W HEREAS by "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit, either absolutely or except in accordance with regulations under the said Act, the introduction into Western Australia, either generally or from auction into Western Australia, either generally or from any specified colony, country, port, or place, or, *inter alia*, any vegetable or other thing which, in his opinion, is likely to introduce any disease into Western Australia: AND WHEREAS a fungus disease of the potato is prevalent in the Colony of New Zealand, and in the opinion of the Governor the importation of potatoes from New Zealand is likely to introduce the disease into this State: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, do hereby prohibit absolutely the introduction into Western Australia of potatoes, directly or indirectly, from the Colony of New Zealand, until this Proclamation shall be revoked.

VII., No. 28, has approved of the subjoined Regulations relating to the Examination of Inspectors, as provided in Section 6 of the said Act.

# Regulations for conducting Examination of CANDIDATES FOR THE POSITION OF INSPECTOR OF MACHINERY.

The examination of candidates for the position of 1. The examination of candidates for the position of Inspector under "The Inspection of Machinery Act, 1904," will be held at Perth on a date which the Minister shall from time to time determine, and such examination shall be conducted by a Board of Examiners consisting of the Chief Inspector of Machinery who shall be Chairman, and two qualified persons appointed by the Minister. Any two members of the Board shall be a quorum.

The Official Application Form must be used by each Candidate. These can be obtained from the Chief Inspector Candidate. These can be obtained from the Chief Inspector of Machinery, Perth, from whom any further reasonable particulars can be obtained. No application will be enter-tained unless sent in on the official form, to which copies of all original references relating to practical Engineering experience dealing with construction, design, and main-tenance of Engines and Boilers, also character and educa-tional draining to prove the attrached for mean drained tional attainments, must be attached for record purposes.

3. Each candidate, before he can be considered eligible for examination, must furnish satisfactory evidence :---

- (a.) That neither his hearing nor his eyesight is defective.
- (b.) That his health is good—affections of the heart or chest will disqualify.
- (c). That he is not under the age of 30 years, and is of average build.
- (d.) That he has been at least five years actually em-ployed in a workshop or workshops as a mechanic in the manufacture and repair of engines and machinery, or where work of a similar character is performed.

4. The Minister, on the recommendation of the Board, reserves the right to reject any candidate who, in the opinion of the Board, has not had sufficient practical ex-perience, or if not satisfied as to character, or for any reason, and any such candidate or candidates rejected as aforesaid shall be debarred from sitting for examination.

Each candidate shall receive at least seven days notice of the date arranged for the examination ; such date shall be also duly advertised in the Government Gazette.

6. The examinations will commence at 10 a.m. on the date appointed, and all candidates are required to appear at the examination room punctually five minutes before the appointed time. Each candidate is requested to have with him his original references for the Board's perusal.

7. Before the examination each candidate will be supplied with the necessary writing and blotting paper, pens, ink, paper fasteners, and other necessary materials as may be determined by the Board. Each candidate must bring with him any drawing instruments required.

8. Candidates' attention is particularly called to the following:

- (a.) The number given to each answer must correspond with that given on the question paper.
- (b.) Candidates' replies are to be legibly written in ink, and all workings are to be shown, otherwise no marks will be allowed; a margin of one and a-half inches  $(1\frac{1}{2}in.)$  shall be left on the left hand side of the paper.
- (c.) One side of the paper only to be written on.
- (d.) The candidate must affix his signature on the top of each sheet of paper containing his answers.

9. No candidate will be allowed to bring into the examination room any book or paper.

No person will be allowed into the room during the 10. examination other than those whose duties require them to be present.

11. Perfect silence is to be observed during the examination, and any candidate found copying or communicating in any way with another, or who behaves in a disorderly or improper manner in or about the room, will be requested to immediately leave the building, and will be debarred from again appearing at the same examination.

12. Opposite each question appearing on the set paper the full number of marks allowed will appear.

13. No candidate shall, during the examination, leave the room without permission, and without first giving up the papers on which he is engaged. Under no circum-stances will the same paper be returned to him, but the examiners may substitute other data or another question.

