QUALIFICATIONS FOR CERTIFICATED MARINE SURVEYORS.

Certificates of competency as Marine Surveyors will be issued to those persons who have passed the examination necessary for an extra first-class engineer's certificate, as issued or recognised by the Board of Trade;

Or to Master Mariners who have been in command for not less than five years since they obtained a foreign-going certificate as master, issued or recognised by the Board of Trade, or who are in possession of extra masters'

I have the honour to transmit to you, for your information, a copy of a circular despatch that I have addressed to the Governors of Crown Colonies intimating that His Majesty the King has been pleased to approve of a new white undress uniform that may be worn by members of the Colonial Civil Service in tropical countries.

2. Although the above description cannot be said to apply strictly to any of the Colonies possessing responsible Government, there may be certain seasons of the year when a white uniform would be preferred by officials in the colony under your Government to the ordinary Civil uniform; and it may therefore be useful to you to know that the wearing of such an uniform has received His Majesty's sanction, more particularly as you will observe that in granting this concession His Majesty is desirous that there should no longer be any excuse for not wearing uniform on the many occasions when it is obviously desirable.

CIRCULAR.

Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that His Majesty the King has been pleased to approve of a new white undress uniform that may be worn by members of the Colonial Civil Service in tropical countries.

2. The uniform is to be of white drill, with a stand-up collar, on which is to be a detachable gorget of gold braid on a blue ground. The usual buttons will be worn, according to rank, as prescribed in the "Schedutes of Civil Uniforms" issued from the Lord Chamberlain's Office, the general purport of which is embodied in the Colonial Regulations. The number of buttons on the cuffs will be according to rank, i.e. lations rank, i.e.,

1st and 2nd class 3rd and 4th class 5th class ... Three buttons. Two buttons. One button.

Ist and 2nd class ... Three buttons.
3rd and 4th class ... Two buttons.
5th class ... One button.
The usual Civil sword will be worn, the frog and scabbard being underneath the coat, the hilt appearing through a slit in the side of the

Ribbons of decorations and medals will be worn half way between the first and second buttons.

No lace is worn on the trousers.

The uniform will be worn with a white helmet, bearing on the front a gilt badge with the Royal arms and supporters,

- 3. The new uniform is to be worn on all ordinary occasions where the wearing of uniform is desirable, the following occasions being suggested as examples:—
 - (a.) Receiving or returning the ceremonial visit of a Royal Personage or of a naval officer of whatever rank or nationality.

 (b.) Receiving or returning the visit of a Foreign Governor, Minister 'lenipotentiary, or military officer of high rank.

 (c.) Receiving formal visits from the consular body.

- (a.) Receiving formal visits from the consular body.
 (d.) Receiving or returning visits of native Potentates or Chiefs.
 (e.) Review or inspection of Naval, Military, or Constabulary Forces.
 (f.) All outdoor official ceremonies held in the daytime, such as the official landing, arrival, or departure of a Governor at a place within his administration, or on official visits to neighbouring localities; inspection of buildings, laying foundation stones, etc.
- 4. The new uniform may, if so desired, be worn at Church, but should not be worn at any evening ceremony, except on occasions where naval or military officers of any nationality are likely to be present in
- 5. Should it be necessary to wear the uniform mounted, white or dark blue pantaloons will be worn, with black or brown knee boots, and straight-necked steel hunting spurs. You are at liberty to choose between white or blue pantaloons of any material, and black or brown boots; but whichever is decided upon must be worn by all.

6. The ordinary Civil uniform will continue to be worn on the occasions of the celebration of the Sovereign's Birthday, the opening or closing of the Legislature, or any other special occasion, according to the discretion of the Officer Administering the Government.

 7. It is to be understood that in making this concession His Majesty the King is desirous of providing the members of his Colonial Service with a simple and inexpensive uniform that shall be more convenient for wearing in hot climates than the ordinary Civil uniform. His Majesty has been led to believe that the wearing of the latter uniform has for climatic reasons practically fallen into abeyance on many occasions where uniform ought unquestionably to be worn; and it is His Majesty's desire that in future there should be no excuse for not wearing uniform on these occasions. The adoption of the white uniform in the colony under your Government is left to your discretion, but, should it be adopted, it will accordingly be your daty to see that the wearing of it is made compulsory on all such occasions as those I have indicated.

