RECOMMENDED for the approval of His Excellency the Governor-General in Council that His Excellency be pleased to enter into arrangements with their Excellencies the Governors of the several States to the effect following:—

- 1. When a Commonwealth officer who is subject to the Public Service Regulations is summoned or called as a witness on behalf of a State, he shall, as regards his attendance to give evidence, be deemed to be in the performance of his duty as a Commonwealth officer, and no witness fees (other than the expenses, if any, paid by the Commonwealth for his travelling allowances) shall be charged by or paid to him on account of his being so summoned or called, but the State on whose behalf he was so summoned or called shall pay to the Commonwealth such sum as is sufficient to recoup the sum, if any, paid by it for the travelling allowances of the officer.
- 2. When a State officer who is subject to the Public Service Regulations of the State is summoned or called as a witness on behalf of the Commonwealth, he shall, as regards his attendance to give evidence, be deemed to be in the performance of his duty as a State officer, and no witness fees (other than the expenses, if any, paid by the State for his travelling allowances) shall be charged by or paid to him on account of his being so summoned or called, but the Commonwealth shall pay to the State such sum as is sufficient to recoup the sum (if any) paid by it for the travelling allowances of the officer.
- 3. Any claim for travelling allowances of an officer payable to the Commonwealth by a State, pursuant to this arrangement, may be rendered direct by the proper officer of the Commonwealth Department concerned to the proper officer of the State Department concerned, and any such claim payable to a State by the Commonwealth may be rendered direct by the proper officer of the State Department concerned to the proper officer of the Commonwealth Department concerned.

MUNICIPALITY OF COOLGARDIE.

By-Law No. 114. Licensing Hawkers.

A By-law of the Municipality of Coolgardie, made under Section 167 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and numbered 114, to amend By-law No. 100 of the said Municipality.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Coolgardie order as follows:

1. Any person hawking fruit, fish, vegetables, or any article of merchandise within the Municipality, without having obtained a license thereto from the Council, and paying a license fee of Three pounds (payable 1ss. quarterly) for the same, shall, for each such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

2. Such license shall be of force and effect within any part of the Municipality other than Bayley Street, or within nine chains of Bayley Street, and under no conditions whatever shall any hawker, whether licensed or otherwise, ply his trade in any part of the above-named Street, and any person attempting to do so shall, for each such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. Every license, notwithstanding the date of issue, shall be in force until the 31st day of December then next ensuing: Provided that it shall be at the discretion of the Council at any time to cancel or suspend any such license for sufficient cause shown.

A BY-LAW OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF FREMANTLE, MADE BY-LAW OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF FREMANTLE, MADE UNDER SECTION 167, PART VI., OF "THE MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS ACT, 1900," AND NUMBERED 40, FOR ALTERING BY-LAW NUMBERED 4, PUBLISHED IN THE "GOVERNMENT GAZETTE" OF THE 17TH DAY OF JULY, 1903, AND FOR REGULATING THE DRIVING OF HEAVY VEHICLES THROUGH OR OVER SPECIFIED STREET IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF FREMANTLE.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality order as follows :-

1. No person shall, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 1. No person shall, between the hours of a.m. and 6'30 p.m., drive or conduct, or cause or suffer or permit to be driven or conducted, any four-wheeled vehicle exceeding the weight of 9cwt., or any two-wheeled vehicle exceeding the weight of 8cwt. along the undermentioned street in the Municipality of Fremantle, namely :-

High Street, between Cliff Street and Queen Street: PROVIDED it shall not be an offence against this By-law for any person to drive or conduct any such vehicle across any street where it intersects any other street: PROVIDED further, that any person in going to or from any place situated in the above-mentioned street within the above-mentioned boundaries, for the purpose of loading or deliver-ing goods, or in proceeding to or from the place where such vehicle is kept, may drive or conduct any such vehicle along the portion of such street lying between the nearest available intersecting street and the place in question: PROVIDED lastly, that this By-law shall not apply to any vehicle used exclusively for the conveyance of passengers and persons.

2. Paragraph 11 of By-law numbered four for regulating the general traffic and processions within the Town of Fremantle, published in the Government Gazette of the 17th day of July, 1903, on page 1842 thereof, dealing with the driving or conducting of heavy vehicles, is hereby repealed.

3. Every person committing a breach of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