14. The syllabus of examination shall be as follows:

- (a.) Mechanical drawing to scale, also freehand working sketches of one or more of the principal parts of any piece of machinery or boiler.
- (b.) Construction and working of different kinds of steam engines used for railway, marine, mining, or factory purposes, including different fittings and valve gears, and the relative merits of each.
- (c.) The indicator, its purpose and parts, and how to arrive at the deduction to be drawn from the Indicator Diagrams. The setting and adjustment of admission and exhaust valves.
- (d.) The direct, torsional, and bending stresses of round and rectangular sections. The breaking or working loads of chains and ropes, and the application of the necessary formulæ.
- (e.) Surface condensation, superheating, and working of steam expansively.
- (f.) The extraction of square and cube roots, decimals and fractions, areas and volumes, simple equations, and the application of formulæ relating to the estimate of power duty and economy of engines, boilers, and pumps.
- (g.) The various standard designs of boilers now in general use. Methods of modern setting, and the disadvantages of inferior setting.
- (h.) The formulæ relating to the design of boilers for giving maximum working pressures, the construction of rivetted seams, the stresses of stays, the resistance of flat and circular surfaces. The construction and object of the various fittings, used, including spring-loaded and dead-weighted safety valves, and the principles involved in determining the sizes of safety valves in any particular case.
- (i.) The causes of corrosion, pitting and grooving as found in the various types of boilers, how these might be prevented, also the effecting of repairs. The usual modern methods adopted for the purification of feed water for boilers.
- (j.) The causes leading to formation of scale, the precipitation of salt and other foreign matter; the effect of scale, oil, or other fatty substances on the heating surfaces, and the precautionary measures usually adopted in respect thereto.
- (k.) The principles and main features of internal combustion engines.
- (l.) A general knowledge of the construction and management of electric motors and dynamos.

15. The Board may, in addition to the foregoing syllabus, require any candidate to submit to a viva voce examination, and to write a complete report on the condition, repairs and alterations necessary to any machinery or boiler erected, to which the provisions of "The Inspection of Machinery Act, 1904," apply.

# BY-LAWS OF THE BOULDER RACING CLUB. PART I.

**By-LAWS** providing for the constitution of, the entrance fees and subscription to the Club, the election and admission of members into the Club, the expulsion of members therefrom, and providing for the management of the affairs of the Club, and for the appointment of the Committee and Officers, and the expenditure of the funds of the Club.

# CONSTITUTION OF THE CLUB.

# Title.

1. The club shall be called "The Boulder Racing Club." How constituted.

2. The club consists of all persons who have been duly elected or who shall hereafter be duly elected member-, and who continue to be members pursuant to these by-laws.

MEMBERS AND ADMISSION OF MEMBERS.

# Candidates.

3. Candidates for admission as members of the club shall be proposed by one member and seconded by another in writing, and shall be elected by the committee by ballot. Three black balls shall exclude.

# Notice of ballot.

4. No ballot shall be held unless at least two days' written notice thereof shall have been previously sent to each member or the committee, containing the names and occupations of the candidates, and the names of their respective proposers and seconders. No election of members shall take place between the 30th day of April and the day of holding the annual meeting in any year.

#### Candidate when a member.

5. A candidate shall become a member as soon as he has been elected and paid his entrance fee and subscription for the current year.

#### Life members.

6. Any person who has rendered valuable services to the club, or who shall give a plate, purse, or trophy of the

value of £50 to be run for at the races under the management of the club, may be admitted a life member of the club by the committee. Any such admission shall be binding on the club. A life member shall have all the rights and privileges of a member, but shall not be required to pay any subscriptions.

#### Honorary members.

7. The Governor of Western Australia and his staff for the time being shall be honorary members of the club, where

8. Visitors to the State and members of the Federal and State Parliaments may be admitted by the committee as honorary members at any race meeting without payment of any subscription.

9. Honorary members shall be entitled to all the privileges of members, but shall not be entitled to vote nor take part in the conduct of the affairs of the club.

Members cannot vote unless subscription paid. 10. No member, with the exception of a life member, shall be competent to vote on any occusion whatever or enjoy any of the privileges of a member unless he has paid his subscription for the current year.

# Addresses of members.

11. All members shall communicate their addresses from time to time to the secretary of the club, who shall register the same, and all letters delivered at or sent by post to such addresses shall be considered to have been delivered to the respective members personally. If no address be given, all letters and notices posted and addressed to the last known place of abode of the members shall be considered to have been delivered to the respective members personally.

# Persons ceasing to be members.

12. All persons ceasing to be members of the club, whether by retirement, expulsion, death, neglecting to pay the annual subscription, or otherwise, shall forfeit *ipso facto* all right to or claim upon the club or its property.

# FNTRANCE FEE AND SUBSCRIPTION.

# Entrance fee and subscription.

13. The entrance fee shall be  $\pounds 5$  5s. The annual subscription shall be  $\pounds 2$  2s. Each member, in addition to his own ticket, shall be entitled to two ladies' tickets for each meeting held by the club, and no more. Provided that members elected to the club between the first day of January and the first day of May in any year shall be required to pay only  $\pounds 1$  1s. subscription for the current year.

#### Entrance fee, when payable.

14. Every candidate shall, within one month after his election, pay his entrance fee of  $\pounds 5$  5s. and subscription for the current year, otherwise his election shall be void, unless he shall justify the delay to the satisfaction of the committee.

