WHEREAS by "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1902" (1 and 2 Edward VII, No. 2^o), the Governor may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, after the opinion of the Road Board of the District has been requested, close any road or reservation for a road which may have been surveyed or shown as a road on any plan published by the Department of Lands and Surveys: Provided such road is not within the limit of a Municipality or Townsite, and has not been declared a Government road or a road under "The Roads Act," or any Act amending the same: AND WHEREAS the road hereinafter described has been surveyed and shown as a road on the plan of the survey of Dalaroo Agricultural Area as published by the Department of Lands and Surveys: AND it is desirable to close such road:

AND WHEREAS the opinion of the Victoria Plains Road Board has been requested: NOW THEREFORE I, Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, G.C.B., Governor as aforesaid, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the said surveyed road to be closed.

DESCRIPTION ABOVE REFERRED TO:

The surveyed road extending South-South-Westward, passing along the Western boundaries of Dalaroo A.A. Lots 1, 2, 3, 6, 7, 10, 11, and 14 to the latter's South-West corner.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 3rd day of February, 1905.

Present:

The Honourables—
The Minister for Works (Senior Member),
The Minister for Lands,

The Minister for Labour.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that Reserve 9599, for Temporary Camping at Broome (Lot 370), should be placed

under the control of the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Broome as a Board of Management: NOW, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Broome as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said reserve, for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon, for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.
