WHEREAS by Section 219 of "The Municipal Institute Witions Act, 1900" (64 Vict., No. 8), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the Government cazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become ard be

absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: And whereafts the Claremont Municipal Council has requested that certain lands, named and described in the Schedule hereto annexed, which have been used for streets or ways within the Municipality of Claremont, be declared public highways: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said lands to be public highways; and such lands shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as highways within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force:—

THE following Despatch received by His Excellency the Governor from the Right Honourable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, together with the Regulations therein referred to, are published for general information.

Downing Street, 22nd March, 1905.

Sir.

I have the honour to inform you that considerable difficulty has been experienced in this Department in connection with the attestation of signatures to documents executed in the Colonies and required for use by Foreign Governments.

I have to call your attention to Chapter VII., para-2. I have to call your attention to Chapter VII., paragraph vii., of the Colonial Regulations (Nos. 229, 230, and 231), and to state that, save under exceptional circumstances, I do not feel justified in authorising the certification for legalisation of any signatures except those of the Governor or Officer administering the Government; and I shall be glad if you will invite your Ministers to adopt some means of notifying persons concerned of what is required in order to facilitate the legalisation of documents in this country. in this country.

COLONIAL REGULATIONS.

CHAPTER VII .- PARAGRAPH VII.

Attestation of documents.

229. The attestation of signatures to documents can only take place upon a full knowledge or intimate belief in the genuineness of those signatures, and, as a general rule, the Secretary of State can only undertake to attest those of Governors or officers administering (bovernment)

230. Persons, therefore, who may have occasion to instruct their friends or agents in any State to send to them certificates or powers of attorney or judicial acts for legal use in this country, should take care to have these documents authenticated in the State by the officer administering the G overnment.

231. The same rule must particularly be observed by the Governor in sending home documents which, after being verified in England, are intended to be used in foreign countries. The last signature attached by way of attestation to any such document must invariably be one which is known, and can therefore be certified to in this Department. If possible, it should always be that of the officer administering the Government.

MUNICIPALITY OF COOLGARDIE.

A By-law of the municipality of Coolgardie, made under and by virtue of the provisions and powers of "The Building Act, 1884," Section 4, and "The Building Act, 1884, Amendment Act, 1895," Section 4, Subsection (g) for regulating the depositing of plans and specifications of new buildings to be lodged with the Council.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Acts and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Coolgardie order as follows:-

Every person, whether owner, agent, or contractor, who shall intend to erect a building within the Municipality shall deliver or cause to be delivered, at the office of the Council, complete plans and sections of every such intended building and of every floor of such intended building, which shall be drawn to a scale of not less than one inch to every eight feet, and shall show the position, form, and dimensions of the several parts of such building, and of every water closet, earth closet, privy, ashpit, cesspool, well, and all other appurtenances.

Every person, whether owner, agent, or contractor, who shall intend to erect a building within the Municipality shall deliver or cause to be delivered, at the Office of the Council, a true copy of the specifications thereof.

If such person neglects or refuses to deliver or cause to be delivered any such plan and specification, or either of them, within seven days after notice, in writing, under the hand of the Town Clerk or other officer of the Council, shall have been served upon him, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

MUNICIPALITY OF COOLGARDIE.

ELEVENTH SCHEDULE.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Coolgardie, made under Section 170 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and numbered 109, for regulating the keeping or storage of sandalwood or timber or other inflammable or dangerous thing.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Coolgardie order as follows:

Every person who shall make or place any stack or heap of sandalwood or other timber or inflammable or dangerous thing within 15 feet of any building within the Municipality, and every occupier of any premises whereon any stack or heap of sandalwood or other timber or inflammable or dangerous thing shall be within 15 feet of any building within the Municipality, if the same, though lawfully made and placed or deposited before the coming into force of this By-law, shall be there contrary to the tenor of this By-law, who shall not, within seven days after notice from the Council so to do, remove such stack or heap shall forfeit, on conviction for such offence, a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and in every such case a further sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day after any such conviction during which such stack or heap shall so continue.

ELEVENTH SCHEDULE.

A By-Law of the Municipality of Coolgardie, mad under Section 170 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and numbered 110, for prohibiting or regulating the carriage of houses or heavy goods along, through, or over any streets of the Municipality.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Coolgardie order as follows :-

No person shall carry or cause to be carried any house or heavy goods along, through, or over any street or portion of any street of the Municipality without having first given 24 hours notice, in writing, to the Council of his intention from where and the street through which the same are intended to be carried, and without first obtaining the permission, in writing, of the said Council to the carriage of the same. Any person committing a breach of the above By-law shall be liable, upon conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £5.

To Regulate the general Traffic of Camels,

The Municipality of Coolgardie, in pursuance of the powers vested in it, and by virtue of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, hereby repeals By-law No. 102, and hereby in pursuance of such powers and authorities aforesaid, makes the following By-law in lieu thereof:-

No. 111. No person owning or having the management of any camels or dromedaries shall load or unload, or suffer or permit to be loaded or unloaded, any such camel or dromedary within the Municipality of Co lgardie, except between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on any week day, and it shall not be lawful for any such person to keep, camp, or otherwise detain any camels or dromedaries within the Municipality at any time upon such week day, except for the purposes aforesaid, or upon Sundays, except for the purpose of watering such camels or dromedaries when necessary, and then without any unnecessary delay to water and remove the said camels and dromedaries out of the said Municipality.