#### Subscription, when payable.

15. The annual subscription shall be payable in advance on the first day of May in each year.

#### Absent members.

16. Any member who has paid his subscription for the current year, and who intends to be absent from the State during at least six months of the succeeding year, may make written application to the committee to place his name on the "Absent Members' List."

# Committee may grant applications.

17. The committee may grant such application, and if such member continues absent from the State for more than one year, may keep the name of such member on the "Absent Members' List" during his absence.

Absent member not required to pay subscriptions-Return.

18. Any member whose name is on the "Absent Members' List" shall not be required to pay his annual subscription for the year or years during which his name is on such list, an i shall not during such time be entitled to any of the privileges of a member; provided always that any such member may at any time on his return to the State pay his subscription for the current year, and become an effective member.

#### Non-payment of subscription.

19. If any member neglect to pay his subscription when due, notice shall be sent to him or his agent (if known), or to his last known place of abode by the secretary, and if the subscription be not paid before the next following race meeting of the club the defaulter shall cease to be a member of the club, and his name shall be erased from the list of members, unless he can assign to the committee reasons which they may deem satisfactory for his default; then on payment of the amount due, the committee may replace his name upon the list. Provided that no member shall be entitled to vote at any meeting of the club until his annual subscription shall have been paid.

# MANAGEMENT OF THE CLUB-THE COMMITTEE.

.President and Vice-Presidents. 20. There shall be one president and two vice-presidents of the club.

# Election.

21. The president and vice-presidents shall be elected at the annual meeting of the club, and shall be dotted offices for one year. They shall be nominated, and, if re-quired, ballotted for as provided by the by-laws for the election of the committee.

# Committee of Management to be elected.

22. The affairs and general business of the club shall be managed by a committee consisting of the president, the two vice-presidents, and fourteen members to be elected at the general meeting. The seven longest in office of the the general meeting. The seven longest in office of the fourteen members of committee shall retire annually, but shall be eligible for re-election. In the event of any dis-agreement as to who shall retire between two or more retiring members who have been in office for an equal length of time, the same shall be decided by lot. Provided that if the seat of any member shall become vacant and such vacancy shall have been filled under By-law 29, then the number of members to retire under this by-law shall be reduced by as many as the number of vacancies so filled.

# Members eligible.

23. No person shall be eligible to become a member of the committee unless he shall have been a member of the club for at least six months prior to the general meeting at which the election is to take place. No trainer or bookmaker shall be eligible to become a member of the comclub shall be eligible to hold office as committeeman of this Club.

#### Nominations.

24. The names of all members proposed or submitting themselves for election as members of the committee shall be forwarded to the secretary of the club at least fourteen clear days before the general meeting; and a list of such names, in alphabetical order, shall be published in one of the local newspapers at least seven days before the general meeting.

24a. The members of committee not seeking re-election shall decide on the validity of any nomination for the The members of committee not seeking re-election committee.

# If number of candidates equal to vacancies.

25. If the number of candidates nominated for election as members of the committee is equal to the number of vacancies, the chairman of the general meeting shall declare all the candidates elected.

#### Election.

Electron. 26. If the number of candidates nominated for election as members of committee is greater than the number of vacancies a ballot shall be taken on the day of the annual general meeting. The ballot shall commence at 3:30 p.m. and close at 8:30 p.m. Each ballot paper shall contain the names of all candidates duly nominated, printed in alpha-betical order, according to their surnames. Every member voting shall strike through the names of all persons named in such ballot paper for whom he does not desire to vote, and shall then deposit such ballot paper in the ballot-box. Every member voting shall vote for the full number of candidates to elected, and vote for the full number of candidates to elected, and any paper containing a greater or less number of names than there are vacancies to be filled shall be rejected as informal. The ballot boxes shall be opened in the presence of three scrutineers chosen by the general meeting from the members present. The majority of such scrutineers shall, at the close of the ballot, certify to the secretary the names of the successful candidates, and in case of their being an equal number of votes recorded for two or more candidates, the majority of the scrutineers shall then decide who shall be elected. The names contained in such certificate of the scrutineers, or a majority of them, shall be the members of the committee in place of those that retire, or whose term of office shall have expired. The committee shall from time to time make such provision as they may think necessary for taking such ballot. No member shall be entitled to vote at an election of committee until his subscription shall have been paid.

