MUNICIPALITY OF MENZIES.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Menzies, made under Section 167 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and numbered 62, for regulating the keeping of cows and goats, and the selling of the milk therefrom.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Menzies order as follows —

- (a.) On and after 1st January, 1905, any person keeping one or more cows, or one or more goats, on any premises within the Municipality, and sell-ing the milk therefrom, will be classed as a dairy-keeper, and such premises will be classed as a dairy, and be liable to inspection.
- (b.) On and after 1st January, 1905, any person keeping a goat or goats within the Municipality will be charged an annual license fee of Two shillings and sixpence per head per goat.



COLLIE DISTRICT ROAD BOARD LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

Amendment of By-laws.

WHEREAS by Section 34 of "The Health Act, 1898," any Local Board of Health may from time to time make By-laws, and may from time to time repeal, alter, and amend any By-law so made: Now, therefore, the Local Board of Health for the District of the Collie Road Board hereby makes the following amendments :-

By-law No. 9: Schedule "A" is amended to read as follows :-

- (1.) For the removal, cleansing, carting, and replacing each pan within the district of the Local Board of Health, at per pan, one shilling
- (2.) For the removal and disposing of slops, at per 100 gallons, eight shillings.
- (3.) For the removal and disposal of trade refuse, i.e., refuse which may have accumulated on any premises from or through any business, manufacture, or trade carried on, on such premises, at per load, 7s. 6d.
- (4.) For the removal and disposal of household refuse, at per calendar month, 6d.

By-law No. 2 is amended by inserting after paragraph two thereof the following :

- 2A. (a.) Seats to be hinged so as to lift up for inspection and cleansing.
 - (b.) Risers not to come within two or three inches of the floor.
 - (c.) The top of pan or receptacle not to be, under any circumstances, more than one inch from the under surface of the seat.
 - (d.) Guide bars to be inserted so as to ensure pan being placed in exact position by the nightman.
 - (e.) All floors under pans to be made impervious. 24-gauge galvanised iron tray would be sufficient in most cases.
 - (f.) Arrangements to be made so that all pans and receptacles may be removed from the outside.
 - (g.) When the privy walls are constructed of stone or brick the whole of the internal wall surfaces to be properly plastered or smoothly rendered in cement mortar.
 - (h.) Ventilating outlets to be constructed in each wall as near the ceiling as practicable, each such outlet to be not less than 50 square inches in area, and the door of the privy to be hung so that its bottom edge is at least three inches above the privy floor.

JANUARY, 1905.

This month was exceptionally cool in South-West districts, the mean maximum for Perth being one of the lowest on record. This summer will probably be gratefully remembered here on account of the remarkably long period of uninterrupted cool weather, usting from December 21st to January 16th, during the whole of which time the thermometer at the Observatory only once reached 0° (82.6 on December 26th). This is the longest cool spell that has ever been recorded here. The present summer will probably be membered in the Eastern States on account of the excessive heat waves, and it is probable that the same cause produced both our cool and heir hot weather, for a succession of moderate "lows" travelled through Australia from our North-West coast in a more or less South-lasterly direction, and these brought severe heat throughout our inland and especially North-West districts, and later in Eastern tates, whilst the South-West corner of Australia was enjoying the cool breezes blowing from the higher pressure off the South-West past towards the "lows" inland.

The effect of the sea breezes in modifying the temperature is again well shown in the mean daily maximum along an approximately East and West line. Thus, between Rottnest and Southern Cross we find—

The value of Rottnest as a summer holiday resort is strikingly shown by the fact that the maximum temperature for the month was 83.2, whilst at the Observatory it was 97.1 and Guildford 102.1. On the other hand it was even lower on the South coast. The mean maximum for the mouth at Cape Leeuwin was 73.1 and at Breaksea 68.6, and the absolute maximum at those places 79.5 and 75.0 respectively. The hottest place in the State from which records were sent is Marble Bar, in the North-West interior, where the mean maximum was 108 9 and the absolute maximum 120 5. The coolest nights were, as usual, experienced at Bridgetown, where the mean minimum was 49 8 and the absolute lowest 35 2. Rainfall was considerably below the average in the tropics, whilst elsewhere it was very light. In fact, with the exception of a few coastal showers and scattered thunderstorms, no rain has fallen since the break-up of the heat inland at the end of December.
