REGULATIONS AMENDING FORM OF RATE BOOK.

W HEREAS by Section 217 of the Roads Act, the Governor is empowered to make regulations to alter or vary any of the Schedules of the said Act, or make additional forms: His Excellency the Governor, in pur-suance of the powers so vested in him, under and by virtue of the said Act, doth hereby make and publish the following Regulations:

- (1.) That the form of Rate Book as specified in Schedule 8 is hereby amended, and shall be in the form of specimen attached hereto.
- (2.) That the form of Rate Book as now prescribed, together with the directions contained therein, shall be read as the Eighth Schedule, with the exceptions mentioned in Regulation 3.
- (3.) That where the Road Board are adopting the Rate Book of the previous year, under the provisions of Section 134 of the Roads Act, so far as it applies to these Regulations, shall still continue to be recognised as being in the form of the Eighth Schedule.

DIRECTIONS FOR GUIDANCE OF SECRETARY.

(1.) The Rate Book is compiled to meet the requirements of Section 125 and Schedule Eight of "The Roads Act, 1902," amplified to meet the necessities of all Boards, and is issued under the provisions of Section 171.

(2.) VALUATIONS.—(a.) Great care should be exercised in transferring these amounts from the Valuation Book to the proper column (13 or 14) in Rate Book so soon as basis of valuation, either by "Annual" of "Unimproved Capital" Value, has been adopted, in order that the result, both in details and total, may be absolutely correct, and transfer.

(b.) When Unimproved Value is adopted, the Annual Value should, if available, also be filled in for electoral purposes.

Directly the rate has been struck, the necessary information should be filled in as per specimen on opposite page, in accordance with Section 144 of the Roads Act. The necessary notices should also be copied in the Minute Book.

(3.) ARREARS OF RATES BROUGHT FORWARD .- Similar care is to be exercised in bringing these forward to each particular property, and in making the totals agree. Should any alteration have occurred in the working out of the previous "Arrears forward," the same shall be initialled by the Auditor for that year, as no discrepancies in the trans-fers can be passed by the succeeding Auditor.

(4.) Column 21 is provided to show any costs incurred in recovering rates when taken to Court, so that both rate and costs is shown separate.

(5.) RATES ABANDONED.—When through poverty, errors in assessment, reversions of properties to the Crown, or other lawful causes, rates have to be abandoned, the par-ticulars thereof and reasons should from time to time be constituted by the Board at an ordinary meeting, and if clause 159 of the Act (Clause 21 of amendment), duly re-corded in the Minute Book, and the amounts posted into column No. 22, provided in the Rate Book for that purpose.

(6.) At the end of the Board's financial year the columns should be totalled, and any amounts owing should be shown in "Arrears carried forward," column No. 23. The total of columns Nos. 19, 20, 22, and 23 should agree

with the totals of Nos. 16 and 17.

(7.) SUBDIVISIONS.—Let the Assessment Nos. be continuous for the rate as a whole.

(8.) Care should be exercised in entering the reference assessment numbers against the "Arrears brought forward," in column No. 18; also against "Arrears carried forward," in column No. 23.

(9.) After the 30th June in each financial year the Rate Book should be balanced up and arrears carried forward in readiness for the Annual Audit.

(10.) No erasures whatever shall be made in this Book. When alteration is necessary, it must be done by neatly scoring through and initialling entries desired to be amended.

This Book being the property of the Government, must be given up on demand to the current Members of the Board or Minister for Works of the State.



Every person in charge of sheep or eattle requiring water on any fenced reserve in the Minilya Road Board District, shall after entering the gate of the reserves take the stock to water and thence to yard without allowing them to depasture on the Reserve.