# If number of candidates and number of vacancies.

27. If the number of candidates nominated for election as members of the committee is less thon the number of vacancies, the chairman of the general meeting shall declare all the candidates who have been nominated elected, and the general meeting may thereupon proceed to fill up the other vacancies by show of hands, subject to a poll being demanded

Voting by absent members. 28. A member unable to attend on the day of election to record his vote may, at any time after the names of the intending candidates have been duly advertised, obtain from the secretary a ballot paper indorsed by the secretary, and after duly notifying thereon the members for whom he and after duly notifying thereon the members for whom he proposes to vote, shall put such paper into an envelope indorsed "Ballot Paper," addressed to the secretary, and the secretary shall retain such ballot paper and envelope until the day of election, when, in the presence of the scrutineers, it shall be opened and the ballot paper taken therefrom and deposited in the ballot-box. A member absent from Boulder may record his vote by letter or telegram addressed to the Secretary. Provided that such member shall vote for no more nor less than the number of candidates to be elected, and such letter or telegram shall be delivered to the scrutineers on the day of election be delivered to the scrutineers on the day of election.

#### Casual vacancy.

29. In the event of any vacancy occurring in the office of president or vice-president, or in the committee after the annual election, the Committee shall have the power of filling it up until the next general meeting, when a member shall be elected to fill such vacancy.

#### POWERS OF THE COMMITTEE.

#### Power to appoint and dismiss officers.

30. The committee shall have the power of, from time to time, appointing and at their pleasure dismissing, all such officers and servants as they may think necessary for the purposes of the club.

# Power to pay officers and servants.

31. The committee may pay or allow such salaries, allowances, and recompenses to any officers or servants appointed by them during their services or employments as the committee shall from time to time see fit.

# Officers to give security.

The committee shall take sufficient security for the 32 faithful execution of his office from each officer of the Club (other than totalisator officials) entrusted with the security, custody, or control of moneys of the club, before he shall enter upon his office.

#### Power to make contracts-Disposal of funds.

33. The committee shall have power to enter into such contracts on behalf of the club as they shall think advisable, and shall have the direction and control of the expenditure and distribution of the funds of the club.

# Expulsion of members.

34. (1.) Any member who has been found guilty of corrupt practice, under the rules of racing, by the com-mittee or stewards, or by the committee or stewards of any club, whose decision has been adopted by the committee of the Western Australian Turf Club, and com-municated to the club shall, *ipso facto*, be expelled from the club.

- 34. (2.) The committee may expel any member who-
  - (a.) Has been found guilty by the committee or stewards of any racing club of malpractice, or who has been disqualified under the rules of racing by the committee or stewards of any racing club.
  - (b.) Has been guilty of grossly improper conduct or riotous behaviour at any race meeting.
  - (c.) Is a defaulter in stakes or bets in reference to any race.
  - (d.) Becomes a jockey or licensed trainer of horses or bookmaker.
  - (e.) Declines or neglects to pay any fine imposed on him by the stewards or committee.
  - (f.) Is guilty of any act which, in the opinion of the Committee, renders it undesirable that he should continue a member.

# Opportunity to show cause.

Provided always that no member, except a member  $ip_{30}$ facto expelled in accordance with the first part of this by-law, shall be expelled by the committee until after he shall have been given an opportunity to show cause to the committee why he should not be expelled.

Power to fix dates and to issue programmes for race meetings.

35. Subject to the rules of racing of the Western Aus-35. Subject to the rules of racing of the Western Aus-tralian Turf Club, the committee shall have full power to fix the dates for and prepare and issue programmes of all race meetings of the club to be held during the year, and to prepare the conditions of, and advertise to be run in succeeding years such races as they in their judgment may deem expedient to make public during their term of office.

# Can decline to receive nominations.

36. All nominations for any race to be run at any race meeting of the club shall be subject to the approval of the committee, who may decline to receive any nomination without giving a reason for so doing.

# Power to postpone races.

37. The committee may, in case of urgent necessity, put off from time to time the races at any race meeting of the club.

# Power to make regulations.

38. The committee shall have power to make, alter, and repeal such regulations, not inconsistent with these by-laws, as they may deem proper for the management and administration of the club and of their own proceedings; and for regulating the duties, privileges, and control of all officers and servants of the club; and for regulating the admission, conduct, and control of all owners, trainers, jockeys, farriers, and attendants on the club's course; and for licensing bookmakers to bet on any part or parts of the club's race-course, and for regulating the fee to be paid by the licensee on the issue to him of a license.

#### Sub-Committees.

38a. The committee may delegate any of their powers to sub-committees, consisting of such member or members of their body as they may think fit.

# PROCEEDINGS OF COMMITTEE.

# Meetings of committee-Quorum.

39. The committee shall meet as often as they may deem necessary; seven shall form a quorum, and minutes of the proceedings shall be entered in a book, and be read and confirmed at the next meeting.

# Convening of meetings.

40. A committee meeting may be convened by the chairman or secretary at any time, and shall be convened by either of them upon receiving a requisition to do so, signed by three members of the committee.

#### Chairman and Vice-Chairman.

41. The committee shall at their first meeting after the annual general meeting elect a chairman and vice-chairman, who shall hold office until the next general meeting. Any vacancy occurring in the interim shall be filled up by the committee.

