WHEREAS by Section 3, Subsection 5 of "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," it is provided that the Governor may appoint quarantine grounds where plants or fruit, and the packages containing the same or with which the same may have come in contact, may be detained for the purpose of being inspected, disinfected, destroyed, or otherwise disposed of: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient by the said Governor to appoint quarantine grounds at the ports of Fremantle and Albany: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers rested in means aforecast, with the advice of the Exercise. vested in me as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby set apart as a quarantine ground, under "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," all that piece of land

On the West side of Fremantle tunnel and running West from the South boundary of the fruit shed yard fence to the foreshore, and from the Western extremity of the old fruit shed buildings to a point on the foreshore two-and-a-half chains East from the Fremantle Tramways Power House, and including the foreshore between these points.

And all that piece of land situated at Albany and bounded on the North by Stirling Terrace; on the South by and including the foreshore; on the West by Spence Street, and on the East by the Western boundary of Block 11.

COLONIAL MARRIAGES (DECEASED WIFE'S SISTER) ACT, 1906 [6 Edw. VII.]



CHAPTER 30.

An Act to declare the law with respect to a marriage between a man and his deceased wife's sister domiciled in parts of the British Possessions where such a marriage is legal. [4th August, 1906.] Be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Legalisation of colonial marriages with deceased wife's sister.

Legalisation of colonial merriages with deceased wife's sister.

1. For removing doubts, it is hereby declared that where a man has, whether before or after the passing of this Act, married his deceased wife's sister, and at the date of the marriage each of the parties was domiciled in a part of the British Possessions in which at that date such a marriage was legal, the marriage if legal in other respects shall be, and shall be deemed always to have been, legal for all purposes, including the right of succession to real property and to honours and dignities, within the United Kingdom, unless either party to the marriage has subsequently, during the life of the other, but before the passing of this Act, lawfully married another:

Provided that nothing in this Act shall effect any right interest on

passing of this Act, lawfully married another:

Provided that nothing in this Act shall affect any right, interest, or estate to or in any property, dignity, or honour the title to which, whether vested or contingent, and whether in possession, reversion, or remainder, accrued before the passing of this Act, and no claim by the Crown for duties leviable on or with reference to death, and before the passing of this Act due and payable, and no payment, commutation, composition. discharge or settlement of account in respect of any duties leviable on or with reference to death before the passing of this Act duly made or given, shall be prejudicially affected hereby.

Short title.

2. This Act may be cited as the Colonial Marriages (Deceased Wife's Sister) Act, 1906.

REGULATIONS FOR THE STORAGE OF EXPLOSIVES AT THE WOODMAN'S POINT MAGAZINE RESERVE, AND THE LANDING SHED ON THE MAGAZINE JETTY.

1. The following Storage Charges will be made on Explosives stored in the Government Magazines:—

For each and every barrel or case containing gunpowder or other explosive;

For the first week, or fraction thereof ... 4d.

For every subsequent week, or fraction thereof ... ... ... 2d

All handling of explosives into and out of the Government Magazines shall be performed by the owners of the explosives, under the direction of the Magazine Keeper.

- 2. The Landing Shed shall be available for use by importers of explosives when transferring explosives from lighters to the magazines or trucks, but such explosives shall not be left in the shed for a longer period than is required for the purposes of such handling.
- 3. Should explosives be left in the Landing Shed for a period exceeding three working days, a penalty equal to twice the charges for storage at the Government Magazines shall be inflicted.
