REGULATIONS.

- (Under Part IV.)

 1. Applications under Part IV. of "The Rabbit Act, 1902," shall be made in duplicate in the Form A of the Schedule hereto, addressed to the Minister for Agriculture.
- Notice by the Minister to the applicant of the cost of the wire netting, and of the amount of the annual charge upon his holding, shall be in the Form B of the Schedule hereto.
- 3. No application for wire netting will be granted until an inspector has examined the land which it is proposed to enclose with rabbit-proof fencing, and has reported upon the same.
- 4. No netting shall be supplied for the purpose of attaching the same to any existing fence until the inspector shall have reported upon such fence as to its suitability for the attaching of such netting.
- The applicant will be required to produce satisfactory evidence of his title to the land, and to execute a mortgage in such form as the Crown Solicitor may approve, and to pay the cost of the preparation and registration thereof.
- 6. The wire netting shall be of such quality as the Minister, in the public interest, may think fit.
- 7. The fence to which the netting is to be applied shall consist of posts, strainers, and at least four wires, or three wires and a top rail. - 10. Interest at the rate of Four pounds per centum per annum will be charged upon the actual cost of the netting, and the delivered at the nearest railway station or shipping port, as and from the date of the completion of the mortgage; and will be payable half-yearly on the 30th day of June and the 31st day of December, in each year.

- The cost of the netting as aforesaid will be repayable by half-yearly instalments, extending over a period not exceeding twenty years; the first payment to be made on the 30th day of June, or the 31st day of December, as the case may be, next following the date of the completion of the mortgage.
- 12. The mortgagor may, at his option, repay the whole or any portion of his liability at any time during the currency of his mortgage.
- 13. The Government will be under no liability for failing to deliver, or for any delay in delivery of netting.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE APPOINTMENT AND CLASSIFICATION, ETC., OF THE SALARIED STAFF OF THE WESTERN AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Government Railways Act, 1904," the Commissioner of Railways for the State of Western Australia hereby makes the following Regulations for organising, classifying, and paying the salaried staff of the Government Railways, which regulations may to all intents and purposes be cited as the "Salaried Staff Regulations, 1905," and which shall come into operation and take effect as from the first day of July, 1905:—

INTERPRETATION.

For the purpose of these Regulations-

- "Commissioner" shall mean the Commissioner of Railways for the State of Western Australia for the time being, or such other person as may be appointed to act for or on behalf of the said Commissioner.
- "Department" shall mean the Western Australian Government Railways Department.

- "Head of the Branch" shall mean the Chief Traffic Manager, Chief Mechanical Engineer, Chief Engineer of Existing Lines, Chief Accountant, Chief Auditor, Chief Storekeeper, or such other head as may hereafter be appointed.
- "Officer" shall mean any other person who is in receipt of an annual salary, or any person who may be appointed under these Regulations.
- "Permanent" shall mean an officer who has served the full period of probation, and whose appointment has been confirmed by the Commissioner.
- "Temporary" shall mean a person who is engaged upon probation or upon work which, in the opinion of the Head of the Branch, is not likely to necessitate a permanent appointment, and whose services are temporarily required; whose term of employment, etc., shall in all cases be at the discretion of the Head of the Branch.

APPOINTMENT AND PROBATION.

ADMISSION TO THE SERVICE.

Applications for admission to the Service must be made on the usual Departmental form.

The form must be filled in in the applicant's own handwriting, and addressed to the Commissioner.

Each application must be supported with the following documentary testimony, viz.:—

- (a.) Registrar's Certificate of Birth, or in the event of such not being obtainable, a duly sworn statutory declaration of date of birth from a parent, guardian, person of good repute, or from the candidate should he be over the age of 21 years.
- (b.) Educational certificate equal to the sixth Standard of the Western Australian State Schools in the case of cadets, or where otherwise required.
- (c.) Three satisfactory testimonials of character, one of which must be from the last employer or, in the event of a candidate just leaving school, from the head master of the school he last attended, or should neither of these be obtainable, a satisfactory reason must be forthcoming.