 8. A sealed pattern of the new uniform has been deposited with the Crown Agents for the Colonies, and a sketch of the coat and helmet is enclosed for your further information.

Sir.

I have the honour to inform you that, in view of the difficulty experienced in establishing the nationality of the claimants when the British claims recently came up for examination before the Venezuelan Claims Commission, it has been decided by His Majesty's Government to encourage as much as possible the practice of registration at His Majesty's Consulates abroad, and more especially in the case of British subjects resorting to Central and South America; and the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has suggested the desirability of posting public notices at the various ports of emigration in the West Indies or other places in which it may seem advisable, impressing upon all emigrants of British nationality the advisability of having themselves registered at a British Consulate on the earliest opportunity after arrival at their destination, and warning them against the difficulties which their failure to do so may entail.

2. I enclose, for the information of your Ministers, a copy of the new regulations which have been issued to His Majesty's Consular Officers abroad on the subject, and have to request you to invite your Government to consider the necessity for the issue of a notification for the guidance of any emigrants to Foreign countries from the Colony under your Government, calling their attention to the new Consular Regulations affecting this matter.

REGISTRATION OF BRITISH SUBJECTS.

Every British subject is entitled, should be desire to do so, to register himself at a British Consulate, and to obtain a certificate that he is so registered.

Where it is desirable, on account of the number of persons presenting themselves for registration or for other reasons, to keep a special register of British subjects, it should be kept in accordance with the provisions of this circular.

The register should contain the particulars provided for in the form of Annex 1.

of Annex I.

An applicant for registration should be required to fill up a form (Annex 2), and should not be registered until his claim has been established to the satisfaction of the Consular officer.

British-protected persons should be registered in the register of British subjects, but the fact that they are British-protected persons should be noted in the register.

An applicant of European descent, who is not personally known to the Consular officer, claiming British nationality on the ground of birth within the British dominions, should produce a letter from some known and responsible person certifying to his identity and British nationality, or satisfactory evidence of some other description.

Where British nationality is claimed under the statute 4 Geo. II., cap. 21, ie., on the ground that the claimant's father was a natural-born British subject though the claimant was born abroad, the following evidence should be required:—

(a.) A certificate of the birth of the applicant.

- (b.) The marriage certificate of the parents.
- (c.) The birth certificate of the father.

Where the nationality is claimed by descent from the paternal grandfather under the statute 13 Geo. III., cap. 21, evidence in addition to that in paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) above should be required as to—

- (d.) The marriage of the paternal grandparents.(e.) The birth of the paternal grandfather within the British dominions.

In the case of persons of Asiatic or West Indian descent, or of natives of Africa, the following evidence may in general be considered sufficient:—

- (a.) A passport or certificate of fritish nationality issued to him as a British subject, or certificate of registration as a British subject, in British India or British possessions or by a British Consular officer.
- (b.) A birth certificate showing that he was born within His Majesty's dominions, or a certificate of naturalisation in the United Kingdom; and

(c.) In either of the above cases such further evidence of identity as the Consular Officer may think satisfactory.

Where the documents mentioned in (a) bear a date anterior to this circular, they should not be accepted as conclusive, if the Consular officer sees any reason to doubt the validity of the claim to British nationality; and, where the passport has been issued more than six months, evidence may be required from the applicant that he has not changed his nationality since the issue of the passport.

Natives of British Protectorates, or of the territories of any Prince or State in India under the suzerainty of or in alliance with His Majesty, must produce a passport issued by His Majesty's representative in their own country, together with evidence of identity if the Consular officer thinks necessary.

A British subject possessed of double nationality is entitled to registration (even though he may not be entitled to protection) in his country of origin.

