The ad valorem duty upon bills of exchange and promissory notes drawn or made in Western Australia, except bills of exchange and promis-sory notes payable on demand, shall be denoted by impressed stamps, to be impressed on a blank space to be provided for the purpose on the billform or note form, seven inches (more or less) from the right hand side thereof, and half-aninch from the top thereof; and
- (2.) The duty of one penny on receipts may be denoted either by an impressed stamp or an adhesive stamp.

FREMANTLE HARBOUR TRUST.

ROUS HEAD SLIP-AMENDED REGULATIONS.

The Regulations made by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners for the working of Rous Head Slip, dated 6th May, 1904, are hereby amended by the addition of the following provision, viz.:

The Commissioners may, at their discretion, specially permit more than one vessel to be taken upon the slip at one time, provided that in no case must the aggregate maximum weight of such vessels exceed the limit of the capacity of the slip as laid down in these Regulations.

In the event of such special permission being granted, there may be made a reduction in charges equal to twenty-five per centum from the charges that would be made under these Regulations if the said vessels were dealt with separately.

Vessels slipped together must leave the slip at the same time.

For the purpose of these Regulations "a day" shall comprise twenty-four hours from the time the slip is ordered to be ready to take up any vessel or vessels, and after the first day charges may be computed for each half or fraction of each half of twenty- four hours during which the cradle is occupied.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS UNDER "THE IN-DUSTRIAL CONCILIATION AND ARBITRATION ACT, 1902."

In pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by "The Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1902," and of every other power and authority enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the following amending Regulations, that is to say:-

Clause (a) of Regulation No. 2 shall be amended to read as

2. (a.) In the case of a Union of Workers, a list in form numbered 7 in the schedule annexed hereto of the names of the numbered 7 in the schedule attracted hereto of the names of the members, officers, and trustees (if any) of the Society and their addresses, and in the case of a Union of Employers, a list in form numbered 7b of the names of the members, officers, and trustees (if any) with their addresses, giving in the case of a co-partnership firm, the name of each partner residing in the State as well as of the firm.

Regulations numbers 5, 10, 15, 46, 56, 57, 59, 61, and 64 shall be amended to read, respectively, as follows:—

5. On receipt of an application for Registration in accordance with Regulation 1, the Registrar of Friendly Societies shall, before completing such registration, give at least seven days notice of such application, in the form numbered 13 in the Schedule annexed hereto, to every industrial union, within the industrial district, which is connected with the same or a like industry, and to every industrial association, and registered trades and labour council within the same district: Provided that when the application is from a union of workers, workers' unions only shall be notified, and that when the application is from a company or a union of employers, employers' unions only shall be notified. And every such union, association, or council to which a copy of the said notice has been sent may, in the manner provided in such Form 13, before the expiry of the period mentioned in the notice, lodge an objection to such registration, which objection the Registrar may take into account when satisfying himself as to the qualifications for registry included or implied under Section 4 of the Act.

REGISTERED NAME.

Section 5 (2) of Act.

10. The registered name of every Industrial Union inserted in the Rules thereof must, before registry, contain (except in the case of a company) the words "Union of Employers," or "Union of Workers," according to whether such Union is a Union of Employers or Workers, the name of the industry in connection with which it is formed, and the locality in which the majority of members reside or exercise their celling. calling.

Sections 12 (1) and 22 of Act.

An application to register a partial and a complete 15. An application to register a partial and a complete amendment of rules must be made by the Secretary in the forms numbered 21 and 21a respectively in the schedule annexed hereto, and the due making thereof must be verified by statutory declaration of the Secretary, President, or Chairman, which shall be in form numbered 22 in the Schedule annexed hereto. Such application must be accompanied by a copy of the existing rules (marked in the case of a partial amendment to show where the alterations occur, and what they are), and by two copies of the amendment, each copy signed by two or more officers.

Sections 51 (4 to 7) and 73 of Act.