The age of admission shall be:-

 For a Cadet (Clerical Division) For an Engineering Cadet For other position than Cadet 	15 years 16 ,,	Maximum. 17 years 18 ,, 35 ,,
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Provided always, that in special cases to meet the requirements of the Service the Commissioner may admit any person whose age may be beyond the maximum.

CADETS.

Selection of Cadets.—In the event of cadets being required for the Clerical Division, applications will be invited by public advertisement.

Any person desirous of becoming a candidate must send an application in his own handwriting to the Commissioner in the form prescribed in these Regulations. The application must be enclosed in a sealed envelope, which must be marked "Application for the Office of Cadet."

On expiration of the time fixed for receipt of applications, the envelopes shall be opened, and the names and particulars recorded.

On a fixed date, of which due notice will be given, each applicant must present himself before a Selection Board appointed by the Commissioner,

which Board may make such tests and conduct such examinations as they may deem necessary, and those eligible and suitable for employment as Cadets will be selected. Should the number selected exceed the number required, the most suitable will be engaged, and the name and address of each of the remaining shall be recorded in the order of their suitability, as determined by the Board, in a register kept for the purpose, and in the event of further Cadets being required during six calendar months following the date of selection, those registered shall be communicated with in their respective order. At the expiration of 12 months the applications will lapse.

The age of Candidates shall be reckoned to the date fixed for the receipt of applications.

Engineering Cadets.—Before a candidate is admitted as an Engineering Cadet, he will be required to satisfactorily pass a qualifying examination in Elementary Mathematics and Freehand Drawing, the subjects being as follows:—

- (a.) Arithmetic and Mensuration.
- (b.) Algebra.
- (c.) Euclid.
- (d.) Trigonometry.
- (e.) Mechanics.
- (f.) Simple Freehand Drawing.

Should there be more candidates than there are vacancies, their appointment will be in the order of merit. The period of cadetship will be five (5) years, and during this term he may be employed:—

Mechanical Engineering:

- (1.) For the first three and a-half (3½) years (approximately) in the various branches of the Workshops as may be directed.
- (2.) For the remaining one and a-half (1½) years in the Drawing Office and Test Room, or upon such other work as may be directed.

Civil Engineering:

Studying and practising drawing, surveys, and location of works, and carrying out works in the field, as may be directed.

Pass-out Examinations.—Each cadet will be required to pass a final or "pass-out" examination at the termination of his cadetship, and no cadet who fails to pass such examination shall be entitled to any certificate. The subjects included in the "pass-out" examination will be as follows:—

$Mechanical\ Engineering:$

- (a.) Applied Mechanics.
- (b.) Materials of Construction, their manufacture and physical characteristics.
- (c.) The Strength of Materials and Design of Structures.
- (d.) Hydraulics.
- (e.) Theory and Practice of Heat Engines.
- (f.) Theory of Workshops' Practice.
- (g.) Mechanical Drawing and Machine Design.
- (h.) Elementary Electrical Engineering.

In addition to the above subjects, each cadet will be required to satisfactorily pass a practical examination as to his proficiency as a mechanic.

Civil Engineering:--

- (a.) The construction, adjustment, and use of the Level, Theodolite, Clinometer, Box Sextant, and Prismatic Compass.
- (b.) Plotting Surveys and Sections.

- (c.) Calculation of Areas, Traverses, and Volumes.
- (d.) General Principles governing the Grading and Construction of Roads with Metal or Gravel; Roads on loose sand and wet clay; Town Streets—Kerbing, Channelling, Wood-paving.
- (e.) Strength of Materials, Stresses in ordinary structures of wood, iron, and brick, including the Designing and Preparation of Working Drawings for same.
- (f.) Simple Hydraulic Calculations, including the Discharge of Culverts, Long Pipes, Open Channels, the Discharge over Weirs, etc.

In addition, each Civil Engineering Cadet must, during the period of Cadetship, pass the examination established by the Survey Department of W.A. for a "Licensed Surveyor," and an exception shall not be made unless the Commissioner is satisfied that the location of any Cadet or other cause does not admit of his passing such examination.

General.—Specimen examination papers shall be issued from time to time, showing the extent of the work embraced in the above examinations.

