (d.) Shall be provided with at least one separate cell or room.
 - (e.) Shall be permitted to receive once a fortnight not more than three friends or relatives at one time for not more than half an hour.
 - (f.) May write one letter and receive one letter in each fortnight.
 - (g.) The Comptroller General or a visitor may prolong visits or allow additional visits and letters to such reasonable extent as he may deem advisable.
 - (h.) In all other respects the General Gaol Regulations, and especially those regulations relating to debtors, shall apply, except in so far as they conflict with the foregoing to all misdemeanants of the First Division.

CIRCULAR.

Governor General,
Melbourne, 29th September, 1904.

In connection with the Secretary of State's Despatch, "General," dated 15th June, 1904, on the subject of the mode of nominating candidates to Colonial Naval Cadetships, I have the honour to inform your Excellency that under the instructions which were recently issued to me by the Secretary of State, as a result of the Naval Agreement Act, I find that eight nominations will be open in future to Australian candidates each year for cadetships in His Majesty's Naval Force.

During next year five of the nominations will be available under the old scheme, and three under the new scheme. I have had regulations prepared explaining (and governing) the conditions of each scheme, and 25 copies of each set are forwarded to your Excellency this day under separate cover. I am also forwarding 25 copies of each of the following forms:—

- (a.) The form upon which all applications must be made.
- (b.) Particulars of physical requirements.
- (c.) Form A.

All applications will be required to be supported by certificates of—

- (a.) Health.
- (b.) Birth, and
- (c.) Good conduct.

and must be sent in with applications.

It will be gathered from Section 1 of the Regulations governing both schemes, that applications must be lodged with me before the first day of November of the year preceding that for which nominations are desired.

The old scheme of entry will cease to operate after the examination, which will be held at the close of next year (1905), and thereafter all examinations will be conducted under the new scheme.

I find that in the past that it has not been unusual for candidates to be nominated for some years in advance of the date upon which, by reason of age, they would become eligible. This practice has, doubtless, created the impression that the date of application has an influence upon selection, when there is an excess of applicants over the number of nominations available. I would suggest that steps should be taken, when opportunity offers, to remove this impression. It might perhaps be well when applications are received by Your Excellency for nomination to a cadetship, say more than twelve months ahead, to inform the applicant's parent, guardian, etc., that such application cannot be considered until the month of November of the year preceding that for which the nomination is desired, and that priority of application is not by any means the most important factor in the question of eligibility. Confusion has already arisen through accepting applications

for nominations far ahead, and I am afraid there will be several disappointments in cases of parents, etc., who, under the impression that early applications would more certainly secure a nomination, have arranged an educational course for nominees accordingly, only to find that they will be crowded out, either owing to an excess of applicants over the number of nominations available, or the presence of other and subsequent candidates in the field who may possibly be found to be more eligible when a selection (when one is necessary) is finally under review.

Too much stress cannot be laid upon the fact that, although the number of nominations has been increased, there are but eight for the whole of Australia; and I may inform Your Excellency that I have at the present time in hand no less than six applications for nominations for next year, and have yet, possibly, to receive nominations from Queensland and South Australia.

MALLET STRIPPING REGULATIONS.

1. The Minister or such other person as he appoints may issue a Mallet Bark License, authorising the licensee to strip and remove mallet bark upon and from the Crown lands named in the license.
2. A similar license must be obtained by every person engaged only in removing the bark dealt with under a Mallet Bark License.
3. Each licensee will be available only by the person named therein as licensee, and will not be transferable except by the special permission of the officer authorised for the time being to issue licenses.
4. Every licensee must show his license whenever production thereof is demanded by an Officer of the Woods and Forests Department, or other authorised officer.
5. All trees must be felled before being stripped.
6. No mallet tree of nine (9) inches in diameter or under measured at four (4) feet from the ground, shall be felled.
7. All trees felled shall have the limbs as well as the bole stripped to a diameter of three (3) inches.
8. No mallet tree shall be stripped of bark except during the months from July to December, inclusive, in each year.
9. Bark stripped upon Crown lands and not removed during the currency of the license shall become, should the Minister so decide, the property of the State.
10. The officers of the Woods and Forests Department may seize and dispose of any bark stripped or removed contrary to these Regulations.
11. Any person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £20 for any single offence, nor £2 per day for a continuing offence, and not exceeding £100 in the aggregate.
12. The fee for a Mallet Bark License shall be 5s. per month for each person employed in stripping, and for each person engaged only in carting.