# Presiding at meetings.

42. The chairman, or in his absence the vice-chairman, shall preside at all meetings of the committee, and if neither be present some other member of the committee to be elected by the meeting.

#### Voting.

43. The chairman shall have a deliberative as well as a casting vote at all meetings of committee.

# Non-attendance at meetings.

44. Any member of the committee (except in the case of the president or vice-presidents) having been absent from three consecutive meetings, extending over two months, shall cease to be a member thereof, unless he shall have obtained leave of absence from the committee, but may be reinstated by a resolution carried by two-thirds of the members of the committee.

#### STEWARDS.

# Election and powers of stewards.

45. The committee shall, before each race meeting, elect nine stewards, who shall be members of the club. The stewards shall have such powers, priviliges, and duties as are from time to time fixed and determined by these by-laws and the rules of racing of the Western Australian Turf Club.

# Indemnification of committee and stewards.

46. The committee and stewards, and any one of them, shall be indemnified from the funds of the club against the costs of any legal proceedings that may be instituted against them in consequence of the performance of their duties.

#### THE SECRETARY.

# Duties of secretary.

47. It shall be the duty of the secretary to keep full and accurate accounts of all sums of money received or expended on account of the club; to make full and accurate minutes in the books of the proceedings of all general, special, and committee meetings; to give all notices of all general and special meetings, and also propositions to be brought before them, as also notices of committee meetings; and, subject to the directions of the committee, to make all disbursements of the funds of the club by cheque to be signed by one member of the committee, the treasurer, and secretary, to be drawn upon the bank at which the club account is kept; to obtain receipts or discharges for the same; and to carry out the instructions of the committee and Stewards.

# THE TREASURER.

# Appointment of and duties of treasurer.

48. The treasurer shall be appointed by the committee from one of their number at their first meeting after the annual meeting, and shall present at the annual meeting a balance-sheet of the total receipts and expenditure for the preceding year up to and inclusive of the 30th day of April, and shall after every race meeting present to the committee a balance-sheet of the receipts and expenditure of such race meeting. He shall, with one member of the committee authorised by the committee.

# THE AUDITORS.

#### Duties of auditors and how appointed.

49. There shall be two auditors of the club, who shall be appointed by the committee within one month after the annual meeting, and who shall retire annually, but shall be eligible for re-appointment. It shall be their duty to audit the books of the club, and the accounts prepared by the secretary and treasurer for submission at the annual meeting, and to make a separate audit after each race meeting, and to certify to the correctness thereof. In the event of there being a vacancy in the office of auditor the committee shall have power to fill it.

# GENERAL AND SPECIAL MEETINGS.

#### Annual general meeting.

50. There shall be a general meeting of the club on or before the 21st day of May in each year, for the purpose of electing president, vice-presidents, and members of the committee, discussing the general business of the club, and receiving from the committee an abstract of the state of the accounts of the receipts and expenditure, with a report of the general concerns of the club. At such meeting the accounts shall exhibit a true state of the total receipts and expenditure of the club during the year immediately preceding the first of May, with a statement of the balance of such account.

# Report and Balance-sheet to be forwarded to members.

51. A printed copy of such report, balance-sheet, and statement of receipts and expenditure shall be posted or sent to each member of the club two days previously to the general meeting.

# Notice of proposition by members.

52. Should any member desire to bring forward any proposition or motion at any general meeting of the club, he shall give written notice thereof to the secretary at least fourteen clear days prior to the general meeting at which he may wish his proposition considered; and the secretary shall embody such proposition in the notice convening the meeting.

# Business to be transacted.

53. No business of a special description shall be transacted at any such meeting, unless special notice of such business shall have been given in the circular letter convening such meeting.

54. Seven days' notice at the least of any general meeting, specifying the place, day, and hour of meeting, and, in the case of special business, the general nature of such business, shall be given to the members by circular letter, addressed to such members at their registered addresses, but the non-receipt by any member of such notice shall not invalidate the proceedings at such general meeting.

# Extraordinary or Special General Meeting.

55. The committee may, whenever they think fit, and they shall upon a requisition in writing under the hands of not fewer than twelve members, convene a special general meeting.

# Requisition for Special Meeting.

56. Any requisition so made by members shall clearly and fully express the objects of the meeting required to be called, and shall be left at the office of the club.

# Meeting-When held.

57. Upon such requisition being so left, the committee shall forthwith proceed to convene a special general meeting to be held at such time and place as they shall think fit, not being more than twenty-eight days after the leaving of such requisition.

#### Business to be transacted.

58. No business shall be entered upon by any special general meeting except such as shall be set forth in the notice convening the same.