A certificate of registration in the form of Annex 3 should be given on application to any person who is registered as a British subject or British-protected person on payment of fee No. 67. Where a person was registered before the issue of this circular, and the Consular officer is unaware whether the claim to British nationality was properly investigated before the entry was made, the Consular officer should obtain further evidence before the certificate is granted.

In cases where the Consular officer entertains doubt whether the applicant is entitled to registration, he should draw up a full statement of the facts and refer the matter to the Secretary of State for instructions.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations relating to Residential Leases of lands now open for selection, or which may hereafter be declared open for selection, as Residential Lots.

R. CECIL CLIFTON, Under Secretary for Lands.

Regulations for Residential Leases. Repeal.

1. The Regulations of the 27th day of May, 1903, and all other regulations heretofore made relating to Residential Leases, are hereby repealed.

Applications.

2. Any person above the age of eighteen years, resident in Western Australia, and intending to actually reside on the lot applied for, may be an applicant for land set apart for Residential Leases.

But no lease of any lot shall be applied for, granted to, or held by—

- (a.) Any Asiatic or African alien, except as provided in Regulation 38; or
- (b.) Any person having any interest in any other Residential Lot within two miles of the lot applied for, except such other lot has been approved by the Minister for a Business Permit, and is used for business purposes only.
- 3. Every application-
 - (I.) Shall be in the form of Schedule A, with the declaration therein contained; and
 - (2.) Shall be lodged with the Land Agent for the District; or, in case there is no Land Agent for the District, with the Warden or Resident Magistrate.
- 4. With every application the applicant shall pay a fee of Ten shillings, and the amount of rent payable in advance, in accordance with the provisions of "The Land Act, 1898," or any amendment thereof, and of the Regulations there-under
- 5. All applications shall be subject to the approval of the Minister; and the Land Agent, Warden, or Resident Magistrate shall forthwith forward the application, with his recommendation thereon, and the fee and rent, to the Under Secretary for Lands. The applicant may be granted by the Land Agent, Warden, or Resident Magistrate, respectively, permission to occupy temporarily the land applied for in the form of Schedule B.
- 6. The granting or refusal of the application shall be in the discretion of the Minister, but priority will, where practicable, be given to married applicants where husband and wife intend to reside on the area applied for.
- 7. If an application is refused, the rent paid with the application shall be returned to the applicant.
- 8. (1.) If an application is approved, a lease shall be granted to the applicant in the form or to the effect of Schedule C, as from the first day of the quarter next preceding the date of approval of the application, upon payment by the applicant of a fee of Ten shillings for the cost of the lease.
- (2.) On approval of an application, notice shall be given to the applicant by letter sent by post to his address.
- (3.) If the fee of Ten shillings is not paid within thirty days after the posting to the applicant of notice of approval, such approval shall be void and the application shall be deemed to have been refused.
- 9. The granting of any lease shall not be a waiver of the restrictions mentioned in Regulation 2.

Conditions of Lease.

- 10. No lease or interest in a lease shall, except as provided in Regulation 38, be held by any Asiatic or African alien, nor by any person under the age of eighteen years, nor by any person who is interested in any other Residential Lease within a distance of two miles, except as provided in Regulation 2.
- 11. Every lease shall be granted and held subject to the provisions of "The Land Act, 1898," and any amendment thereof, or any Act passed in substitution for the same, (hereinafter referred to as the Act), and the Regulations thereunder in force for the time being relating to Residential Leases (hereinafter referred to as the Regulations).