In the event of any Cadet failing to pass the final examination, his term of Cadetship may, at the discretion of the Commissioner, be extended for a period not exceeding one year, his salary during such period being the same as that allowed for the fifth year of Cadetship.

At the end of such extension he shall again be examined, and should he fail to satisfactorily pass the examination, his services will be dispensed with.

A Board of Examiners will be appointed by the Commissioner to conduct all examinations comprised in this section.

SELECTED CANDIDATES TO PASS MEDICAL EXAMINATION.

Each selected candidate shall be required to pass an examination by a medical officer appointed by the Department, that he is free from bodily or mental infirmity, and that he is physically fitted to perform the duties of the position applied for. The cost of such examination shall be borne by the candidate. He shall also pass the departmental test for vision and hearing as required.

PROBATION.

(a.) Each person appointed under these regulations shall be considered to be temporary until having served a period of probation as follows, viz. :—

Cadet One year. Any other person ... One year.

- (b.) Each clerical cadet engaged in the head offices, or in such other office as may be required, shall qualify in Pitman's system of shorthand, and no cadet shall be permanently appointed in these offices unless he can write, and accurately transcribe, at the rate of 40 words per minute. Each cadet shall also qualify in typewriting before the expiration of the period of probation, where the conditions of employment permit.
- (c.) Each cadet in other offices shall qualify in the work on which he is engaged.
- (d.) No appointment to the permanent staff shall be made until confirmed by the Commissioner.

(e.) In computing the service of an officer for any purpose, the period of probation shall count.

DUTIES AND DISCIPLINE.

- (a.) Each officer shall confine himself exclusively to his duties, and will hold his appointment conditionally on his being subject to and strictly observing all rules, regulations, and instructions. The duties to be performed and the discipline to be observed shall be as specified in the rules, regulations, and instructions of the Department which may be in force, and which may come into force from time to time, and such rules, regulations, and instructions shall be read in conjunction with these Regulations.
- (b.) No officer shall use for political or other purposes unconnected with the department, information gained in the course of duty.
- (c.) Except in the course of official duty, no information concerning public business, or any matter of which an officer has knowledge officially, shall be given, directly or indirectly, by an officer to anyone without express permission of the Commissioner.
- (d.) No officer shall seek the influence of, or address any communication to, any outside person or persons concerning his duties in the Department, nor seek the influence or interest of any such person or persons with a view to obtain promotion or any other advantage.
- (e.) No officer shall engage in any employment outside the duties of his office; or in any way participate, or claim to be entitled to participate, in the profits of, or in any benefit or emolument arising from any contract or agreement made by or on behalf of the Government, but this shall not debar any officer from holding the position of secretary to a registered Friendly Society, or to any society of railway servants.
- (f.) If the estate of an officer shall become sequestrated, either voluntarily or compulsorily, for the benefit of his creditors, such officer shall report the full circumstances, through the head of his branch, to the Commissioner, and shall apply, as soon as he may legally do so, to the Court for a certificate of discharge. If such officer does not so report, or apply for such certificate of discharge, or if he applies, and it appears from the report that such officer has been guilty of fraud, dishonourable conduct, or extravagance, such officer may be dismissed or otherwise dealt with by the Commissioner.
- (g.) If an officer is, on an indictment, convicted of any offence, he shall be dismissed the service.

Hours of Duty.

The hours of duty shall be as prescribed from time to time.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

After twelve months' continuous service, each Officer shall be entitled to leave of absence for recreation.

The term shall be :--

- 1. Officers in Head and District Offices
- 12 days' leave annually, exclusive of Sundays and such public holidays as may fall within the period of leave; and on such public holidays as they may be conveniently spared.
- 2, Other Officers-

Station-masters and Officers in Charge at Booking Stations, and Booking and other Clerks who work each Sunday

Night Officers at Booking Stations who are on duty each night in the year 12 hours per night

Inspectors and Foremen, whose duties necessitate their attendance on Sundays

Station-masters and Officers in Charge at Booking Stations and Booking and other Clerks who regularly work each alternate Sunday.