#### Quorum.

59. At the general or any special meeting ten members must be present before proceeding to business. If within half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting a quorum is not present, the meeting, if convened upon the requisition of members, shall be dissolved. In any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place; and if at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present it shall be adjourned sine die.

#### Chairman.

60. The president or the chairman, or the vice-chairman of committee, or, in their absence, some other member of committee, or, in his absence, some member to be elected by the meeting, shall preside at the general or any special meeting. The chairman at all such meetings shall have a deliberative as well as a casting vote.

#### Voting.

61. All propositions, questions, and matters (except the election of president, vice-presidents, and committeemen nominated as before-mentioned) submitted in accordance with these rules to any meeting shall be decided by a majority of those present, to be determined in the first instance by a show of hands.

#### Poll.

62. Any five members may demand a poll, and if a poll is so demanded, the proposition, question, or matter shall be finally decided by a division, to be held and conducted in such manner as shall be determined by the chairman.

#### Reconsideration of decisions.

63. All decisions arrived at and carried at any general or special meeting held in conformity with these rules shall be binding and conclusive upon all members of the club; and no notice of motion to reconsider any such decision shall be received by the committee during the current year ending on the 30th day of April in each year, after such decision has been so arrived at.

#### MISCELLANEOUS.

#### Insulting Officials.

64. If any person shall be proved to the satisfaction of the committee to have insulted, abused, or imputed improper motives to any member of committee, steward, handicapper, or official of the club, in connection with the performances of any matter or thing done by him, them, or any of them in the exercise or performance of his or their duty, such person shall be punished in such manner, either by being fined a sum not exceeding Ten pounds, being warned off the course, and other places where the rules of the club are in force, or otherwise, as the nature of the case may require.

# Actions confirmed.

65. All the actions of the committee of the club, particularly the election of life members prior to the making of these By-laws, are hereby confirmed.

#### Interpretation of Rules and By-laws.

66. The chairman, at any meeting, shall in the first place interpret the By-laws and Regulations, provided always that any member may, if he thinks fit, require the chairman to submit the question of interpretation to the meeting, which shall decide.

# Alteration of Rules.

67. No By-law shall be made, altered, or repealed except at a special general meeting duly convened for the purpose, and in accordance with "The Kalgoorlie and Boulder Racing Clubs Act, 1904."

#### PART II.

By-laws for regulating matters connected with the land which now is, or may hereafter be, vested in the chairman for the time being of the club, and for the general management of the club's racecourse, and for prescribing tolls and charges, and the recovery and receipt thereof.

# Division of Club's Premises.

#### 1. The Grand Stand and appreaches

- 2. The weighing yard, the horse stalls, the committee rooms, the committee stand, the stewards' rooms, the stewards' stands, the judge's box, and approaches.
- 3. The saddling paddock.
- 4. The outer carriage paddock and approaches.
- 5. The leger stand and enclosure.
- 6. The course proper.
- 7. The training ground and approaches.
- 8. The members' stands, members' rooms and enclosure, and the members' carriage paddock and approaches.
- 9. The totalisator buildings.
- 10. Jockeys and trainers' stand.
- 11. All the residue of the course and paddock.

# MANAGEMENT OF RACECOURSE AT RACE MEETINGS. Admission of Members.

69. Subject to the provisions of these By-laws, and to the rules of racing, all members of the Boulder Racing Club shall, upon production of their tickets, be admitted to the first, third, fourth, fifth, eighth, and eleventh divisions hereinbefore specified at all race meetings held by the club.

# Vehicles not to be driven on Racecourse.

70. No vehicle shall at any time (without the consent of the committee) be driven or taken a ross or on any of the said divisions, or any part thereof, except as hereinafter mentioned.

#### Members' Stand and Enclosure.

71. No persons except members of the club shall be admitted to the eighth of the said divisions without the consent of the chairman or of the committee; and any members who shall, without the consent of the chairman or of the committee being first obtained, take any other person (not being a fellow member or an honorary member, into the said eighth division, shall for the first offence pay a fine of  $\pm 5$ , for the second offence pay a fine of  $\pm 10$  (such fines shall in no case be remitted by the committee), and for the third offence shall be expelled from the club. Provided that any member may take in his company into the members' carriage paddock any person or persons holding a ticket entitling such person or persons to admission to the first division.

#### Judge's Box.

72. No person except the Judge, or any person he may call to his assistance, shall enter the Judge's box at the time the horses are prepared to start or are running for any race.

# Weighing Stand and Enclosure.

73. No person shall enter the weighing stand or the weighing yard, or the approaches thereto, except the committee, the stewards, the officers of the club, the jockeys requiring to be weighed, and the owners and trainers of horses desirous of seeing their jockeys weighed.

# Committee and Stewards' Rooms and Stands.

74. No person shall enter the committee rooms, the committee stand, the stewards' stand, the stewards' rooms, or the several approaches thereto, except the officers of the club, and such persons as the committee or the stewards may invite to do so.