- 12. Every lease shall be limited to the natural surface of the land demised, and the land below the natural surface to a depth not exceeding 40 feet if situated within a gold-field or mineral district, and if not so situated, not exceeding 200 feet.
- 13. The term granted by any lease shall be for 999 years from the first day of January preceding the date of the application.
- 14. (1.) The yearly rent for each Residential Lot shall be Four pounds per centum on the capital unimproved value of the land, the minimum rent being Ten shillings per annum.
- (2.) The capital unimproved value of each Residential Lot shall be fixed by the Minister, and such value fixed on or before the granting of the lease shall be the basis of the yearly rent for the first ten years, and shall continue to be the rent until revaluation of the land is made, or caused to be made, by the Minister.
- (3.) The Minister may, for each subsequent period of ten years, make, or cause to be made, a valuation of each Residential Lot within the twelve calendar months next pending the expiration of the then current ten years, and the value so fixed shall be the basis of the yearly rent for the subsequent period of ten years. The capital unimproved value of each lot shall be the price at which the land in fee simple, unennumbered by any mortgage or charge thereon, might be expected to sell at the time when valued.
- (4.) The rent shall be payable half-yearly in advance, in accordance with the provisions of the Act.
- (5.) If the lessee of any Residential Lease granted before the publication of these Regulations wishes to bring the lease under these Regulations, he may do so by the payment of a fee of Ten shillings, when the lease shall be cancelled' and a new lease issued subject to these Regulations.
- (6.) All rates, taxes, etc., chargeable on the land must be paid by the lessee.
- 15. Possession of the Residential Lot shall be taken by the applicant within two calendar months of the approval of the application.
- 16. The lessee shall not, except as hereinafter provided, use the land or permit it to be used for any business, trade, or occupation, or for any purpose whatever other than bona-fide residence.
- 17. If a lessee, or the husband or wife of a lessee, has or acquires any interest in any other Residential Lot within two miles of the lot, except as hereinbefore provided in Regulation 2, the lease may be forfeited.

But this Regulation shall not apply where the husband or wife of a lessee is permanently living separate and apart from the lessee.

Transfers.

- 18. (1.) No transfer shall be allowed without the consent in writing of the Minister in that behalf first obtained, on application in the form of Schedule D. No such consent shall be given within twelve months of the granting of the lease, except in very special cases.
- (2.) On every such application the lease shall be produced, with a statutory declaration by the intended transferee in the form of Schedule E, and the fee of Twenty shillings shall be paid.
- (3.) No transfer shall be made to any person not entitled to be an applicant for or to hold the lease, and the consent of the Minister to the transfer shall not avoid a forfeiture of the lease, if it shall appear that the transferee was disqualified.
- 19. No portion of any Residential Lot shall be transferred or sub-let under any circumstances whatever.

Forfeiture.

- 20. (1.) A lease may be forfeited by the Minister-
 - (a.) If the rent is not fully paid at the times and in manner provided by the Act.
 - (b.) In case of breach, non-performance, or non observance of any of the conditions thereof or of the provisions of the Act or Regulations relating thereto.
- (2.) No acceptance of rent, or other act subsequent to any breach, non-performance, or non-observance as aforesaid shall be deemed to be, or operate, or be pleaded as a waiver of the forfeiture, and no forfeiture shall be waived otherwise than by an express waiver under the hand of the Minister.

- 21. A lease may be determined at the option of the lessee, at the expiration of any year of the tenancy, by notice in writing, given by the lessee to the Minister three months before the expiration of such year.
- 22. At any time during the continuance of or within one month after the determination of any lease, the lessee may remove any buildings or fixtures on the lot.
- 23. If, in the opinion of the Minister, a lease has been or has become liable to be forfeited, he shall give notice thereof to the lessee by letter sent by post addressed to the lessee at the lot in question, or by notice in the Government Gazette; and unless, within the time limited by such notice, the Minister is satisfied to the contrary, the lease may, by notice in the Government Gazette, be absolutely forfeited.

Mortgages.

24. A lessee may not mortgage his lease without the consent of the Minister. On such consent being given, a lease may be mortgaged in accordance with the provisions of the Act and Regulations, but such mortgage shall only be effected for the purpose of boak fide improving the lot. This Regulation shall not apply to mortgages effected prior to the coming into force of these Regulations.

Business Permits.