Sunday.
Officers in Charge and
Night Officers at Nonbooking Stations who
work each Sunday

Night Officers at Booking Stations who work each night in the year, but whose hours do not exceed nine per night

Station - masters, and Officers-in-Charge and Night Officers, Booking and other Clerks who do not perform Sunday duty, or who only perform Sunday duty occasionally.

- 24 days' leave annually, exclusive of Sundays.
- 15 days' leave bi-annually, exclusive of Sundays.

- 18 days' leave annually, exclusive of Sundays.
- 12 days' leave annually, exclusive of Sundays.

Leave of absence shall be calculated to the close of each financial year, and shall be paid for at the salary the officer is in receipt of at the time such leave is taken.

The leave shall be applied for and taken out at a time convenient to the Department, before the 30th June following the year for which it fell due. At the expiration of that time the leave shall lapse, unless such leave shall have been deferred by the Department, or the permission of the Commissioner obtained to its accumulating.

- (a.) Each application for leave to accumulate must be supported by good and sufficient reasons, and the granting of such shall be subject to the recommendation of the Head of the Branch, and to the approval of the Commissioner.
- (b.) In no case shall leave be permitted to accumulate beyond two periods for a night officer receiving leave bi-annually, and three periods for any other officer.
- (c.) In very urgent cases, leave in addition to the foregoing may be granted on the recommendation of the head of the branch, and subject to the approval of the Commissioner, to any officer, without pay, for a period not exceeding three (3) months.

- (d.) An officer who resigns, or whose services have been dispensed with, shall not be entitled to any leave beyond that due to 30th June preceding the date of such officer leaving the service, or to participate in any other privilege of the Department in any respect whatever.
- (e.) In cases where the exigencies of the service have entailed extra hours and work upon an officer, he may represent the particulars to the head of the branch, whose recommendation shall be dealt with by the Commissioner in connection with holidays due as he may deem fit.

LONG SERVICE LEAVE.

The Commissioner may grant to any officer who has continued in the railway service for ten years long service leave for three months on full pay, or six months on half pay, and for each ten years subsequent the same conditions may apply.

Service subsequent to advancement to seventh class, and also service prior to the date of this Classification, shall be counted.

During the year in which long service leave is ranted, the ordinary annual leave shall be void.

SICK LEAVE.

- (a.) Should an Officer be unable to attend to duty through illness, he shall notify his superior officer.
- (b.) An Officer may be called upon to submit a medical certificate when absent from duty for any period.
- (c.) If the absence exceeds one week an Officer may be called upon to produce further medical certificates from time to time, or to be examined by a medical officer of the Department.
- d.) Application for payment for leave on account of illness shall be made to the Head of the Branch, who shall forward the application with his recommendation to the Commissioner, whose decision shall be final.
- (e.) No payment shall be made unless upon the production of a satisfactory medical certificate from time to time, as may be directed, and an Officer failing to produce a medical certificate when called upon shall be treated as absent without leave.
- (f.) Annual leave shall not be affected by sick leave.

TRAVELLING ALLOWANCE.

(a.) Travelling allowances will be granted as follows, subject to the conditions named:—

Twenty-five per cent. $(25^{\circ}/_{\circ})$ additional allowance will be granted an Officer stationed outside the Goldfields areas when travelling in the Goldfields areas, e.g., from Yerbillon and East thereof and Yalgoo and East thereof.

In special cases the above scale may be varied by the Commissioner.

Engineering Surveyors will be granted a daily allowance of 4s. in place of the scale before-mentioned whilst in camp provided by the Department.

The "Daily Allowance" shall be granted when an Officer is travelling or absent from his usual location a day and a night. Portions of the "Daily Allowance" shall be computed as under:—

- If leaving Home Station before 8 a.m., entitled to Breakfast Allowance.
- If arriving at Home Station after 1 p.m., entitled to Luncheon Allowance.
- If leaving Home Station before 1 p.m., entitled to Luncheon Allowance.
- If arriving at Home Station after 6 p.m., entitled to Tea Allowance.
- If leaving Home Station (for all night) before 6 p.m., entitled to Tea Allowance.
- If arriving at Home Station after 8 a.m. (after travelling during the night), entitled to Breakfast Allowance.

