WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of leasing for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that Reserve ⁹⁸⁵⁷ (Denham Lot 29) should vest in and be held by the Sharks Bay Road Board in trust for "Mechanics' Institute and Recreation": NOW, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Sharks Bay Road Board, with power to the said Sharks Bay Road Board to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease.

Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*: AND

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that Reserve ⁹⁴¹⁸ for Recreation, at Harris (Vivien), should be placed under the control of R. D. Knott, T. Kealey, P. Coyne, John Hince, and John Smith as a Board of Management: NOW, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of R. D. Knott, T. Kealey, P. Coyne, John Hince, and John Smith as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve, for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon, for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.
