CLOSING OF MURRAY AND SERPENTINE RIVERS, ETC., THE ENTRANCE TO PEEL'S INLET, AND PORTION OF THE SEA AGAINST FISHING BY MEANS OF ANY NET OR FIXED ENGINE.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } FRED. G. D. BEDFORD, Governor. [r.s.]

By His Excellency Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

W HEREAS by "The Fishery Act, 1889" (53rd Vict., No. 4), "The Fisheries Act, 1899" (63rd Vict., No. 47), and "The Fisheries Act Amendment Act, 1902" 2nd Edward VII., No. 43, the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to declare any Western Australian waters to be close waters for all and or kind of fishing, and for any times specified in such Proclamation: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the Murray and Serpentine Rivers, with their estuaries, tributaries, lakes, and lagoons, the waters of which, at any time of the year, have access, directly or indirectly, to the sea, the entrance to Peel's Inlet, and that portion of the sea more particularly described in the schedule hereto attached, should be declared close waters for fishing by net or fixed engine: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor,

with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the Murray and Serpentine Rivers, with their estuaries, tributaries, lakes, and lagoons, the waters of which, at any time of the year, have access, directly or indirectly, to the sea, the entrance to Peel's Inlet, and that portion of the sea more particularly described in the schedule hereto attached, to be close waters against fishing by means of any net or fixed engine from and after the 1st day of December, 1904.

The notice published in the Government Gazette of the 9th June, 1899, providing for Herring and Salmon Fishing from 1st April to 31st December in each and every year within portions of No. 1 Bank, is hereby repealed.

Every person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and shall forfeit the implements used and all fish taken.

No. 1 BANK

(Portions of the Sea and Entrance to Peel's Inlet).

Bounded by line starting from the most Westerly portion of Hall's Point, and extending North one-quarter of a mile; thence East to the seas here and along it and the entrance to Peel's Inlet Southward and Eastward to a point East of the East end of Creery Island; thence West to the said end and Westward along the South shore of said Creery Island to its Southernmost point; thence Westerly to the South-East corner of Murray Location 5; thence by the Western shore of the entrance to Peel's Inlet and the sea shore East, North, West, and South to the starting point.

No. 2 BANK

(Including the whole of the Murray and Serpentine Rivers, with their Estuaries).

Bounded by a line starting from a point on the Eastern shore of Peel's Inlet situate East of the Southernmost point of Goongoolup Island, and extending West through said point for half-a-mile; thence North to the said shore of Peel's Inlet and along it Southerly to the starting point. To include also the Murray River and Serpentine River, with their estuaries, tributaries, lakes, and lagoons, the waters of which, at any time of the year, have access, directly or indirectly to the sea. directly or indirectly, to the sea.

WHEREAS it is, by "The Explosives Act, 1895," amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, or repeal by-laws or regulations dealing, amongst other matters, with the carriage of Explosives: AND WHEREAS the Governor in Council, under the powers of the said Act, on the 20th day of July, 1904, made certain regulations dealing with the carriage of Explosives which it is desirable to amend: Now, THEREFORE, the said Governor in Council does hereby repeal Regulation 12, in Part II. of the said Regulations, and does hereby make the following Regulation in lieu thereof:-

CARRIAGE OF EXPLOSIVES.

12. No explosive shall be conveyed as merchandise unless the same be conveyed in vehicles enclosed on all sides by wood, unless the explosive be surrounded on all sides with tarpaulins so as to effectually protect it against

communication of fire, and so as to prevent the explosive, or the cases containing the same, from coming in contact with any exposed iron or steel. Provided that the Inspector of Explosives may, if demanded by the requirements of public safety, require in any given case that vehicles enclosed on all sides with wood shall be exclusively used.

BY-LAWS FOR THE PEPPERMINT GROVE LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

WHEREAS by Section 38 of "The Health Act, 1898," any Local Board of Health may from time to time make, repeal, alter, or amend any By-law: Now, THEREFORE, in pursuance thereof, the Local Board of Health for the District of Peppermint Grove hereby makes By-laws as follows: follows:

- The ordinary system of pans for nightsoil shall be and is hereby abolished.
- 2. In place thereof every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service.
- 3. At least once a week, or so much more frequently as the Board may from time to time decide, the pan in use shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid and removed in a suitable cart by the Board's contractor.
- 4. Every occupier shall pay to the Board the sum of 4s. for every receptacle supplied to him for the double-pan service.
- 5. The Board reserves to itself the exclusive right to sell such receptacles and bins.
- 6. A pan cleansed by superheated steam, or some other equally efficient means approved by the Board, shall be put in place of the pan removed under By-law No. 3.

- 7. Every occupier shall keep and use, in all closets on the premises occupied by him, a suitable deodorant or disinfectant to the satisfaction of the Local Board.
- 8. All nightsoil removed shall be trenched or ploughed into the land on the sanitary site for the time being in use by the Board.
- 9. The following By-laws published in the Government Gazette of the 14th August, 1903, are hereby repealed:—By-law No. 1, By-law No. 3, By-law No. 7, Schedule A Sub-section (m) of By-law No. 9.
- 10. Section 4 of By-law No. 23 shall be and is hereby amended by the insertion of the words "by the Board's contractor" between the words "week' and "or."
