WHEREAS by Section 11, Sub-section 2 (d), of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to annex any land forming with the municipal district of some municipality one continuous area to such municipality: AND WHEREAS a petition has been presented to His Excellency the Governor praying that an outlying district to the Municipality of Menzies be annexed to the said Municipality, signed by not less than 20 resident householders or owners of rateable land within the area proposed to be annexed: And whereas the said petition was publicly advertised in the Government the said petition was publicly advertised in the Government Gazette on the 6th day of January, 1905: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers so vested in me by the said Act, do hereby annex to the Municipality of Menzies the area contained within the following boundaries:

Bounded on the North-Westward by part of the South-Eastern boundary of G.M. Lease 4966z, and the whole of those of 4976z and 4930z, and the North-Western boundary of 3053z:

On the North-Eas'ward by parts of the South-Western boundaries of G.M. Leases 5017z and 5018z;
On the South-Eastward by the North-Western and part of the South-Western boundaries of G.M. Lease 3151z, and part of the North-West boundary of G.M. Lease 5097z, and

On the South-Westward by the South-Western boundaries of late G.M. Leases 3053z and 3052z.

The entire boundaries of the Menzies Municipality being as follow:

MUNICIPALITY OF VICTORIA PARK.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By HIS Excellency Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

WHEREAS by Section 11 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," the Governor may by Proclamation divide any Municipality into wards and define the boundaries thereof: And whereas a Petition has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, praying that the Municipality of Victoria Park be divided into three wards, signed by not fewer than one third of the persons on the Municipal by not fewer than one third of the persons on the Municipal by not fewer than one third of the persons on the Municipal Roll of the said Municipality: And whereas the said Petition was publicly advertised in the Government Gazette on the 21st day of October, 1904: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and by virtue of the powers so vested in me by the said Act, hereby divide the said Municipality into three wards, to be known as the East Ward, the Central Ward, and the West Ward, respectively, and declare the boundaries of the said Wards to be as follow:—

EAST WARD. Bounded by lines starting from the left bank of the Swan River, at the North-West corner of Swan Location 34, and extending in a South-Easterly direction, passing along the North-East boundary of Swan Location 35 to the North-North-East boundary of Swan Location 35 to the North-West side of Brookman Road, Canning Location 2; thence South-Westerly along the said North-West side to the centre of the Perth-Bunbury Railway; thence North-Westerly along the centre of the said Railway to its intersection with the centre of the Guildford Road; thence along the centre of the said Road to its intersection with the centre of the Swan Road, thence along the centre of the said Road to the left hank of the Swan river: thence of the said Road to the left bank of the Swan river; thence North-Easterly along the said left bank to the commencing point, to include also the Perth Causeway.

CENTRAL WARD.

Bounded by lines commencing at the centre of the Perth-Albany Road at its intersection with the centre of the Guildford Road; thence along the centre of the said Guildfundrord Road; thence along the centre of the said Guildford Road to its intersection with the centre of the Perth-Bunbury Railway; thence South-Easterly along the centre of the said Railway to its intersection with the North-West side of Brookman Road, and along it South-Westward to the North side of Welshpool Road; thence Westerly along the said North side and in a line with it to the centre of the Perth-Albany Road; thence North-Westerly along the centre of the said road to the commencing point,

WEST WARD.

Bounded by lines commencing at the left bank of the Swan River at its intersection with the centre of the Perth-Albany Road; thence South-Easterly along the centre of the line of North side of said road to its intersection with the line of North side of Welshpool Road; thence Westerly to the West side of the Welshpool Road; thence Westerly to the West side of the said Perth-Albany Road, and along it South-South-Easterly to the North-West boundary of Subdivision E of Canning Location 2, and along it and that of Subdivision L South-Westerly to the North corner of Canning Location 328; thence South-Westerly along its North-West boundary and that of Location 65 to the lower Canning Bridge Road, and Westerly along its North side to the East boundary of Canning Location 37; thence North to the South-West boundary of Reserve 3694, and along it North-Westerly to the South-East boundary of Swan Location 39; thence North-East, passing along the South-East boundaries of Swan Locations 39, 38A, and 38B, to the South-East boundary of Swan Location 37; thence South-Eastward boundary of Swan Location 37; thence South-Eastward boundary of Swan Location 37; thence South-Eastward and North-Eastward, passing along part of the South-West and South-East boundaries of said Location 37, to the South-West boundary of Swan Location 36; thence North-Westward along said boundary to high water mark of Perth Water, and along it and the said left bank of the Swan River upwards to the commencing point.