In case of an Officer's duty preventing return to Home Station before midnight an "All night" allowance will be granted.

An Officer travelling on duty and able to return to head-quarters within nine (9) hours shall not be entitled to more than one quarter of the daily allowance.

Vouchers must show each day's movements, and state the time of departure from and arrival at the various places.

An Officer whose duties necessitate continuous travelling or prolonged absence from Home Station may be paid a weekly or monthly allowance, as may be determined by the Commissioner.

LODGING ALLOWANCE.

A Cadet living away from home may, at the discretion of the Head of the Branch, when on duty, be paid 10s. per week lodging allowance during the first year, 8s. per week during the second, 6s. per week during the third, and 4s. per week during the fourth year.

TRANSFER ALLOWANCE.

An Officer when transferred from one Station to another to suit the convenience of the Department shall be paid actual out-of-pocket expenses not exceeding:—

£2 when married. 15s. when single,

In addition, a free pass for himself and family dependent upon him, and free railway transport of furniture and effects. shall be granted.

An Officer whose wife and family do not reside with him shall be treated as single.

The granting of allowances in excess of those as provided above, to meet special cases, shall be at the discretion of the Commissioner.

When an Officer is allowed to transfer from one place to another to suit himself, or is transferred on account of misconduct, he shall be allowed a free pass for himself and family and furniture, but no expenses.

House Allowance.

(a.) Each Station-master, Goods Agent, and Officer-in-Charge shall be provided with quarters free of charge, as far as conditions admit. Where quarters are not provided the following allowance shall be made in lieu thereof, viz.:—

Station-master or Goods Agent ... £50 per annum. Officer-in-Charge £26 per annum.

This allowance shall not be granted to Relieving Officers receiving the regulation travelling allowance.

- (b.) Officers must reside in quarters provided by the Department, and such quarters must not be let or sublet without the approval of the Commissioner.
- (c.) Officers shall be held responsible for the careful use and preservation of any quarters in which they may reside.

GOLDFIELDS ALLOWANCE.

An Officer stationed in the Goldfields areas, e.g., Yerbillon and East thereof and Yalgoo and East thereof, shall, in addition to salary, be granted Goldfields Allowance on the following scale:

To an Officer in receipt of an annual salary of over $\pounds 250$

... £50 per annum.

To an Officer in receipt of an annual

salary of over £150 and up to £250 £30 per annum.

To an Officer in receipt of an annual

... £20 per annum salary of £150 and under (Provided that nothing herein contained shall prejudicially affect the goldfields allowance an Officer is in receipt of on the date on which these Regula-

tions come into force).

UNIFORM.

The following uniform shall be supplied free of charge, viz., to Station-masters, Night Stationmasters, Officers-in-Charge, and Night Officers, and Traffic Inspectors of the Traffic Branch:

- 1 cap and 1 helmet bi-annually (Night Officers, 1 cap annually).
- 1 summer suit annually, consisting of coat, vest, and trousers.
- 1 winter suit annually, consisting of coat, vest, and trousers.

FREE PASSES.

After twelve months' continuous service an Officer may be allowed three (3) first-class passes per annum, as under:

- (a.) One station to station pass on the occasion of the annual leave, to cover the full term of annual leave due.
- (b.) Two privilege passes from one given station to another and return.
- (c.) The passes may be issued in favour of the Officer, his wife, and members of his family (in the case of females unmarried, and in the case of males under 18 years of age) solely dependent upon the officers The concession may be exearnings. tended to the mother or the sister of an unmarried Officer residing with him, and solely dependent upon his earnings.
- (d.) Free passes may be issued to an officer of the Department for the purpose of attending the Government Technical School, and approved Shorthand, Accounts, Safe-working, and other classes at the Railway Institute, on production of a certificate from the Master of the School or from the Secretary of the Institute. The passes are to be used exclusively for the purpose for which they are issued.

Officers in isolated parts may be issued medical passes at the discretion of the Head of the Branch.