# Admission of general public.

75. No person shall enter the said first, third, fourth,  $\epsilon r$  fifth divisions of the said course without a ticket duly authorising him in that behalf, and which ticket shall be issued on the express understanding that it is revocable by the committee or stewards, or any one of them at any time.

# Course proper.

76. No person shall be allowed upon the course proper at any time, except the officers of the club and the jockeys of horses actually engaged in a race about to be run, without the written authority of the stewards, during the time a race meeting is under their jurisdiction, or without the consent of the committee at any other time.

# Totalisator Buildings.

77. No person shall enter the ninth of the said divisions except the chairman of the committee, any committeeman, secretary, or stewards specially appointed by the committee to supervise the working of the totalisator, the officers of the club engaged in working the said machine, or on the invitation of the chairman. Persons who shall not be admitted.

The following persons shall not be admitted into 78 any of the said divisions :-

- (a.) Any person under sentence of disqualification by the committee or the stewards, or by the com-mittee or stewards of any other racing club whose decision has been adopted by the com-mittee of the Western Australian Turf Club under the Rules of Racing.
- (b.) Any person who has been warned off the course.
- (c.) Any person not admitted to any of the said divisions in pursuance of these rules.
- (d.) Any person whose name is on the Forfeited List.
- (e.) Any person who is a defaulter in bets.
- (f.) Any person who has been at any time declared guilty of a corrupt practice by the committee or stewards, or by the committee or stewards of any other racing club whose decision has been adopted by the committee of the Western Australian Turf Club, under the Rules of Racing.
- (g.) Any person who, having been a member, has been expelled from the club.

# Committee or Stewards may refuse admission.

79. The committee or stewards, or any one of them may, without reason, refuse admission to all or any of the said divisions, or any portion thereof, to anyone not a member, and may, without reason, expel any person not a member who has gained admission to any of the said divisions upon tendering to him the money he has paid to obtain entrance.

# Tickets to be produced.

80. Every member of the club, and any person paying for admission to any of the said divisions, shall, upon demand, produce and (if required) surrender his ticket to all gatekeepers and other persons having authority from the club to demand the production or surrender of the same.

# Remaining on land after Races.

81. No person, without permission, shall remain on the said land or divisions, or any part thereof, for a longer period than half an hour after the last race of the day shall have been run.

# Lost Property.

82. Any officer or servant or employee of the club, and any other person finding any lost property or document upon any land in the use or occupation of the club, or upon any land belonging to the club, or in any building or premises erected on any such laud, shall immediately deliver the same at the office appointed by the committee for the reception of lost property, to the person in charge of such office; but should such office be closed, he shall deliver such property at the office of the club in Boulder, to the person for the time being in charge of such office. Any person committing a breach of this By-law will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

#### Removal of Offenders.

Any person committing on the said racecourse, or in 83. any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be removed from such racecourse, notwithstanding such person may be a member of the club, or may have purchased and is or may be in possession of a ticket for admission :--

- (a.) Assaulting any other person
  - (b.) Being drunk.

  - (c.) Riding, crossing, or trespassing upon the course or any part of it during a race meeting, or when the horses are prepared to start, or are running for any race.
  - (d.) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
  - (e.) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
  - (f.) Behaving improperly or riotously.
  - (g.) Being found in any of the said divisions, and not producing upon demand, or (if required) not surrendering to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the club to demand production of the same, a ticket duly authorising admission to such division, unless the person so found shall forthwith satisfy the stewards, committee, or secretary, or one of them, that the proper charge for admission has been paid by him, and that his ticket has been lost.

- (h.) Obtaining admission to any of the said divisions when not entitled to such admission under these By-laws.
- (i.) Remaining on the said land or any division or part thereof after having been warned off any part of the said land on behalf of the committee or Stewards.
- (j.) Betting or wagering, or offering to bet or wager, unless duly authorised to do so by the committee under these By-laws.
- (k.) Any person selling or offering to sell tips or information in connection with races run or to be run on the club's course.

# Scale of tolls and charges.

The following is the scale of tolls and charges which 84 shall be levied and taken for admission to the several divisions of the said land and the buildings thereon respectively :--

- For the admission of each person to the first s. d division (grand stand) not exceeding ... 11 0 For the admission of each lady and each person under the age of 14 years to the
- first division (grand stand) not exceeding 6 0
- For the admission of each person in the third division (saddling paddock) not exceeding 2 6
- For the admission of each person to the fifth (Ledger stand) not exceeding ... 3 0
- For admission to the seventh division for training or exercising every horse per each six months ....

... 10 0 . . . ...

