WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900' (64 Vict., No. 8), the Governor may, by Proclamation, annex any land forming with the municipal district of some municipality one continuous area to such municipality: And whereas a petition has been presented praying for the annexation to the Municipality of Leederville of certain land herinafter described, situated partly within the Municipal District of Subiaco and partly within the Perth Road District: AND WHEREAS the said petition was publicly advertised in the Government Gazette on the 29th day of September, 1905, as required by law: Now THEREFORE I, Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, G.C.B., Governor as aforesaid, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby annex to the Munici-

pality of Leederville the area contained within the follow-

Bounded by lines starting from the present West boundary of the municipality at its intersection with the North side of Ruby Street, and extending West 4 chains 30 links, and South 21 chains 50 links to the North side of Cambridge Street; thence along the latter West to the East boundary of Perthshire Location A1; thence South along it and an Eastern boundary of Location 2103 to the Northern side of the road to the City Endowment; thence along the latter road to the City Endowment; thence along the latter North-Eastward to the South-West corner of Location North boundaries and part of the West boundary of Swan Location 2123 and its production North to the centre of Salvado Road; thence along said centre Eastward to a point South of the West corner of Swan Location 1096; thence North to the South side of Cambridge Street, and along it Eastward to the present West boundary of the Municipality, and along the latter Northward to the starting point.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Circuit Courts Act, 1897," the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation published in the Government time to time, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, declare that such portions of the State of Western Australia as he thinks fit shall form Circuit Districts; and further that a sitting of the Supreme Court shall be held in every District once at least every three months, at a time to be appointed by the Governor by the like or any subsequent Proclamation: AND WHEREAS, by Proclamation details a 2nd day of May 1002, the they for Governor tion dated the 22nd day of May, 1902, the then Governor declared that a portion of the said State should be constituted a Circuit District, to be known as the Eastern Goldfields Circuit District, and appointed the third Wednesday in December as one of the times at which a sitting of the Supreme Court should be held: AND WHEREAS by Proclamation dated the 21st day of October, 1903, the fourth Monday in November was substituted for the third Wednesday in December as the time at which a sitting of the Supreme Court, in each year, should be held in the said Circuit District: AND WHEREAS it is desirable to alter the time for the holding of the said Court in the said Circuit District in the month of November for criminal business and remanets from the last September sittings: Now THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint the third Monday in November instant, in lieu of the fourth Monday in November instant, for the holding of a sitting of the Supreme Court in the said Circuit District for the exercise of all criminal jurisdiction, original or appellate, capable of being exercised by the Chief Justice or any Judge of the Supreme Court, and for the trial and determination of any civil causes being remanets from the last September sitting of the Supreme Court in the said Circuit District: AND I DO HEREBY appoint and confirm the fourth Monday in November instant for the holding of a sitting of the Supreme Court in the said Circuit District for the exercise of all civil jurisdiction for the trial and determination of causes for which notice of trial shall have been given for the November sitting of the said Court in the said Circuit District.

WHEREAS by "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1902" (1 and 2 Edwardi VII., No. 20), the Governor may, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, after the opinion of the Road Board of the District has been requested, close any road or reservation for a road which may have been surveyed or shown as a road on any plan published by the Department of Lands and Surveys: Provided such road is

not within the limit of a Municipality or Townsite, and has not been declared a Government road or a road under "The Roads Act," or any Act amending the same: AND WHEREAS the roads hereinatter described have been surveyed and shown as roads on Plan 28/80, as published by the Department of Lands and Surveys: And it is desirable to close such roads: And WHEREAS the opinion of the Gingin Road Board has been requested; Now THEREFORE I, Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, G.C.B., Governor as aforesaid, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the said surveyed roads to be closed.

#### DESCRIPTIONS ABOVE REFERRED TO:

- 1. The surveyed road starting from the West boundary of Swan Location 1870, where it joins the South boundary of Swan Location 1500, and extending East to the South-East corner of Location 1501; thence from the opposite side of Road No. 2176 Eastward, as surveyed, Diagram 10841, to the Eastern boundary of Swan Location 1870.
- The surveyed road starting from the North-East corner of Swan Location 1702, and extending West, as surveyed, to Road No. 2176.

HEREAS by a Regulation made under "The Stock Diseases Act. 1895." and published in the Government Gozette on the 18th September, 1903, it was provided, inter alia, that no cattle should leave the East Kimberley Quarantine Area except at the Port of Wyndham: And whereas by the said Act it is provided that the Governor may, from time to time, by Order in Council, exempt such stock as he may think fit from the operations of any of the stock as he may think fit from the operations of any of the provisions thereof, either by generic or particular description: AND WHELEAS it is deemed expedient to permit the removal of certain stock from within the boundaries of the East Kimberley Quarantine Area, via Derby: Now THERE-East Kimberey Quaractine Area, via Derby: Now There-fore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby exempt from the operation of the said Regulation under the said Act, six hundred head of cattle, the property of Messrs. Copley & Co.

WHEREAS by Section 96 of "The Roads Act, 1902," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of "The Permanent Reserves Act, 1899," the Governor may place any Public Reserve under the control and management of a Road Board, and that for the purpose of controlling or manag ng such Reserve the Board shall have all the power of a Board of Parks and Reserves appointed under "The Parks and Reserves Act, 1895," together with the powers conferred by "The Roads Act, 1902": AND WHEREAS it is

expedient that Reserve  $\frac{\Lambda}{5967}$  (Woodanilling Sub. NOBEL PEACE PRIZE.

All proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed December 10, 1906, must, in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the first of re ruary of the same veer.

Any one of the following persons is held to be duly qualified: (a) Members, acting and former, of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute; (b) Members of Parliament and Members of Government of the different States, as well as Members of the Interparliamentary Union; (c) Members of the International Arbitration Court at the Hague; (d) Members of the Commission of the International Peace Bureau; (e) Members of the Institute of International Law; (f) University professors of Political Science and of Law, of History and of Philosophy; and (g) Persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize. The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.

According to the Code of Statutes, § 8, the grounds upon which any proposal is made must be stated, and handed in along with such papers as may therein be referred to.

According to § 3, every written work, to qualify for a prize, must have appeared in print.

For particulars qualified persons are requested to apply to the office of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, Drammensvei 19, Kristiania.
