# PUBLIC SERVICE ACT, 1904.

Proposal of the Public Service Commissioner relating to Classification of the Clerical Division.

# INTRODUCTION.

- The Commissioner has, with few exceptions (about 20, who are mostly stationed in the tropics), personally examined each official at his post.
- The position, not the official who for the time being occupies it, has been All salaries are fixed at Perth rates. On the goldfields in the tropics a district allowance is paid in addition to the salary.
- If the official is not, for any reason, properly fulfilling the duties of his position, an obligation under the Act and Regulations rests on his superior officer to see that he does, or report him to the Commissioner. The names placed against the respective positions do not necessarily entitle such officers to the positions.
- 4. The value of a position is not enhanced by reason of the official occupying such position being capable of performing more important work than the position Such capacity must look for reward to promotion to a position carrying a higher classification. Seniority only counts when there is equality of efficiency.
- Considerable work is done by seniors which should be done by office boys Three adults This cannot always be avoided, but in many cases it can. should not be employed to do work which can be done by two and a boy.

- 6. The Commissioner believes that the future expansion of the Service can be met by increasing the Junior staff rather than the staff of Senior Officers. At the same time, the future additions to the Public Service both in the Senior and Junior classes must necessarily depend upon the nature of new legislative enactments. All new Acts cost something to administer, either directly or indirectly, and sometimes the cost is very considerable.
- 7. The measure of capacity for promotion towards an administrative position will embrace an officer's ability to get satisfactory work out of others.
- 8. Of 618 officials now placed in the Clerical Division, no less than 539 are stationed in the Metropolitan District.
- 9. It is comparatively easy to grasp the situation in the provinces, and the Commissioner thinks the suggestions made will (as matters stand at the present moment) fairly bring them down to bedrock. The systems and organisations in Perth will require further study and consideration. That cannot be done till the classification of the whole Service has been completed.
- 10. Promotion in the higher grades is practically stopped until the surplus officials in all departments have been placed, or have been retired under Regulation 52, which reads as follows:—

If any officer appears to the Permanent Head or Head of Sub-department to be unfit to discharge or incapable of discharging the duties of his office efficiently, he shall report to the Commissioner, who shall inquire and determine whether it is proved that such officer is unfit to discharge or incapable of discharging the duties of his office, and the Governor, on the recommendation of the Commissioner, may deal with such officer either by calling upon such officer to retire from the Public Service or by transferring him to some other position; and every such officer, if called upon to retire, shall retire accordingly.

# Or under Section 9, Subsection (7), of the Public Service Act, viz.:—

If the services of any officers in excess in any department are not likely to be required in any other department, the Governor, on the recommendation of the Commissioner, may call upon such officers to retire from the Public Service; and every such officer so called upon to retire shall retire accordingly. A record shall be kept of all officers who retire-under this subsection, and in the event of the re-appointment of any such officer to the Public Service the provisions of section thirty-four shall not apply.

11. The appointment of a Commissioner under the Public Service Act does not, in the slightest degree, relieve any official in an administrative position of responsibility; on the other hand, it confirms and defines such responsibility. This again is amplified and confirmed in the Regulations passed under the Act. For instance, Regulation 51 reads as follows:—

The Permanent Head shall report to the Commissioner whenever it appears to him that alterations are necessary or expedient for the more economic, efficient, or convenient working of his Department, or any branch thereof. He shall further report to the Commissioner what alterations, if any, are, in his opinion, necessary in the salaries, fees, or allowances of any of the officers under his control; and shall also bring under the attention of the Commissioner any matter, whether in relation to any officer or to the work of any branch of his Department, with which he may think it desirable for the Commissioner to be acquainted. All such returns and reports will be filed as a record by the Commissioner.

12. No official in charge of others will be recommended by the Commissioner for promotion to a higher administrative position if he, to the knowledge of the Commissioner, fails to report to his chief the inefficient, indolent, or unsatisfactory officers in his office, or fails in getting junior work done by junior officers.

- 13. Officials whose names are omitted from this list, but who consider they should be included in the Clerical Division, are requested to communicate with the Commissioner.
- 14. The title of "Chief Clerk" is only used where the Official is virtually Assistant Under Secretary, taking the Under Secretary's place in his absence, etc.
- 15. Each Accounts Office is provided with two principal officials named respectively "The Accountant" and "The Bookkeeper." It does not follow that the latter official must necessarily actually keep any particular set of books, but he, with the Accountant, is responsible for the bookkeeping and general administration of the office; and when the nature of the work permits, as it does in the Treasury, the Savings Bank, and the Agricultural Bank, etc., the Bookkeeper should actually keep the General Ledgers. The title will always denote the second in command of the branch.
- 16. Each large department is provided with one official entitled "Clerk in charge of Correspondence Office." He should be capable of organising and controlling an efficient Correspondence Branch. It is advisable that he should be an expert shorthand writer and typewriter, so that he may know exactly what to expect from others. The tendency for each important official to have a shorthand writer solely devoted to his personal requirements has not been provided for in the Classification. The idea is one central office for each large Department, under proper control, from which assistance can be drawn as required.
- 17. Mining Registrars, who are or have been Clerks of Court, will be considered eligible for positions of Clerks of Court on the coast, as vacancies occur. A larger salary has been provided for Mining Registrars engaged at the headquarters of the Warden in order to provide opportunity of promotion, not because the positions entail more arduous work or heavier responsibilities.
- 18. The visit of the Commissioner to the various Departments or Offices, for the primary purpose of classification, must not be confounded with "the examination of the Department" referred to in Section 36, Subsection 8, of the Public Service Act. Such examination will be made at a later date, when the systems in vogue will be inquired into. For instance, many outstations are required to make daily returns to Perth, both to Treasury, Lands, and Law. If these were only required weekly, instead of 939 returns during a working year of 313 days having to be made, 156 would suffice; probably saving not only a vast amount of labour at outstations, but also in Perth.
- 19. The Classification discloses the condition of affairs existing when the Commissioner made his inspection. Some of the suggestions have since been put into effect.
- 20. The apparent discrepancy in District Allowances is owing to the new scale differentiating between the married and single.
- 21. The proposals of the Public Service Commissioner relating to classification, etc., are subject to the approval of the Governor.
  - 22. Attention is drawn to the two following Regulations:—
  - 256. Appeals shall only be considered if made within one month of the date on which the report or recommendation affecting an officer is communicated to him directly, or made known by public advertisement.
  - 257. An officer, in his appeal, shall set out concisely the grounds of his dissatisfaction with the action appealed against, and shall forward the same to the Head of Sub-department, who shall forthwith transmit it, through the Permanent Head, to the Commissioner.

- 23. In special cases the Commissioner will (under Regulation 144) extend the time within which appeals can be lodged, provided application for extension is made to him by telegram stating the reasons for such application and the further time required.
- 24. The Commissioner's first Annual Report will probably be published about the middle of July next, but he does not expect (owing to other demands on his time) to be able to complete the classification of the remainder of the Service (Administrative, Professional, and General Divisions) until the 1st May, 1907.