Provided that all members of the Boulder Racing Club, upon production of their tickets, and all ladies producing ladies' cards issued to members, shall be admitted to any part of the said land, with the exception of the second, sixth, seventh, ninth, and tenth divisions, and shall be admitted to the members' carriage paddock, with their carriages and horses, without payment of any of the above tolls and charges for admission. Provided that no licensed vehicle plying for hire shall be allowed to remain in the members' carriage paddock.

# BOOKMAKERS.

85. Any person may carry on the business of a book-maker on the Boulder Racing Club course in such places set apart for that purpose by the committee if he shall have complied with the following conditions:—

- 1. That he has been approved by the committee, and his name and address registered at the office of the Boulder Racing Club, and that he shall have obtained from the committee of the club a license authorising him to carry on betting operations at or upon the racecourse of the club.
- 2. That he has paid to the committee for the privilege of betting in and upon the place set apart for the purpose such annual fee or such fee for each race meeting of the club as the committee may de-termine. Provided always that the committee shall have full power at any time in their absolute discretion to revoke all or any such registrations, and they shall not be compelled to refund any part of the said fees so paid as aforesaid.
- 3. This privilege shall extend to all race meetings held on the Boulder Racing Club's course. Any person offending against this By-law shall be removed from all land or lands vested in the chairman of the club, or over which the chairman and the committee shall have control.
- 4. The business of a bookmaker shall not include any betting which is illegal.

#### GENERAL MANAGEMENT OF RACECOURSE.

# Admission for training horses.

86. Subject to the provisions of these rules, and to the Rules of Racing, all persons who shall have duly paid the fees for the use of the seventh of the said divisions for the purpose of training or exercising horses shall, upon pro-duction to the club's officials of the training track tickets for the term then current, be admitted thereto with the horses in respect of which tickets shall have been issued, for the period for which such tickets are issued, subject, however, to the condition thereof and to such order as the committee or the stewards may from time to time give as, in their opinion, occasion may require with reference to such division. Any person trespassing on such division with a horse or horses without having first paid the necessary fees shall be disqualified and otherwise dealt with as the committee may, in their discretion, determine.

# Tenants hiring course.

87. Persons renting or hiring, or having the free use of for any race meeting, or any other purpose, the racecourse, of any of the stands, or any portions thereof, or any booth upon the said racecourse, shall abide by any order given by the committee, stewards, or any one of them, or secretary, in reference to the said racecourse and the buildings and other erections thereon.

#### Bills and placards.

88. No person, unless duly authorised in writing by the Secretary, shall distribute or post or stick bills or placards, or assist in distributing or posting or sticking same, within or upon any fence, wall, building, property, or premises of the club. Any person committing a breach of this By-law will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

#### Trespass.

89. Any person who shall wilfully trespass, obstruct, or impede any officer, servant, or agent of the committee in the execution of his duty upon the racecourse, or upon any division or portion thereof, or upon any land for the time being vested in the chairman, or upon any building or premises connected therewith, or wilfully trespass upon any mak hard huildings or premises on provide or wilfully premises connected therewith, or wilfully trespass upon any such land. buildings, or premises, or remove or wilfully injure any building, enclosure, post, tree, or shrub upon any such land, or who shall refuse to leave the racecourse of the club upon being requested so to do by an official of the club, and upon being tendered the amount paid by him for admission to the said racecourse, shall, on conviction thereof before a justice, forfeit and pay, for every such offence over and above the amount of the injury done, any sum not exceeding Ten pounds. sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

90. No person shall admit, take, or drive any dogs, pigs, goats, or poultry on the said land, or any division thereof, or in any building therein, and any dogs, pigs, goats, or poultry found upon the said land may be destroyed by any officer or servant of the club. Any person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction thereof, forfeit and pay, for every such offence over and above the amount of injury done, any sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

91. No person shall, without the consent of the comof the period and the horses, camels, donkeys, or sheep of which he is the owner, or which are under his control, or which he is the owner, or which are under his control, or in his custody, to trespass into or upon the said land, or any part or division thereof, and no person shall, without the consent of the committee, admit, take, or drive any cattle, horses, camels, donkeys, or sheep into or upon the said land or any division or part thereof. Any person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction thereof before a justice, forfeit and pay, for every such offence over and above the amount of injury done, any sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

#### MISCELLANEOUS.

#### Defaulters.

92. A person shall be considered a defaulter in bets if the committee, after investigation, shall have decided that such person is a defaulter. Provided that the committee shall not investigate any bets other than those—

- (α.) Made between members of the club and book-makers licensed by the Western Australian Turf Club; or
- (b.) Made between any persons on a race run under the management of the club.

#### Penalties.

93. Any person committing a breach of these By-laws not otherwise provided for shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, which penalty shall be recoverable as provided in "The Kalgoorlie and Boulder Racing Clubs Act, 1904."