PORT REGULATIONS.

By His Excellency Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

Y virtue of the Ordinance 18 Victoria, No. 15, and of the Act 37 Victoria, No. 14, I do hereby, with the advice of the Executive Council, repeal Port Regulations Nos. 44, 54, 55, and 57, proclaimed the 2nd day of November, 1904, and proclaim the regulations set forth in the schedule in lieu thereof respectively, and the additional Regulation numbered 55A, to be observed in all ports and harbours of the State, except the harbour of Fremantle so far as the same is under the control of the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners, and to come into force on the 1st day of March, 1905.

THE SCHEDULE.

The Port Regulations for the State of Western Australia, as proclaimed on 2nd November, 1904, are amended as follow, viz. :-

1st. By repealing Regulation No. 44.

By repealing Regulation No. 54, and adding the following new Regulation in lieu thereof:-

VESSELS CALLING FOR COAL OR SUPPLIES.

54. All vessels calling at any port in this State, other than Fremantle, for coal or supplies (but not broaching or shipping cargo, or landing or embarking any passengers), shall pay a fixed sum of Five pounds (£5) to cover all port charges, including light dues, and at Fremantle the same sum for light dues only. and at Fremantle the same sum for light dues only. Such vessels at any port of the State, other than the Port of Fremantle, being desirous of landing or embarking passengers, may land or embark same, not exceeding ten in number, by paying a sum of Ten pounds (£10) to cover all pilotage charge, tonnage dues, or port charges of any sort whatsoever, except light dues.

3rd. By repealing Regulation No. 55, and adding the following new Regulation in lieu thereof:-

Vessels in Distress.

55. All vessels calling at any port in the State in distress, and not broaching or shipping cargo, or landing or embarking passengers, shall be exempt from the payment of light dues.

4th. By the addition of the following new Regulation:-VESSELS WORKING CARGO LESS THAN ONE-FOURTH OF
THEIR NET REGISTERED TONNAGE.

55. (a.) All vessels, except where otherwise specially
provided in these Regulations, arriving from beyond seas

at any port in the State, and landing or shipping cargo less in extent than one-fourth of their net registered tonnage, or landing or embarking passengers not exceeding ten in number, shall pay light dues at the rate of one penny per ton on their net registered tonnage; such payment to cover both inwards and outwards working.

5th. By repealing Regulation No. 57, and adding the following new Regulation in lieu thereof:—

LIGHT DUES TO BE PAID ONCE.

57. The master of any vessel who has paid full light dues at any port in Western Australia, and who may desire to visit other ports in the State for purpose of loading or unloading thereat, may obtain from the Chief Harbour Master at the port where he shall have so paid such light dues as aforesaid a certificate to that effect, and such certificate shall free him from payment of light dues at any other port in Western Australia for a period of three months from the date thereof; and in the event of such vessel leaving the State, and returning within the period of two months, and loading not more than one quarter her net registered tonnage, such certificate shall also free the said vessel from payment of light dues as above.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such researches and preserving fees for depositions thereon and for reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette: whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve $\frac{\Lambda}{9593}$, for Common at Pingelly (Lot 401), should be placed under the control of the Moorumbine Road Board as a Board of Management: Now, THEREFORE. His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of the Moorumbine Road Board as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said reserve, for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon, for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

THE STOCK DISEASES ACT, 1895. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

W HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council, to be published in the Government Gazette, from time to time to make, vary, alter, or revoke such Regulations under this Act as may be deemed expedient for all or any of the following purposes:-For the purpose of subjecting any stock to such restrictions or remedial measures as may be deemed necessary to prevent the introduction or spread of disease; for providing for the steps to be taken in case of any disease breaking out among any stock in the State, and for preventing the spreading of such disease; for prescribing preventing the spreading of such disease; for prescribing the manner in which persons coming into contact with infected stock, and land, premises, or conveyances travelled over or used by infected stock, shall be cleaned and disinfected; for the regulation, management, and control of quarantine grounds, and for prescribing the treatment and disposal of stock whilst in quarantine, or in transit thereto or therefrom; for prescribing the term during which stock shall be quarantined, and generally for all or any such purposes as he may deem necessary for preventing the introduction or spread of disease: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby make the following Regulations under the said Act.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. It is the duty of the owner of poultry infected with tick, within twenty-four hours of the time when he shall have discovered or suspected such poultry to be infected, to give written notice thereof to the nearest Inspector, and thenceforth to keep such poultry from coming into contact with other poultry until otherwise ordered by the Inspector (see 59 Vict., No. 34, Section 11).
- 2. If an Inspector shall discover on any premises poultry infected, or suspected of being infected with tick, he may serve upon the owner of such poultry a notice in the form or to the effect of the schedule hereto.