Officers in isolated parts shall be issued market passes, on application, once per month, to the nearest approved market town. The pass may be issued in favour of the Officer, his wife, or his housekeeper, and may include his children under twelve years of

For the purpose of free transport of household provisions for the use of his family alone, a free freight order shall also be issued monthly for a maximum weight of 2cwt. Daily provisions such as meat, bread, and vegetables may also be carried free from the nearest market town.

Officers between Hine's Hill and Carrabin shall have the option of market passes, etc., to Northam or Southern Cross.

PRIVILEGE TICKETS.

After six months' continuous service an Officer shall be allowed first-class privilege return tickets at one-half the ordinary single fare (minimum, 1s. for an adult and 6d. for a child).

The privilege ticket shall be issued on production of the departmental order in favour of the Officer, his wife, and members of his family under 18 years of age, and who are solely dependent upon his earnings. The concession may also be extended to the mother or a sister of an unmarried Officer residing with him, and solely dependent upon his

PRIVILEGE SEASON TICKETS.

First-class Season Tickets at one-half the ordinary Season Ticket rates will, on application and on production of the Departmental Certificate, be issued to an Officer to enable him to travel between his place of occupation and the station nearest to which he resides. To an Officer in receipt of less than £110 per annum, one-quarter of the ordinary Season Ticket rates shall be charged.

These Season Tickets shall be available only whilst the holder is in the employment of the Department.

MISCONDUCT.

For misconduct, breach of rules, regulations, and instructions, Officers render themselves liable to be cautioned, fined, suspended, reduced to a lower class or grade, or dismissed.

The Head of the Branch shall decide the form of investigation, and the action to be finally taken, excepting as to reduction in position or dismissal, which shall be referred to the Commissioner for his decision.

SALARY DURING SUSPENSION.

Where an Officer is suspended, and the charge is not proven, full salary for the period of suspension shall be allowed.

Where the charge is admitted or proved, the Officer may be deprived of salary for the whole or any portion of the period of suspension, but in any such case the Commissioner shall decide the amount of salary of which it is intended to deprive the Officer, and any such deprivation shall be regarded and recorded as part of the punishment.

APPEAL.

Officers shall have the right of appeal against any fine, reduction to a lower class or grade, or dismissal, and such appeal shall be dealt with by the Appeal Board constituted under "The Government Railways Act, 1904," and regulations in connection therewith.

RESIGNATIONS AND RETIREMENTS.

- (a.) No permanent officer shall leave the Department until the expiration of one calendar month's notice, in writing. Excepting in cases of summary dismissal, one calendar month's notice, in writing (dating from the day on which such notice is given), will be given by the Department in case of those permanent officers whose services are no longer required.
- (b.) Before leaving the Department, each officer shall hand to his successor, or to his next superior officer, all the property of the Commissioner entrusted to his care.
- (c.) An officer who resigns, or who is dismissed, shall not be re-employed in the Department except with the approval of the Commissioner.

REDUCTION IN THE STAFF.

- (d.) Whenever the Commissioner considers it is necessary to reduce the number of the Staff, the following shall be the course adopted with regard to the re-employment of retrenched officers, viz.:—
- (e.) The name and address of each officer shall be registered. As vacancies occur, each shall, in order of seniority of service, all other things being equal, have the offer of re-employment in any position in the Department for which he is qualified.
- (f.) An officer having left the Department on account of retrenchment, and being re-employed within twelve months, may, with the approval of the Commissioner, be credited with the period of former service, but the salary at which the re-employment is made shall be the starting factor for future advancement.
- (g.) An officer, who has reached the age of 60 years, may be called upon to retire, and the Commissioner shall decide whether any such officer having reached this age shall continue in the Department.

CLASSIFICATION.

- (a.) On the first day of September, 1905, the Commissioner shall cause all officers then in the service of the Department to be classified according to the classification set forth in the schedule embodied in these Regulations: Provided that such classification shall not tend to diminish the salary any officer is in receipt of on the first day of July, 1905, the date from which the classification will operate.
- (b.) A list of the officers, showing their respective positions in the classification, shall be prepared, and shall be available to each salaried officer, and such list shall remain open for 30 days after the date of issue. Should an officer be dissatisfied with his position on the classification or rate of salary assigned, he may appeal through his superior officer to the Commissioner, whose decision shall be final. The lists will be closed at the expiration of the 30 days, and amended if necessary, and will thenceforth form the basis of operation of the classification.

