REGULATION RESTRICTING CUTTING OF TIMBER ON STATE FOREST AT BOORARA.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulation under the provisions of Section 161 of "The Land Act, 1898:"—

No person shall, without the special permission in writing of the Minister for Lands or his agent (such permission only to be given where the timber is required for use within the boundaries of the said State Forest), fell, cut, split, or remove any timber growing or standing on the area of Crown land hereafter to be known and distinguished as Boorara State Forest, the boundaries of which are described hereunder:—