3. It shall be a sufficient ground to suspect that poultry are infected with tick if tick is found in or about the fowlhouses used by such poultry, or the appurtenances used in connection with such fowl-houses.

4. During the fourteen days next following the service of such notice it shall be unlawful for any person to remove

any poultry from the premises referred to in such notice.

5. Within the fourteen days next following the service of such notice the following steps shall be taken by the owner of such poultry for cleansing and disinfecting the premises and preventing the spreading of such disease, that is to say ;-

(a.) All fowl-houses and the appurtenances used in connection therewith shall be dismantled or treated in such manner as directed by the Inspector, and all visible ticks destroyed.

(b.) All material with which such fowl-houses and appurtenances were constructed shall then (if not destroyed by fire) be saturated with boiling water, and in order that all ticks and their germs hidden in crevices may be destroyed, thoroughly saturated with a three per cent. solution of carbolic acid and water, tar, or other effective destroyer.

(c.) Should the fowl-houses be in close proximity to or attached to fencing, such fencing must be treated in a similar manner.

(d.) The whole of the ground area of infected houses, etc., must be strewn to a thickness of half-inch with fresh quick-lime, and then slacked with water, also the ground within three feet of each side of infected fencing must be treated in a similar manner.

6. If the owner of any poultry shall make default in taking such steps as aforesaid, pursuant to such notice, all work that the Inspector shall deem necessary to be done to comply therewith may be undertaken by or under the direction of the Inspector, and the expenses incurred shall be recoverable in a summary way at the suit of such Inspector before any Justice of the Peace.

7. All four houses and the appropriate approach in approach.

7. All fowl-houses and the appurtenances in connection therewith which shall be dismantled in accordance with Clause $(\alpha.)$ hereof shall not be re-erected unless the same shall be constructed in such manner as to prevent the harbouring of tick, and shall be provided with tick-proof perches to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

The Regulations made by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners, and dated the 24th day of July, 1903, and amendments thereof, are hereby further amended as follows; such amendments to come into force on the 27th day of February, 1905, viz.:-

1st.—By adding the following new Regulation:

No. 63 (a).
Special Pilotage Rates.—All steamers arriving in the port, and landing or shipping cargo less in extent than one fourth of their net registered tonnage, or landing or embarking passengers exceeding ten in number, or both, shall, except where otherwise specially provided, pay the usual pilotage charges, including removals into and out of Inner Harbour, up to a maximum of £20, but shall pay the usual charges for all other pilotage removals incurred, as well as all other port charges provided for in these Regulations.

2nd.—By repealing Regulation No. 97 (as amended by proclamation dated 26th January, 1905), and adding the following new Regulation in lieu thereof:—

No. 97 (Amended).

Vessels Calling in Distress, for Orders, Supplies, etc.—No harbor dues payable to the Trust under these Regulations, with the exception of a special payment of half the ruling pilotage rates, up to a maximum of £10 per entry into the port, shall be paid by vessels arriving—

(a.) In distress, for the purpose of being docked or refitted or repaired, or filling up coal bunkers only; or

(b.) For orders or provisions, or landing or embarking passengers not exceeding ten in number without discharging or taking on board any cargo; or

(c.) Employed solely in mission work in connection

with some religious body; or
(d.) Employed solely as a pleasure yacht, and not engaged in trading or plying for hire.

The above special payment shall also apply to vessels calling at the Port in the course of following their usual trade vertes but not landing or shipping cargo. Where, trade routes, but not landing or shipping cargo. Where, however, a wharf berth is occupied the minimum berthing dues, provided for in Regulation No. 98, shall be paid as though the vessel had worked cargo.

In order to take advantage of this special payment, the masters or agents of vessels so landing or embarking passengers as herein mentioned shall declare to the Trust on the manifest of the ship the number of passengers so landed or embarked.