- 46. (1.) An employer being a party to a reference may appear in person or by his agent or, subject to Section 51 (7) of the Act, by Counsel or Solicitor, duly appointed in writing for that purpose. Such appointment may be in Form numbered 46 in the Schedule annexed hereto.
- (2.) An Industrial Union or an Industrial Association being a party to a reference may appear by its Chairman or Secretary, or by any person appointed in writing by the Chairman or, subject to section 51 (7) of the Act, by Counsel or Solicitor, or in such other manner as the rules prescribe. And the appointment may be in Form numbered 46 in the Schedule annexed hereto

Sections 69 and 97 (3) of Act.

The application under Section 69 of the Act for the 56. The application under Section 69 of the Act for the reference of an industral dispute to the Court of Arbitration direct shall be in the Form numbered 53 in the Schedule annexed hereto. Such application must be signed in the manner directed for Form 52 in Regulation 54, and be filed with the Clerk of the Court. The application must be accompanied by the certificate in Form 41, and the consent in Form 42 described in Regulation 39. When filing such application with the Clerk of the Court, the applicant or applicants shall lodge as many copies thereof as there are other parties to the dispute, together with four additional copies for the use of the Court.

$Section\ 72\ of\ Act.$

57. The Clerk of the Court, upon the receipt of an applica-57. The Cierk of the Court, upon the receipt of an applica-tion in Form 52 or 53, accompanied by the extra copies thereof, prescribed in Regulations 55 and 56, shall indorse at the foot of each extra copy a memorandum signed by him, setting forth the fact and date of the filing of the original, and shall forthwith post one such copy by registered letter, addressed to each of the other parties to the dispute.

Sections 70 and 72 of Act.

59. Forthwith after a dispute has been referred to the Court, the Clerk of the Court shall notify the fact to the President. The Clerk of the Court shall arrange a sitting of the Court by posting by registered post, or delivering to each member of the Court and to each party mentioned in any dispute or application to be heard or dealt with by the Court at such sitting at least seven clear days before the time appointed for such sitting, a notice in the Form numbered 45 in the Schedule annexed hereto, which form may be modified as circumstances may require which form may be modified as circumstances may require

Sections 71 and 72 of Act.

- 61. When a dispute is before the Court, Regulations 42 to 47, and the forms therein mentioned shall, where applicable, apply mutatis mutandis. In such case the Clerk of the Court shall be read in place of the Clerk of Awards, and the Court of Arbitration in place of the Board of Conciliation.
- In every case where an application is filed in forms 33 64. In every case where an application is filed in forms 33 or 54, the applicant shall lodge as many copies thereof respectively as there are parties alleged to have committed a breach or default, together with four additional copies for the use of the Court, and each such application shall be accompanied by the Certificate in Form 41, and the consent in Form 42, required by section 96 (3) and (4) of the Act. The Clerk of the Court shall indorse at the foot of each copy of application a memorandum signed by him, setting forth the fact and date of the filing of the original, and shall then forthwith post one copy by registered letter addressed to each of the aforesaid parties.

Clause (d) of Section 1 of Regulation 76 shall be amended to read as follows:-

(d.) In addition to the foregoing fees, there shall be payable to each member the cost actually paid or incurred by him in respect of fare for passage within the State by rail, vessel, or coach from Perth to the place where the sitting is held, and return.

Clause (e) of Section 2 of the same Regulation shall be amended to read as follows:—

(e.) In addition to the foregoing fees, there shall be payable to each member the cost actually paid or incurred by him in respect of fare for passage within the State by rail, vessel, or coach from Perth to the place where the sitting is held, and return.

The following Regulation, number 81, shall be added:-

AMALGAMATION.

- 81. When two or more registered societies amalgamate, the following procedure shall be observed:—
 - (a.) When it is desired that the registration of one of the societies shall be continued, each of the other societies concerned shall apply for cancellation of its Registry on Form 23, stating as the ground therefor:—