- 25. (1.) If, in the opinion of the Minister, it is desirable so to do, he may, in his discretion, grant to any lessee permission to carry on, upon his residential lot, any specified business or businesses.
- (2.) Such permission shall be granted at such additional rent as the Minister may in each case determine, and the additional rent, if any, shall be payable half-yearly in advance, as from the next preceding quarter-day.
- (3.) Such permission shall not be granted in respect of any Residential Lease granted before the publication of these Regulations, but such lease may be cancelled, and a new lease granted in lieu thereof, subject to these Regulations.
- 26. Application for a business permit shall be made in the form of Schedule F, and a deposit of £2 shall be paid with every application.
- 27. The application shall be lodged and dealt with as hereinbefore provided in the case of an application for a lease
- 28. Before granting permission, the Minister shall satisfy himself, by any such personal or other inquiry as he may deem fit, of the bona fides of the application, and that the permission applied for is necessary in the general interest of the neighbourhood.
- 29. If the Minister refuses to grant the permission applied for, the deposit, after deducting the expenses of the inquiry (if any), to be fixed by the Minister, shall be returned to the applicant.
- 30. If the Minister is prepared to approve of the grant of a permit, he shall give notice, by letter sent by post to the applicant, of the amount of additional rent fixed; and the applicant shall, within twenty-eight days after the posting of such letter, forward to the Minister the additional rent for the current half-year. If such rent is not received by the Minister within such time, the application shall be forthwith cancelled and the deposit forfeited. If such rent is so received the application shall be deemed granted, and the expense of any inquiry shall be deducted from the deposit, and the balance credited to the lessee on account of future rent.
- 31. Such permission may be granted in the form of Schedule G.
- 32. The additional rent shall be payable half-yearly in advance, at the times and in manner prescribed for payment of the rent reserved by the lease, and, in case of default in payment in accordance therewith, the permission may be cancelled by order of the Minister.
- 33. The permission may be cancelled by order of the Minister in his absolute discretion at any time if, in the opinion of the Minister, any business other than the business expressly authorised is carried on upon the residential lot.
- 34. The permission shall follow every approved transfer or sub-lease of the residential lot.
- 35. (1.) No lessee shall sell or allow or permit the sale of any liquor on his residential lot by virtue of any license under "The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Act, 1880," or any amendment thereof, or any Act passed in substitution for the same, for consumption either on or off the premises, without the special permission, in writing, of the Governor.

(2.) No such permission shall be granted for a longer period than one year without the special consent of the Governor, but every such permission may be renewed, and shall be revocable at any time at the discretion of the Governor.

Resumption.

36. The whole or any part of a residential lot leased, or agreed to be leased, under these Regulations, may be resumed by the Governor for mining purposes, or for any public purpose whatever, at three months' notice to the lessee, published in the Government Gazette; and, immediately after the expiration of such three months, all the estate and interest of the lessee therein shall cease and determine as if the lease had never been granted. But on any such resumption the lessee shall be entitled to receive from the land resumed, to be ascertained, in the absence of agreement, by one competent person to be appointed by the lessee and one by the Minister, and any difference of opinion between the said valuers shall be determined by the Resident Magistrate of the District or Warden of the Goldfield within which the land is situate acting as umpire.

Transmissions.

37. On the death or bankruptcy of a lessee his legal personal representative or the Official Receiver or trustee of his estate may be registered as the lessee, but a transfer to a person entitled to be an applicant for and to hold a lease shall be made by such representative, Official Receiver, or trustee, and registered within three calendar months thereafter, otherwise the lease shall be forfeited.

Special areas for Asiatic and African aliens.

38. Notwithstanding the exceptions contained in regulations 2 and 10, residential leases and business permits may be applied for, granted to, and held by Asiatic or African aliens under and subject to these regulations in respect of any land situated northward of the 25th degree of south latitude, and declared open for selection by Asiatic or African aliens.

Interpretation.

- 39. In these regulations the term "lessee" includes any authorised transferee or sub-lessee.
- 40. "Improvements" include all buildings, structures, fencing, clearing, and other work done, or material used thereon, by the expenditure of capital or labour by the lessee of the land, but in so far only as the effect thereof is to increase the value of the land, and the benefit thereof is unexhausted at the time of valuation.