(c.) The Staff shall be divided into classes, and each class shall be subdivided as set forth in the following schedule, and the rate of salary of an officer in the subdivision of any such class shall be that assigned to such subdivision:—

- (e.) Each cadet in the eighth class, who, in the second year of cadetship, obtains a certificate from an examiner appointed by the Department as being able to write 80 words per minute in Pitman's system of shorthand, may be allowed to count three months' service for such certificate; and each cadet, who, in the third year, obtains a similar certificate for 120 words per minute, may be allowed to count an additional three months (making six months in all), and the date of promotion shall be arranged accordingly.
- (f.) All new appointments shall be made to the first subdivision of the eighth class, provided always that the Commissioner may employ any person of known skill and ability.
- (g.) Each officer of the seventh and eighth classes shall be entitled to annual increments, subdivision to subdivision, up to a maximum of £150 per annum, provided always that such advances are conditional on efficiency of the officer concerned. "Efficiency" in this clause shall mean special qualifications and aptitude for the discharge of the duties of the office to be filled, together with merit and good and diligent conduct.
- (h.) The granting of an increment to any other officer shall be by merit, and upon the value of worked performed.
- (i.) No officer shall be advanced within a class, except by promotion, from one subdivision to the next higher subdivision, nor until he has been at least twelve months in the subdivision from which it is proposed to advance him, but in special cases advancement may be authorised by the Commissioner.
- (j.) Should the exigencies of the Department's finances require it, a general suspension of the classification advances may be made.

VACANCIES.

When a vacancy occurs in any branch, a list of the officers eligible shall be made in the order of seniority of service, and should the head of the branch recommend a junior officer for the position, there shall accompany such recommendation the reasons for passing over the senior officer. The decision of the Commissioner shall be final.

PROMOTION.

Promotion shall be made according to merit and seniority, and shall be determined by the Commissioner.

On the promotion of an officer, he shall, as a rule, be paid the minimum rate of pay assigned to the class to which he is promoted, being, however, in no case less than the rate of pay he was receiving at the time of promotion.

Examinations shall be made from time to time as may be prescribed by the Commissioner.

An officer desiring to be passed over in the event of promotion being offered shall, if his request be acceded, forfeit his right to future promotion; but if good and sufficient reasons have been given to the satisfaction of the Commissioner, he may restore such right.

No officer shall refuse compliance with any order directing his transfer from one position to another.

GENERAL.

- (a.) Should an officer be transferred from another branch of the Government service to the Railway Department, such transfer shall not carry with it any rights or privileges contrary to, or in conflict with, the Regulations of the Railway Department.
- (b.) Nothing in these Regulations shall be held to confer on an officer any right or title under regulations which may have existed prior to the date of the issue of these Regulations.
- (c.) No officer, unless authorised, shall incur liability or enter into any contract on behalf of the Department, or alter the terms or conditions of any contract.
- (d.) In the matter of accounts and the collection and remittance and payment of public moneys, each officer is enjoined to conform strictly to "The Audit Act, 1904," and such regulations and instructions as may be issued from time to time.
- (e.) A son of an officer shall not be engaged in any office or at any station under his father after he attains the age of 21.
- (f.) All officers who have served three years on the goldfields shall be considered for a transfer to the coast as vacancies occur.
- (g.) An officer not employed on the relief staff, required to temporarily carry out the duties of a higher position, shall, subject to the approval of the Commissioner, receive the minimum salary attached to such higher position, provided that such increase shall not commence until the officer relieved is on half pay.

- (h.) In the event of any question arising as to the meaning of these Regulations or any part thereof, or as to anything done or alleged to have been done thereunto, or contrary thereto, it shall be refered to the Commissioner, whose decision shall be final.
- (i.) All regulations and instructions in force at the coming into operation of these Regulations are, in so far as they are in conflict with these Regulations, hereby revoked.