MONGER'S LAKE BOARD.

BY-LAWS.

THE Monger's Lake Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in it by virtue of "The Parks and Reserves Act, 1895," hereby make the following By-laws:—

AS TO BATHING.

1. No person shall bathe in Monger's Lake (hereinafter referred to as "the Lake") except from a bathing-house provided by the Board for that purpose. Any person offending against this By-law shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty shillings.

2. No male shall bathe unless he wears bathing trunks or other suitable bathing costume; and no female shall bathe unless she wears a suitable bathing costume. Any person offending against this By-law shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

3. The bathing-houses provided by the Board shall be available only at the following times, namely:—

On every day except Saturday and Sunday.

For Males: From 6 a.m. to 9 a.m., and from 8 p.m. to 10 p.m.

For Females, and children under 10 years of age accompanied by a guardian: From 10 a.m. to 7 p.m.

On Saturdays.

For Males: From 6 a.m. to 8 a.m., and from 3 p.m. to 10 p.m.

For Females, and Children under 10 years of age accompanied by a guardian: From 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.

On Sundays:

For Males: From 6 a.m. to 12 noon.

Any person who shall bathe in the Lake at any other times than those specified in this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding 20s.

4. Any person who wilfully damages any property of the Board shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

5. Any person who commits any nuisance in or about any bathing-house or other property of the Board shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding 20s.

6. Any person throwing broken bottles or glass or other refuse into the Lake shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding 40s.

7. The bathing of cattle, sheep, and horses in the Lake is strictly forbidden, and any person permitting the same shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding 40s.

AS TO BOATING.

8. No person shall place or use any canoe, skiff, boat, or launch on the Lake without the license in writing from the Board first obtained for that purpose, which license the Board may in its discretion grant on payment of the fee hereinafter prescribed, and subject to such conditions as the Board may think fit.

Any person offending against this By-law shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

9. Every license shall be granted for the year ending the 31st day of December next following the granting thereof.

10. License fees shall be paid as under:—

For canoes or skiffs, to hold one person, 2s. 6d. per annum.

For private rowing boats, of any capacity, 5s. per annum.

For boats plying for hire, to carry not more than four persons, 5s. per annum.

For sailing boats, plying for hire, up to 16ft. in length, 5s. per annum.

For sailing boats, plying for hire, over 16ft. in length, 7s. 6d. per annum.

For launches, propelled by steam, oil, or electric power, 10s. per annum.

11. No canoe, skiff, boat, or launch shall be placed or used on the lake until the Board shall have certified that the same is suitable and safe for the purpose intended.

Any person offending against this By-law shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £3.

12. Every boat or launch plying for hire shall have painted upon it in legible letters, to the satisfaction of the Board, the number of its license and the number of passengers it is licensed to carry. Any person keeping a boat for hire contrary to this By-law, or carrying in such boat or launch a greater number of persons than the same is licensed to carry, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and on the second or subsequent offence, in addition to the fine, to the cancellation of the license.

13. The Board may at any time cancel a license if in the interests of the public it shall deem it desirable so to do.

AS TO FISHING.

14. Fishing in the Lake by net or any instrument other than a line or rod and line is absolutely forbidden.

Any person offending against this By-law shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

15. The license fee for angling shall be as under:—

1s. per day per rod or line.

2s. 6d. per week per rod or line.

5s. per month " " "

10s. per quarter " " "

£1 " season " " "

16. No person shall use, in fishing, a line having more than 3 hooks attached.

Any person offending against this By-law shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding 40s.

17. The Board reserves the right to refuse to grant a license for fishing, and to cancel any license already granted at any time by giving the person licensed notice to that effect.

Any person found fishing without a license shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding 40s.

18. Shooting on the Lake is strictly forbidden.

Any person offending against this By-law shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

19. No person shall erect a boat-shed or slip on the shores of the Lake or fix any mooring buoy in the Lake without the approval of the Board, in writing, first obtained.

Any person offending against this By-law shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