Any person committing a breach of the above By-law shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each such offence.

ELEVENTH SCHEDULE.

A By-Law of the Municipality of Coolgardie, made under Section 170 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and numbered 112, for regulating the lighting of fires in the open air.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Coolgardie order as follows:

- Every person who shall place or permit to be placed in any street, lane, yard, or place, whether public or private, any fire, or any combustible material of any kind, in such manner as to endanger any contiguous buildings, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Five shillings nor more than Five pounds for such offence, and shall further be liable to a similar penalty for every day during which such said offence shall be continued.
- Any unprotected fire in the open air, made or permitted within the yard of any dwelling house, store, or other building, or within five yards of any fence shall, for the purpose of this By-law, be held to endanger such building or other structures.

ELEVENTH SCHEDULE.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Coolgardie, made under Section 170 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and numbered 113, for regulating the carrying of lights on vehicles at night.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Coolgardie order as follows :-

For regulating the carrying of Lights on Vehicles at Night.

Any person who, between sunset and sunrise, except on the occasion when there is a full moon, and for two nights before and two nights after such full moon, shall, in, upon, or along any public streets or lanes within the municipality, drive or cause to be driven any vehicles constructed for the drive or cause to be driven any vehicles constructed for the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise without having suitable lamps securely fixed and lighted at the off side of the front of such vehicle, or shall drive any vehicle constructed for the conveyance of persons as well as goods, or of persons only, without having a suitable light securely fixed and lighted on each side of the front of such vehicle shall, for each such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

THE following letter from the Registrar of His Majesty's Privy Council, together with a copy of the Order in Council therein referred to, amending the procedure to be followed in England in Appeals to His Majesty in Council where the Respondent fails to enter an Appearance, is published for general information.

- 1. I am instructed by the Lord President of the Council to send you four copies of an Order in Council, dated the 20th March, 1905, amending the procedure to be followed in England in Appeals to His Majesty in Council where a Respondent fails to enter an appearance, and to ask you to be good enough to bring the contents of the Order under the notice of the learned Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia.
- 2. I am, at the same time, to explain that the Order, which has been assented to by the Colonial and India Offices, was passed in response to representations made to the Lords of the Judicial Committee from many quarters as to the inconvenience and expense of the existing practice in cases where a Respondent does not enter an appearance.
- 3. The object of the Order is, on the one hand, to supply a method by which an Appellant may set down an Appeal ex parts without having to take out Appearance Orders against a non-appearing Respondent, and, on the other hand, to ensure the Respondent's having ample notice of the Appeal, and a reasonable time within which to appear.

- 4. As the Order is intended to apply to Appeals from all Courts from which an Appeal lies to His Majesty in Council, it has necessarily been framed in general terms, but their Lordships conceive that its provisions cannot in any way conflict with the rules for the time being in force in any of the Courts referred to.
- 5. Their Lordships have observed that in many cases a considerable interval elapses between the admission of the Appeal and the dispatch of the record. In an Appeal recently heard by their Lordships this interval amounted to over three years. The Order in Council accordingly provides for the Respondent's receiving notice of the despatch of the record to England.
- 6. Their Lordships desire me, in conclusion, to express the hope that the Transcript Record, or the covering letter of the officer transmitting the same to England, may, whenever practicable, show that the notices mentioned in the Order have been given to the Respondent, in order that the parties to the Appeal may have the benefit of the procedure provided by the Order.

That where a Respondent to an Appeal to Your Majesty in Council whose name has been brought on the Record of the Appeal by an Order of Your Majesty in Council fails to enter an Appearance to the Appeal in the Registry of the Privy Council and it appears from the Transcript Record or from a Supplementary Record in the Appeal or from a Certificate of the Officer of the Court transmitting the said Transcript Record or Supplementary Record to the Registrar of the Privy Council that the said Respondent has received due notice of any intended application to Your Majesty in Council to bring him on the Record as a Respondent to the Appeal the Appellant shall not subject to any direction by their Lordships to the contrary be required to take out Appearance Orders calling upon the said Respondent to enter an Appearance in the Appeal, and the Appeal may subject as aforesaid be set down for hearing ex parts as against the said Respondent at any time after the expiration of three calendar months from the date on which the said Respondent shall have been served with a copy of Your Majesty's Order in Council bringing him on the Record of the Appeal in like manner as if the said Appearance Orders lad been taken out by the Appellant and the times thereby respectively limited for the said Respondent to enter an Appearance had expired.

That nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect the power of their Lordships to order the Appellant in an Appeal referred by Your Majesty to their Lordships to take out Appearance Orders or to be excused from taking out Appearance Orders in any case in which their Lordships shall think fit so to order and generally to give such directions as to the time at which and the conditions on which an Appeal so referred as aforesaid shall be set down as in the opinion of their Lordships the circumstances of the case may require.
